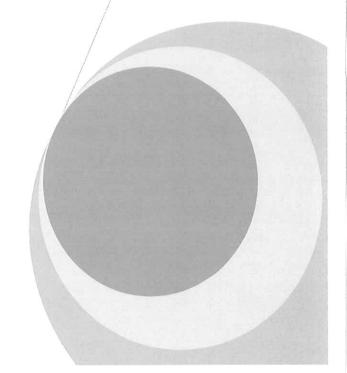

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GENERAL TERMS & CONDITIONS REQUEST FOR QUOTATION (RFQ) AND REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL (RFP)

- 1. Awards will be made in the best interest of the State of West Virginia.
- 2. The State may accept or reject in part, or in whole, any bid.

3. Prior to any award, the apparent successful vendor must be properly registered with the Purchasing Division

and have paid the required \$125 fee.

- 4. All services performed or goods delivered under State Purchase Order/Contracts are to be continued for the term of the Purchase Order/Contracts, contingent upon funds being appropriated by the Legislature or otherwise being made available. In the event funds are not appropriated or otherwise available for these services or goods this Purchase Order/Contract becomes void and of no effect after June 30.
- 5. Payment may only be made after the delivery and acceptance of goods or services.
- 6. Interest may be paid for late payment in accordance with the West Virginia Code.
- 7. Vendor preference will be granted upon written request in accordance with the West Virginia Code.
- 8. The State of West Virginia is exempt from federal and state taxes and will not pay or reimburse such taxes.
- 9. The Director of Purchasing may cancel any Purchase Order/Contract upon 30 days written notice to the seller.
- 10. The laws of the State of West Virginia and the Legislative Rules of the Purchasing Division shall govern the purchasing process.
- 11. Any reference to automatic renewal is hereby deleted. The Contract may be renewed only upon mutual written agreement of the parties.
- 12. BANKRUPTCY: In the event the yendor/contractor files for bankruptcy protection, the State may deem this contract null and void, and terminate such contract without further order.

The West Virginia Department of Military Affairs & Public Safety, Division of Corrections is soliciting contracts to provide psychological evaluation services to the Division of Corrections' sentenced inmates housed in regional jail facilities awaiting transfer to a correctional facility in accordance with the following specifications.

Specifications:

The successful Vendor will be required to travel to and/or communicate with the following facilities operated by the West Virginia Regional Jail and Correctional Facility Authority (RJA):

- · Central Regional Jail, Flatwoods, Braxton County, WV
- · Eastern Regional Jail, Martinsburg, Berkeley County, WV
- Northern Regional Jail, Moundsville, Marshall County, WV
- · North Central Regional Jail, Greenwood, Doddridge County, WV
- Potomac Highlands Regional Jail, Augusta, Hampshire County, WV
- South Central Regional Jail, Charleston, Kanawha County, WV
- · Southern Regional Jail, Daniels, Raleigh County, WV
- · Southwestern Regional Jail, Holden, Logan County, WV
- · Tygart Valley Regional Jail, Elkins, Randolph County, WV
- · Western Regional Jail, Barboursville, Cabell County,

WV Background:

The Division of Corrections, hereafter referred to as "Agency", manages sentenced adult felons. Currently, there are approximately one thousand seven hundred seventy one (1,771) offenders housed in regional jails facilities due to lack of correctional facility bed space. The goal of this requisition is to facilitate the classification process in order to transfer inmates into an appropriate correctional facility as soon as possible.

Limits of confidentiality will be observed by the successful vendor and its practitioners and will be required to sign agreements to adhere to Agency's policy. The Agency contact personnel during the performance of the contract will be identified and conveyed to the Vendor upon implementation of services.

Scope of Work

Psychological Evaluations: The Agency will administer tests to an estimated sixty (60) to one hundred (100) DOC offenders housed in RJA facilities each month during the contract period. Specifically, these tests are the Minnesota Multiphasic Personality Inventory Restructured Form (MMPI-2-RF, Beta-3, Texas Christian University Drug Screen 2 (TCUD 2), and the Wide Range Achievement Test (WRAT-4). On a schedule to be determined by the Agency and RJA, the Vendor will be notified electronically of testing completed and be provided with the following documentation: Pre/Post Sentencing Reports, CIB report, and raw testing data. Utilizing qualified psychologists, the Vendor shall conduct a face to face interview with the offender on the next scheduled interview day and will complete the Social History interview provided by the Agency as well as the psychological evaluation. Interviews via telecommunication will be considered to be a face to face contact.

The Vendor shall provide a typed written, signed psychological evaluation in the Agency's format to the Agency's Movement Coordinator or other Designee within ten (10) working days of the interview date.

Personnel: The Vendor shall provide adequate, qualified, licensed, or supervised psychologists for the term of this agreement. The Vendor shall require personnel involved to attend any orientation or training provided by the Agency at the expense of the Vendor. The Vendor shall ensure that all the required West Virginia licenses and credentials associated are active, unrestricted and in good Standing. Vendor employees must pass a background investigation conducted by the Agency at no cost to the Vendor. The Agency shall reserve the right of approval/ or removal of any Vendor employee during the contract period.

Evidence of License: All vendors shall include current and active copy of license as approved and issued by the West Virginia Board of Examiners of Psychologists.

