Notification of Federal Participation

Federal funding for this project is being provided by the Federal Transit Administration through Section 5311 ARRA, CFDA 20509 for 100 % of the project cost and regular Section 5311, CFDA 25029 at 80% of the project cost.

No Federal Government Obligations to Third Parties

- (1) The WV Division of Public Transit and Vendor acknowledge and agree that, notwithstanding any concurrence by the Federal Government in or approval of the solicitation or award of the underlying contract, absent the express written consent by the Federal Government, the Federal Government is not a party to this contract and shall not be subject to any obligations or liabilities to the WV Division of Public Transit, Vendor, or any other party (whether or not a party to that contract) pertaining to any matter resulting from the underlying contract.
- (2) The Vendor agrees to include the above clause in each subcontract financed in whole or in part with Federal assistance provided by the Federal Transit Administration. It is further agreed that the clause shall not be modified, except to identify the subcontractor who will be subject to its provisions.

Program Fraud and False or Fraudulent Statements or Related Acts

- (1) The Vendor acknowledges that the provisions of the Program Fraud Civil Remedies Act of 1986, as amended, 31 U.S.C. §§3801 et seq. and U.S. DOT regulations, "Program Fraud Civil Remedies," 49 C.F.R. Part 31, apply to its actions pertaining to this Project. Upon execution of the underlying contract, the Vendor certifies or affirms the truthfulness and accuracy of any statement it has made, it makes, it may make, or causes to be made, pertaining to the underlying contract or the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) assisted project for which this contract work is being performed. In addition to other penalties that may be applicable, the Vendor further acknowledges that if it makes, or causes to be made, a false, fictitious, or fraudulent claim, statement, submission, or certification, the Federal Government reserves the right to impose the penalties of the Program Fraud Civil Remedies Act of 1986 on the Vendor to the extent the Federal Government deems appropriate.
- (2) The Vendor also acknowledges that if it makes, or causes to be made, a false, fictitious, or fraudulent claim, statement, submission, or certification to the Federal Government under a contract connected with a project that is financed in whole or in part with Federal assistance originally awarded by FTA under the authority of 49 U.S.C. § 5307, the Government reserves the right to impose the penalties of 18 U.S.C. § 1001 and 49 U.S.C. § 5307(n)(1) on the Vendor, to the extent the Federal Government deems appropriate.
- (3) The Vendor agrees to include the above two clauses in each subcontract financed in whole or in part with Federal assistance provided by FTA. It is further agreed that the clauses shall not be modified, except to identify the subcontractor who will be subject to the provisions.

Exclusionary or Discriminatory Specifications

The Vendor agrees that it will comply with the requirements of 49 U.S.C. § 5325(h) by refraining from using any Federal assistance awarded by the WV Division of Public Transit to support procurements using exclusionary or discriminatory specifications.

Geographic Restrictions

The Vendor agrees to refrain from using state or local geographic preferences, except those expressly mandated or encouraged by Federal statute, and as permitted by FTA.

Audit and Inspection

The Vendor agrees to permit the WV Division of Public Transit, the Secretary of the United States Department of Transportation and the Comptroller General of the United States, or their authorized representatives, to inspect all Contract work, materials, payrolls, and other data and records with regard to the Contract. The Vendor also agrees to permit an audit of the books, records, and accounts of the Vendor and its subcontractors.

Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE)

The Vendor shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, or sex in the performance of this Contract. The requirements of 49 C.F.R. Part 26 and the WV Department of Transportation's (WVDOT) U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) approved Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Program are incorporated in the Contract by reference. The Vendor agrees to take all necessary and reasonable steps under the requirements of 49 C.F.R. Part 26 and the USDOT approved Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Program (where required) to ensure that eligible DBEs have the maximum feasible opportunity to participate in USDOT approved Contracts. Failure by the Vendor to carry out these requirements is a material breach of the Contract, which may result in the termination of this Contract or such other remedy as the WV Division of Public Transit deems appropriate.

Civil Rights

The following requirements apply to the underlying contract:

(1) Nondiscrimination. In accordance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, 42 U.S.C.§§ 2000d, Section 303 of the Age Discrimination Act of 1974, as amended, 42 U.S.C.§ 6101 et seq., Section 202 of the Americans With Disabilities Act of 1990, 42 U.S.C.§ 12101 et seq., and Federal transit law at 49 U.S.C.§ 5332, the Vendor agrees that it will not discriminate against

any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, creed, national origin, sex, age, or disability. In addition, the Vendor agrees to comply with applicable Federal implementing regulations and other implementing requirements FTA may issue.

