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GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

- 1. CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENT: Issuance of an Award Document signed by the Purchasing Division Director, or his designee, and approved as to form by the Attorney General's office constitutes acceptance by the State of this Contract made by and between the State of West Virginia and the Vendor. Vendor's signature on its bid, or on the Contract if the Contract is not the result of a bid solicitation, signifies Vendor's agreement to be bound by and accept the terms and conditions contained in this Contract.
- **2. DEFINITIONS:** As used in this Solicitation/Contract, the following terms shall have the meanings attributed to them below. Additional definitions may be found in the specifications included with this Solicitation/Contract.
- **2.1. "Agency"** or "**Agencies"** means the agency, board, commission, or other entity of the State of West Virginia that is identified on the first page of the Solicitation or any other public entity seeking to procure goods or services under this Contract.
- 2.2. "Bid" or "Proposal" means the vendors submitted response to this solicitation.
- **2.3.** "Contract" means the binding agreement that is entered into between the State and the Vendor to provide the goods or services requested in the Solicitation.
- **2.4. "Director"** means the Director of the West Virginia Department of Administration, Purchasing Division.
- **2.5. "Purchasing Division"** means the West Virginia Department of Administration, Purchasing Division.
- **2.6. "Award Document"** means the document signed by the Agency and the Purchasing Division, and approved as to form by the Attorney General, that identifies the Vendor as the contract holder.
- **2.7. "Solicitation"** means the official notice of an opportunity to supply the State with goods or services that is published by the Purchasing Division.
- **2.8. "State"** means the State of West Virginia and/or any of its agencies, commissions, boards, etc. as context requires.
- **2.9. "Vendor"** or "Vendors" means any entity submitting a bid in response to the Solicitation, the entity that has been selected as the lowest responsible bidder, or the entity that has been awarded the Contract as context requires.

3. CONTRACT TERM; RENEWAL; EXTENSION: The term of this Contract shall be determined in accordance with the category that has been identified as applicable to this Contract below:

Renewal Term: This Contract may be renewed upon the mutual written consent of the Agency, and the Vendor, with approval of the Purchasing Division and the Attorney General's office (Attorney General approval is as to form only). Any request for renewal should be delivered to the Agency and then submitted to the Purchasing Division thirty (30) days prior to the expiration date of the initial contract term or appropriate renewal term. A Contract renewal shall be in accordance with the terms and conditions of the original contract. Unless otherwise specified below, renewal of this Contract is limited to successive one (1) year periods or multiple renewal periods of less than one year, provided that the multiple renewal periods do not exceed the total number of months available in all renewal years combined. Automatic renewal of this Contract is prohibited. Renewals must be approved by the Vendor, Agency, Purchasing Division and Attorney General's office (Attorney General approval is as to form only)
Alternate Renewal Term – This contract may be renewed for successive year periods or shorter periods provided that they do not exceed the total number of months contained in all available renewals. Delivery Order Limitations: In the event that this contract permits delivery orders, a delivery order may only be issued during the time this Contract is in effect. No delivery order may be extended beyond one year after this Contract has expired.

One-Time Purchase: This Contract is for the purchase of a set quantity of goods that are identified in the specifications included herewith. Once those items have been delivered, no additional goods may be procured under this Contract without an appropriate change order approved by the Vendor, Agency, Purchasing Division, and Attorney General's office.
Construction: This Contract is for construction activity more fully defined in the specifications.
6. EMERGENCY PURCHASES: The Purchasing Division Director may authorize the Agency to purchase goods or services in the open market that Vendor would otherwise provide under this Contract if those goods or services are for immediate or expedited delivery in an emergency. Emergencies shall include, but are not limited to, delays in transportation or an unanticipated increase in the volume of work. An emergency purchase in the open market, approved by the Purchasing Division Director, shall not constitute of breach of this Contract and shall not entitle the Vendor to any form of compensation or damages. This provision does not excuse the State from fulfilling its obligations under a One-Time Purchase contract.
7. REQUIRED DOCUMENTS: All of the items checked in this section must be provided to the Purchasing Division by the Vendor as specified:
LICENSE(S) / CERTIFICATIONS / PERMITS: In addition to anything required under the Section of the General Terms and Conditions entitled Licensing, the apparent successful Vendor shall furnish proof of the following licenses, certifications, and/or permits upon request and in a form acceptable to the State. The request may be prior to or after contract award at the State's sole discretion.
The apparent successful Vendor shall also furnish proof of any additional licenses or certifications contained in the specifications regardless of whether or not that requirement is listed above.

