41. BACKGROUND CHECK: In accordance with W. Va. "State Contract Project" means any erection or construction of, or any addition to, alteration of or other improvement to any building or structure, including, but not limited to, roads or highways, or the installation of any heating or cooling or ventilating plants or other equipment, or the supply of and materials for such projects, pursuant to a contract with the State of West Virginia for which bids were solicited on or after June 6, 2001. b. "Steel Products" means products rolled, formed, shaped, drawn, extruded, forged, cast, fabricated or otherwise similarly processed, or processed by a combination of two or more or such operations, from steel made by the open heath, basic oxygen, electric furnace, Bessemer or other steel making process. The Purchasing Division Director may, in writing, authorize the use of foreign steel products if:
 - c. The cost for each contract item used does not exceed one tenth of one percent (.1%) of the total contract cost or two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00), whichever is greater. For the purposes of this section, the cost is the value of the steel product as delivered to the project; or
 - d. The Director of the Purchasing Division determines that specified steel materials are not produced in the United States in sufficient quantity or otherwise are not reasonably available to meet contract requirements.

43. PREFERENCE FOR USE OF DOMESTIC ALUMINUM, GLASS, AND STEEL: In Accordance with W. Va. Code § 5-19-1 et seq., and W. Va. CSR § 148-10-1 et seq., for every contract or subcontract, subject to the limitations contained herein, for the construction, reconstruction, alteration, repair, improvement or maintenance of public works or for the purchase of any item of machinery or equipment to be used at sites of public works, only domestic aluminum, glass or steel products shall be supplied unless the spending officer determines, in writing, after the receipt of offers or bids, (1) that the cost of domestic aluminum, glass or steel products is unreasonable or inconsistent with the public interest of the State of West Virginia, (2) that domestic aluminum, glass or steel products are not produced in sufficient quantities to meet the contract requirements, or (3) the available domestic aluminum, glass, or steel do not meet the contract specifications. This provision only applies to public works contracts awarded in an amount more than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) or public works contracts that require more than ten thousand pounds of steel products.

The cost of domestic aluminum, glass, or steel products may be unreasonable if the cost is more than twenty percent (20%) of the bid or offered price for foreign made aluminum, glass, or steel products. If the domestic aluminum, glass or steel products to be supplied or produced in a "substantial labor surplus area", as defined by the United States Department of Labor, the cost of domestic aluminum, glass, or steel products may be unreasonable if the cost is more than thirty percent (30%) of the bid or offered price for foreign made aluminum, glass, or steel products. This preference shall be applied to an item of machinery or equipment, as indicated above, when the item is a single unit of equipment or machinery manufactured primarily of aluminum, glass or steel, is part of a public works contract and has the sole purpose or of being a permanent part of a single public works project. This provision does not apply to equipment or machinery purchased by a spending unit for use by that spending unit and not as part of a single public works project.

All bids and offers including domestic aluminum, glass or steel products that exceed bid or offer prices including foreign aluminum, glass or steel products after application of the preferences provided in this provision may be reduced to a price equal to or lower than the lowest bid or offer price for foreign aluminum, glass or steel products plus the applicable preference. If the reduced bid or offer prices are made in writing and supersede the prior bid or offer prices, all bids or offers, including the reduced bid or offer prices, will be reevaluated in accordance with this rule.

ADDITIONAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS (Construction Contracts Only)

1. CONTRACTOR'S LICENSE: West Virginia Code § 21-11-2 requires that all persons desiring to perform contracting work in this state be licensed. The West Virginia Contractors Licensing Board is empowered to issue the contractor's license. Applications for a contractor's license may be made by contacting the West Virginia Division of Labor. West Virginia Code § 21-11-11 requires any prospective Vendor to include the contractor's license number on its bid. Failure to include a contractor's license number on the bid shall result in Vendor's bid being disqualified. Vendors should include a contractor's license number in the space provided below.

The apparent successful Vendor must furnish a copy of its contractor's license prior to the issuance of a Award Document.