- (2) Equal Employment Opportunity. The following equal employment opportunity requirements apply to the underlying contract:
- (a) Race, Color, Creed, National Origin, Sex. In accordance with Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 2000e, and Federal transit laws at 49 U.S.C. § 5332, the Vendor agrees to comply with all applicable equal employment opportunity requirements of U.S. Department of Labor (U.S. DOL) regulations, "Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs, Equal Employment Opportunity, Department of Labor," 41 C.F.R. Parts 60 et seq., (which implement Executive Order No. 11246, "Equal Employment Opportunity," as amended by Executive Order No. 11375, "Amending Executive Order 11246 Relating to Equal Employment Opportunity," 42 U.S.C. § 2000e note), and with any applicable Federal statutes, executive orders, regulations, and Federal policies that may in the future affect construction activities undertaken in the course of the Project. The Vendor agrees to take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, color, creed, national origin, sex, disability or age. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. In addition, the Vendor agrees to comply with any implementing requirements FTA may issue.
- (b) Age. In accordance with the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended, 42 U.S.C. §§ 6101 et seq. and implementing regulations, the Vendor agrees to refrain from discrimination against present and prospective employees for reason of age. In addition, the Vendor agrees to comply with any implementing requirements FTA may issue.
- (c) <u>Disabilities</u>. In accordance with Section 102 of the Americans With Disabilities Act, as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 12112, the Vendor agrees that it will comply with the requirements of U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, "Regulations to Implement the Equal Employment Provisions of the Americans With Disabilities Act," 29 C.F.R. Part 1630, pertaining to employment of persons with disabilities. In addition, the Vendor agrees to comply with any implementing requirements FTA may issue.
- (3) The Vendor also agrees to include these requirements in each subcontract financed in whole or in part with Federal assistance provided by FTA, modified only if necessary to identify the affected parties.

Energy Conservation

The Vendor agrees to comply with, and obtain the compliance of its subcontractors, with mandatory standards and policies relating to energy efficiency contained in applicable state energy conservation plans issued in compliance with the Energy Policy and Conservation Act, 42 U.S.C. §§ 6321 et seq.

Clean Air & Clean Water Requirements

- (1) The Vendor agrees to comply with all applicable standards, orders or regulations issued pursuant to the Clean Air Act, as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 7414 and other applicable provisions of the Clean Air Act, as amended, 42 U.S.C. §§ 7401 et seg. and Section 508 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended, 33 U.S.C. § 1368, and other provisions of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended, 33 U.S.C. §§ 1251 et seg. The Vendor agrees to report each violation to the WV Division of Public Transit and understands and agrees that the WV Division of Public Transit will, in turn, report each violation as required to assure notification to FTA and the appropriate EPA Regional Office.
- (2) The Vendor also agrees to include these requirements in each subcontract exceeding \$100,000 financed in whole or in part with Federal assistance provided from FTA.

Application of Federal, State and Local Laws and Regulations

To achieve compliance with changing federal, state and local requirements, the Vendor shall note that federal, state and local requirements may change and the changed requirements will apply to this Contract as required.

Labor Provisions

The Vendor shall comply with Section 102 of the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act (40 U.S.C. §§ 3701 *et seq.*, esp. § 3702 & 3704) as supplemented by Department of Labor Regulations (29 CFR, § 5 & 29 CFR § 1926) as they involve the employment of mechanics and laborers.

Overtime Requirements. No Vendor or subcontractor for any part of the contract work which may require or involve the employment of laborers or mechanics shall require or permit any such laborer or mechanic in any workweek in which he or she is employed on such work to work in excess of forty hours in such workweek unless such laborer or mechanic receives compensation at a rate not less than one and one-half times the basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of forty hours in such workweek.

