Addendum #1 - Questions During Pre-Bid Conference For DEP 14156

Buffalo Coal Company, Inc. Permit # S-2003-03

The following questions were identified at the Pre Bid Conference (PBC). The answers provided herein take precedence over verbal answers at the PBC should there be any conflicts between the two.

- 1.) Q. Item 6.0, liming, what type of lime do you want? Is it required for pit dewatering, or treating continuously throughout after dewatering is over, do we have to monitor that (water quality)? Is it going to cover up spoil (backfilling) or going to treat the water?

 A. The lime in the backfill will be the same as the agricultural lime for revegetation. It's not for water treatment, it's for liming the pit and/or creating a pad for toxic material. If we don't find toxic material on the pit floor after it's been dewatered, we're going to use it in the subsurface. We plan to use the whole amount here on the job as an alkalinity amendment.
- Q. Are we going to treat the water as we dewater the pits?A. Yes, that's under pit dewatering. Water treatment is incidental to pit dewatering.
- Q. Will that second gate need to stay closed all the time?A. Yes, both gates need to be closed and locked, in and out at all times.
- 4.) Q. Is water treatment incidental to pit dewatering?
 A. Yes.
- 5.) Q. What is the current pH of the pit water?

 A. About 4 or 5, but it's not real high in metals, not a real hard treat.
- Q. When you say agricultural lime, you're not meaning limestone sands, you're meaning burnt lime?
 A. Under bid item 9.1: Unless otherwise specified, all lime used shall be registered with the WV Dept. of Agriculture, have an 85% minimum calcium carbonate equivalent, and meet the fineness classification no larger than for ground lime. The following fineness classifications or

fineness classification no larger than for ground lime. The following fineness classifications or combinations of lime are acceptable: See chart for sieve passing percentages for pulverized and ground lime. For the revegetation line item, lime is to be spread at 5 tons/acre, but we'll do 40 tons/acre in the backfilling for alkaline amendment. Clarification: Not burnt lime.

- 7.) Q. On the previous statement you made on backfilling acreage (a lump sum item), you're saying the pit areas equal approximately 19 acres. If it's more than that, can we bring it to your attention after the fact?
 - A. No, the actual areas and volumes are up to the contractor to determine. 19 acres is a rough estimate. The acreage doesn't matter to us, it's a lump sum bid item, however you bid it is how much you'll get paid for completing it.

8.) Q. If it's more than 19 acres, do we just stop at 19 acres?

A. No, you do whatever it takes; if it's 30 acres you do it. We're not paying anything different, it's a lump sum bid item. Individually, it's up to the contractor to come out here and verify it. We're not negotiating anything this time (no 20% over/under), it's going to be up to the contractor to verify areas and volumes.

- Q. (Directed towards statement of needing approval for more work on regrading and topsoiling)
 Do we need approval to go after more material for backfilling? We have to do everything that's exposed, there's no need for permission to go after material on the backfilling lump sum item?

 A. That's correct, but we don't want to touch anything that's not disturbed, keep to the permit boundaries. That's why on the site map we talk about going from site reference point A to point B. After we get through the spoil material that's closest to pit area 1 done, you're going to have to start going out where they took all this material out on the old haulroad. We want that material brought in to backfill these pits. Anything left over we're just going to regrade in place. Clarification: We expect there to be enough spoil material to complete the backfilling without needing to dig below the approximate original contour.
- 10.) Q. (In reference to regrading the old haulroad in place) Is it all going to drain towards that ditch (between access road and spoil area A), or are we going to crown it?

 A. We'll crown it; it'll go off both ways. On the map, we have all the V-ditches routed into the sediment control structure, so in the case that the water is still bad, we can eventually treat it.
- Q. (In reference to original grade above pit area 1, on the south/southwest side) Is that where the finished grade will be?
 A. That will be your finished grade there, and it tapers out into a big bowl, with the center between the two pits. Get everything to drain towards the center where the sediment control pond is.
- 12.) Q. Have you made any calculations as to total cubic yards in all this that have to be moved?

 A. No, that's up to the contractor.
- Q (At pit 1, in reference to the two parts of pit 1) Is this water (large pit pool) going through this rock into this (smaller pool to the northeast)? Is it all just level?
 A. We think you're getting drainage from over here (above the pit to the northwest) on around (behind the central spoil pile).
- Q. (At pit 1) Is pit 2 draining this way too?A. No, the low point is over there (between the two pits).
- Q. (At final outflow culvert) Does anything happen on the outfall of this pipe?