Standards of Service: All psychological services provided will be in compliance and in accordance with all applicable Federal and State statutes, court orders and policy directives of the Agency and the Standards of the American Correctional Association, 4th edition, 2003 and any revisions, or supplements issued thereto.

Agency Policy and Formats: The Vendor will be provided with standard formats for the Social History Interview and the Psychological Evaluation as well as all applicable Agency Policy.

Reports: Psychological evaluations submitted under this contract shall be typewritten in the form provided and within the time frame designated with an original signature and date of the submitting and/or supervising psychologist. The Agency reserves the right to return any report not in compliance with the established format. The Vendor shall make the necessary corrections and return it to the Agency within five (5) working days.

Invoices: All invoices are to be submitted to the Division of Corrections Central office, to the attention of "Accounts Payable" 1409 Greenbrier Street, Charleston, WV 25311. Invoices must be by jail and by visit, and must list each offender so verification could be easily done.

Salaries/Wages, Travel and other Expenses: Remuneration of all salaries, wages, travel, and any other expenses required for the performance of this contract shall be the responsibility of the Vendor.

Insurance, Indemnification and HIPAA:

Insurance Requirements:

Certificates of Insurance are required prior to award but are not required at the time of bid. The vendor shall present evidence of insurance at the time of award in the types and amounts required by the Agency and acceptable to the State. The vendor, as an independent contractor, is solely liable for the acts and omissions of its employees and agents. The vendor shall maintain and furnish proof of coverage of liability insurance for loss, damage, or injury (including death) of third parties arising from acts and omissions on the part of the vendor, its agents and employees in the following amounts:

- 1. For bodily injury (including death): \$1,000,000.00 per Occurrence.
- 2. For property damage and professional liability: Up to \$1,000,000.00 per Occurrence.
- 3. Professional Liability: Minimum of \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence.

The State of West Virginia must be listed as the certificate holder.

License Requirements:

Vendor at all times shall provide health care providers who are qualified, professional, competent, duly licensed. The successful vendor must present evidence of certification or licensure with WV Workers Compensation and Unemployment Funds, a copy of its WV business Certificate and any other license it may be required to hold by the nature of its operation.

Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) of 1996:

The West Virginia government HIPAA Business Associate Addendum (BAA), approved by the Attorney General, and available online at the Purchasing Division's website: http://www.state.wv.us/admin/purchase/vrc/hipaa.html is hereby part of this agreement. All future updates to the BAA will be considered part of this agreement.

Indemnification: Vendor agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the State and the Agency, their officers, and employees from and against (1) any claims or losses for services rendered by any subcontractor, person or firm performing or supplying services, materials, or supplies in connection with the performance of the Contract; (2) any claims or losses resulting to any person or entity injured or damaged by the Vendor, its officers, employees, or subcontractors by the publication, translation, reproduction, delivery, performance, use, or disposition of any data used under the Contract in a manner not authorized by the Contract, or by federal or state statutes or regulations; and (3) any failure of the Vendor, its officers, employees or sub-contractors to observe state and federal laws, including but not limited to labor and wage laws; and (4) Any claims or losses to any person or firm injured or damaged by the erroneous or negligent acts, including without limitation, disregard of federal or State Medicaid and Medicare statutes or regulations of Vendor, its officers, employees, or subcontractors in the performance of the services required under this contract.

Governing Law:

This contract shall be governed by the laws of the State of West Virginia. Vendor further agrees to comply with the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and all other applicable Federal, State and local government rules, regulations and policies.

Evaluation and award: Award will be based on the vendor with the lowest cost per evaluation meeting all of the specifications with most complete bid. The State reserves the right to make a multiple award should it be in the best interest of the State.

PURCHASING AFFIDAVIT

West Virginia Code §5A-3-10a states: No contract or renewal of any contract may be awarded by the state or any of its political subdivisions to any vendor or prospective vendor when the vendor or prospective vendor or a related party to the vendor or prospective vendor is a debtor and the debt owed is an amount greater than one thousand dollars in the aggregate.

DEFINITIONS:

"Debt" means any assessment, premium, penalty, fine, tax or other amount of money owed to the state or any of its political subdivisions because of a judgment, fine, permit violation, license assessment, defaulted workers' compensation premium, penalty or other assessment presently delinquent or due and required to be paid to the state or any of its political subdivisions, including any interest or additional penalties accrued thereon.

"Debtor" means any individual, corporation, partnership, association, limited liability company or any other form or business association owing a debt to the state or any of its political subdivisions. "Political subdivision" means any county commission; municipality; county board of education; any instrumentality established by a county or municipality; any separate corporation or instrumentality established by one or more counties or municipalities, as permitted by law; or any public body charged by law with the performance of a government function or whose jurisdiction is coextensive with one or more counties or municipalities. "Related party" means a party, whether an individual, corporation, partnership, association, limited liability company or any other form or business association or other entity whatsoever, related to any vendor by blood, marriage, ownership or contract through which the party has a relationship of ownership or other interest with the vendor so that the party will actually or by effect receive or control a portion of the benefit, profit or other consideration from performance of a vendor contract with the party receiving an amount that meets or exceed five percent of the total contract amount.

EXCEPTION: The prohibition of this section does not apply where a vendor has contested any tax administered pursuant to chapter eleven of this code, workers' compensation premium, permit fee or environmental fee or assessment and the matter has not become final or where the vendor has entered into a payment plan or agreement and the vendor is not in default of any of the provisions of such plan or agreement.
