GENERAL TERMS & CONDITIONS REQUEST FOR QUOTATION (RFQ) AND REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL (RFP)

- 1. Awards will be made in the best interest of the State of West Virginia.
- 2. The State may accept or reject in part, or in whole, any bid.
- 3. All quotations are governed by the West Virginia Code and the Legislative Rules of the Purchasing Division.
- 4. Prior to any award, the apparent successful vendor must be properly registered with the Purchasing Division and have paid the required \$125 fee.
- 5. All services performed or goods delivered under State Purchase Order/Contracts are to be continued for the term of the Purchase Order/Contracts, contingent upon funds being appropriated by the Legislature or otherwise being made available. In the event funds are not appropriated or otherwise available for these services or goods, this Purchase Order/Contract becomes void and of no effect after June 30.
- 6. Payment may only be made after the delivery and acceptance of goods or services.
- 7. Interest may be paid for late payment in accordance with the West Virginia Code.
- 8. Vendor preference will be granted upon written request in accordance with the West Virginia Code.
- 9. The State of West Virginia is exempt from federal and state taxes and will not pay or reimburse such taxes.
- 10. The Director of Purchasing may cancel any Purchase Order/Contract upon 30 days written notice to the seller.
- 11. The laws of the State of West Virginia and the *Legislative Rules* of the Purchasing Division shall govern all rights and duties under the Contract, including without limitation the validity of this Purchase Order/Contract.
- 12. Any reference to automatic renewal is hereby deleted. The Contract may be renewed only upon mutual written agreement of the parties.
- 13. BANKRUPTCY: In the event the vendor/contractor files for bankruptcy protection, the State may deem this contract null and void, and terminate such contract without further order.
- 14. HIPAA BUSINESS ASSOCIATE ADDENDUM: The West Virginia State Government HIPAA Business Associate Addendum (BAA), approved by the Attorney General, and available online at the Purchasing Division's web site (http://www.state.wv.us/admin/purchase/vrc/hipaa.htm) is hereby made part of the agreement. Provided that, the Agency meets the definition of a Cover Entity (45 CFR §160.103) and will be disclosing Protected Health Information (45 CFR §160.103) to the vendor.
- 15. WEST VIRGINIA ALCOHOL & DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE ACT: If this Contract constitutes a public improvement construction contract as set forth in Article 1D, Chapter 21 of the West Virginia Code ("The West Virginia Alcohol and Drug-Free Workplace Act"), then the following language shall hereby become part of this Contract: "The contractor and its subcontractors shall implement and maintain a written drug-free workplace policy in compliance with the West Virginia Alcohol and Drug-Free Workplace Act, as set forth in Article 1D, Chapter 21 of the West Virginia Code. It is understood and agreed that this Contract shall be cancelled by the awarding authority if the Contractor: 1) Fails to implement its drug-free workplace policy; 2) Fails to provide information regarding implementation of the contractor's drug-free workplace policy at the request of the public authority; or 3) Provides to the public authority false information regarding the contractor's drug-free workplace policy."

1. Definitions:

"Owner" as used herein shall be defined as the West Virginia Department of Transportation, Division of Highways.

"Contractor" as used herein shall be defined as the successful vendor with whom the "Owner contracts for service and maintenance.

"Services" as used herein shall be defined as, and shall include services performed, workmanship, and material furnished or used in performing services.

This contract will apply to the bridge(s) listed below. Other bridges having navigation or aerial lighting may be placed in service during the period of this contract and if mutually agreeable by owner and contractor, this contract may be extended to cover these bridges.

2. General Conditions:

The Contractor shall provide for all taxes, permits, fees, insurance, liability, compensations, and any other items necessary to render owner free and harmless from all claims arising from services performed under such contract.

3. <u>Emergency Telephone Service:</u>

4. Extent of Work:

The Contractor shall provide regular and systematic examinations, repair and preventative maintenance service (on an annual basis) at which time he shall take necessary actions to restore the lights to satisfactory service and by using preventative maintenance methods, furnish and install parts prior to their breakdown point, where possible.