8. INSURANCE: The apparent successful Vendor shall furnish proof of the insurance identified by a checkmark below prior to Contract award. The insurance coverages identified below must be maintained throughout the life of this contract. Thirty (30) days prior to the expiration of the insurance policies, Vendor shall provide the Agency with proof that the insurance mandated herein has been continued. Vendor must also provide Agency with immediate notice of any changes in its insurance policies, including but not limited to, policy cancelation, policy reduction, or change in insurers. The apparent successful Vendor shall also furnish proof of any additional insurance requirements contained in the specifications prior to Contract award regardless of whether that insurance requirement is listed in this section.

Professional/Malpractice/Errors and Omission Insurance in at least an amount of: per occurrence. Notwithstanding the forgoing, Vendor's are not required to list the State as an additional insured for this type of policy.
Commercial Crime and Third Party Fidelity Insurance in an amount of: per occurrence.
Cyber Liability Insurance in an amount of: per occurrence.
Builders Risk Insurance in an amount equal to 100% of the amount of the Contract.
Pollution Insurance in an amount of: per occurrence.
Aircraft Liability in an amount of: per occurrence.

- **9. WORKERS' COMPENSATION INSURANCE:** Vendor shall comply with laws relating to workers compensation, shall maintain workers' compensation insurance when required, and shall furnish proof of workers' compensation insurance upon request.
- 10. VENUE: All legal actions for damages brought by Vendor against the State shall be brought in the West Virginia Claims Commission. Other causes of action must be brought in the West Virginia court authorized by statute to exercise jurisdiction over it.

11. LIQUIDATED DAMAGES: This clause shall in no way be considered exclusive and shall

- 12. ACCEPTANCE: Vendor's signature on its bid, or on the certification and signature page, constitutes an offer to the State that cannot be unilaterally withdrawn, signifies that the product or service proposed by vendor meets the mandatory requirements contained in the Solicitation for that product or service, unless otherwise indicated, and signifies acceptance of the terms and conditions contained in the Solicitation unless otherwise indicated.
- 13. PRICING: The pricing set forth herein is firm for the life of the Contract, unless specified elsewhere within this Solicitation/Contract by the State. A Vendor's inclusion of price adjustment provisions in its bid, without an express authorization from the State in the Solicitation to do so, may result in bid disqualification. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Vendor must extend any publicly advertised sale price to the State and invoice at the lower of the contract price or the publicly advertised sale price.
- **14. PAYMENT IN ARREARS:** Payments for goods/services will be made in arrears only upon receipt of a proper invoice, detailing the goods/services provided or receipt of the goods/services, whichever is later. Notwithstanding the foregoing, payments for software maintenance, licenses, or subscriptions may be paid annually in advance.
- **15. PAYMENT METHODS:** Vendor must accept payment by electronic funds transfer and P-Card. (The State of West Virginia's Purchasing Card program, administered under contract by a banking institution, processes payment for goods and services through state designated credit cards.)
- **16. TAXES:** The Vendor shall pay any applicable sales, use, personal property or any other taxes arising out of this Contract and the transactions contemplated thereby. The State of West Virginia is exempt from federal and state taxes and will not pay or reimburse such taxes.

