Enclosed please find the research proposal, "West Virginia Breeding Bird Atlas II – Statistical Analysis". This proposal is being submitted by Scott Klopfer with our Virginia Tech Conservation Management Institute. The proposed period of performance for this effort is 06/01/2015 through 05/31/2016 with an estimated cost of \$72,164. This proposal is considered confidential/proprietary information of Virginia Tech and is being provided to you for evaluation purposes for funding this work at Virginia Tech. No other use of the information contained in this proposal is authorized until such time as an award is made. Virginia Tech reserves the right to negotiate mutually agreeable terms and conditions at the time of award. Please note that Virginia Tech takes exception to the following terms and conditions noted in the solicitation:

- 13. REGISTRATION: Prior to Contract award, the apparent successful Vendor must be properly registered with the West Virginia Purchasing Division and must have paid the \$125 fee, if applicable. As a not for profit, state educational institution, Virginia Tech cannot agree to this.
- 18. APPLICABLE LAW: This Contract is governed by and interpreted under West Virginia law without giving effect to its choice of law principles. Any information provided in specification manuals, or any other source, verbal or written, which contradicts or violates the West Virginia Constitution, West Virginia Code of State Rules is void and of no effect. Virginia Tech has no authority to agree to be bound by the law of any other state due to the fact that it is a state university and (1) the General Assembly has never given up nor delegated its authority to make the laws of Virginia or those that govern the activities of state government. Therefore, employees of the state do not have the authority to contractually agree to bind a state agency to laws of another state; and (2) the Commonwealth of Virginia has sovereign immunity which must be explicitly waived before the University would be amenable to the jurisdiction of the courts of another state. 

West Virginia Breeding Bird Atlas - Statistical Analysis

Proposal submitted by Scott D. Klopfer¹, Caitlin Carey¹, and Dr. Andrew Wilson²

Background

Many states have completed at least one Breeding Bird Atlas (BBA) project. A traditional BBA utilizes primarily volunteers to systematically survey an area, usually a state, for bird species present during a specified period. BBAs typically take multiple seasons to complete, generate large amounts of data, and provide quantitative information on the extent of species distribution in the state.

Recently, states have adopted a new approach for conducting BBAs. Pennsylvania completed both a traditional BBA and a point-count effort which allowed them to account for species detection probabilities to provide more robust estimates of species density and distribution (Wilson et al 2012). This required a dedicated, controlled effort by trained survey personnel over the entire state and took six field seasons to complete. The resulting data were used for species-specific detection probabilities as a function of time of day, season, distance, and observer and habitat bias. These data were used in conjunction with spatial information on habitat type, spatial arrangement of breeding birds, and other metrics to develop density, abundance, and predicted probability of occurrence estimates for several more common species over the entire landscape of Pennsylvania.

The second Pennsylvania BBA has set a new standard for conducting a survey of breeding birds over a state, and others have implemented similar techniques. Ohio is presently completing an effort using the same model as Pennsylvania. Virginia is planning on implementing a similar project in 2015.

West Virginia has recently completed the field survey portion of their second BBA and is seeking assistance to complete the analysis of both the traditional BBA and point-count survey data following the procedures used in Pennsylvania and Ohio. The Conservation Management Institute (CMI) at Virginia Tech is proposing to complete this analysis with assistance from Dr. Andrew Wilson (Gettysburg College, Pennsylvania).

Scope of Work

The CMI will work cooperatively with the West Virginia Department of Natural Resources (WVDNR) throughout this project. West Virginia DNR will provide all datasets, priorities for analysis, and guidance on how results will be presented. We will summarize and conduct statistical analyses of observational and abundance data collected during the 6-year atlas project. In general, we expect to produce results similar to those presented in the *Atlas of Breeding Birds in Pennsylvania* (eds. Wilson et al. 2012) and those being produced in Ohio BBA II. We will work directly with Dr. Wilson to apply the same methodologies and techniques used in Pennsylvania and Ohio and include any additional information that may enhance the West Virginia BBA II.

A general outline of project tasks includes:

- 1. Receiving, cleaning, organizing, and preparing abundance datasets for summary and analysis.
- 2. Refining, creating outputs, and testing density models using established methodology.
 - a. Quantify and correct for detection biases and incorporate into density models
- 3. Conducting landcover analysis related to atlas block, atlas region, Partners in Flight region and change over time. Creating maps summarizing the above. Data will be used to help identify important habitats and breeding locations.
 - a. Using land cover datasets in Geographic Information Systems (GIS) software (ArcMap10.1), we will classify each block and region in both atlas projects by proportion landcover type. Retrofitting land cover data will be conducted as needed to assess changes over time between the first and current BBA.
- 4. Receiving, cleaning, organizing, and migrating all atlas distribution data into an existing database template.
- 5. Using distribution data in a GIS environment produce maps detailing occurrence and change between atlas projects for all species in order to document the current breeding bird distribution in atlas blocks and regions and assess changes in breeding distributions since the first BBA.
 - a. In addition, using distribution data and land cover analysis data in ArcMap, we will compare presence/absence of species in blocks or regions to assess whether changes in landcover correlate with changes in species distribution.
- 6. Modelling probably species occurrence using GIS and statistical software packages (ArcMap and R).
 - a. Incorporating BBA datasets, landcover analysis data, and survey effort effects into occupancy modeling to develop maps of predicted probability of occupancy.
- 7. Summarizing and analyzing observer effort across all atlas blocks to investigate the effects of effort on block occupancy.

- a. To investigate, and account for, the effects of observer effort on block occupancy and probability of detection, we will compare effort to the number of species detected per block and to the proportion of blocks occupied by a species.
- 8. Using an existing template/format in R, create data packs for 170+ species to support ongoing species account writing. Each data pack will include above outputs and additional summary statistics.
- 9. Preparing additional outputs covering breeding probability and breeding phenology such as:
 - a. Estimating proportion available for detection as a function of distance and survey time and effort.
 - b. Identifying times of day, season, or habitat components that minimize and maximize probability for detection using regression models.
 - c. Summaries of breeding evidence data. Summarizing by category, code, and bird activity dates across all atlas blocks for each species to assess changes since first BBA.
 - d. Summaries and map of blocks occupied by physiographic region between atlas projects for all species.
- 10. Organizing and delivering all outputs in a print-ready format.
- 11. Conducting periodic progress meetings, reports, and related project communications with WVDNR.

CMI will work with WVDNR to finalize specific details for each of these steps as appropriate, particularly with respect to spatial analysis steps and prioritizing the specific analyses to be completed. For the purposes of developing this proposal we have used the *Atlas of Breeding Birds in Pennsylvania* as a guide. We will maintain continual communication with WVDNR regarding progress and our project plan as the analysis is conducted. This will ensure that limited resources are allocated to the highest priority analyses as determined by WVDNR.

Timeline and Budget

We will assume a start date of June 1, 2015 with an end date of 365 days after initiation (May 31, 2016); however changes to these dates will not affect our schedule. Wherever possible we will attempt to accommodate WVDNR requests for specific deliverables by specific dates. We estimate that the total cost of this project will be \$72,164 (see Pricing Page). This includes costs related to personnel time required to complete tasks, related fringe benefit costs, and travel. We also applied an indirect cost of 27% per our institutional established rate.

We will supply the WVDNR with progress reports to support quarterly invoicing, or to address information needs they may have related to the project.

Specific Qualifications

The Conservation Management Institute has over 15 years' experience working with federal, state, private, and other non-governmental organizations on wildlife and natural resource-related issues. We have been actively involved in avian research and related data analyses for the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Virginia Department of Military Affairs, Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries, and other groups.

Dr. Wilson is an affiliated researcher with the CMI and was the primary researcher on the Pennsylvania Breeding Bird point count project and principal author and editor of the *Atlas of Breeding Birds in Pennsylvania*. Dr. Wilson is the foremost expert available for conducting the analyses required for this project.

Experience with R and other statistical and spatial analysis software

Dr. Wilson has extensive analysis experience including the use of R programs along with other packages such as WinBUGS, R, SURVIV, and ArcGIS. Ms. Carey has a strong statistical background with considerable experience conducting statistical analysis of biological data to assess species population dynamics and distributions. She has training and experience using statistical and GIS analysis software programs, including R, SAS, Program MARK, and ArcMap10.1. Mr. Klopfer has over 15 years of experience applying geospatial information to wildlife related applications. He has experience mapping vegetation and land use for developing habitat maps and models, quantifying land cover change, and supporting decision making.

Dear Scott,

Thank you for contacting me about the opportunity of affiliating with the Conservation Management Institute (CMI) affiliate. I am particularly excited about the potential to collaborate on the analysis of bird atlas data. As field worker, lead analyst and editor of the Second Atlas of Breeding Bird in Pennsylvania, I have gained extensive experience of "second generation" bird atlases, and I am keen to make good use of that experience to assist other atlas projects. Recently I have also worked as a consultant for Ohio State University, taking the lead on analysis of bird abundance data for the Second Ohio Breeding Bird Atlas, to be published later this year. Further, I have recently (within the last year) advised atlas teams in a further four states, currently at various stages of 2nd Bird Atlas production.

Expectations of "second generation" bird atlases are high, especially with regards an increasing anticipation that they will map bird abundances as well as bird distributions. The extra dimension of abundance mapping will provide valuable data for large-scale conservation management and long-term monitoring, but gathering and analyzing such data is undoubtedly challenging. I have gladly aided Rich Bailey at WVDNR with the final stages of the WV Bird Atlas field work, and the planning for data analysis. My current position as an Assistant Professor at a teaching college precludes me from taking the lead on analysis of the WV Bird Atlas data, so I am delighted to offer my services as an affiliate and Co-Principal Investigator with CMI. CMI has the staff and resources that are needed to meet the challenges posed when analyzing the large volumes of spatial data generated by bird atlas projects. I will gladly share not only my experience of bringing a similar project to fruition (i.e. book publication), but all the computer code that we have developed to analyze bird atlas data. I think this would serve to greatly improve the efficiency of the analytical process, thereby ensuring a timely book publication.

I look forward to hearing more about this collaboration in due course.



CONFIDENTIALITY: The Vendor agrees that it will not disclose to anyone, directly or indirectly, any such personally identifiable information or other confidential information gained from the Agency, unless the individual who is the subject of the information consents to the disclosure in writing or the disclosure is made pursuant to the Agency's policies, procedures, and rules. Vendor further agrees to comply with the Confidentiality Policies and Information Security Accountability Requirements, set forth in http://www.state.wv.us/admin/purchase/privacy/default.html.
- 30. DISCLOSURE: Vendor's response to the Solicitation and the resulting Contract are considered public documents and will be disclosed to the public in accordance with the laws, rules, and policies governing the West Virginia Purchasing Division. Those laws include, but are not limited to, the Freedom of Information Act found in West Virginia Code §§ 29B-1-1 et seq. and the competitive bidding laws found West Virginia Code §§ 5A-3-1 et seq., 5-22-1 et seq., and 5G-1-1 et seq.

If a Vendor considers any part of its bid to be exempt from public disclosure, Vendor must so indicate by specifically identifying the exempt information, identifying the exemption that applies, providing a detailed justification for the exemption, segregating the exempt information from the general bid information, and submitting the exempt information as part of its bid but in a segregated and clearly identifiable format. Failure to comply with the foregoing requirements will result in public disclosure of the Vendor's bid without further notice. "Steel Products" means products rolled, formed, shaped, drawn, extruded, forged, cast, fabricated or otherwise similarly processed, or processed by a combination of two or more or such operations, from steel made by the open heath, basic oxygen, electric furnace, Bessemer or other steel making process. The Purchasing Division Director may, in writing, authorize the use of foreign steel products if:
 - c. The cost for each contract item used does not exceed one tenth of one percent (.1%) of the total contract cost or two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00), whichever is greater.

For the purposes of this section, the cost is the value of the steel product as delivered to the project; or

- d. The Director of the Purchasing Division determines that specified steel materials are not produced in the United States in sufficient quantity or otherwise are not reasonably available to meet contract requirements.
- 43. PREFERENCE FOR USE OF DOMESTIC ALUMINUM, GLASS, AND STEEL: In Accordance with W. Va. Code § 5-19-1 et seq., and W. Va. The cost of domestic aluminum, glass, or steel products may be unreasonable if the cost is more than twenty percent (20%) of the bid or offered price for foreign made aluminum, glass, or steel products. If the domestic aluminum, glass or steel products to be supplied or produced in a "substantial labor surplus area", as defined by the United States Department of Labor, the cost of domestic aluminum, glass, or steel products may be unreasonable if the cost is more than thirty percent (30%) of the bid or offered price for foreign made aluminum, glass, or steel products.

This preference shall be applied to an item of machinery or equipment, as indicated above, when the item is a single unit of equipment or machinery manufactured primarily of aluminum, glass or steel, is part of a public works contract and has the sole purpose or of being a permanent part of a single public works project. SPECIFICATIONS

1. **PURPOSE AND SCOPE:** The West Virginia Purchasing Division is soliciting bids on behalf of the West Virginia Division of Natural Resources (WVDNR), Wildlife Resources Section to establish a contract for work related to analysis, summary and outputs of data collected during fieldwork on a 6 year West Virginia Breeding Bird Atlas.

In 2014, staff and volunteers completed the last of six years of fieldwork on the 2nd West Virginia Breeding Bird Atlas. Data from this project will serve as a primary tool for guiding conservation and management decisions related to birds for the next 20 years. Over 100,000 individual observations were submitted, and these data will enable the creation of accurate distribution maps for each of over 170 species known to breed in the state. In addition to distribution data, staff and volunteers also conducted abundance sampling in over 700 atlas blocks. The resulting density models will serve to identify focal areas for conservation for up to 80 species. These will be particularly useful for still-ubiquitous but declining species such as wood thrush and eastern wood-pewee.

WVDNR is seeking bids for work related to analysis, summary and outputs of data collected during the 6-year atlas period. This work will serve to support and enable ongoing writing and analysis efforts by WVDNR that will ultimately lead to a draft book manuscript by the end of 2016. General deliverables will include statistical analysis, summary and presentation of abundance sampling data, summary and presentation of distribution data, and modelling probable species occurrence as well as population density.

PURCHASING AFFIDAVIT

MANDATE: Under W. Va. Code §5A-3-10a, no contract or renewal of any contract may be awarded by the state or any of its political subdivisions to any vendor or prospective vendor when the vendor or prospective vendor or a related party to the vendor or prospective vendor is a debtor and: (1) the debt owed is an amount greater than one thousand dollars in the aggregate; or (2) the debtor is in employer default.

EXCEPTION: The prohibition listed above does not apply where a vendor has contested any tax administered pursuant to chapter eleven of the W. Va. Code, workers' compensation premium, permit fee or environmental fee or assessment and the matter has not become final or where the vendor has entered into a payment plan or agreement and the vendor is not in default of any of the provisions of such plan or agreement.

DEFINITIONS:

"Debt" means any assessment, premium, penalty, fine, tax or other amount of money owed to the state or any of its political subdivisions because of a judgment, fine, permit violation, license assessment, defaulted workers' compensation premium, penalty or other assessment presently delinquent or due and required to be paid to the state or any of its political subdivisions, including any interest or additional penalties accrued thereon.

"Employer default" means having an outstanding balance or liability to the old fund or to the uninsured employers' fund or being in policy default, as defined in W. Va. Code § 23-20-2, feiture to maintain mandatory workers' compensation coverage, or fallure to fully meet its obligations as a workers' compensation self-insured employer. An amployer is not in employer default if it has entered into a repayment agreement with the Insurance Commissioner and remains in compliance with the obligations under the repayment agreement.

"Related party" means a party, whether an individual, corporation, partnership, association, limited liability company or any other form or business association or other entity whatsoever, related to any vendor by blood, marriage, ownership or contract through which the party has a relationship of ownership or other interest with the vendor so that the party will actually or by effect receive or control a portion of the benefit, profit or other consideration from performance of a vendor contract with the party receiving an amount that meets or exceed five percent of the total contract amount.

AFFIRMATION: By signing this form, the vendor's authorized signer affirms and acknowledges under penalty of law for false swearing (W. Va. Code §61-5-3) that neither vendor nor any related party owe a debt as defined above and that neither vendor nor any related party are in employer default as defined above, unless the debt or employer default is permitted under the axception above.
