RE: Justification Request for Renewal of the Water Infrastructure Improvements for the Nation, State Lead Testing in School and Child Care Program Drinking Water Grant Change Order

The Office of Environmental Health Services is requesting a change order for EHS21*002 in the amount of \$305,000. This is additional monies being added to the original contract. These supplementary federal funds were received from EPA as an award that was subsequent to the original award of \$262,000. There is a second allotment that EPA has awarded to us in the amount of \$151,000. EPA has also awarded OEHS with a third allotment of \$154,000 which brings the total awards for this project to \$567,000. These 3 EPA grant awards are for testing for lead in drinking water of West Virginia's schools and daycare centers. The focus for these grant dollars is toward low income and impoverished areas of the state and at sites with the youngest children.

There is no safe blood lead level for children. In children, lead exposure can cause adverse health effects both physical and behavioral, including impaired growth, reduced attention span, hyperactivity, and learning disabilities. Children are most susceptible to the effects of lead because their bodies are still developing; therefore, they tend to absorb more lead than adults which their bodies cannot metabolize.

Lead in drinking water most often results from corroded plumbing materials that contain lead. Collaborative work is necessary to assist schools and childcare facilities test drinking water for lead and take the necessary steps to correct problems (when lead is detected).

The EPA grant that provided these funds requires the state to establish a contract with a vendor to conduct sampling, develop a computer program to track samples and display results, and provide technical assistance if remediation due to lead contamination is required. Grant funds are limited, and the current vendor has already established a proprietary computer program to track and display sample results and funding has already been expended for those activities. Changing vendors would decrease the number of WV schools and daycares that could be sampled for lead as funds would have to be spent on developing a new computer program. A second vendor could potentially also mean that sample results would be displayed for the public in different websites which is not effective or efficient especially for parents searching for information regarding lead contamination in WV schools and childcare facilities.