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- 17. ADDITIONAL FEES: Vendor is not permitted to charge additional fees or assess additional charges that were not either expressly provided for in the solicitation published by the State of West Virginia, included in the Contract, or included in the unit price or lump sum bid amount that Vendor is required by the solicitation to provide. Including such fees or charges as notes to the solicitation may result in rejection of vendor's bid. Requesting such fees or charges be paid after the contract has been awarded may result in cancellation of the contract.
- 18. FUNDING: This Contract shall continue for the term stated herein, contingent upon funds being appropriated by the Legislature or otherwise being made available. In the event funds are not appropriated or otherwise made available, this Contract becomes void and of no effect beginning on July 1 of the fiscal year for which funding has not been appropriated or otherwise made available. If that occurs, the State may notify the Vendor that an alternative source of funding has been obtained and thereby avoid the automatic termination. Non-appropriation or non-funding shall not be considered an event of default.
- 19. CANCELLATION: The Purchasing Division Director reserves the right to cancel this Contract immediately upon written notice to the vendor if the materials or workmanship supplied do not conform to the specifications contained in the Contract. The Purchasing Division Director may also cancel any purchase or Contract upon 30 days written notice to the Vendor in accordance with West Virginia Code of State Rules § 148-1-5.2.b.
- **20. TIME:** Time is of the essence regarding all matters of time and performance in this Contract.
- 21. APPLICABLE LAW: This Contract is governed by and interpreted under West Virginia law without giving effect to its choice of law principles. Any information provided in specification manuals, or any other source, verbal or written, which contradicts or violates the West Virginia Constitution, West Virginia Code, or West Virginia Code of State Rules is void and of no effect.
- **22. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS:** Vendor shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, regulations and ordinances. By submitting a bid, Vendor acknowledges that it has reviewed, understands, and will comply with all applicable laws, regulations, and ordinances.
 - **SUBCONTRACTOR COMPLIANCE:** Vendor shall notify all subcontractors providing commodities or services related to this Contract that as subcontractors, they too are required to comply with all applicable laws, regulations, and ordinances. Notification under this provision must occur prior to the performance of any work under the contract by the subcontractor.
- 23. ARBITRATION: Any references made to arbitration contained in this Contract, Vendor's bid, or in any American Institute of Architects documents pertaining to this Contract are hereby deleted, void, and of no effect.

- **24. MODIFICATIONS:** This writing is the parties' final expression of intent. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Contract to the contrary no modification of this Contract shall be binding without mutual written consent of the Agency, and the Vendor, with approval of the Purchasing Division and the Attorney General's office (Attorney General approval is as to form only). Any change to existing contracts that adds work or changes contract cost, and were not included in the original contract, must be approved by the Purchasing Division and the Attorney General's Office (as to form) prior to the implementation of the change or commencement of work affected by the change.
- **25. WAIVER:** The failure of either party to insist upon a strict performance of any of the terms or provision of this Contract, or to exercise any option, right, or remedy herein contained, shall not be construed as a waiver or a relinquishment for the future of such term, provision, option, right, or remedy, but the same shall continue in full force and effect. Any waiver must be expressly stated in writing and signed by the waiving party.
- **26. SUBSEQUENT FORMS:** The terms and conditions contained in this Contract shall supersede any and all subsequent terms and conditions which may appear on any form documents submitted by Vendor to the Agency or Purchasing Division such as price lists, order forms, invoices, sales agreements, or maintenance agreements, and includes internet websites or other electronic documents. Acceptance or use of Vendor's forms does not constitute acceptance of the terms and conditions contained thereon.
- **27. ASSIGNMENT:** Neither this Contract nor any monies due, or to become due hereunder, may be assigned by the Vendor without the express written consent of the Agency, the Purchasing Division, the Attorney General's office (as to form only), and any other government agency or office that may be required to approve such assignments.
- 28. WARRANTY: The Vendor expressly warrants that the goods and/or services covered by this Contract will: (a) conform to the specifications, drawings, samples, or other description furnished or specified by the Agency; (b) be merchantable and fit for the purpose intended; and (c) be free from defect in material and workmanship.
- **29. STATE EMPLOYEES:** State employees are not permitted to utilize this Contract for personal use and the Vendor is prohibited from permitting or facilitating the same.
- **30. PRIVACY, SECURITY, AND CONFIDENTIALITY:** The Vendor agrees that it will not disclose to anyone, directly or indirectly, any such personally identifiable information or other confidential information gained from the Agency, unless the individual who is the subject of the information consents to the disclosure in writing or the disclosure is made pursuant to the Agency's policies, procedures, and rules. Vendor further agrees to comply with the Confidentiality Policies and Information Security Accountability Requirements, set forth in www.state.wv.us/admin/purchase/privacy.