The preventative maintenance program and emergency service shall include (but is not limited to):

- A. Replacement of all burned out bulbs and tubes and cleaning of lenses.
- B. Replacement of all burned out and/or defective primary and secondary wiring, and conduit.
- C. <u>Immediate service</u> upon notification by the US Coast Guard or WV Division of Highways.
- D. Materials and labor for up-grading and repairing the navigation signals and facilities due to obsolescence, deterioration, and vandalism as directed by the District Engineer.
- E. Keep the navigation lights in first-class condition at all times.

5. Control of Work

The Contractor shall notify the District Bridge Engineer 24 hours in advance of any preventative maintenance service to be performed under this contract.

The Contractor will submit an annual plan and schedule of proposed preventative maintenance inspections for approval of the District Engineer or his representative.

Upon award of this contract, the Contractor shall meet with each responsible District Bridge Engineer to develop an operation plan for each structure. Areas of responsibility are as follows:

District One Bridge Engineer (304-558-3344) – Fayette, Kanawha Mason & Putnam

District Two Bridge Engineer (304-528-5655) - Cabell & Wayne

District Three Bridge Engineer (304-420-4674) - Jackson, Pleasants, & Wood

District Four Bridge Engineer (304-842-1512) – Marion & Monongalia

District Six Bridge Engineer (304-843-4032) – Brooke, Hancock, Ohio, Marshall, Wetzel & Tyler

6. Repair

Maintaining the river navigation lighting systems shall consist of the following:

- A. Replacement of navigation light units when required on a unit by unit basis as deemed necessary by the District Engineer.
- B. Replacement of all expired bulbs and cracked, broken, or discolored navigation light lenses. Lenses will be cleaned when expired bulbs are replaced.
- C. Necessary replacement or repair of all supportive electrical apparatus (this implies all such items as control station enclosure and all items therein, conduit and all required hardware, junction boxes, conductors and photo cells) within the entire control and distribution portions of the navigation lighting system, due to normal wear, accidents, vandalism, or acts of nature.
- D. Upon confirmed notification of an emergency outage by the District Engineer or his representative, the contractor will start work immediately and continue 24 hours per day until the repair is complete.
- E. Access to the lighting components is generally from the bridge structure. In cases where specialized equipment (aerial lift, small crane, backhoe, etc.) are required to maintain or install the lighting system, rental cost shall be the price bid in the Bid Schedule under All Districts, Item Q.
- F. The Contractor shall at all times keep the work area free from accumulations of waste or used materials. Before the services are considered complete, the Contractor shall remove from the work area and premises any rubbish, tools, scaffolding, equipment, and materials that are not the property of the owner. Upon completing the work, the Contractor shall leave the work area in a clean, neat, and orderly condition satisfactory to the owner.

7. Subcontracts

The Contractor shall obtain the Owner's written consent before authorizing any of the services provided for in this contract to be performed by a subcontractor. Failure to obtain prior approval of subcontract services may result in termination of the contract and/or non-payment for unapproved services.

Governing Statements:

- A. All work shall be done in a neat and workman-like manner, resulting in a completely operational system in accordance with all applicable specifications of this contract, including:
 - 1) National Electrical Code
 - 2) US Coast Guard Bulletin CC-208
 - 3) Regulations of service electrical utility company
 - 4) Information available to the Contractor from the District Bridge Department which may include plans and specifications pertaining to the navigation lighting systems, condition reports and other general information.
- B. Generally, the quality of new equipment and material shall be understood to be replaced "inkind" as a minimum standard. However, in the case of old outdated items, the District Engineer shall be consulted and appropriate inspections made prior to any such work being done.
- C. All vehicular traffic control, required to perform the necessary maintenance work safely, shall be done in accordance with the West Virginia Division of Highways manual for Traffic Control for Street and Highway Construction and Maintenance Operations dated November, 1994.

Cost for signs, traffic cones, and other incidental traffic control items shall be included in the price bid for Items D through N in the Bid Schedule under All Districts.