- 2. DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE AFFIDAVIT: W. Va. Code § 21-1D-5 provides that any solicitation for a public improvement contract requires each Vendor that submits a bid for the work to submit at the same time an affidavit that the Vendor has a written plan for a drug-free workplace policy. To comply with this law, Vendor must either complete the enclosed drug-free workplace affidavit and submit the same with its bid or complete a similar affidavit that fulfills all of the requirements of the applicable code. Failure to submit the signed and notarized drug-free workplace affidavit or a similar affidavit that fully complies with the requirements of the applicable code, with the bid shall result in disqualification of Vendor's bid. Pursuant to W. Va. Code 21-1D-2(b) and (k), this provision does not apply to public improvement contracts the value of which is \$100,000 or less or temporary or emergency repairs.
- 2.1. DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE POLICY: Pursuant to W. Va. Code § 21-1D-4, Vendor and its subcontractors must implement and maintain a written drug-free workplace policy that complies with said article. The awarding public authority shall cancel this contract if: (1) Vendor fails to implement and maintain a written drug-free workplace policy described in the preceding paragraph, (2) Vendor fails to provide information regarding implementation of its drug-free workplace policy at the request of the public authority; or (3) Vendor provides to the public authority false information regarding the contractor's drug-free workplace policy.

Pursuant to W. Va. Code 21-1D-2(b) and (k), this provision does not apply to public improvement contracts the value of which is \$100,000 or less or temporary or emergency repairs.

- 3. DRUG FREE WORKPLACE REPORT: Pursuant to W. Va. Code § 21-1D-7b, no less than once per year, or upon completion of the project, every contractor shall provide a certified report to the public authority which let the contract. For contracts over \$25,000, the public authority shall be the West Virginia Purchasing Division. For contracts of \$25,000 or less, the public authority shall be the agency issuing the contract. The report shall include:
 - (1) Information to show that the education and training service to the requirements of West Virginia Code § 21-1D-5 was provided;
 - (2) The name of the laboratory certified by the United States Department of Health and Human Services or its successor that performs the drug tests;
 - (3) The average number of employees in connection with the construction on the public improvement;
 - (4) Drug test results for the following categories including the number of positive tests and the number of negative tests: (A) Pre-employment and new hires; (B) Reasonable suspicion; (C) Post-accident; and (D) Random.

Vendor should utilize the attached Certified Drug Free Workplace Report Coversheet when submitting the report required hereunder, Pursuant to W. Va. Code 21-1D-2(b) and (k), this provision does not apply to public improvement contracts the value of which is \$100,000 or less or temporary or emergency repairs.

4. AIA DOCUMENTS: All construction contracts that will be completed in conjunction with architectural services procured under Chapter 5G of the West Virginia Code will be governed by the AIA A101-2007 and A201-2007 or the A107-2007 documents, as amended by the Supplementary Conditions for the State of West Virginia, in addition to the terms and conditions contained herein.

- 5. SUBCONTRACTOR LIST SUBMISSION: In accordance with W. Va. Code § 5-22-1, The apparent low bidder on a contract for the construction, alteration, decoration, painting or improvement of a new or existing building or structure valued at more than \$250,000.00 shall submit a list of all subcontractors who will perform more than \$25,000.00 of work on the project including labor and materials. This provision shall not apply to any other construction projects, such as highway, mine reclamation, water or sewer projects. Additionally, if no subcontractors who will perform more than \$25,000.00 of work are to be used to complete the project, it will be noted on the subcontractor list.
 - a. Required Information. The subcontractor list shall contain the following information:
 - i. Bidder's name
 - ii. Name of each subcontractor
 - iii. License numbers as required by W. Va. Code § 21-11-1 et. seq.
 - iv. Notation that no subcontractor will be used to perform more than \$25,000.00 of work, when applicable
 - b. Submission. The completed subcontractor list shall be provided to the Purchasing Division within one business day of the opening of bids for review. Failure to submit the subcontractor list within one business day after the deadline for submitting bids shall result in disqualification of the bid.
 - c. Substitution of Subcontractor. Written approval must be obtained from the State Spending
 - Unit before any subcontractor substitution is permitted. Substitutions are not permitted unless:
 - i. The subcontractor listed in the original bid has filed for bankruptcy;
 - ii. The subcontractor in the original bid has been debarred or suspended; or
 - iii. The contractor certifies in writing that the subcontractor listed in the original bill fails, is unable, or refuses to perform his subcontract.
- 6. GREEN BUILDINGS MINIMUM ENERGY STANDARDS: In accordance with § 22-29-4, all new building construction projects of public agencies that have not entered the schematic design phase prior to July 1, 2012, or any building construction project receiving state grant funds and appropriations, including public schools, that have not entered the schematic design phase prior to July 1, 2012, shall be designed and constructed complying with the ICC International Energy Conservation Code, adopted by the State Fire Commission, and the ANSI/ASHRAE/IESNA Standard 90.1-2007: Provided, That if any construction project has a commitment of federal funds to pay for a portion of such project, this provision shall only apply to the extent such standards are consistent with the federal standards.

SPECIFICATIONS

PURPOSE AND SCOPE: The West Virginia Purchasing Division is soliciting bids on behalf of the West Virginia Lottery to establish an open-end contract for ON-CALL Plumbing maintenance services twenty-four (24) hours per day, seven (7) days per week, three hundred sixty-five days (365) per year to include materials, parts, and labor for Lottery Headquarters located at 900 Pennsylvania Avenue, Charleston, West Virginia.

- 1. **DEFINITIONS:** The terms listed below shall have the meanings assigned to them below. Additional definitions can be found in section 2 of the General Terms and Conditions.
 - 1.1 "Plumbing Maintenance" means Preventative Maintenance and Corrective Maintenance services provided by the Vendor under this Contract, but shall not include an individual project that exceeds \$25,000 in total value including both parts and labor and shall not include the addition of new plumbing systems to increase the size or coverage area of the existing plumbing system.
 - 1.2 "Preventative Maintenance" mean the scheduled inspections and the replacement of parts, components, and materials on plumbing equipment prior to the failure or wearout period of the parts, components or materials in accordance with the equipment manufacturer's specifications and recommendations and any testing required to ensure that equipment is in proper working order.
 - 1.3 "Corrective Maintenance" means work performed on an as-requested basis to correct a malfunction or failure in the Plumbing System, and any necessary inspection or testing to identify a problem or ensure that a problem has been resolved.
 - 1.4 "Plumbing System" means all equipment, fixtures, pipes, drains, valves, and other components associated with clean water distribution throughout the building and removal of waste water from the building.
 - 1.5 "Pricing Pages" means the schedule of prices, estimated quantity, and totals attached hereto as Exhibit A and used to evaluate the RFQ.
 - 1.6 "Solicitation" means the official notice of an opportunity to supply the State with goods or services that is published by the Purchasing Division.

- 2. QUALIFICATIONS: Vendor, or Vendor's staff if requirements are inherently limited to individuals rather than corporate entities, shall have the following minimum qualifications:
 - 2.1. Experience: Vendor must have a minimum of five (5) years of experience in fully maintaining plumbing systems in commercial high-rise buildings and be certified as a plumber by the WV Division of Labor. Vendor should provide a copy of the certification provided by the WV Division of Labor with their bid response.
 - 2.2. Certifications: Vendor shall ensure that all Plumbing Maintenance performed under this Contract is performed by an appropriately licensed individual. Required licenses may include, but are not limited to the following:
 - 2.2.1 Plumbers WV Plumbers License
 - 2.2.2 Plumbing EPA608 Certification and Apprentice Certification or Completion of Plumbing Vocational Program.
 - 2.2.3 WV Contractor's License
 - 2.3 <u>Building Codes:</u> At a minimum, the Plumbing Maintenance shall comply with the State of West Virginia Building Code as well as the City of Charleston, West Virginia Building Code current editions of the applicable standards and codes in effect at the time of performance.
 - 2.4 Compliance: with experience requirements will be determined prior to contract award by the State through references provided by the Vendor with its bid or upon request, through knowledge or documentation of the Vendor's past projects, or some other method that the State determines to be acceptable. Vendor must provide any documentation requested by the State to assist in confirmation of compliance with this provision. References, documentation, or other information to confirm compliance with this experience requirement are preferred with the bid submission, but may be requested after bid opening and prior to contract award.

3. MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS:

- 3.1 Mandatory Contract Services Requirements and Deliverables: Contract Services must meet or exceed the mandatory requirements listed below.
 - 3.1.1 Plumbing Preventive Maintenance
 - 3.1.1.1 Vendor shall provide ON-CALL Plumbing Maintenance in accordance with manufacturer's recommendations and specifications.

- 3.1.1.2 Vendor shall furnish and install parts as necessary to keep the Plumbing System in the best possible working order.
- 3.1.1.3 At all times, the Vendor shall maintain the efficiency, speed and safety of the Plumbing System as designated by the original manufacturer specifications.
- 3.1.1.4 Vendor shall perform all necessary examinations and adjustments to maintain the Plumbing System.
- 3.1.1.5 Vendor shall furnish all equipment, tools, and parts necessary in the performance of the ON-CALL Plumbing Maintenance. Equipment and tools will be provided by the Vendor at no cost to the Agency.
- 3.1.1.6 Vendor shall provide non-reusable parts, components, and materials used in the scope of performing under this Contract at no cost to the Agency. Such items may include, but are not limited to, grease, cleaning supplies, rags, etc.
- 3.1.1.7 Vendor shall be responsible for replacement of ceiling grid and tiles should they become soiled or damaged by Vendor. Agency will make final determination whether to clean or replace on a case-by-case basis.
- 3.1.1.8 Vendor may only remove part or all of the Plumbing System from service for a period of 24 hours or more with written permission from the Agency. Any request to remove equipment for 24 hours or more must include a description of the work required and an estimate of the time it will be out of service.
- 3.1.1.9 Vendor shall maintain a continuous 24-hour emergency telephone service where they can be reached every day of the week, including Sundays and Holidays. Vendor shall establish a call down list or other procedure that will insure the quickest possible response time.
- 3.1.1.10 Vendor shall not perform any Plumbing Maintenance under this contract without prior approval from Agency.
- 3.1.1.11 The Lottery requires and will perform a criminal background investigation for each employee, as well as the employees of all

subcontractors, who will be required to enter the State of West Virginia office buildings as part of the project. The Lottery will not allow any vendor or subcontractor access to the building until the background investigations are complete.

- 3.1.1.12 Vendor's work shall be in strict accordance with the requirements of any and all City, County, State or Federal codes of law having jurisdiction, including all amendments and/or additions to the said codes, laws, requirements, and recommendations, the requirements and recommendations of local utility, the Lottery, and the Standard Building Code (SBC) and the Southern Building Code Congress International (SBCCI).
- 3.1.1.13 Vendor shall provide required materials/parts for Plumbing Maintenance at cost plus the proposed percentage mark-up on the pricing page. Copies of invoices for required materials/parts shall be submitted with the Vendor's invoice and request for reimbursement.
- 3.1.1.14 Emergency calls: emergency calls shall be performed when necessary to diagnose problems and perform adjustments. Emergency service must be available 365 days per year, 24 hours per day. Emergency work may be performed only upon written authorization from the Lottery prior to commencement of work.
- 3.1.1.15Vendor recognizes that during the course of this agreement, interfacing activities may be conducted by the Lottery's work forces and other contracted parties that may hinder their work. These activities may include but not be limited to, special events, landscape refurbishment, construction and/or storm-related operations. Vendor will be required to modify or curtail its operations during these periods and shall promptly comply with any request by the Lottery.
- 3.1.1.16 All damages to existing facilities caused by the Vendor or his employee or agents shall be repaired or replaced at the Vendor's expense. All damages caused by the vendor's action or inaction shall also be the vendor's responsibility.
- 3.1.1.17 Vendor agrees to perform all work outlined in this agreement in such a manner as to meet all accepted standards for safe practices during the maintenance operation and to safely maintain stored equipment, machines, and materials or other hazards consequential or related to the work; and agrees additionally to accept the sole

responsibility for complying with all local, County, State and other legal requirements including, but not limited to, full compliance with the terms of the applicable OSHA safety orders at all times to protect all persons including vendor's employees, agents of the Lottery, vendors, members of the public or others from foreseeable injury, or damage to their property. Vendor shall inspect all potential hazards at said facilities and keep a log indicating date inspected and action taken.

