

- 9. WORKERS' COMPENSATION INSURANCE: The apparent successful Vendor shall comply with laws relating to workers compensation, shall maintain workers' compensation insurance when required, and shall furnish proof of workers' compensation insurance upon request.

LITIGATION BOND: The Director reserves the right to require any Vendor that files a protest of an award to submit a litigation bond in the amount equal to one percent of the lowest bid submitted or \$5,000, whichever is greater. The entire amount of the bond shall be forfeited if the hearing officer determines that the protest was filed for frivolous or improper purpose, including but not limited to, the purpose of harassing, causing unnecessary delay, or needless expense for the Agency. - 22. COMPLIANCE: Vendor shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, regulations and ordinances. By submitting a bid, Vendor acknowledges that it has reviewed, understands, and will comply with all applicable laws, regulations, and ordinances.
- 23. ARBITRATION: Any references made to arbitration contained in this Contract, Vendor's bid, or in any American Institute of Architects documents pertaining to this Contract are hereby deleted, void, and of no effect.
- 24. MODIFICATIONS: This writing is the parties' final expression of intent. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Contract to the contrary no modification of this Contract shall be binding without mutual written consent of the Agency, and the Vendor, with approval of the Purchasing Division and the Attorney General's office (Attorney General approval is as to form only). Any change to existing contracts that adds work or changes contract cost, and were not included in the original contract, must be approved by the Purchasing Division and the Attorney General's Office (as to form) prior to the implementation of the change or commencement of work affected by the change.

- 25. WAIVER: The failure of either party to insist upon a strict performance of any of the terms or provision of this Contract, or to exercise any option, right, or remedy herein contained, shall not be construed as a waiver or a relinquishment for the future of such term, provision, option, right, or remedy, but the same shall continue in full force and effect. Any waiver must be expressly stated in writing and signed by the waiving party.
- 26. SUBSEQUENT FORMS: The terms and conditions contained in this Contract shall supersede any and all subsequent terms and conditions which may appear on any form documents submitted by Vendor to the Agency or Purchasing Division such as price lists, order forms, invoices, sales agreements, or maintenance agreements, and includes internet websites or other electronic documents. Acceptance or use of Vendor's forms does not constitute acceptance of the terms and conditions contained thereon.
- 27. ASSIGNMENT: Neither this Contract nor any monies due, or to become due hereunder, may be assigned by the Vendor without the express written consent of the Agency, the Purchasing Division, the Attorney General's office (as to form only), and any other government agency or office that may be required to approve such assignments. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Purchasing Division approval may or may not be required on certain agency delegated or exempt purchases.
- 28. WARRANTY: The Vendor expressly warrants that the goods and/or services covered by this Contract will: (a) conform to the specifications, drawings, samples, or other description furnished or specified by the Agency; (b) be merchantable and fit for the purpose intended; and (c) be free from defect in material and workmanship.
- 29. STATE EMPLOYEES: State employees are not permitted to utilize this Contract for personal use and the Vendor is prohibited from permitting or facilitating the same.
- 30. BANKRUPTCY: In the event the Vendor files for bankruptcy protection, the State of West Virginia may deem this Contract null and void, and terminate this Contract without notice.
- 31. PRIVACY, SECURITY, AND CONFIDENTIALITY: The Vendor agrees that it will not disclose to anyone, directly or indirectly, any such personally identifiable information or other confidential information gained from the Agency, unless the individual who is the subject of the information consents to the disclosure in writing or the disclosure is made pursuant to the Agency's policies, procedures, and rules. Vendor further agrees to comply with the Confidentiality Policies and Information Security Accountability Requirements, set forth in <a href="http://www.state.wv.us/admin/purchase/privacy/default.html">http://www.state.wv.us/admin/purchase/privacy/default.html</a>.

32. YOUR SUBMISSION IS A PUBLIC DOCUMENT: Vendor's entire response to the Solicitation and the resulting Contract are public documents. As public documents, they will be disclosed to the public following the bid/proposal opening or award of the contract, as required by the competitive bidding laws of West Virginia Code §§ 5A-3-1 et seq., 5-22-1 et seq., and 5G-1-1 et seq. and the Freedom of Information Act West Virginia Code §§ 29B-1-1 et seq.