 A. We've got some trapezoidal ditch and V-ditch. If anything we might use some trapezoidal ditch to redo a little bit, but we didn't have planned to go down through there very far. We plan to use that (trapezoidal ditch?).

- 16.) Q. (Standing at the 36 inch road culvert) This is the final discharge? A. Yes.
- Q. (Pointing up to the north of pit 2) That area up there, is that included in the revegetation, where it's clear and grubbed?
 A. Yes, up to the tree line and back to where it comes up this way. You can see a dark green area to the left, then you see where it gets to the more disturbed areas. If it's not been disturbed much and there's good vegetation on it, you might not have to do anything on those areas. So it's going to be more of the lower part of it here where the pit is, this section down to the haulroad is where we're focusing.
- 18.) Q. What about the topsoil, if there's not a lot of topsoil on site?A. You'll have to use the best available material. Stockpile the best that we have.
- 19.) Q. Concerning the year warranty on the seed, as far as coming back if you're wanting to do more reforestation, how are you going to deal with that? What about seeing a lot of bare spots? What if we have to come back?
 A. Reforestation is why we're doing a light vegetation, light seeding, fertilizing and liming. We're shooting for a light vegetation here, but if we've got big bare areas, you're going to have to come back.
- Q. If it's still as spotty as it is up there, is that going to be good enough?

 A. Yes, probably. We don't want to get the soil all limed up, we want an acidic soil for future tree vegetation, so you're going to have some spotty vegetation.
- Q. As far as you said mixing in the brush and roots that are piled up, it can all just be mixed?

 A. Just bring it back in, yes. That was the intent. We can utilize those stockpiles of brush that can actually be placed back in.
- 22.) Q. What about surface conditions when we're finished, with big rocks sticking up and whatnot?

 A. These sites are rough as a cob when you're done, if there are rocks sticking up, no big deal.
- 23.) Q. Could you go over the tree species for this planting, are they listed in there?
 A. No, that's a separate contract that will be done next spring.
- 24.) Q. They're going to do that the following year?

 A. We're hoping if this job's done by winter, next spring is when we'll plant. If it's not done in time, we'll have to wait until the next spring.
- 25.) Q. You're not going to plant trees if we're still working right?

 A. No, if you're still working, we aren't going to do the trees. But we may come in if you've got a section done, and do that. It's to our benefit to get the vegetation in as quick as possible.

- Q. You said to pump this pend (pit 2) back out after we pumped that pend (pit 1) into it, do you pump it into here (final pend)?

 A. Yes. Once you're down to this, you're not going to have a lot of water to treat. That's the intent, to keep going from big areas to smaller areas (of water), but hopefully we'll get some sediment control and settling out of that final pend, so we're not discharging turbid water.
- Q. On the water treatment, we're responsible for treatment when we're pumping in here and it's discharging, is that the only time?A. Yes. And of course, we have to keep the pits dewatered when you're backfilling.
- Q. If we pump the pits down, and there's discharge not due to us pumping, are we responsible for that? How long are we responsible for treatment? Through the warranty period, or just when we're pumping?

 A. No, no treatment during times it's discharging without you pumping, you only need to treat while you're pumping.
- 29.) Q. So normal flow, like right now, we wouldn't be treating?

 A. Right. We have our own treatment that may be set up to kick in and help treat at those times.

 But we're not taking the responsibility to treat while it's being pumped.
- Q. (At the wetlands between the haulroads) Does anything happen here?

 A. No, we hope to leave everything approximately the same there, we don't want to dewater that, it's an existing wetland. Clarification: a new 24" culvert for the outflow of that wetland (bid item 15.0) will be placed by the contractor. All efforts shall be made to minimize impact to the wetland during culvert placement and regrading the access road.
- 31.) Q. Are you going to have another date set up (to survey the site)?

 A. Yes, we'll get a couple dates set up to come out and see things (call Brad Moore, 304-203-4051 or call David McCoy, 304-203-2921).



Pit 2 shall be backfilled following the backfilling of pit 1, and backfill material shall be obtained from spoil area A. Any disturbance to original ground shall be kept to a minimum. Regrading and topsoiling is required for all disturbed area. Revegetation is required for all disturbed areas. Reclamation is to be according to the attached specifications, plans, and clarifying discussions at the Pre-Bid Conference.
- 4. Construct riprap ditches or open limestone channels.
- 5. Remove structures and debris from site.
- Upgrade access roads.
- 7. Install culverts.
- 8. Dewater pits and water treatment while discharging.
- 9. Alkalinity amendments to spoil material with lime.
- 10. Fertilize, lime, seed, and mulch approximately 60 acres of disturbed area.
- 11. Any other site specific items required.