- 3.1.1.18 It shall be the vendor's responsibility to inspect and identify any condition(s) that renders any portion of the premises unsafe, as well as any unsafe practices occurring thereon. The Lottery shall be notified immediately of any unsafe condition that requires major correction.
- 3.1.1.19 Vendor shall take appropriate action under this contract concerning any employee, whose conduct or activity shall, in the reasonable exercise or discretion by the work, be deemed detrimental to the interest of the public patronizing the premises. Vendor shall take such appropriate action within a reasonable time following notice from the Lottery.
- 3.1.1.20 The Lottery reserves the right to request removal of any employee, should such action be considered necessary by the Lottery.
- 3.1.1.21 Maintenance service workers shall be required to wear a distinctive identification badge of a type selected by the vendor and approved by the Lottery.
- 3.1.1.22 Vendor shall not interfere with the public use of the premises and shall conduct operations as to offer the least possible obstruction and inconvenience to the public or disruption to the peace and quiet of the area within which the services are performed.

3.2 Plumbing Corrective Maintenance:

3.2.1 Vendor shall respond to Corrective Maintenance calls by phone or in person within two hours and must arrive on site to begin performance as soon as possible, but no later than four hours after Vendor is notified of the request. Vendor may only deviate from the required four hour response time with written permission from the Agency.

- 3.2.2 Corrective Maintenance must be performed between the hours of 8:00 A.M. EST. and 4:30 P.M. EST., Monday through Friday unless the Corrective Maintenance will cause disruption of business activity. Corrective Maintenance that would cause disruption of business activities during the regular business hours must be performed after 5:00 P.M. EST. daily, over weekends or on scheduled holidays.
- Agency may request Corrective Maintenance on an emergency basis by notifying the Vendor of the emergency. Vendor must respond to all emergency requests within 30 minutes of being notified of the emergency request and arrive on site to begin performance no later than two hours after being notified of the emergency. Emergency requests can be authorized by Ray Moore and/or David Oliverio.

3.3 Parts:

- 3.3.1 Vendor is responsible for procuring all necessary parts needed to perform Plumbing Maintenance under this Contract within the required time frames established herein. Vendor must, however, obtain advanced written approval from Agency prior to purchasing any part in excess of \$500.00
- 3.3.2 Vendor shall maintain a supply or inventory of routinely used replacement parts for the Plumbing equipment utilized by the Agency. All replacement parts shall be equal to or better than original manufacturer's parts.
- 3.3.3 Parts Warranty: The Vendor shall provide a copy of the manufacturer's warranty on parts with the invoice.
- 4. REPORTS: Vendor shall provide all of the reports as outlined below.
 - 4.1 Preventative Maintenance Log: Vendor shall provide and update a Preventative Maintenance performed under this Contract. The log must include the name of the individual performing the Preventative Maintenance, A description of the work performed a list of any parts that were repaired or replaced, the total time spent performing the he Preventative Maintenance log must include a listing of all Preventative Maintenance performed, Vendor shall also maintain a duplicate maintenance log that Vendor must submit to Agency on a monthly basis.
 - 4.2 Corrective Maintenance Log: Vendor shall maintain a log of all Corrective Maintenance performed under this Contract. The log must include the name of the

individual performing the Corrective Maintenance, a description of the work performed a list of any parts that were repaired or replaced, the total time spent performing the Corrective Maintenance, and the date and time Corrective Maintenance was performed. Vendor shall submit a copy of this log to Agency upon Agency's request.

4.3 Quarterly and Annual Reports: Vendor shall provide quarterly reports and annual summaries to the Agency, and to the Purchasing Division when requested, with a detailed listing of Plumbing Maintenance performed under this Contract during that period of time. The quarterly and annual reports must include a listing of the hours worked per project, the cost of hours worked per project, the total of all hours worked and corresponding cost, a listing of parts utilized per project, the total parts used for the period, the cost of parts for the period, a grand total of all costs for the period, and any other information that the Agency or Purchasing Division may request.

5. CONTRACT AWARD:

Contract Award: The Contract is intended to provide Agency with a purchase price for the Contract Services. The Contract shall be awarded to the Vendor that provides the Contract Services meeting the required specifications for the lowest overall Total Bid Amount as shown on the Pricing Pages.

5.1 Pricing Page: Vendor should complete the Pricing Pages (Exhibit A) by inserting the requested information in the appropriate location and performing the calculations necessary to arrive at a TOTAL BID AMOUNT. The requested information includes: an Hourly Labor Rate, a Percentage Markup, the Total Labor Cost, the Total Parts Cost, and the Total Bid Amount of labor and parts. Vendor should complete the Pricing Pages in its entirety as failure to do so may result in Vendor's bid being disqualified.