Submission of any bid, proposal, or other document to the Purchasing Division constitutes your explicit consent to the subsequent public disclosure of the bid, proposal, or document. The Purchasing Division will disclose any document labeled "confidential," "proprietary," "trade secret," "private," or labeled with any other claim against public disclosure of the documents, to include any "trade secrets" as defined by West Virginia Code § 47-22-1 et seq. All submissions are subject to public disclosure without notice.

- 33. LICENSING: In accordance with West Virginia Code of State Rules § 148-1-6.1.e, Vendor must be licensed and in good standing in accordance with any and all state and local laws and requirements by any state or local agency of West Virginia, including, but not limited to, the West Virginia Secretary of State's Office, the West Virginia Tax Department, West Virginia Insurance Commission, or any other state agency or political subdivision. Upon request, the Vendor must provide all necessary releases to obtain information to enable the Purchasing Division Director or the Agency to verify that the Vendor is licensed and in good standing with the above entities.
- 34. ANTITRUST: In submitting a bid to, signing a contract with, or accepting a Award Document from any agency of the State of West Virginia, the Vendor agrees to convey, sell, assign, or transfer to the State of West Virginia all rights, title, and interest in and to all causes of action it may now or hereafter acquire under the antitrust laws of the United States and the State of West Virginia for price fixing and/or unreasonable restraints of trade relating to the particular commodities or services purchased or acquired by the State of West Virginia. Vendor shall be responsible for selecting, supervising, and compensating any and all individuals employed pursuant to the terms of this Solicitation and resulting contract. Neither the Vendor, nor any employees or subcontractors of the Vendor, shall be deemed to be employees of the State for any purpose whatsoever. Vendor shall be exclusively responsible for payment of employees and contractors for all wages and salaries, taxes, withholding payments, penalties, fees, fringe benefits, professional liability insurance premiums, contributions to insurance and pension, or other deferred compensation plans, including but not limited to, Workers' Compensation and Social Security obligations, licensing fees, etc. and the filing of all necessary documents, forms, and returns pertinent to all of the foregoing.

Vendor shall hold harmless the State, and shall provide the State and Agency with a defense against any and all claims including, but not limited to, the foregoing payments, withholdings, contributions, taxes, Social Security taxes, and employer income tax returns.

- 37. Any extension of this Contract to the aforementioned Other Government Entities must be on the same prices, terms, and conditions as those offered and agreed to in this Contract, provided that such extension is in compliance with the applicable laws, rules, and ordinances of the Other Government Entity. If the Vendor does not wish to extend the prices, terms, and conditions of its bid and subsequent contract to the Other Government Entities, the Vendor must clearly indicate such refusal in its bid. A refusal to extend this Contract to the Other Government Entities shall not impact or influence the award of this Contract in any manner.
- 40. CONFLICT OF INTEREST: Vendor, its officers or members or employees, shall not presently have or acquire an interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict with or compromise the performance of its obligations hereunder. Vendor shall periodically inquire of its officers, members and employees to ensure that a conflict of interest does not arise. Any conflict of interest discovered shall be promptly presented in detail to the Agency.
- 41. REPORTS: Vendor shall provide the Agency and/or the Purchasing Division with the following reports identified by a checked box below:
- Such reports as the Agency and/or the Purchasing Division may request. Requested reports may include, but are not limited to, quantities purchased, agencies utilizing the contract, total contract expenditures by agency, etc.

- 42. BACKGROUND CHECK: In accordance with W. Va. Code § 15-2D-3, the Director of the Division of Protective Services shall require any service provider whose employees are regularly employed on the grounds or in the buildings of the Capitol complex or who have access to sensitive or critical information to submit to a fingerprint-based state and federal background inquiry through the state repository. The service provider is responsible for any costs associated with the fingerprint-based state and federal background inquiry.

- 43. PREFERENCE FOR USE OF DOMESTIC STEEL PRODUCTS: Except when authorized by the Director of the Purchasing Division pursuant to W. Va. Code § 5A-3-56, no contractor may use or supply steel products for a State Contract Project other than those steel products made in the United States. A contractor who uses steel products in violation of this section may be subject to civil penalties pursuant to W. Va. Code § 5A-3-56. As used in this section:
- a. "State Contract Project" means any erection or construction of, or any addition to, alteration of or other improvement to any building or structure, including, but not limited to, roads or highways, or the installation of any heating or cooling or ventilating plants or other equipment, or the supply of and materials for such projects, pursuant to a contract with the State of West Virginia for which bids were solicited on or after June 6, 2001.
- b. "Steel Products" means products rolled, formed, shaped, drawn, extruded, forged, cast, fabricated or otherwise similarly processed, or processed by a combination of two or more or such operations, from steel made by the open heath, basic oxygen, electric furnace, Bessemer or other steel making process. The Purchasing Division Director may, in writing, authorize the use of foreign steel products if:
- c. The cost for each contract item used does not exceed one tenth of one percent (.1%) of the total contract cost or two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00), whichever is greater. For the purposes of this section, the cost is the value of the steel product as delivered to the project; or d. The Director of the Purchasing Division determines that specified steel materials are not produced in the United States in sufficient quantity or otherwise are not reasonably available to meet contract requirements.