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BID ITEM TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

1.0 MOBILIZATION/DEMOBILIZATION/PROJECT SIGN

PROJECT SIGN

A project sign shall be obtained or manufactured and installed as indicated on the attached specifications and details. Payment for this sign shall be incidental to the mobilization item. No separate payment will be made.

MOBILIZATION

This work shall consist of the performance of construction preparatory operations, including the movement of personnel, equipment and other facilities to the project site necessary to begin work on a substantial phase of the contract.

DEMOBILIZATION

Prior to demobilization, an inspection shall be conducted by the Department of Environmental Protection and the contractor to insure compliance with contract performance. Once compliance is ascertained, demobilization activities can be initiated and completed. Demobilization shall be totally completed before the invoice for payment shall be processed.

PAYMENT

The lump sum bid for this item shall not exceed 5% of the total bid for this permit. Payment shall be made in two 50% amounts, one upon completion of the mobilization and project sign items and the second payment at the completion of demobilization. No deduction shall be made nor shall any increase be made in the lump sum item amount, regardless of decreases or increases in the final total contract amount or any other reason.

2.0 SPILL CONTAINMENT AREA (S.C.A.)

Spill containment measures shall be used for fuel and lubricant storage areas. All containers, barrels, buckets, cans, etc., are to be legally disposed of off site. Used lubricants are to be disposed of according to state law to minimize pollution to the local surface and ground water supplies. Spills are the responsibility of the contractor and need immediate clean up and maintained at no expense to the State. This S.C.A. shall be constructed in accordance with the typical drawing specification. (See Attachment) Alternate containment measures will be considered for approval by the Program Manager if acceptable results can be shown. Fuel tanks manufactured with secondary containment are desirable. Minimum secondary containment is 110 percent. (Bid limited to \$1,000.00 maximum)

3.0 HAULROAD/ACCESS ROAD UPGRADE

The contractor shall maintain and/or construct haulroad/access road(s) during the reclamation process to provide access on a well drained surface. Plan to upgrade the existing access road to the specifications and details as indicated in the Upgrade Access Road drawing. The access road on the reclamation site shall be graded, sloped, and maintained to drain to provide a road surface free of excessive mud and standing waters at all times while work is in progress. Upon completion of all reclamation activities, a final 3 inch layer of 1 ½ crusher run limestone shall be placed on the roadway. Roads which are below the project shall be guarded against rolling rock and removal of rocks done as necessary. Dust-control measures may be necessary if hauling creates airborne material. Snow removal is to be included in this item.

4.0 INCIDENTAL #1 STONE FOR ROAD UPGRADE

During construction of culvert installations, roadway ditch improvements, and reshaping of the roadway, areas may need additional base layer stone. After any necessary re-compaction and re-grading work on roadways has been performed by the contractor, a six (6) inch layer of #1 limestone (3.5" to 1.5" size) shall be placed as needed. This stone shall be graded and tracked in with a dozer or other equipment to achieve a compacted base for the final top layer of 1 ½ inch crusher run limestone (separate bid item).

Payment shall be paid per ton of stone applied by weight ticket and will be made at completion of all work

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and acceptance by DEP.

5.0 PIT DEWATERING

Two pits will need to be dewatered prior to backfilling operations. Pit 1 has an average depth of 25 feet with the deepest areas of 30 feet adjacent to the highwall and in the center. Pit 2 has an average depth of 20 feet. The contractor shall treat all water discharge to a pH of 6-9 throughout the dewatering process.

Pits shall be dewatered in the following manner in order to facilitate sediment control. Pit 1 shall be dewatered first with the water being pumped into pit 2. Upon completion of backfilling of pit 1, pit 2 shall be dewatered. The water from pit 2 shall be pumped into an old pit area shown on the site map as "temporary drainage control" and from there into a ditch to a cell that is part of the existing sediment pond. Pits shall remain dewatered during backfilling. Water treatment by the contractor shall take place in the existing sediment structure, when pit water is being pumped and discharged. This is a lump sum item.

6.0 LIMING

Liming of open pits is to be carried out at a rate of 40 tons/acre. All potentially toxic material shall be cleaned from the pavement prior to spreading lime uniformly over the exposed pavement. This potentially toxic material shall be placed on a pad prepared in the backfilling of the pits. The top of the pad shall be a minimum of ten (10) feet above the elevation of saturation and twenty (20) feet from the highwall. Lime shall be blended with the toxic material or (lime shall be spread over top of toxic material.) Coal refuse shall be treated in the same manner as the toxic material above. The specifications for this lime shall be the same as required in the Agricultural Lime bid item.