<u>Violation; Liability for Unpaid Wages; Liquidated Damages</u>. In the event of any violation of the clause set forth in paragraph (2) of this section, the Vendor and any subcontractor responsible therefore shall be liable for the unpaid wages. In addition, such Vendor and subcontractor shall be liable to the United States for liquidated damages. Such liquidated damages shall be computed with respect to each individual laborer or mechanic, including watchmen and guards, employed in violation of the clause set forth in paragraph (2) of this section, in the sum of \$10 for each calendar day on which such individual was required or permitted to work in excess of the standard workweek of forty hours without payment of the overtime wages required by the clause set forth in paragraph (2) of this section.

Withholding for Unpaid Wages and Liquidated Damages. The WV Division of Public Transit shall upon its own action or upon written request of an authorized representative of the Department of Labor withhold or cause to be withheld, from any moneys payable on account of work performed by the Vendor or subcontractor under any such contract or any other Federal contract with the same prime Vendor, or any other federally-assisted contract subject to the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act, which is held by the same prime Vendor, such sums as may be determined to be necessary to satisfy any liabilities of such Vendor or subcontractor for unpaid wages and liquidated damages as provided in the clause set forth in paragraph (3) of this section.

<u>Subcontracts</u>. The Vendor or subcontractor shall insert in any subcontracts the clauses set forth in this section and also a clause requiring the subcontractors to include these clauses in any lower tier subcontracts. The prime Vendor shall be responsible for compliance by any subcontractor or lower tier subcontractor with the clauses set forth in this section.

Payrolls and Basic Records. Payrolls and basic records relating thereto shall be maintained by the Vendor during the course of the work and preserved for a period of three years thereafter for all laborers and mechanics working at the site of the work (or under the United States Housing Act of 1937, or under the Housing Act of 1949, in the construction or development of the project). Such records shall contain the name, address, and social security number of each such worker, his or her correct classification, hourly rates of wages paid (including rates of contributions or costs anticipated for bona fide fringe benefits or cash equivalents thereof of the types described in Section 1(b)(2)(B) of the Davis-Bacon Act), daily and weekly number of hours worked, deductions made and actual wages paid. Whenever the Secretary of Labor has found under 29 CFR .5(a)(1)(iv) that the wages of any laborer or mechanic include the amount of any costs reasonably anticipated in providing benefits under a plan or program described in Section 1(b)(2)(B) of the Davis-Bacon Act, the Vendor shall maintain records which show that the commitment to provide such benefits is enforceable, that the plan or program is financially responsible, and that the plan or program has been communicated in writing to the laborers or mechanics affected, and records which show the costs anticipated or the actual cost incurred in providing such benefits.

Vendors employing apprentices or trainees under approved programs shall maintain written evidence of the registration of apprenticeship programs and certification of trainee programs, the registration of the apprentices and trainees, and the ratios and wage rates prescribed in the applicable programs.

Termination

(a) Termination for Convenience

The WV Division of Public Transit may terminate this contract, in whole or in part, at any time by written notice to the Vendor when it is in the Government's best interest. The Vendor shall be paid its costs, including contract close-out costs, and profit on work performed up to the time of termination. The Vendor shall promptly submit its termination claim to the WV Division of Public Transit to be paid to the Vendor. If the Vendor has any property in its possession belonging to the WV Division of Public Transit, the Vendor will account for the same, and dispose of it in the manner the WV Division of Public Transit directs.

(b) Termination for Default (Breach or Cause)

If the Vendor does not deliver supplies in accordance with the contract delivery schedule, or, if the contract is for services, the Vendor fails to perform in the manner called for in the contract, or if the Vendor fails to comply with any other provisions of the contract, the WV Division of Public Transit may terminate this contract for default. Termination shall be effected by serving a notice of termination on the contractor setting forth the manner in which the Vendor is in default. The Vendor will only be paid the contract price for supplies delivered and accepted, or services performed in accordance with the manner of performance set forth in the contract.

If it is later determined by the WV Division of Public Transit that the Vendor had an excusable reason for not performing, such as a strike, fire, or flood, events which are not the fault of or are beyond the control of the Vendor, the WV Division of Public Transit, after setting up a new delivery of performance schedule, may allow the Vendor to continue work, or treat the termination as a termination for convenience.

(c) Opportunity to Cure

The WV Division of Public Transit in its sole discretion may, in the case of a termination for breach or default, allow the Vendor an appropriately short period of time in which to cure the defect. In such case, the notice of termination will state the time period in which cure is permitted and other appropriate conditions.