The Pricing Pages contain an estimated number of labor hours and an estimated cost for parts. The estimates for labor and parts represent an amount that will be utilized for evaluation purposes only. No future use of the Contract or any individual item is guaranteed or implied.

5.2 Vendor should type or electronically enter the information into the Pricing Pages to prevent errors in the evaluation. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Purchasing Division may correct errors at its discretion.

5.3 Vendor's who wish to respond to a Centralized Request for Quotation (CRFQ) online may submit information through the State's wvOASIS Vendor Self Service (VSS). Vendors should download the Exhibit "A": Pricing Page that is attached separately to the CRFQ and published to the VSS. Vendors must complete this form with their pricing information and include it as an attachment to their online response. Vendors submitting bids online should enter the Total Bid Amount from Exhibit A in the WVOasis Commodity Line.

Vendors must submit Exhibit "A" Pricing Page with their submitted bid response prior to bid opening date.

Hourly Labor Rate

Vendors should provide a single Flat Hourly Rate to cover on-call plumbing maintenance services. The Quantity of two hundred (200) hours is provided as an estimate only, used only for evaluating bids. No guaranteed quantity of requested hours is assumed, provided, or implied. Agency must pre-approve any hourly rate charges. Vendors should multiply their bid Hourly Labor Rate times the Quantity of two hundred (200) to calculate the Total Labor Cost.

Parts Markup

Vendors should provide a bid for their markup for parts (for which a charge is allowed per these specifications) provided. If responding on paper using the Exhibit A Pricing Page, vendors should provide the markup in terms of a decimal multiplier, as per the following example:

Example Markup bid = 15% Place decimal point in front of percentage digits to add to 1. Example multiplier would be 1.15. Vendors should then multiply the multiplier times the provided estimated Cost for parts of \$1,000.00, to arrive at the Total Parts Cost. The \$1,000.00 is only an estimate used for evaluating bids. No guaranteed quantity of requested parts is assumed, provided, or implied. Agency must pre-approve any parts charges.

Total Bid Amount

Vendors should add totals from Total Labor Cost and Total Parts Cost, to arrive at the Total Bid Amount. A + B + C = TOTAL BID AMOUNT. This is the amount the vendor's should put in Commodity Line if submitting their bid through wvOASIS.

6. PAYMENT and ORDERING:

6.1 Preventative Maintenance Ordering: After award of this Contract, Agency and Vendor shall agree upon a Preventative Maintenance schedule. The Agency shall then issue an ADO release order against this Contract covering the agreed upon

Preventative Maintenance to be performed. Agency shall not issue a release order that allows Preventative Maintenance performed under this Contract to exceed \$25,000 per project in total costs.

- 6.2 Corrective Maintenance Ordering: The Agency shall define the scope of each Corrective Maintenance project to be performed under this Contract and submit it to Vendor for a cost quote prior to Vendor's commencement of any work. The cost quote must detail the intended scope of work required to complete the project and contain an itemized listing of time and parts that will be required. If the Vendor's quote is satisfactory to the Agency, then Agency will issue an ADO allowing Vendor to commence work. This release order shall have a unique number, reference the master contract number, and detail the scope of work for the project in question. Issuance of the release order to the Contractor shall be considered authorization to begin work. If the Agency determines that the cost quote is not satisfactory, then Agency and Vendor shall work to obtain a satisfactory cost quote by modifying the project, requesting different parts, performing labor with state employees, or other methods that Agency and Vendor deem appropriate. Agency shall not issue a release order that allows Corrective Maintenance performed under this Contract to exceed \$25,000 per project in total cost.
- 6.3 Vendor is not permitted to perform any work other than that specified on the release order issued under section 9.1 or 9.2 of this Contract.
- 6.4 Issuance of multiple release orders to circumvent the \$25,000 per project limitation on Preventative Maintenance or Corrective Maintenance is strictly prohibited.
- 6.5 Change orders that cause Preventative Maintenance or Corrective Maintenance to exceed \$25,000 per project will not be permitted.
- 6.6 Payment: Vendor shall accept payment in accordance with the payment procedures of the State of West Virginia.