44. PREFERENCE FOR USE OF DOMESTIC ALUMINUM, GLASS, AND STEEL: In Accordance with W. Va. Code § 5-19-1 et seq., and W. Va. CSR § 148-10-1 et seq., for every contract or subcontract, subject to the limitations contained herein, for the construction, reconstruction, alteration, repair, improvement or maintenance of public works or for the purchase of any item of machinery or equipment to be used at sites of public works, only domestic aluminum, glass or steel products shall be supplied unless the spending officer determines, in writing, after the receipt of offers or bids, (1) that the cost of domestic aluminum, glass or steel products is unreasonable or inconsistent with the public interest of the State of West Virginia, (2) that domestic aluminum, glass or steel products are not produced in sufficient quantities to meet the contract requirements, or (3) the available domestic aluminum, glass, or steel do not meet the contract specifications. This provision only applies to public works contracts awarded in an amount more than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) or public works contracts that require more than ten thousand pounds of steel products.

The cost of domestic aluminum, glass, or steel products may be unreasonable if the cost is more than twenty percent (20%) of the bid or offered price for foreign made aluminum, glass, or steel products. If the domestic aluminum, glass or steel products to be supplied or produced in a "substantial labor surplus area", as defined by the United States Department of Labor, the cost of domestic aluminum, glass, or steel products may be unreasonable if the cost is more than thirty percent (30%) of the bid or offered price for foreign made aluminum, glass, or steel products. This preference shall be applied to an item of machinery or equipment, as indicated above, when the item is a single unit of equipment or machinery manufactured primarily of aluminum, glass or steel, is part of a public works contract and has the sole purpose or of being a permanent part of a single public works project. This provision does not apply to equipment or machinery purchased by a spending unit for use by that spending unit and not as part of a single public works project.

All bids and offers including domestic aluminum, glass or steel products that exceed bid or offer prices including foreign aluminum, glass or steel products after application of the preferences provided in this provision may be reduced to a price equal to or lower than the lowest bid or offer price for foreign aluminum, glass or steel products plus the applicable preference. If the reduced bid or offer prices are made in writing and supersede the prior bid or offer prices, all bids or offers, including the reduced bid or offer prices, will be reevaluated in accordance with this rule.

#### **SPECIFICATIONS**

1. PURPOSE AND SCOPE: The West Virginia Purchasing Division is soliciting bids on behalf of the West Virginia Office of Technology to establish a contract for a complete one time full string replacement of eighty (80) - 12V UPS (Uninterruptable Power System) ENERSYS HX505 batteries, all Power AC and DC filter capacitors, and all fans; and a continuing maintenance agreement for a Liebert Series 610 UPS system for one year, with the option to renew maintenance agreement annually for three additional years.

CURRENT ENVIRONMENT: The State currently owns one (1) Liebert Series 610 UPS system located at the State's primary Data Center in Charleston, WV. The 610 UPS system is composed of one (1) 610 System Control Cabinet (model U39CC8004CT223), two (2) S600T Multi-Module Systems (each model U39MM154A0CA223), and two (2) Liebert battery cabinets (each model U36BP150WXBNUUU), each containing forty (40) ENERSYS HX505 batteries (model XH505). The (80) batteries, the AC and DC capacitors, and the fans are near the end of their usable life and must be replaced.

- 2. **DEFINITIONS:** The terms listed below shall have the meanings assigned to them below. Additional definitions can be found in section 2 of the General Terms and Conditions.
  - 2.1 "Agency" means the West Virginia Office of Technology (WVOT).
  - 2.2 "Contract" means the binding agreement that is entered into between the State and the Vendor to provide the items requested in this solicitation.

  - 2.8 "Battery" means two or more electrochemical cells connected together electrically.
  - 2.9 "Jar" means a container that holds a cell or group of cells.

