Dear Mr. Sheets:

Market forces at play are resulting in the current provider for ammunition under the State contract having delivery wait times in excess of one year from the date of order for ammunition used by the West Virginia Department of Homeland Security agencies authorized to carry firearms. Due to market constraints and conditions, it does not appear that the delivery wait times will shorten any time soon.

This has a negative effect on critical public safety and Homeland Security mission readiness capabilities of the agencies. Training is impacted by a lack of ammunition as divisions within the Department of Homeland Security authorized to carry firearms, including the Division of Corrections and Rehabilitation, the State Fire Marshal, the Division of Protective Services and others, do not have the necessary ammunition to practice. Further, ammunition rotation protocols are impacted as fresh ammunition can be unavailable when necessary.

We are requesting your approval to purchase ammunition on an emergency basis. We will, of course, follow all emergency purchase procedures and documentation requirements, if approved.
