Emergency Purchase Request – FHWA Data Assessment 81220092

The West Virginia Department of Transportation (WVDOT) is requesting approval to proceed with an emergency contract to be issued for professional services for FHWA data validation / HPMS. The requested emergency contract, tentatively called 81220092, is to be awarded to 1Spatial, Inc., who have previously been awarded two (2) direct award agreements (CSSD DOT20*02 and CSSD DOT21*03). The required services dates will be from 3/23/2022- 12/31/2022 and the cost will be \$118,480.00.

WVDOT is required to validate its data for the Highway Performance Monitoring System (HPMS) by April 15, 2022. The HPMS is a national level highway information system that includes data on the extent, condition, performance, use and operating characteristics of the nation's highways. The HPMS contains administrative and extent of system information on all public roads, while information on other characteristics is represented in HPMS as a mix of universe and sample data for arterial and collector functional systems. Limited information on travel and paved miles is included in summary form for the lowest functional systems.

Recently, WVDOT lost its subject matter expert who handled this process historically and will be attempting to fill the vacancy. However, until that process can be completed, these services are being requested on an emergency need.

Failure to complete the required HPMS data validation immediately will greatly impact WVDOT's ability to meet the deadline of April 15, 2022, for the annual Highway Performance Monitoring submission.