7.0 BACKFILLING

Areas of this project subject to backfilling to achieve the post-mining land-use shall: be accomplished in a continuous concurrent manner on all surface disturbances within the original permit and associated disturbed areas as existing at bid showing; be filled by mechanical methods to eliminate highwall and rock outcropping, to produce slopes of consistent lines and of the approximate original contour; be free of protruding rock and debris; be compacted in a progressive backfilling manner with mechanical equipment to ensure stability of backfill material. Potentially toxic material shall be placed on an alkaline material /clean pad a minimum of ten (10) feet above the elevation of saturation and twenty (20) feet from the highwall. Upon final placement, the material shall be compacted to minimize air contact and promptly covered by a minimum of ten (10) feet of non toxic overburden. The maximum acceptable slope of any backfill face shall not exceed two (2) horizontal to one (1) vertical, unless otherwise stated. Backfilling shall cease during periods of adverse site conditions. (For example: excessive soil moisture) The estimated area of backfilling is 19 acres. It shall be the contractor's responsibility to verify acreage for bidding purposes. This is a lump sum bid item.

8.0 REGRADING AND TOPSOILING

Concurrent regrading and topsoiling shall immediately follow backfilling and shall distribute topsoil or the best available material to support vegetation, as identified by the Department of Environmental Protection contact person. This item shall include the construction of sediment control sumps, the removal of sediment control sumps, the grading of spoil and/or fill materials. Topsoil presently stockpiled on site shall be preserved and spread on the fill surface. In the absence of stockpiled topsoil, material which can be used as a topsoil substitute shall be identified, segregated, and stockpiled for spreading on the surface. Following final regrading of the mine site, the original topsoil and upper horizon material shall be spread over the backfill to an approximate depth of 18 inches to provide growth medium for permanent grasses and seedlings. Seed bed preparation shall be performed using light equipment and minimal passes to avoid compaction. For forestry purposes, the growth medium shall be left loose and non-compacted with random depressions left on the surface of the final backfill. Where possible, some organic matter may be added to the growth medium in the form of tree tops, root wads, leaves, etc. Regrading and topsoiling shall be conducted prior to and in preparation for the revegetation item. The estimated area of regrading and topsoiling is

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60 acres. It shall be the contractor's responsibility to verify acreage for bidding purposes. This is a lump sum bid item.

9.0 REVEGETATION

The actual seeding date, within the work performance period, shall be at the discretion of the contractor, but a permanent vegetative cover must be established. Verification of materials used shall be required for payment. Seeding shall commence after seedbed preparation on a loose and uncompacted soil and with the approval of the Department of Environmental Protection. Contractor shall provide equipment as necessary to secure approval of the seedbed. Revegetation activities shall be carried out in a continuous, concurrent, timely and uniform manner. Failure to do this may result in nonpayment for portions of or the entire Revegetation item. Hydroseeding or broadcast seeding with the approved species is acceptable. The application rate may be increased but the ratio is to remain constant, but no additional monetary compensation will be awarded. Areas outside the limits of construction, disturbed by the contractor, shall be revegetated by the contractor at no expense to DEP. Water utilized for hydroseeding shall be free of injurious or other toxic substances harmful to plant life. The source of water is subject to the approval of the DEP Specialist. It shall be the vendor's responsibility to repeat the procedures under REVEGETATION until a permanent vegetation is established. The acreage quantities in this contract are for bidding purposes only. It shall be the contractor's responsibility to verify acreage for bidding purposes. The contractor shall not exceed the contract amount of 60 acres. If any additional amount is required, the contractor must have written approval from the DEP, prior to any additional work being completed.

A warranty period of one (1) year shall commence upon completion and payment of the revegetation item of the contract. No payment will be made for additional seeding necessary to comply with warranty requirements. The warranty period will be extended for one (1) year from the date of the last augmented seeding done by the contractor. The performance bond and labor and materials bond shall remain in effect throughout the warranty period. The Standards for Evaluating Vegetative Cover as presented in Title 38, CSR2, Section 9 of the West Virginia Surface Mining Reclamation Regulations will apply.

Equipment for the retracking/scarification to eliminate rills and gullies shall be mobilized and utilized to produce slopes consistent with the regrading and topsoiling bid item prior to warranty reseeding. No additional payment will be made by DEP for this warranty work.

