- 1. Awards will be made in the best interest of the State of West Virginia.
- 2. The State may accept or reject in part, or in whole, any bid.
- 3. All quotations are governed by the West Virginia Code and the Legislative Rules of the Purchasing Division.
- 4. Prior to any award, the apparent successful vendor must be properly registered with the Purchasing Division and have paid the required \$125.00 registration fee.
- 5. All services performed or goods delivered under State Purchase Orders/Contracts are to be continued for the term of the Purchase Order/Contract, contingent upon funds being appropriated by the Legislature or otherwise being made available. In the event funds are not appropriated or otherwise available for these services or goods, this Purchase Order/Contract becomes void and of no effect after June 30.
- 6. Payment may only be made after the delivery and acceptance of goods or services.
- 7. Interest may be paid for late payment in accordance with the West Virginia Code.
- 8. Vendor preference will be granted upon written request in accordance with the West Virginia Code.
- 9. The State of West Virginia is exempt from federal and state taxes and will not pay or reimburse such taxes.
- 10. The Director of Purchasing may cancel any Purchase Order/Contract upon 30 days written notice to the seller.
- 11. The laws of the State of West Virginia and the *Legislative Rules* of the Purchasing Division shall govern all rights and duties under the Contract, including without limitation the validity of this Purchase Order/Contract.
- 12. Any reference to automatic renewal is hereby deleted. The Contract may be renewed only upon mutual written agreement of the parties.



### West Virginia Code §5A-3-10a states:

No contract or renewal of any contract may be awarded by the state or any of its political subdivisions to any vendor or prospective vendor when the vendor or prospective vendor or a related party to the vendor or prospective vendor is a debtor and the debt owned is an amount greater than one thousand dollars in the aggregate.

"Related party" means a party, whether an individual, corporation, partnership, association, limited liability company or any other form or business association or other entity whatsoever, related to any vendor by blood, marriage, ownership or contract through which the party has a relationship of ownership or other interest with the vendor so that the party will actually or by effect receive or control a portion of the benefit, profit or other consideration from performance of a vendor contract with the party receiving an amount that meets or exceed five percent of the total contract amount.

#### **EXCEPTION:**

#### **VENDOR QUALIFICATIONS**

#### The vendor must:

1. Have at least three years of documented experience of providing data collection and data manipulation, on a state-wide scope, related to the substance abuse and violence consequences and consumption patterns in West Virginia at the state and county level.

#### **Mountain State Measures**

The West Virginia Prevention Resource Center (WVPRC) of the Marshall University Research Corporation has a well established history of data collection and analysis on multiple projects. Through a partnership with the West Virginia's Office of the Governor's Cabinet on Children and Families (Cabinet) that began in 1998, the West Virginia Prevention Resource Center (WVPRC) began collecting and analyzing data on thirty-seven indicators of child and family well-being. These indicators corresponded to six explicitly defined outcomes established by the Cabinet to measure the State's progress toward improving conditions for WV's citizens. To the extent possible, national, state, and county-level indicator data were compiled. While the scope of this project and covered multiple domains of child and family well-being, several of the indicators, listed below, related specifically to substance abuse and violence.

- Youth who use tobacco products
- Mothers who smoke during pregnancy
- · Adults who use tobacco products
- · Heart disease mortality
- Cancer mortality
- · Domestic violence reports
- Number of students reported for bringing weapons to school
- Number of people who access out-reach services for domestic violence
- Number of people seeking admission to domestic violence shelters
- · Child injury death rate
- · Adult injury death rate
- · Number of violent crime reports

Although this particular project no longer is funded, the WVPRC has continued and expanded its work in this area. To support the State in implementing the prevention set aside of the federal Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Block Grant (SAPT BG), as well as WV's Strategic Prevention Framework State Incentive Grant (SPF SIG), the WVPRC has compiled over the past 3 years a database of over 125 indicators related substance abuse. The database focuses on the consequences of substance abuse, corresponding consumption patterns, and factors contributing to these problems. #### **Key Informant Survey**

A Key Informant Survey was conducted in the spring of 2003 as a part of a substance abuse community needs assessment for the state of WV. Based on the Risk and Protective Factor framework of substance abuse prevention, the survey was intended to collect data on the opinions, perceptions, and attitudes of selected community leaders about alcohol, tobacco, and other drug (ATOD) issues in their communities. Results will be used in an assessment of community needs with respect to ATOD prevention and informational or awareness gaps among community leaders across the state. The initial report providing an introduction to the project, a description of the research methods and questionnaire, a demographic profile of respondents, and some general perceptions about youth and ATOD issues is available from the WVPRC. Subsequent reports will address ATOD issues in communities more generally and will include topics such as: (a) Community perceptions, (b) Attitudes and beliefs about alcohol, tobacco, and other drug issues, (c) Availability of services, and (d) General comments and ideas about addressing alcohol, tobacco, and other drug issues.
