#### INTRODUCTION

Thrasher Engineering, Inc. (THRASHER) is pleased to present our proposal to provide oversight and quality assurance/quality control services on an as-needed basis for WV Department of Environmental Protection's (WVDEP) proposed underground storage tank (UST) removal and leaking underground storage tank (LUST) assessment activities throughout the State of West Virginia.

THRASHER'S team of environmental professionals is experienced, qualified, and excited to serve the WV DEP on this important project. This proposal presents our understanding of the project specifications, our qualifications, and fees.

#### PROJECT BACKGROUND

The WVDEP is responsible for the oversight of corrective actions taken at Leaking Underground Storage Tank (LUST) facilities throughout West Virginia. When no owner or operator of LUST sites can be found or if the owner/operator is not willing or able to take action, the DEP can use EPA funds to take action in order to protect human health and the environment. Sites that pose the greatest threat will be addressed to protect the citizens of West Virginia from the potential environmental harm caused by leaking underground storage tanks.

This proposal is for the performance of oversight and QA/QC activities related to work performed under the removal contract.

#### SCOPE OF WORK

THRASHER has thoroughly read the *Request for Quotation (RFQ)* provided by the WVDEP and has a full and complete understanding of the requested Scope of Work and is excited to be considered for the project.

THRASHER understands that the consultant selected for this project shall assist the WVDEP in Oversight and QA/QC Services during the removal of underground storage tanks. Specifically, the consultant will be required to complete the following tasks:

- 1. Observe UST removal activities performed by on-site contractors which include or may not be limited to:
  - Removal and proper disposal of petroleum contaminated water, rinsate and/or product;
  - Transportation of petroleum contaminated water, rinsate and/or product to a disposal facility;
  - Purging vapors from the UST's to <10% LEL;</li>
  - Excavation and extraction of UST/piping from the ground;
  - Cutting openings and cleaning sludges from the UST;
  - Disposing/scrap cleaned UST's, disposal of tank cleaning sludges;
  - Proper stockpiling and confinement of petroleum contaminated soils;
  - Properly disposing of non-hazardous materials;
  - Backfilling of excavations.
- 2. Observe the collection and proper preservation of soil and water samples from the UST pit.
- 3. Observe direct push activities and other assessment activities conducted by onsite contractor.
- 4. Observe all other activities by the on-site contractor according to their assigned work directives.
- 5. Keep record of daily field activities which include but not limited to: field notes, site sketches, digital pictures, record of quantities used, and time sheets.
- 6. Confirm by using a DEP provided sworn statement form that all work was performed and the job completed according to specifications and time frames as stated in the contractor's assigned work directive.
- 7. Complete and submit a DEP provided on-site contractor evaluation form.

#### REQUIREMENTS:

THRASHER shall furnish all necessary and appropriate personnel, materials, and services needed for, or incidental to, overseeing the UST removals and assessments. All field personnel will have the 40-hour health and safety training certification in accordance with OSHA 29 CFR 1910.120 requirements



#### **II. Brownfields Assessments**

THRASHER is currently conducting Phase I and II Environmental Site Assessments under a City-Wide Brownfields Petroleum Assessment Grant for the City of Charleston, WV. Prior to initiation of the assessments, THRASHER worked with city officials and public stakeholders to develop a comprehensive list of potential assessment sites and developed a GIS mapping system for potential properties. THRASHER is currently undertaking assessment of available properties and assisting with the development of reuse and redevelopment plans for these sites. Most notably, THRASHER is nearly complete with the assessment and remedial planning of innovative city park located on the city's historic East End.

THRASHER is currently performing project management and technical oversight of the clean-up and remedial planning of a former glass plant site in the City of Clarksburg. THRASHER has successfully managed the demolition of former plant structures and is negotiating with WV DEP and the EPA to develop final clean-up criteria for the remainder of the site.



This site has presented numerous challenges due to its long environmental history and a large volume of previous assessment data. Completion of the site has been complicated by multiple regulatory considerations. THRASHER is currently working with the Northern Brownfields Assistance Center, the US EPA, WVDEP, and the City of Clarksburg to seek additional funding for further clean-up measures required by regulations.

#### III. Remediation Management/Oversight

#### Artel Superfund Site - Remedial Design, Construction and Operation

Remedial design, construction and operation of a gas/liquid transfer system to remove, transport and incinerate more than 30 tons of a highly toxic, flammable, process waste mixture from an EPA Superfund site in West Virginia. Project activities included the preparation of a work plan, health and safety plan, detailed engineering plans and specifications, operating procedures, operator training, equipment procurement, construction management and operation oversight. This project was awarded the 1991 Grand Prize for Design Engineering Excellence by the American Academy of Environmental Engineers.

#### **Rubber Chemical Manufacturer - Lagoon Closure**

Closure of two major industrial wastewater lagoons at a rubber chemical manufacturing plant in West Virginia. Project activities included sludge sampling, bench-scale testing of solidification agents, and construction management, including quality assurance testing. The solidified sludges were determined to be non-hazardous and a major odor source was eliminated.

#### Orphan Disposal Sites - Remedial Design/Construction

Capping in place of low-level dioxin wastes at several orphan disposal sites for a PRP chemical company in West Virginia. The facility has a state issued hazardous waste post closure permit, an EPA Region III RCRA consent order requiring a RCRA Facility Investigation and Corrective Measures. Services provided include:

- Review and interpretation of groundwater data generated during sampling activities conducted under the state hazardous waste post closure permit
- Preparation of reports and data submittal activities required by the post closure permit
- Negotiations with the agency to ensure effective implementation and continued compliance; Negotiations have included complex technical issues revolving around the presence of Dense Non-aqueous Phase Liquids (DNAPLs) contaminating the alluvial aguifer beneath the facility
- Complex regulatory jurisdiction negotiations have also been conducted where EPA Region III, the state hazardous waste agency and state water pollution agency have all asserted jurisdiction

Provided wetlands delineation and project support related to mitigation to a major new manufacturing facility located in south central West Virginia. As part of this project, the following was provided:
