PURCHASING AFFIDAVIT

MANDATE: Under W. Va. Code §5A-3-10a, no contract or renewal of any contract may be awarded by the state or any of its political subdivisions to any vendor or prospective vendor when the vendor or prospective vendor or a related party to the vendor or prospective vendor is a debtor and: (1) the debt owed is an amount greater than one thousand dollars in the aggregate; or (2) the debtor is in employer default.

EXCEPTION: The prohibition listed above does not apply where a vendor has contested any tax administered pursuant to chapter eleven of the W. Va. Code, workers' compensation premium, permit fee or environmental fee or assessment and the matter has not become final or where the vendor has entered into a payment plan or agreement and the vendor is not in default of any of the provisions of such plan or agreement.

"Related party" means a party, whether an individual, corporation, partnership, association, limited liability company or any other form or business association or other entity whatsoever, related to any vendor by blood, marriage, ownership or contract through which the party has a relationship of ownership or other interest with the vendor so that the party will actually or by effect receive or control a portion of the benefit, profit or other consideration from performance of a vendor contract with the party receiving an amount that meets or exceed five percent of the total contract amount.



We will begin this process by establishing a dialogue among the design team, the Owner's representative(s), our elevator consultant, and your elevator service company to ensure that all pertinent needs are addressed. We have already begun this process by contacting Hollister, ThyssenKrupp and Otis Elevator to renew our relationship with them, as well as to introduce them to the project.

Pat Ionadi Corp., et al., Civil Action No. II-C-I3 pending in the Circuit Court of Barbour County. The suit involves the failure of a standing seam metal roof installed on an addition to Phillip Barbour High School in Barbour County, West Virginia during a severe windstorm in 2009. The addition was built beginning in 2002. The case was brought by the Barbour County Board of Education and the West Virginia Board of Risk and Insurance Management, as subrogee, against WSA; the construction manager, G.A. Brown; the general contractor, Pat Ionadi Corp.; the roofing subcontractor, Kalkreuth Roofing and Sheet Metal, Inc.; Exterior Metal Products, Inc., the supplier of the roof; and Fabral Holdings, Inc., the manufacturer of the roof. The complaint alleges that the failure of the roof was due to design and construction errors which are attributable jointly and severally to each of the defendants. WSA has denied liability. Due to a stay resulting from the bankruptcy of the general contractor, the case is still in its early stages and little discovery has been completed.