31. YOUR SUBMISSION IS A PUBLIC DOCUMENT: Vendor's entire response to the Solicitation and the resulting Contract are public documents. As public documents, they will be disclosed to the public following the bid/proposal opening or award of the contract, as required by the competitive bidding laws of West Virginia Code §§ 5A-3-1 et seq., 5-22-1 et seq., and 5G-1-1 et seq. and the Freedom of Information Act West Virginia Code §§ 29B-1-1 et seq.

DO NOT SUBMIT MATERIAL YOU CONSIDER TO BE CONFIDENTIAL, A TRADE SECRET, OR OTHERWISE NOT SUBJECT TO PUBLIC DISCLOSURE.

Submission of any bid, proposal, or other document to the Purchasing Division constitutes your explicit consent to the subsequent public disclosure of the bid, proposal, or document. The Purchasing Division will disclose any document labeled "confidential," "proprietary," "trade secret," "private," or labeled with any other claim against public disclosure of the documents, to include any "trade secrets" as defined by West Virginia Code § 47-22-1 et seq. All submissions are subject to public disclosure without notice.

32. LICENSING: In accordance with West Virginia Code of State Rules § 148-1-6.1.e, Vendor must be licensed and in good standing in accordance with any and all state and local laws and requirements by any state or local agency of West Virginia, including, but not limited to, the West Virginia Secretary of State's Office, the West Virginia Tax Department, West Virginia Insurance Commission, or any other state agency or political subdivision. Obligations related to political subdivisions may include, but are not limited to, business licensing, business and occupation taxes, inspection compliance, permitting, etc. Upon request, the Vendor must provide all necessary releases to obtain information to enable the Purchasing Division Director or the Agency to verify that the Vendor is licensed and in good standing with the above entities.

SUBCONTRACTOR COMPLIANCE: Vendor shall notify all subcontractors providing commodities or services related to this Contract that as subcontractors, they too are required to be licensed, in good standing, and up-to-date on all state and local obligations as described in this section. Obligations related to political subdivisions may include, but are not limited to, business licensing, business and occupation taxes, inspection compliance, permitting, etc. Notification under this provision must occur prior to the performance of any work under the contract by the subcontractor.

- 33. ANTITRUST: In submitting a bid to, signing a contract with, or accepting a Award Document from any agency of the State of West Virginia, the Vendor agrees to convey, sell, assign, or transfer to the State of West Virginia all rights, title, and interest in and to all causes of action it may now or hereafter acquire under the antitrust laws of the United States and the State of West Virginia for price fixing and/or unreasonable restraints of trade relating to the particular commodities or services purchased or acquired by the State of West Virginia. Such assignment shall be made and become effective at the time the purchasing agency tenders the initial payment to Vendor.
- **34. VENDOR NON-CONFLICT:** Neither Vendor nor its representatives are permitted to have any interest, nor shall they acquire any interest, direct or indirect, which would compromise the performance of its services hereunder. Any such interests shall be promptly presented in detail to the Agency.

35. VENDOR RELATIONSHIP: The relationship of the Vendor to the State shall be that of an independent contractor and no principal-agent relationship or employer-employee relationship is contemplated or created by this Contract. The Vendor as an independent contractor is solely liable for the acts and omissions of its employees and agents. Vendor shall be responsible for selecting, supervising, and compensating any and all individuals employed pursuant to the terms of this Solicitation and resulting contract. Neither the Vendor, nor any employees or subcontractors of the Vendor, shall be deemed to be employees of the State for any purpose whatsoever. Vendor shall be exclusively responsible for payment of employees and contractors for all wages and salaries, taxes, withholding payments, penalties, fees, fringe benefits, professional liability insurance premiums, contributions to insurance and pension, or other deferred compensation plans, including but not limited to, Workers' Compensation and Social Security obligations, licensing fees, etc. and the filing of all necessary documents, forms, and returns pertinent to all of the foregoing.