- 3. QUALIFICATIONS: Vendor, or Vendor's staff if requirements are inherently limited to individuals rather than corporate entities, shall have the following minimum qualifications:
  - 3.1. Authorization: Vendor must be certified (where required), authorized, and qualified to perform the battery replacement, repairs, testing, maintenance and services listed in this solicitation by the UPS Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM) and appropriate governing organizations.

#### 4. MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS:

The Vendor shall provide all hardware, software, and services necessary for the one time replacement of the existing eighty (80) batteries (model HX505, type VRLA), and all fans and AC / DC capacitors, and provide maintenance to the Liebert Series 610 UPS for one year (which may be renewed annually for three additional years at no additional cost per contract year).
    - 4.1.1.1 Battery Replacement: The Vendor must replace the existing eighty (80) batteries using: Enersys DataSafe HX part number 12HX505-FR, "or Equal". Requirements include:
      - 4.1.1.1.1 The Vendor shall configure the UPS system for continuation of inline power to the equipment serviced (by the Liebert Series 610 UPS system) throughout the entire replacement process.
      - 4.1.1.2 The replacement of all batteries will take place on a weekday of the State's choosing during normal business hours.
      - 4.1.1.3 The replacement of the batteries will not be on the same weekday as the fans and capacitor replacement as described in Section 4.1.1.2, but will be considered a separate activity.
      - 4.1.1.4 Batteries shall have a minimum of ten (10) year design life.
      - 4.1.1.1.5 Battery warranty: minimum of a three (3) year agreement.

- **4.1.1.1.6** Batteries must meet or exceed Liebert Series 610 UPS system) Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM) requirements.
- 4.1.1.7 Battery submittal shall utilize the same hardware, the same cabling, and shall require no "fitting" of mounting area for use. However, the Vendor will use any new hardware supplied with the batteries, if duplicate.
- 4.1.1.1.8 Battery shall not require changes to the system for use. The existing UPS system must accept the units with no alterations (hardware or software) required.
- 4.1.1.1.9 Battery submittal shall include appropriate recombination, thermal runaway prevention, gassing and flame retardant characteristics.
- **4.1.1.1.10** Battery submittal shall be a Valve Regulated Lead Acid Battery type, and, shall be designed for UPS Standby Power Applications.
- 4.1.1.11 Batteries: Watts per Cell @ 77 degrees F. rated at 506. Operating time (to 1.67 end voltage per cell) is 15 minutes for this rating.
- **4.1.1.1.12** Batteries shall have UL recognized flame arresting ventilation.
- 4.1.1.1.13 Batteries shall have a flame retardant enclosure.
- **4.1.1.1.14** Batteries shall be installed in the exact same orientation as the old batteries.
- 4.1.1.15 Vendor will torque all connections to the specific 'inchpound' requirement specified by the battery manufacturer.
- 4.1.1.16 Vendor will ensure the newly installed batteries are fully charged after installation, and will record all temperatures, charging currents, voltages, internal resistance (ohm) readings, etc. after installation.
- **4.1.1.17** Battery Enclosure Dimensions (not to exceed): (13.31") overall length x (6.81") width x (10.71") overall height.
- 4.1.1.18 Terminal Fastener Thread Specification: Recessed Threaded M6 Terminal.
- 4.1.1.1.19 The proposed replacement of the (80) batteries shall include delivery of new units to the interior basement UPS room of the building, installation in the system, and removal of existing batteries. The Vendor will be responsible for providing for all shipping provisions, vehicles and/or equipment necessary to deliver the equipment. There is a loading dock at the building where the equipment is located. The dock area is accessible by tractor-trailer. The dock itself is approximately four (4)

- feet high. There are no tight turns, carpet, or other such obstacles between the loading dock and the equipment.
- **4.1.1.1.20** Replacement of batteries within forty-five (45) days of the award of this contract.
- 4.1.1.21 The Vendor shall warrant and maintain the (80) batteries for (36) months after installation. During this (36) month period, the Vendor shall make any necessary repairs, replace any defective parts, perform preventative maintenance, install engineering changes and modifications, and otherwise maintain the (80) batteries at no cost to the Agency.
- 4.1.1.22 In addition to the above specifications, the Vendor will perform, at a minimum, the battery replacement tasks as identified in ATTACHMENT B.
- 4.1.1.1.23 Proper UPS Battery Disposal.
  - 4.1.1.23.1 The Vendor will dispose of each battery unit (80 battery units in all) that is removed by wrapping the batteries in plastic on pallets, removing the pallets from the premises, and disposing of the batteries.
  - 4.1.1.23.2 Battery removal and disposal shall be performed according to all applicable regulations: local, state, federal, etc.
  - 4.1.1.23.3 The Vendor will include the total cost for battery disposal in bid price submittal for "Battery Replacement".