If Vendor fails to remedy to the WV Division of Public Transit's satisfaction the breach or default or any of the terms, covenants, or conditions of this Contract within ten (10) days after receipt by Vendor or written notice from the WV Division of Public Transit setting forth the nature of said breach or default, the WV Division of Public Transit shall have the right to terminate the Contract without any further obligation to Vendor. Any such termination for default shall not in any way operate to preclude the WV Division of Public Transit from also pursuing all available remedies against Vendor and its sureties for said breach or default.

(d) Waiver of Remedies for Any Breach

In the event that the WV Division of Public Transit elects to waive its remedies for any breach by Vendor of any covenant, term or condition of this Contract, such waiver by the WV Division of Public Transit's remedies for any succeeding breach of that or of any other term, covenant, or condition of this Contract.

Bankruptcy

Upon entering of a judgment of bankruptcy or insolvency by or against a Vendor, the WV Division of Public Transit may terminate this Contract for cause.

FTA Role in Bid Protests

Under the Federal Transit Administration's Circular 4220.1F, the Federal Transit Administration's (FTA's) appeals process for reviewing protests of a recipient's procurement decisions are:

- 1. Requirements for the Protester. The protester must:
- a. <u>Qualify as an "Interested Party."</u> Only an "interested party" qualifies for FTA review of its appeal. An "interested party" is a party that is an actual or prospective bidder or offeror whose direct economic interest would be affected by the award or failure to award the contract at issue.
 - 1. <u>Subcontractors</u>. A subcontractor does not qualify as an "interested party" because it does not have a direct economic interest in the results of the procurement.
 - 2. <u>Consortia/Joint Ventures/Partemerships/Teams</u>. An established consortium, joint venture, partnership, or team that is an actual bidder or offeror and is acting in its entirety, would qualify as an "interested party" because it has a direct economic interest in the results of the procurement. An individual member of a consortium, joint venture, partnership, or team, acting solely in its individual capacity, does not qualify as an "interested party" because it does not have a direct economic interest in the results of the procurement.
 - 3. <u>Associations or Organizations</u>. An association or organization that does not perform contracts does not qualify as an "interested party," because it does not have a direct economic interest in the results of the procurement.
- b. <u>Exhaust Administrative Remedies</u>. The protester must exhaust its administrative remedies by pursuing the WV Division of Public Transit's protest procedures to completion before appealing the WV Division of Public Transit's decision to FTA.
- c. <u>Appeal Within Five Days</u>. The protester must deliver its appeal to the FTA Regional Administrator, Region III, 1760 Market Street, Suite 500, Philadelphia, PA 19103-4124 within five (5) working days of the date when the protester has received actual or constructive notice of the WV Division of Public Transit's final decision. Likewise, the protester must provide its appeal to the same address within five (5) working days of the date when the protester has identified other grounds for appeal to FTA. For example, other grounds for appeal include the WV Division of Public Transit's failure to have or failure to comply with its protest procedures or failure to review the protest.
- 2. Extent of FTA Review. FTA limits its review of protests to:
- Failure of the Division of Public Transit to have or adhere to its written bld protest procedures, or failure of the Division of Public Transit to review a complaint or protest.
- Alleged violations on other grounds are under the jurisdiction of the appropriate State or local administrative authorities,
- c. Alleged violations of a specific Federal Law or regulation that provides an applicable complaint procedure shall be submitted and processed in accordance with that Federal Law or regulation. <u>See, e.g.</u>, Buy America Requirements, 49 C.F.R. Part 661 (Section 661.15); Participation by Minority Business Enterprise in Department of Transportation Programs, 49 C.F.R. Section 26.89.

FTA will exercise discretionary jurisdiction over those appeals involving issues important to FTA's overall public transportation program. FTA will refer violations of Federal law for which it does not have primary jurisdiction to the Federal authority having proper jurisdiction.

3. <u>FTA Determinations to Decline Protest Reviews</u>. FTA's determination to decline jurisdiction over a protest does not mean that FTA approves of or agrees with the Division of Public Transit's decision or that FTA has determined the contract is eligible for Federal participation. FTA's determination means only that FTA does not consider the issues presented to be sufficiently important to FTA's overall program that FTA considers a review to be required.