Vendor shall hold harmless the State, and shall provide the State and Agency with a defense against any and all claims including, but not limited to, the foregoing payments, withholdings, contributions, taxes, Social Security taxes, and employer income tax returns.

- 36. INDEMNIFICATION: The Vendor agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the State and the Agency, their officers, and employees from and against: (1) Any claims or losses for services rendered by any subcontractor, person, or firm performing or supplying services, materials, or supplies in connection with the performance of the Contract; (2) Any claims or losses resulting to any person or entity injured or damaged by the Vendor, its officers, employees, or subcontractors by the publication, translation, reproduction, delivery, performance, use, or disposition of any data used under the Contract in a manner not authorized by the Contract, or by Federal or State statutes or regulations; and (3) Any failure of the Vendor, its officers, employees, or subcontractors to observe State and Federal laws including, but not limited to, labor and wage and hour laws.
- 37. NO DEBT CERTIFICATION: In accordance with West Virginia Code §§ 5A-3-10a and 5-22-1(i), the State is prohibited from awarding a contract to any bidder that owes a debt to the State or a political subdivision of the State. If the domestic aluminum, glass or steel products to be supplied or produced in a "substantial labor surplus area", as defined by the United States Department of Labor, the cost of domestic aluminum, glass, or steel products may be unreasonable if the cost is more than thirty percent (30%) of the bid or offered price for foreign made aluminum, glass, or steel products. This preference shall be applied to an item of machinery or equipment, as indicated above, when the item is a single unit of equipment or machinery manufactured primarily of aluminum, glass or steel, is part of a public works contract and has the sole purpose or of being a permanent part of a single public works project. This provision does not apply to equipment or machinery purchased by a spending unit for use by that spending unit and not as part of a single public works project.

All bids and offers including domestic aluminum, glass or steel products that exceed bid or offer prices including foreign aluminum, glass or steel products after application of the preferences provided in this provision may be reduced to a price equal to or lower than the lowest bid or offer price for foreign aluminum, glass or steel products plus the applicable preference. If the reduced bid or offer prices are made in writing and supersede the prior bid or offer prices, all bids or offers, including the reduced bid or offer prices, will be reevaluated in accordance with this rule.

43. INTERESTED PARTY SUPPLEMENTAL DISCLOSURE: W. Va. Code § 6D-1-2 requires that for contracts with an actual or estimated value of at least \$1 million, the Vendor must submit to the Agency a disclosure of interested parties prior to beginning work under this Contract. Additionally, the Vendor must submit a supplemental disclosure of interested parties reflecting any new or differing interested parties to the contract, which were not included in the original pre-work interested party disclosure, within 30 days following the completion or termination of the contract. Facilitation (concurrent workshops, 2 people, 2 travel days, 2 days on site)

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4.1.1.2 Must be completed within 180 calendar days. A notice to proceed will be issued to establish the start date of the contract. A change order to set the start date will be initiated by the Agency and processed by the WV Purchasing Division.

4.1.2 Phase Two (2)- 3D Response Plan

- **4.1.2.1** Successful vendor will draft the 3D Response Plan after the completion of the workshop. Resulting documents will reflect the discussions and decisions expressed in the workshop and must be approved by WVDA.
- **4.1.2.2** Draft plan must be completed and delivered to WVDA within 2 weeks (14 calendar days) of the plan development workshop.

4.1.3 Phase Three (3)-3D Response Plan Seminar

- **4.1.3.1** Successful vendor will conduct a virtual 3D Response Plan Seminar. Once the 3D plan has been approved by WVDA, the plan will be presented to stakeholders and staff who would be responsible for plan implementation. This step is referred to as plan socialization.
- **4.1.3.2** The virtual seminar must be conducted within two to four weeks prior to the tabletop exercise based on agency availability.

4.1.4 Phase Four (4)-3D Response Plan Tabletop Exercise

4.1.4.1 Successful vendor will conduct an in-person tabletop exercise. This step will validate WVDA's livestock 3D plans, policies, and procedures. This discussion-based exercise will be designed around a scenario that engages both swine and beef production operations and, in addition to validation, will allow updating of the applicable plans, policies, and procedures.