### 4.1.1.2 Fan and Capacitor Replacement Requirements:

- 4.1.1.2.1 The Vendor must replace all existing AC and DC capacitors, and all fans in each of the two (2) S600T Multi-Module Systems (each model U39MM154A0CA223).
- 4.1.1.2.2 The replacement of all capacitors and fans will take place on a weekday of the State's choosing during normal business hours.
- 4.1.1.2.3 The replacement of all capacitors and fans will not be on the same weekday as the battery replacement as described in Section 4.1.1.1, but will be considered a separate activity.
- 4.1.1.2.4 The Vendor must have authorized access to OEM technical information, specifications, and quantities for the fans and capacitors.
- 4.1.1.2.5 The Vendor must have authorized access to OEM equipment service history.

- 4.1.1.2.6 Vendor personnel must be trained and authorized by the OEM to properly service the equipment based on the requirements of this solicitation and applicable safety concerns.
- 4.1.1.3 Preventative Maintenance: The preventative maintenance tasks for the Liebert Series 610 UPS system must include:
  - 4.1.1.3.1 One (1) UPS preventative maintenance visit, to be accomplished at the midpoint of the first year of that maintenance coverage.
  - 4.1.1.3.2 One (1) separate preventative battery maintenance visit to be scheduled no more than one (1) month following the Liebert Series 610 UPS system preventative maintenance visit.
  - 4.1.1.3.3 The maintenance agreement for the Liebert Series 610 UPS system will begin once the (80) batteries model ENERSYS HX505 have been installed and accepted (this applies to the first year of the maintenance agreement only).
  - 4.1.1.3.4 All preventative maintenance services will be scheduled by the State between 8 a.m. 5 p.m., Monday through Friday (excluding national holidays).
  - 4.1.1.3.5 In addition to the above specifications, the Vendor will perform, at a minimum, the preventative maintenance tasks as identified in ATTACHMENT B.

### 4.1.2 Service and Support:

- 4.1.2.1 The Vendor must provide guaranteed support services. This service must be 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year critical-response time of eight (8) hours (excluding original installation of (80) batteries model ENERSYS HX505). The determination of what qualifies as a critical event is at the sole discretion of the WVOT.
- **4.1.2.2** Note that "Service and Support" is a component of all items listed under section 4.1.1 and will be provided for one (1) year beginning on the acceptance date of the battery units.
- 4.1.2.3 Service and Support will include all labor and materials required to maintain covered items in a proper operational state.

### 4.1.3 System Acceptance:

- 4.1.3.1 The agency will formally accept the batteries after they have been installed and confirmed to be working properly for 30 days from the installation date without any problems, outages or failures.
- 4.1.3.2 The agency will formally accept the fans and capacitors after they have been installed and confirmed to be working properly for 30 days from the installation date without any problems, outages or failures.

## 4.1.4 Renewal of the Maintenance Agreement for the Liebert Series 610 UPS system:

- 4.1.4.1 Optional Renewal of the maintenance agreement for the Liebert Series 610 UPS system (all items listed under 4.1.1.3) Year "2".
- 4.1.4.2 Optional Renewal of the maintenance agreement for the Liebert Series 610 UPS system (all items listed under 4.1.1.3) Year "3".
- 4.1.4.3 Optional Renewal of the maintenance agreement for the Liebert Series 610 UPS system (all items listed under 4.1.1.3) Year "4".

#### 5. CONTRACT AWARD:

- 5.1 Contract Award: The Contract is intended to provide the Agency with a purchase price for the Items listed and Contract Services. The Contract shall be awarded to the Vendor that provides the Items listed and Contract Services meeting the required specifications for the lowest overall total cost.
- 5.2 Pricing Page: Vendor should complete the Pricing Sheet (Exhibit A) by inserting the unit price values in the cells provided. The Extended Unit Price value will be the result of multiplying the quantity by the unit price. Vendor should complete the Pricing Sheet in full as failure to complete the Pricing Sheet, Exhibit A, in its entirety may result in Vendor's bid being disqualified.