Prohibited Interest

No employee, officer, board member, agent or their family members of the WV Division of Public Transit may participate in the selection, award, or administration of a Contract supported by Federal funds if a real or apparent conflict of interest is involved. Such a conflict could arise when any of the parties mentioned above have a financial or other interest in the Vendor selected for the Contract.


## **ACC Eco-Power Brush: Type EPB 2000**

### **Initial Setup of EPB**

- 1. Upon accepting the delivery of the Eco-Power Brush (EPB), inspect the unit and any additional parts that were shipped with the unit.
- 2. If there is damage to the machine and/or contents of the skid, please indicate it on the carrier's shipping documents and contact ACC International Inc. immediately to report the damage.
- 3. Once you have inspected the EPB, begin the setup by removing any parts that are secured to the top of the unit and place them aside, except the aluminum handles that are mounted on the 1'X4" wood.
- 4. Remove the four (4) bolts that secure the EPB to the skid.
- 5. Make sure that the wheel brake is locked. Please note, if this unit does not have a wheel lock, place a 4' long piece of wood about 10" past where the wheels will touch the ground when the machine is lifted up.
- 6. Stand the EPB up with two (2) people. Grasp the top of the machine, one person at each side, and lift up. As the machine begins to stand up, walk your hands down the sides of the machine until it is standing. As the base wheels begin to contact the ground, slow down the settling of the machine by placing one foot on the base and pull back on the side rails of the splash shield till the machine wheels touch the ground.
- 7. Remove the handles with the push buttons, from the upright supports of the machine and take all the packing off them.
- 8. Remove the fastening bolts and nuts from the three (3) areas where the handles will be bolted to the frame:
  - two (2) nuts on the control box,
  - two (2) bolts on the splash shield


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one (1) on the back support of the Eco-Power Brush.



- 9. First, push the excess wire for the handle controls into the hole in the control box cavity.

  Then fasten the handle in place by replacing all the nuts and bolts. Do not over-tighten.
- 10. Repeat this procedure for the handle on the other side of the EPB.
- 11. Next, install the safety distance wheels. These are the grey wheels that are mounted on the aluminum brackets. They are mounted on each side of the brush, on the aluminum upright, at a height of ± 5 ½'. Please note, some units can accommodate four (4) safety distance wheels, an upper and a lower wheel on each side of the brush.



- 12. Remove the nuts and washers on the back of the splash shield supports.
- 13. Install the safety distance wheels with the washer on the top, and the cotter pin at the bottom.
- 14. You can now proceed to assembly and connection of the power cord and water hose.


## **ACC Eco-Power Brush: Type EPB 2000**

#### **Electrical Cord Connection**

In most cases the electrical cord set for the ACC Eco-Power Brush (EPB) will be assembled for your unit. If it is not, or you purchased your own electrical cord, the red cord end for the electrical connection to the EPB, will be supplied to you with your shipment.

#### **Electrical Cord Set**

1. To connect the red cord end to your electrical cord, first it is necessary to separate it into three (3) parts, the bottom grey nut, the red body, and the black insert.



- 2. Feed the electrical cord through the grey nut and the red body approximately 12" past the hinged lid.
- 3. Strip the cord sheath,
- about 2" from the end and strip the conductor insulation 3/8".
- 4. **For 230 Volt 3 phase units**, connect the exposed wires to the black insert based on the following:
  - black conductor is connected to L1 terminal
  - white conductor is connected to the L2 terminal
  - red conductor is connected to the L3 terminal
  - green conductor connected to the ground terminal, raised and labeled "PE".
- 5. Reassemble the three (3) sections of the cord end. Open the hinged cover, slide the red body over the black insert and tighten the two Philips screws. Next, slide the grey nut over the bottom of the red body and tighten.

6. Attached the appropriate cord end (male), to match your building's 230-volt electrical outlet (female). As there are a multiple of configurations, ACC International Inc. does NOT supply the parts for this connection.

NOTE: When starting the EPB from the side control panel, the brush tips that are to touch the vehicle should spin away from you. This is done to keep the operator dry and make the unit easy to move. If the EPB is spinning toward you, turn off power and uplug the cord and "swap" the white and red conductors at the male cord end you just installed. Repeat steps 5 and 6; your EPB should now spin in the correct direction.