Successful vendor will develop the Situation Manual, associated PowerPoint presentation, Exercise Evaluation Guide, Facilitator Guide, and feedback form for the tabletop exercise. 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4.1.4.2 Tabletop exercise must be conducted within 4 months (120 calendar days) after the 3D workshop (Phase 1).

4.1.5 Phase Five (5)-Develop After-Action Report

- **4.1.5.1** Successful vendor will develop after-action report. The identification of planning or operational gaps and areas needing improvement will be captured in the After-Action Report (AAR) and Improvement Plans (IP). These documents will be based on formal exercise evaluation, hot washes, and player feedback.
- **4.1.5.2** Successful vendor will conduct a virtual After-Action Meeting.
- 4.1.5.3 After-action report and after-action meeting must be completed by 4 weeks (28 calendar days) after the tabletop exercise.

4.2 DELIVERABLES AND TIMELINES:

- 4.2.1 The successful Vendor will design, establish, and provide both electronic and printed copies of products which must be presented to WVDA in an electronic format that is suitable for WVDA and agreed to by the vendor that will allow the inclusion of additional/removal of information and updating of the delivered products by WVDA upon conclusion of the contract.

Depopulation, Disposal, and Disinfection Plan Development Workshop and Tabletop Exercise

Statement of Work

This project will assist the West Virginia Department of Agriculture (WVDA) in developing and validating its plan for emergency livestock and poultry depopulation, disposal, and disinfection (3D).

Step 1: 3D Workshop

SES, Inc. (SES) will design and conduct a 3D workshop that will 1) review depopulation and disposal methods for livestock and poultry, and 2) examine the WVDA's current plans and procedures for livestock and poultry 3D. The goal of reviewing WVDA's existing plans and procedures is to include those plans and procedures, as necessary, in the new 3D plan.

The project will begin with a kickoff meeting that should be held within two weeks of contract award and execution, SES and the WVDA exercise planning team will develop goals and objectives for the workshop, set a date and time for the workshop, and identify potential workshop venues. In addition, SES will coordinate with the exercise planning team to develop a workshop invitee list. Once the list is developed, SES will send out invitations by email. SES will create a formal invitation letter that will be reviewed and approved by the planning team. This letter can be placed on WVDA letterhead and signed by the appropriate WVDA official, if the planning team should feel that would boost attendance. SES recommends that this workshop be attended by WVDA, state supporting agencies, and federal personnel who would be responsible for planning and implementing 3D during a foreign animal disease (FAD) response.

Prior to the workshop, three webinars discussing depopulation, disposal options, and decontamination concepts will be conducted for participants. The webinars will cover swine depopulation methods, cattle depopulation methods, poultry depopulation methods, disposal of livestock and poultry, and best practices for virus elimination. These webinars will provide workshop invitees with a common baseline understanding of the topics so they can contribute to the workshop discussions.

The workshop will be conducted in one day and will address 3D methods, implementation, and pros and cons. The notes and feedback from this workshop will be used by SES to create a 3D appendix to the *Incident Support Annex 9 – Agriculture Incidents*. The workshop will involve a preliminary examination of the processes WVDA will use to develop herd and flock plans for infected premises, and relevant indemnity issues. To prepare for the workshop, SES will review all relevant WVDA plans and procedures.

The workshop will be delivered through a facilitated discussion, supported with a PowerPoint presentation. It will be conducted in a face-to-face environment, at a location provided by WVDA. SES will provide all supplies, equipment, and documents necessary to conduct this workshop. This proposal does not include SES providing any beverages, snacks, or meals for the workshop. These items can be added with a written modification to the contract.

SES will provide a workshop facilitator and a notetaker to support workshop conduct.

SES will capture participant feedback on the workshop via an online survey. The survey data will be made available to WVDA. In addition, SES will organize and formalize its notes from

the workshop conduct and develop the draft 3D appendix to WVDA within two weeks of workshop conduct.