#### 10. VENDOR DEFAULT:

- 10.1. The following shall be considered a vendor default under this Contract.
  - 10.1.1. Failure to perform Contract Services in accordance with the requirements contained herein.
  - 10.1.2. Failure to comply with other specifications and requirements contained herein.
  - 10.1.3. Failure to comply with any laws, rules, and ordinances applicable to the Contract Services provided under this Contract.
  - 10.1.4. Failure to remedy deficient performance upon request.
- 10.2. The following remedies shall be available to Agency upon default.
  - 10.2.1. Immediate cancellation of the Contract.

  - 10.2.3. Any other remedies available in law or equity.

#### 11. DELIVERY AND RETURN:

- 11.1. Shipment and Delivery: Vendor shall ship the Contract Items immediately after being awarded this Contract and receiving a purchase order or notice to proceed. Vendor shall deliver the Contract Items (hardware and software necessary for replacement of the (80) batteries) within forty-five (45) working days after receiving a purchase order or notice to proceed. Contract Items must be delivered to Agency at Building 6, Room B-110, 1900 Kanawha Blvd E., Charleston, WV 25305 (inside the basement UPS room). Vendor shall verify the West Virginia State contact and shipping information prior to shipment.
- 11.2. Late Delivery: The Agency placing the order under this Contract must be notified in writing if the shipment of the Contract Items will be delayed for any reason. Any delay in delivery that could cause harm to an Agency will be grounds for cancellation of the Contract, and/or obtaining the Contract Items from a third party.

Any Agency seeking to obtain the Contract Items from a third party under this provision must first obtain approval of the Purchasing Division.

11.3. Delivery Payment/Risk of Loss: Vendor shall deliver the Contract Items F.O.B. destination to the Agency's location.

- 11.4. Return of Unacceptable Items: If the Agency deems the Contract Items to be unacceptable, the Contract Items shall be returned to Vendor at Vendor's expense and with no restocking charge. Vendor shall either make arrangements for the return within five (5) days of being notified that items are unacceptable, or permit the Agency to arrange for the return and reimburse Agency for delivery expenses. If the original packaging cannot be utilized for the return, Vendor will supply the Agency with appropriate return packaging upon request. All returns of unacceptable items shall be F.O.B. the Agency's location. The returned product shall either be replaced, or the Agency shall receive a full credit or refund for the purchase price, at the Agency's discretion.
- 11.5. Return Due to Agency Error: Items ordered in error by the Agency will be returned for credit within 30 days of receipt, F.O.B. Vendor's location. Vendor shall not charge a restocking fee if returned products are in a resalable condition. Items shall be deemed to be in a resalable condition if they are unused and in the original packaging. Any restocking fee for items not in a resalable condition shall be the lower of the Vendor's customary restocking fee or 5% of the total invoiced value of the returned items.

### Batteries - Quarterly Service

- 1. Inspect the appearance at cleanliness of the battery and the battery room. Clean normal jar top dirt accumulation.
- 2. Visually inspect the jars and covers for cracks and leakage.
- 3. Visually inspect for evidence of corrosion.
- 4. Verify the integrity of the battery rack / cabinet.
- 5. Measure and record the total battery float voltage and charging current.
- 6. Measure and record the overall AC ripple voltage and ripple current.
- 7. Measure and record the ambient temperature.
- 8. Measure and record 100% of the jar temperatures.
- 9. Measure and record the float voltage of all jars.
- 10. Measure and record all internal ohmic readings.
- Provide a written report noting any deficiencies and corrective action needed, taken, or planned.

### Batteries - Annual Service

- 1. Perform tasks as specified in 'Batteries Quarterly Service' above, plus the following tasks.

An employer is not in employer default if it has entered into a repayment agreement with the insurance Commissioner and remains in compliance with the obligations under the repayment agreement.

"Related party" means a party, whether an individual, corporation, partnership, association, limited liability company or any other form or business association or other entity whatsoever, related to any vendor by blood, marriage, ownership or contract through which the party has a relationship of ownership or other interest with the vendor so that the party will actually or by effect receive or control a portion of the benefit, profit or other consideration from performance of a vendor contract with the party receiving an amount that meets or exceed five percent of the total contract amount.

AFFIRMATION: By signing this form, the vendor's authorized signer affirms and acknowledges under penalty of law for false swearing (W. Va.