#### **Water Hose Connection**

- 1. For the hose connections install the supplied hose ends on your hose.
- 2. Connect the hose to the EPB by mating the brass quick connect coupler to the matching coupler on the EPB and turning clockwise ¼ turn.


## **ACC Eco-Power Brush: Type EPB 2000**

### **General Operating Instructions**

- 1. **PRE-Rinse** If the vehicle has a lot of sand or other abrasives on the surface, give the vehicle a quick rinse with a water hose. This will aid in protecting the paint surface of the vehicle.
- 2. **PRE-Shampoo (Bus)** Apply shampoo to the lower part of the vehicle paying special attention to dirtier areas. You do <u>not</u> have to apply shampoo to the windows or above the window area.

**PRE-Shampoo** (Truck) – Apply shampoo to the vehicle paying special attention to dirtier areas, such as the top rub rail at the front, and all door hardware. These areas tend to collect exhaust, oil, grease and excess road grime.


3. Position the Eco-Power Brush at one of the corners of the vehicle. The safety distance wheels should be approximately 5 inches away from the surface of the vehicle.



- 4. Turn on the main power switch located on the front control panel. If the power is on, then the green light will be on.
- 5. The emergency stop switch (large red switch) on the front panel must be pulled out. If this is not done, the machine will not start.

## DO NOT use this button to turn off the EPB, use the main ON/OFF switch located on the front panel.

6. The operator will be on the same side of the Eco-Power as the direction of washing.



7. If required, adjust the position and tilt using the tilting  $(\uparrow \downarrow)$  buttons as required. For optimal cleaning, only the tip of the brush materials (approximately 4 inches) should touch the surface to be cleaned.

Important: Only Tilt the Eco-Power Brush When It Is Next To A Vehicle.

- 8. Push in the green button to activate the ACC Eco-Power Brush. (The red button is a stop.)
- Guide the machine along side of the vehicle with a pulling motion, walking backwards. You will find that rotation of the brush is sufficient to move the Eco-Power Brush.
- 10. To turn corners, it is easiest to work with the Eco-Power Brush in a completely vertical position (no tilt).
- 11. Under normal circumstances and conditions, one pass with the brush may be sufficient to completely clean the surface. In the event of dirty spots, it may be necessary to reverse the direction of the brush to cover the area twice.

Tip: Two quick passes with the Eco-Power Brush is better than one slow pass.



On the return pass, extra rinse water may be required if:

- No pre-shampoo was applied.
- Extra shampoo was applied.

Activate the dual spraying system by turning on the single/dual spray switch, located on the front control

panel, below the main power on/off switch. This allows water to spray on both sides of the brush.

## IMPORTANT: If you have the optional overhead installation:

To keep all overhead equipment (hose and cord) from becoming entangled, each complete vehicle pass should be done in an opposite direction.

### For example:

First pass - clockwise; Second pass - counter clockwise; Third pass - clockwise;

# Help Desk + Technical Support

ACC International Inc. offers a Help Desk + Technical Support to assist you with any issues you may have with the original ACC Eco-Power Brush (EPB). This service is available Monday to Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (Eastern Standard Time). Simply contact our office at 1.800.265.7405.

Before contacting us, we suggest you review the following common problems and solutions.

PROBLEM: The Eco-Power Brush (EPB) will not start.

**SOLUTION: Please check the following:** 

- Check that the emergency stop button is pulled out this is the "on" position.
- Check that the main on/off button is in the "on" position.
- Make sure the power cord is plugged in at the wall and on the EPB.
- Make sure the building breaker/disconnect is on and supplying power.

If the above recommendations are correct, but the EPB still will not start, most often the issue is with the electrical cord.

#### IMPORTANT! ALWAYS DISCONNECT POWER SUPPLY BEFORE SERVICING

After disconnecting the power cord from the main building power supply, it is recommended that you check the power cord for any signs of damage, starting from the EPB and working toward the other end. If you have the overhead installation, the most common problem area for damage is between the EPB and the first roller. This is due to the overhead hose and cord being tangled and stressed due to operator error. (See Operating Instructions).

As this electrical cord will carry the 230 volt electrical power required to operate the EPB, it is very important that any and all repairs are done correctly. Additionally, it is necessary to verify that you have correct line voltage supplied to the EPB from your facility's electrical panel. ACC International Inc. recommends contacting an electrician or an ACC Factory Trained Technician to conduct testing and electrical repairs.