9.1 AGRICULTURAL LIME

Unless otherwise specified, all lime used shall be registered with the West Virginia Department of Agriculture, have an 85% minimum calcium carbonate equivalent, and meet the fineness classification no larger than that for ground lime. The following fineness classifications or combinations of lime are acceptable:

Pulverized - 100% passing a U.S. Standard 20 mesh sieve

70% passing a U.S. Standard 100 mesh sieve

Ground - 90% passing a U.S. Standard 20 mesh sieve

- 50% passing a U.S. Standard 60 mesh sieve

- 35% passing a U.S. Standard 100 mesh sieve

Use of blends and low-grade agricultural liming materials shall require prior approval. Lime shall be spread as soon as possible after delivery to site. Lime shall be applied evenly and uniformly distributed over the treated area. Lime shall be thoroughly mixed into the soil material. Lime subjected to adverse conditions before spreading will be deemed unacceptable. Failure to complete this phase shall result in nonpayment of this bid item.

Lime shall be applied at 5 ton/acre.

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9.2 FERTILIZER

Fertilizer rates given for REVEGETATION are for 300 lbs. of 10-20-20 per acre. These rates are minimum and for bidding purposes.

Fertilizer shall be applied evenly and uniformly distributed over the treated area. Common complete fertilizers which meet the minimum standards are acceptable.

9.3 MULCH

Acceptable mulch for this project is wood fiber, hay, or straw.

Mulch: Wood Fiber @ 1.0 ton/Acre

Hay or straw mulch may be substituted at a rate of 2 tons/Acre

9.4 <u>VEGETATIVE SPECIES</u>

Seeding rate required is for pure live seed (pls) in pounds per acre. The use of annuals or cover crops will not be considered for vegetative success.

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10.0 EXISTING SEDIMENT CONTROL STRUCTURE

An existing sediment pond shall be cleaned out and resized. At this time the pond is approximately 150 feet by 126 feet. The reduced size shall be 150 feet by 75 feet. Depth of the pond shall be eight (8) feet with two (2) feet of freeboard. Such structures shall be cleaned out when the sediment capacity reaches 60%, repaired, and maintained until demobilization. This item will be a one-time payment. Clean-out and maintenance shall be conducted by the contractor at no expense to DEP.

11.0 SEDIMENT CONTROL WITH SILT FENCE AND HAYBALE DIKE

Disturbed areas which have storm water runoff and does not pass through a sediment control structure shall utilize the following Best Management Practice (BMP) methods to manage storm water runoff. For more information on BMP methods go to the WVDEP website http://www.wvdep.org/dwwm/stormwater/BMP.htm and click on BMP Manual. The WV Erosion and Sediment Control Best Management Practice Manual may be accessed or printed. This item has a Maximum Bid of \$5.00/LF of silt fence and hay bale material used on site.

- 1. Silt fence shall be utilized on perimeter barriers and shall be properly removed after permanent vegetation has been established. See attached drawing for further details.
- 2. For slope stability, place bales on the contour; at the top of cuts; and at the toe of slopes. Bales shall be placed in a row with ends tightly abutting the adjacent bales.
- 3. Bales shall be securely anchored in place by stakes or rebars driven through the bales. Rebar to be removed at the direction of DEP. The first stake in each bale shall be driven toward previously laid bale to force the bales together.
- 4. Construction of sediment control sumps before culvert inlets and/or rock check dams in ditch lines may become necessary to supplement the silt fence and hay bale dikes. These items shall be installed upon request of the DEP onsite representative. Sumps and rock check dams shall be incidental to this bid item.

12.0 RIPRAP DITCH

Provide all materials, excavate and construct ditch or channel as indicated on the attached typical plans, cross-section, specifications, and as discussed at the Pre-Bid Showing. Channels and ditches shall be free draining upon completion of construction. Length of ditch may be adjusted to meet on site conditions. (See riprap specifications) R-5 limestone riprap shall be used at a thickness of 1 ½ feet. The top width of the ditch shall be four (4) feet. Payment shall be for the linear feet of ditch installed.

13.0 TRAPEZOIDAL DITCH

Provide all materials, excavate and construct six-foot trapezoidal ditches as indicated on the attached typical plans, cross-section, specifications, and as discussed at the Pre-Bid Showing. Channels shall be free draining upon completion of construction. Length of channel may be adjusted to meet on site conditions. (See riprap specifications) R-5 limestone riprap shall be used at a thickness of 1 ½ feet. The top width of the ditch shall be ten (10) feet. Payment shall be for the linear feet of ditch installed.