The cost for any specialized equipment (message boards, arrow boards, impact attenuator truck, etc.) for traffic control shall be bid in the Bid Schedule under All Districts, Item P.

D. Operative Concept: When a confirmed "outage" is reported, the Contractor is advised to perform all tests when making his inspection and report findings to the District Engineer along with a firm cost estimate, prior to performing any work. Prior estimates

may be waived for certain emergency situations as deemed appropriate by the District Engineer.

9. Wage Rates

All wage rates paid by vendor under this contract must be in compliance with, The West Virginia Department of Labor Prevailing Rate, Chapter 21-5A. Series 15, at time of bid opening.

10. Labor

Contractor shall maintain a time log for each employee participating in the work. This log shall include time of departure from base of operations, travel time to job site, arrival time at job site, travel time to subsequent job site(s), arrival time at subsequent job site(s), travel time to base of operations, and arrival time at base of operations. Also, any meal and/or lodging period(s) should be documented.

Contractor shall be paid at the regular hourly rate for all travel and work time, except that the overtime Hourly Rate may be paid between the hours of 5:00 pm and 7:00 am on weekdays and on Saturday, Sunday and holidays.

11. Travel Mileage

The most direct suitable route from the contractor's base of operations to the job site, from job site to job site (when applicable) and return to base of operations will be determined by the District Engineer and used to compute travel mileage.

12. Emergency Call Out Service

In the event of equipment failure, the Contractor shall immediately dispatch at least one qualified licensed electrician to the bridge location. After notice by "Owner" the contractor shall proceed at once, and continue without stopping, to make necessary repairs to place the equipment in safe and first class operating condition. Contractor must have adequate personnel in the immediate area to provide this service twenty-four (24) hours per day, three hundred sixty-five (365) days per year.

13. Owner's Right to Inspection of Services

The Owner has the right to inspect and test all services called for by the contract, to the extent practicable, at all times and places during the term of the contract. The owner shall perform inspections and tests in a manner that will not unduly delay the work. If any of the services do not

conform to contract requirements the Owner may require the Contractor to perform the services again in conformity with contract requirements, at no cost to the Owner. When the defects in services cannot be corrected by performing the work again, the Owner may: (1) require the Contractor to take necessary action to ensure that future performance conforms to contract requirements and, (2) reduce the contract pay amount to reflect the reduced value of the services performed. If the Contractor fails to promptly perform the services again, or to take the necessary action to ensure future performance in conformity with contract requirements, the Owner may: (1) by contract or otherwise, perform the services and charge to the Contractor any cost incurred by the Owner that is directly related to the performance of such services or, (2) terminate the contract for default.

14. Examination of Records

The Division of Highways or a duly authorized representative shall, until three (3) years after final payment under this contract, have access to and the right to examine any of the Contractor's directly pertinent books, documents, papers or other records involving transactions relating to this contract.

15. Contract Award

Contractor may submit bids for any and/or all counties on the bid schedule.

Any qualification of bid or any modification of the specifications or conditions governing the bids may be cause for rejection of bids.

The State of West Virginia reserves the right to make multiple awards on this contract when it is in the best interest of the State to do so.

Determination of award shall be made on a county by county basis using an estimate of thirty (30) regular rate manhours per bridge and travel mileage for two (2) visits to each bridge. Also, comparison of material pricing will be considered.

16. Invoice

Contractor's invoice for each bridge shall be submitted in original and one copy within thirty (30) days of performance of service and contain the following:

A. Total quantity and unit price with the total cost of each bid item performed. The date of service for each item must be shown on the invoice.

- B. Name(s) and hours charged for each person performing the work.
- C. This contract number.

17. Insurance

Successful vendor shall furnish proof of coverage of commercial general liability insurance prior to issuance of the contract. Unless otherwise specified in the bid documents, the minimum amount of insurance coverage is \$250,000.

18. Worker's Compensation

Compliance is required with all rules and regulations of the West Virginia Worker's Compensation Commission.