Please contact our technical support division, at 1.800.265.7405, for additional assistance.

PROBLEM: The water sprays but the brush does not spin.

**SOLUTION:** Check and reset the internal motor protection breaker:



- 1. Disconnect the power from the EPB by unplugging the red cord end.
- 2. Open the front panel.
- 3. The internal breaker is located in the top left corner of the main control panel; it is marked as "Q1". It will have all black wires (230V)
- 4. Reset this breaker by turning the front dial switch first to point at
- 5. "O", and then at "I".

Note: This internal breaker will trip if too much strain is put on the spinning brush. This is usually a result of the operator positioning the EPB too close to the side of the vehicle. Please see the Operating Instructions portion of this manual for correct operating procedures.

PROBLEM: The brush spins but there is no water, or <u>low</u> water, flow from the spray nozzles.

SOLUTION 1: Check the hose for any kinks and/or pinches that would restrict water flow, especially if you have the overhead installation.

• Visually inspect the water hose from EPB to source, untangling and straightening, as required.

Note: If the overhead installation is tangled, this is a result of the operator(s) continually using the EPB in the same direction. Please see the Operating Instructions portion of this manual for correct operating procedures.

#### SOLUTION 2: Check the EPB water inlet screen.



- 1. Check that the emergency stop button is pulled out this is the "on" position
- 2. Check that the main on/off button is in the "on" position.
- 3. Turn the water supply off and release the pressure by engaging both tilting up and down functions simultaneously. This creates an open water "circuit" and will drain off any water under the base.
- 4. Disconnect the water supply at the base of the EPB, at the brass coupler.
- On the EPB, there is an external rubber washer screen that may be plugged and restricting water flow.
- Clean the exterior screen to allow water flow.
- 7. Reconnect the water hose at the brass coupler and turn the water supply on.
- 8. Test by running EPB per General Operating Instructions.
- 9. If water flow is still poor, please contact our technical support division, at 1.800.265.7405, for additional assistance.

#### IMPORTANT!

Do not allow any particles to enter the EPB as the three way valve assembly, located behind this brass coupler, is extremely sensitive. If damaged, this part is not repairable and will need to be replaced.

West Virginia Code §5A-3-10a states: No contract or renewal of any contract may be awarded by the state or any of its political subdivisions to any vendor or prospective vendor when the vendor or prospective vendor or a related party to the vendor or prospective vendor is a debtor and the debt owed is an amount greater than one thousand dollars in the aggregate.

#### **DEFINITIONS:**

"Debt" means any assessment, premium, penalty, fine, tax or other amount of money owed to the state or any of its political subdivisions because of a judgment, fine, permit violation, license assessment, defaulted workers' compensation premium, penalty or other assessment presently delinquent or due and required to be paid to the state or any of its political subdivisions, including any interest or additional penalties accrued thereon.

"Debtor" means any individual, corporation, partnership, association, limited liability company or any other form or business association owing a debt to the state or any of its political subdivisions. "Political subdivision" means any county commission; municipality; county board of education; any instrumentality established by a county or municipality; any separate corporation or instrumentality established by one or more counties or municipalities, as permitted by law; or any public body charged by law with the performance of a government function or whose jurisdiction is coextensive with one or more counties or municipalities. "Related party" means a party, whether an individual, corporation, partnership, association, limited liability company or any other form or business association or other entity whatsoever, related to any vendor by blood, marriage, ownership or contract through which the party has a relationship of ownership or other interest with the vendor so that the party will actually or by effect receive or control a portion of the benefit, profit or other consideration from performance of a vendor contract with the party receiving an amount that meets or exceed five percent of the total contract amount.

EXCEPTION: The prohibition of this section does not apply where a vendor has contested any tax administered pursuant to chapter eleven of this code, workers' compensation premium, permit fee or environmental fee or assessment and the matter has not become final or where the vendor has entered into a payment plan or agreement and the vendor is not in default of any of the provisions of such plan or agreement.

Under penalty of law for false swearing (West Virginia Code §61-5-3), it is hereby certified that the vendor affirms and acknowledges the information in this affidavit and is in compliance with the requirements as stated.