14.0 HDPE CULVERT 36 INCH DIAMETER

The culvert shall be HDPE, dual wall smooth interior corrugated twenty (20) foot joint type. The pipe joints shall be silt-tight and the pipe shall meet ASTM D3350 manufacturing standards. The culvert locations shall be determined by the onsite DEP representative.

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STANDARD INSTALLATION

Culverts installed in access roads shall cross the road at a 30 degree angle downgrade with a minimum grade of three percent (3%) from inlet to outlet, except in streams or diversion ditches where the pipe shall be installed straight and coincide with the normal direction of flow.

The culvert inlet and outlet ends shall be protected by a headwall of stable non-erodible material and the slope at the outlet shall be protected with an apron of rock riprap, energy dissipater or other designated material. The culvert shall be installed in a trench excavated in solid undisturbed ground or formed by compacted earth.

The culvert shall be imbedded in a formed trench to a depth no less than 1/10 the outside diameter of the pipe. Selected backfill material shall be placed around the culvert in four (4) inch layers and thoroughly compacted by means of hand tamping or manually directed power tampers or plate vibrators.

The culvert shall be covered with a minimum of eighteen (18) inches of material. Payment shall be for length of culvert installed.

19.0 HDPE CULVERT 24 INCH DIAMETER

The culvert shall be HDPE, dual wall smooth interior corrugated twenty (20) foot joint type. The pipe joints shall be silt-tight and the pipe shall meet ASTM D3350 manufacturing standards. The culvert locations shall be determined by the onsite DEP representative.

STANDARD INSTALLATION

Culverts installed in access roads shall cross the road at a 30 degree angle downgrade with a minimum grade of three percent (3%) from inlet to outlet, except in streams or diversion ditches where the pipe shall be installed straight and coincide with the normal direction of flow.

The culvert inlet and outlet ends shall be protected by a headwall of stable non-erodible material and the slope at the outlet shall be protected with an apron of rock riprap, energy dissipater or other designated material. The culvert shall be installed in a trench excavated in solid undisturbed ground or formed by compacted earth.

The culvert shall be covered with a minimum of twelve (12) inches of material. Payment shall be for length of culvert installed.

20.0 STRUCTURE AND/OR DEBRIS REMOVAL

All existing man-made items particular to the site and not to be utilized in the total reclamation of this site shall be demolished (if necessary) and disposed of in a legal manner. All iron, steel, aluminum, or any other metal, plastic, or any other man made material, including but not limited to I-Beams, Angle Iron, Channel Iron, Corrugated Metal, Flat Metal, Floc Drums, Grease Drums, Pipe or Conduit is to be dismantled, removed and properly disposed of off site and according to state, local, and federal requirements. These structures are identified as:

All transformers, rectifiers, and other electrical structures, which may or may not contain toxic materials, shall be removed.

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BID PREPARATION INFORMATION

HISTORICAL INFORMATION

Prospective bidders may review files at the West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection, Charleston, WV office, or the Regional West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection Office at 105 South Railroad St., Philippi, WV 26416. These files may contain additional information <u>not</u> included in the contract. Documents including, but not limited to, permit applications, permits, inspection reports, environmental documents, permit violation history, geological and geotechnical information, probable hydrologic consequences, maps, modifications, NPDES information and other related data. Copies may be obtained upon request and payment of copying fees.

EXAMINATION OF BID PACKAGE AND SITE OF WORK

The bidder is required to examine, carefully, the bid package (plans, specifications, supplemental specifications, contract forms, etc.) and the site of the work contemplated. The submission of a bid shall be considered prima facie evidence that the bidder has made such examination and has judged for and satisfied themselves as to the character, quantity, and quality of work to be performed and the materials required to be furnished under the contract.

PREBID CONFERENCE

Only the prospective bidders on the sign-in sheet in attendance for the <u>entire Pre-Bid Conference</u> will be eligible to submit bids for consideration of this project. Considerable foot travel over rough terrain and/or inclement weather may be required.

VIDEO

The information given at the pre-bid showing by the project contact person or the assigned person shall be documented on video tape and shall be an integral part of this contract's requirements, but will not supersede the written contract. All information on video tape that is new or provides clarification to the specifications, will be issued in writing by a formal addendum and will become part of the written contract.

INTENT OF CONTRACT

The intent of the contract is for the reclamation/restoration of forfeited mine lands as required by West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection. The contractor is to provide for the construction and completion in every detail of the work described. The Contractor shall furnish all labor, materials, equipment, tools, transportation, and supplies required to complete the work in accordance with the Plans, Specifications, and terms of the Contract.

