GENERAL TERMS &.CONDITIONS REQUEST FOR QUOTATION (RFQ) AND REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL (RFP)

- 1. Awards will be made in the best interest of the State of West Virginia.
- 2. The State may accept or reject in part, or in whole, any bid.

3. Prior to any award, the apparent successful vendor must be properly registered with the Purchasing Division

and have paid the required \$125 fee.

- 4. All services performed or goods delivered under State Purchase Order/Contracts are to be continued for the term of the Purchase Order/Contracts, contingent upon funds being appropriated by the Legislature or otherwise being made available. In the event funds are not appropriated or otherwise available for these services or goods this Purchase Order/Contract becomes void and of no effect after June 30.
- 5. Payment may only be made after the delivery and acceptance of goods or services.
- 6. Interest may be paid for late payment in accordance with the West Virginia Code.
- 7. Vendor preference will be granted upon written request in accordance with the West Virginia Code.

SUMMARY

This is an invitation to provide medium-resolution scanning and 3-D modeling services for portions of the affected explosion areas of the Upper Big Branch Mine, Raleigh Co., West Virginia. This work is for the West Virginia Office of Miners' Health, Safety, and Training (OMHS&T).

DELIVERABLES-Scanning

Medium-resolution 3-D scans shall be acquired in the mine and modeled for visualization and detailed point-to-point measurement of 3D scenes of the underground mine roof, ribs, floor and all mine structures and debris. The survey shall be referenced to the underground spad network,




Figure 1. Overall map showing the areas to be scanned.

which is in the SPCS WV-S NAD 27 coordinate system. An AutoCAD drawing of these survey stations and their coordinates can be provided upon request. This drawing file contains x,y coordinate values for the underground survey stations. It does not appear to contain z-values for these same stations. Approximate starting elevations are available if needed from nearby spot floor elevations. A certain amount of survey work may be necessary to use the existing survey station network (roof spads) as a coordinate reference network reliably in certain areas. Exact SPCS coordinate values for all data is not essential, but accurate relative tie of contiguous scenes and images to each other is required. Survey and scanning shall be performed with the participation of a WV licensed Professional Surveyor with the Underground Endorsement (SU).

The areas to be scanned in the mine are of the mine entries, cross-cuts, and intersections depicted generally in Figure 1. Areas where individual intersections are to be imaged are shown in green. Larger areas of contiguous entries, cross-cuts, and intersections are indicated in red.




Figure 2. Areas to be scanned along the North Glory Mains and #21 Tailgate.

For clarification, the areas which encompass large areas of contiguous scanning are shown in more detail in the Figures 2-4, below (but not all the required local intersection subject areas are shown in these figures).




Figure 3. Areas to be scanned in the region of the "Cross-over" between #21 Headgate and #21 Tailgate.




Figure 4. Areas to be scanned on #22 Headgate.

REGIONS TO BE MAPPED

To reiterate, the regions of the mine where 3-D scanning is required include the areas indicated on Figures 1-4, include portions of:

- 1) North Glory Mains
- 2) Tailgate #21
- 3) Headgate #21
- 4) "Cut-across"
- 5) Tailgate #22
- 6) Headgate #22
- 7) 8-North Mains
- 8) 9-North Mains

Some of the areas depicted in Figures 1-4 may be modified and/or shifted to alternate locations by OMHS&T as the need arises.

TIME SCHEDULE

Time is of the essence. Work underground must begin promptly upon award of the project. Surveying must be complete within 6 weeks, or less. The finished models shall be delivered in phases, not to exceed 8 weeks without prior approval.

NOTE: For safety reasons, when the barometric pressure drops quickly and dramatically outside, the mine is typically evacuated. The bidder should be aware that some days the crews may not be allowed inside the mine and some days the mine must be evacuated after a work day has commenced. By 5:30 am each morning a phone call to the mine can confirm if atmospheric conditions preclude mine entry at the normal time, which is typically 7am - 8 am, Monday-Friday. Our experience in the past 6 months has been that such issues have arisen on average once every 7-10 days. This should be factored into your bid.

TRAINING

The successful bidder will have sufficient numbers of employees trained in underground mine surveying. These persons in the mine shall have received their 80-hour training certificate and shall have current annual refresher training.

CONDITIONS

The conditions in the mine are less than ideal for surveying. Surfaces are dark and sooty, for the most part. There is considerable debris which present obstacles that are tripping hazards. The belt entries are expected to present some of the greatest challenges for performing the scan work. As it is desired that both sides of the belt and the top and underside of the belt be imaged, the number of scan setups required to do this should be carefully considered and factored in.