Step 2: Review of Draft Plan and Plan Socialization

SES will address comments provided by WVDA on the draft plan. Following the review process, SES will conduct a plan socialization activity. This activity will be delivered as a webinar, and it will provide the support agencies that attended the plan development workshop an opportunity to review the draft plan and provide feedback. SES will document suggestions of recommended changes. These recommendations will be provided to WVDA. SES will make the changes requested by WVDA and will deliver a final plan.

Step 3: 3D Tabletop Exercise (TTX)

SES, in coordination with the WVDA exercise planning team, will develop an HSEEP-compliant one-day TTX to validate WVDA's livestock 3D plans, policies, and procedures. This discussion-based exercise will be designed around a scenario that engages both swine and beef production operations and, in addition to validation, will allow updating of the applicable plans, policies, and procedures.

Within two weeks of completing the workshop (Step 1), SES will begin the second step in the exercise series with a combined Initial Planning Meeting (IPM) and Concepts and Objectives Meeting (C&O) for the TTX. During this meeting, SES and the WVDA planning team will develop exercise goals and objectives, and a schedule for deliverables, exercise design, and conduct. SES proposes to conduct this meeting virtually with the WVDA planning team. After this meeting, SES and the planning team will have monthly coordination meetings, held over the Zoom video conferencing platform. These monthly meetings can be accelerated to occur biweekly, if necessary and agreeable to the project team. The monthly meeting prior to exercise conduct will be held as the exercise's Final Planning Meeting (FPM). SES recommends that the TTX be conducted five months after contract award and execution, approximately four months after the 3D workshop.

TTX development will require several steps. The exercise objectives will be converted into exercise evaluation guides (EEG) to be used by the exercise Evaluators during conduct. SES and the exercise planning team will develop an exercise scenario which will be converted into a PowerPoint presentation to guide exercise play and deliver exercise injects. SES proposes that the exercise scenario present two different challenges to the participants looking at different species. Operationally, these two species may present unique challenges to WVDA's implementation of its 3D plans, policies, and procedures. To collect additional participant feedback, SES will design and make available an online feedback form for the TTX. For exercise participants, SES will create a Situation Manual (SitMan) that will present essential exercise information and provide a broad overview of exercise modules, key issues, rules of play, and safety considerations.

SES will coordinate with the exercise planning team to develop a TTX invitee list. Once the list is developed, SES will send out invitations by email. SES will create a formal invitation letter that will be reviewed and approved by the planning team. This letter can be placed on WVDA letterhead and signed by the appropriate WVDA official, if the planning team feels that would boost attendance. SES recommends that this TTX be attended by WVDA, federal, and industry

personnel who would be responsible for planning, implementing, and receiving 3D during a FAD response.

SES will conduct the TTX in a single day. Participants will engage together, face-to-face. We anticipate the TTX will require six to eight hours for conduct. SES may divide participants into two functional groups (e.g., operations and policy) based on their roles and responsibilities for implementing a 3D response. The exercise will be presented to the participants as a single group, but participants may be divided into their functional groups to address exercise injects. If functional groups are used periodically, the functional groups will reconvene as one group to brief back on their findings and responses. After the final exercise inject, SES will conduct a hot wash with participants.

After exercise conduct, SES will collect evaluation notes, hot wash notes, completed EEGs, and other participant notes and feedback. This information will be delivered to SES for analysis, and an After-Action Report (AAR) and Improvement Plan (IP) will be developed, and an After-Action Meeting will be conducted virtually.

The TTX will be delivered through a facilitated discussion, supported with a PowerPoint presentation. It will be conducted in a face-to-face environment, at a location provided by WVDA. WVDA will provide an exercise location that is large enough for all the participants to engage together, and that provides two breakout rooms for the functional groups. SES will provide all supplies, equipment, and documents necessary to conduct this TTX. This proposal does not include SES providing any drinks, snacks, or meals for the TTX. These items can be added with a written contract change order. SES will provide the lead Facilitator and lead Notetaker.

SES will provide participants with a workshop agenda, SitMan, and a Facilitator Guide for the Facilitators for each functional group. SES will develop an online participant survey to capture feedback from participants. SES will capture daily attendance for the workshop.

TTX participants will be expected to engage in the entire TTX, and address injects by applying the existing plans and procedures.