Should any misunderstanding arise as to the intent or meaning of the Contract, or any discrepancy appear, the decision of the Director of Division of Land Restoration shall be final.

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GENERAL PERFORMANCE STANDARDS

INTRODUCTION

The performance standards and non-compliance penalties which govern special reclamation-bond forfeiture projects are in Chapter 22A, Article 3, of the Code of West Virginia and subsequent rules and regulations. The following performance standards are of a general nature and do not represent all the performance standards applicable to a special reclamation-bond forfeiture project. However, some or all of these standards will pertain to each project.

BACKFILLING

- 1. Unless otherwise noted, the highwall shall be eliminated and the disturbed area graded to the approximate original contour.
- 2. The material used to backfill and eliminate the highwall shall be sufficiently compacted so as to insure stability of the backfill throughout the warranty period.
- 3. The land above the highwall shall not be disturbed unless otherwise directed.
- 4. The best available material to support vegetation, sufficient to establish a permanent vegetative cover and to achieve the approved post mining land use, shall be used.

LIFE OF CONTRACT

The purchase order contract becomes effective on the starting date as specified in the notice to proceed as issued by the Department of Environmental Protection. This contract extends for a period of one (1) year and may be renewed until such "reasonable time" thereafter as is necessary to complete the payment therefore. A responsible Contractor's Agent shall be on the site at all working times who demonstrates a knowledge of mined land reclamation, contract requirements and responds to DEP (owner) inspections.

WORK PERFORMANCE PERIOD

The work performance period is a defined portion of the contract in which all items shall be completed. The work performance period is to be performed within 365 calendar days. Extensions may be granted based upon contractor's performance, weather conditions and site-specific site conditions.

NOTICE TO PROCEED

A notice to proceed shall be issued to the Contractor by the project contact person for the Department of Environmental Protection. Actual construction may only begin after a Notice to Proceed is given and as specified. Such notice shall specify the starting date of the Purchase Order, the work performance period, and the completion date of the work performance period.

PRE-CONSTRUCTION CONFERENCE

The Contractor in possession of the awarded purchase order shall schedule a Pre-Construction Conference on the site within ten (10) days after receiving the Notice To Proceed. The Contractor's foreman or the on-the-ground supervisor must be in attendance.

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GENERAL SUPERVISION - This contact is under the general supervision of the West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection's contact person for the purpose of contract compliance inspection only. Contractor shall supervise work being conducted at all times. All services rendered by the Engineer/Contact Person consist of professional opinions and recommendations made in accordance with generally accepted engineering practice. Under no circumstances is it the intent of the Engineer/Contact Person to directly control the physical activities of the Contractor or the Contractor's workmen's accomplishment of work on this project.

CONTRACTOR RESPONSIBILITY

The contractor is responsible for compliance with all aspects of this written contract. No changes will be honored without prior approval from the Program Supervisor.

LAWS TO BE OBSERVED

The Contractor shall keep fully informed of all Federal and State laws, all local laws, ordinances, and regulations and all orders and decrees of bodies or tribunals having any jurisdiction or authority, which in any manner affect those engaged or employed on the work, or which in any way affect the conduct of the work. The Contractor shall at all times observe and comply with all such laws, ordinances, regulations, orders and decrees; and shall protect and indemnify the State and its representatives against any claim or liability arising from or based on the violation of any such laws, ordinances, regulations, orders, or decrees, whether by themselves, their subcontractors or their employees.

PERMITS, LICENSES AND TAXES

The Contractor shall procure all permits and licenses, pay all charges, fees, and taxes, and give all notices necessary and incidental to the due and lawful prosecution of the work.

CONCURRENT RECLAMATION

Reclamation of this project shall commence at a definite point as defined and shall progress from that point with total reclamation to include backfilling, grading/regrading, and revegetation. Changes may be granted based upon weather or differing site conditions with prior approval.

WATER QUALITY CONTROL

Shall commence with initial start-up of the project and remain in effect for the extent of the backfilling, regrading and revegetation activity. DEP obtains a storm water permit for each project from the Water Resources Division. (General Water Pollution Control Permit WVO115924) The Contractor is responsible for performing the best management practices. Adequate facilities shall be installed, operated and maintained using the best management practices of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's Non-Point Source (NPS) Program for sediment control during the active reclamation. The contractor shall take any and all steps necessary to prevent erosion or silting problems from occurring and to minimize pollution or sedimentation of the stream. If any such problems develop, the contractor shall be responsible to take immediate corrective action. No separate payment for this work will be honored. All impounded waters which require removal during reclamation, shall be pumped with appropriate measures taken to prevent erosion from the discharge. The contractor shall be responsible for treatment of said waters to meet pH standards. The water shall be discharged only when the quality meets a pH equivalent to the pH of the receiving stream but not less than 6.0.