It is recognized that a full 3-D rendering of all areas desired may not be feasible. However, to the extent that it is feasible it shall be deemed necessary to perform.

HARDWARE AND SOFTWARE REQUIREMENTS

The scanning system used shall have a position accuracy of 6mm and distance accuracy of 4 mm. Angles (horizontal/vertical) shall be 60 micro-rad / 60 micro-rad (12" / 12"). The modeled surface precision shall be 2 mm, and the target acquisition std. deviation shall be 2 mm. The equipment shall be time-of-flight and the scanned data fully compatible with Leica Cyclone software.

In addition, full 360-deg. x 270-deg. field or view, high accuracy, long range (300m at 90% reflectivity), and high scan speed (50k pts/sec) are required, and the system must be capable of acquiring adequate reflection from dark, gray surfaces.

TERMINATION

In the event that conditions at the mine or time constraints preclude full performance of all the work, the project may be terminated before completion. In that event, a pro-rated settlement of the work that has been performed shall be made.

Please specify the following:

- 1) Cost per day for the scanner
- 2) Cost per day for crew to operate the scanner (include mileage and expenses in this figure, and the underground time will be at least eight (8) hours per day).
- 3) Cost per hour for data processing in the office.

DELIVERABLES- post processing

All scanned data shall be compiled into 3D imagery, together with draped skin of full color video, where feasible. It is anticipated that some coordination will be required during this phase to produce the final product. The imagery shall be provided to OMHS&T on high-quality digital media drives.

Dear Mr. Hieb,

Please consider this letter a response to the Request for Quotation (RFQ) we received from you a few days ago. The RFQ pertains to the investigatory need by your organization of a three-dimensional scan of a portion of the blast area at Massey Energy's Upper Big Branch Mine. Included in the information you sent was a 12-page document that provided additional details about this project. After carefully reviewing all of this information, we submit the following:

• Scope

We understand the scope of the project to consist of providing a 3D laser scan of several areas of the UBB Mine. On page 8 of the additional information that was sent to us, under a section titled "REGIONS TO BE MAPPED", we find you have listed 8 general sections where scanning is to occur. We have broken these areas down further into 17 sections that, once scanned, will be tied to existing spads located throughout the site. These areas are different sizes, and it appears as though there could be as much as 130 scanner set-ups for the whole project. By our estimations, this amounts to about 60 to 65 hours of scan time alone.

• Time-Frame

We plan on utilizing the time-frame specified in the RFQ. Since the processing of the data can take longer than the actual scanning, there will be a delay between the completion of the scanning and the completion of the processing. We can commence with the scanning within about two weeks of your notice to proceed.

Personnel

Marshall Robinson, the owner of the firm and a Licensed Professional Surveyor with the Underground Endorsement (SU), will be personally involved in the survey, along with Dwayne

Hall, another licensed Professional Surveyor and SU, and an employee of this firm for thirteen years. We expect Mr. Hall to be present nearly every day in the mine. The data will be post-processed by me, Damon Wilkewitz, a Licensed Professional Surveyor and an employee of this firm for five years. I will also prepare the final product.

• Coordinate base

It is our intention to tie all the scans to the mine's existing survey control by locating nearby spads. Information in the RFQ mentioned that an AutoCAD drawing of the mine's survey stations and coordinates would be provided upon request. We do request this information, and expect it to provide us the necessary information that will allow us to tie the scan data to the mine's State Plane Coordinate System.

• Cost

The RFQ outlines a total of four cost figures, including cost per day for the scanner, cost per day for the field crews, cost per hour for the office work, and a total lump sum cost for the project. As requested, we submit the following:

- a) Cost per day for the scanner = \$1,000 per day
- b) Cost for field crew per day = \$1,140 per day (factoring \$95 per hour times 12 hour days, including travel time)
- c) Cost per hour for post processing of the data = \$70 per hour
- d) Proposed cost for the entire project = \$37,000

• Deliverables

As outlined in the RFQ, the deliverables would include the point cloud data for the scanned areas. The scans would be colorized based on photos taken by the scanner, and the Cyclone software applies those colors to the point clouds. You may fully view, take measurements, and examine in full detail, the scan data by purchasing Leica's ViewerPro software. A free web-viewer called "Leica TruView" is also available, but we find it is very limited in its capabilities, and would probably not be able to provide you with the functionality you are looking for. If you wish, I would also be made available to assist you either with using ViewerPro, or by working with you with the Leica Cyclone software.