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DIFFERING SITE CONDITIONS

During the progress of the work, if subsurface or latent physical conditions are encountered at the site differing materially from those indicated in the contract or if unknown physical conditions of an unusual nature, differing materially from those ordinarily encountered and generally recognized as inherent in the work provided by the contract, are encountered at the site, the party discovering such conditions shall promptly notify the other party in writing of the specific differing conditions before they are disturbed and before the affected work is performed.

Upon written notification, the Engineer/Contact Person will investigate the conditions, and if determined that the conditions materially differ and cause an increase or decrease in the cost or time required for the performance of any work under the contract, an adjustment, excluding loss of anticipated profits, will be made and the contract modified in writing accordingly. The Engineer/Contact Person will notify the Contractor of DEP's determination whether or not an adjustment of the contract is warranted.

No contract adjustment which results in a benefit to the Contractor will be allowed unless the Contractor has provided the required written notice.

No contract adjustment will be allowed under this clause for any effects caused on unchanged work.

HANDLING AND STORAGE OF MATERIALS

Materials which are stored on site, before utilization, shall be stored so as to assure the preservation of their quality and fitness for the work. Stored materials, even though approved before storage, may be inspected again prior to their use in the work. Damaged or deteriorated materials shall be removed and replaced by materials meeting the original specifications.

Aggregate stockpiles shall be made on ground that is denuded of vegetation, hard, and well drained. Removal of aggregate from the stockpile shall be done in a manner which will not result in the inclusion of foreign material into the aggregate. The use of the aggregate will determine if exceptions are permitted.

All materials shall be handled in such a manner as to preserve their quality and fitness for the work.

MAINTENANCE DURING CONSTRUCTION

The contractor shall maintain the work during construction and until the project is accepted. All cost of maintenance work during construction and before the project is accepted shall be included in the unit or lump sum prices on the various pay items.

FINAL INSPECTION

A final inspection meeting by the Department of Environmental Protection's Specialist and the contractor is required for the construction phase and prior to demobilization.

ACREAGE QUANTITIES

The acreage quantities in this contract are for bidding purpose and are set (definite) number for the project area as specified at the pre-bid showing. Only surveyed acreage's through figures the Contractor and/or the State develops will be honored to alter these acreage numbers.

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PAYMENT

Invoices must be submitted on prescribed Department of Environmental Protection, Special Reclamation Program forms and include <u>verification</u>. <u>Certified contractor payrolls</u> for operators directly involved in this project and a current <u>workers compensation certificate</u> must accompany each invoice for payment. Verification of wage rates may include employee interviews. Invoices shall be signed in <u>blue ink</u> so that it is easy to verify that document is an original.

MOBILIZATION/DEMOBILIZATION shall be invoiced at fifty percent (50%) with the first invoice and the last 50% invoiced after demobilization and acceptance of the road abandonment or final invoice. Demobilization must have written approval.

SPILL CONTAINMENT AREA shall not exceed \$1,000.00 and will be payable in two payments. The first fifty percent (50%) payable with the first invoice and the remainder payable when all fuel tanks, containers and etc., are removed from the site.

Lump sum items shall be percentage payments based on work completed at time of invoice and paid upon acceptance by the Department of Environmental Protection.

Unit items shall be invoiced by specified units completed and accepted by the DEP.

REVEGETATION AND WARRANTY

The seeding date shall be at the discretion of the contractor once an approved seedbed has been prepared. In all cases a permanent vegetative cover capable of supporting the post-mining land use must be established. A warranty period of one (1) year shall commence upon completion and payment of the revegetation item of the contract. No payment will be made for additional seeding necessary to comply with warranty requirements. The warranty period will be extended for one (1) year from the date of the last augmented seeding done by the contractor. The performance bond and labor and materials bond shall remain in effect throughout the warranty period. The Standards for Evaluating Vegetative Cover as presented in Title 38, CSR2, Section 9 of the West Virginia Surface Mining Reclamation Regulations will apply.

Equipment for the retracking/scarification to eliminate rills and gullies shall be mobilized and utilized to produce slopes consistent with the regrading and topsoiling bid item prior to warranty reseeding. No additional payment will be made by DEP for this warranty work.

Water utilized for hydroseeding shall be free of injurious or other toxic substances harmful to plant life. The source of water is subject to the approval of the DEP contact person.
