PURCHASING AFFIDAVIT

CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTS: Under W. Va. Code § 5-22-1(i), the contracting public entity shall not award a construction contract to any bidder that is known to be in default on any monetary obligation owed to the state or a political subdivision of the state, including, but not limited to, obligations related to payroll taxes, property taxes, sales and use taxes, fire service fees, or other fines or fees.

ALL CONTRACTS: Under W. Va. Code §5A-3-10a, no contract or renewal of any contract may be awarded by the state or any of its political subdivisions to any vendor or prospective vendor when the vendor or prospective vendor or a related party to the vendor or prospective vendor is a debtor and: (1) the debt owed is an amount greater than one thousand dollars in the aggregate; or (2) the debtor is in employer default.

EXCEPTION: The prohibition listed above does not apply where a vendor has contested any tax administered pursuant to chapter eleven of the W. Va. Code, workers' compensation premium, permit fee or environmental fee or assessment and the matter has not become final or where the vendor has entered into a payment plan or agreement and the vendor is not in default of any of the provisions of such plan or agreement.

- **3.1** Health Research Systems has provided drug and alcohol testing services for over 25 years. All collectors are certified as required by Title 49 CFR Part 40.
- **3.2** HRS, along with Clear Star Logistics MRO services, Clinical Reference Laboratories, utilizing Compliance Information Systems "Assistant PRO" software, offers a total drug and alcohol program management package. This package is designed for companies who have employees regulated by the USDOT. The program also covers those non-regulated employees needing drug testing for random, pre-employment and other drug testing situations as required by WV State Tax Division policy.
- **4.1.1** HRS along with Med Express can provide scheduled service Monday through Friday, between 7:00 am and 8:00 pm.

- **4.1.9.4** HRS will follow the US Department of Transportation collection protocols provided in 49 CFR Part 40 with respect to conduction workplace drug testing, for collecting and storing urine specimens, testing for drugs and ensuring confidentiality.
- **4.1.9.5** HRS will collect specimens on WV State Tax Division premises, or make other arrangements with the WV State Tax Division and HRS will provide for all conditions of privacy, confidentiality and chain of custody.
- **4.1.9.6** HRS will comply with all applicable laws, regulations, and industry standards relating to drug and alcohol testing.


- **4.1.9.7** HRS will ensure that collection site personnel are all trained in compliance with Title 40 CFR part 40 and shall be regularly engaged in the business of providing the required drug and alcohol testing.
- **4.1.9.8** HRS will provide all forms, collection kits, and miscellaneous supplies for the collection, transportation, and analysis of the specimens.
- **4.1.9.9** HRS will provide expert witness testimony regarding the results and accuracy of specific employee testing should the results and subsequent actions be challenged by the employee.
- **4.1.10.1** HRS utilizes the Alco Sensor VXL for on-site alcohol testing. It is found on the Conforming Product List using the collection protocols found in 49 CFR Part 40.
- **4.1.10.2** HRS will provide for a confirmatory alcohol test on all breath concentrations minimum of .020 or higher using the regulations found in 49 CFR Part 40.
- **4.1.10.3** HRS will provide for collection of urine on-site in compliance with 49 CFR Part 40.
- **4.1.10.4** HRS will provide preliminary drug test results on-site utilizing an instant device. However, HRS does not recommend the use of instant devices as they do not have the lab analysis to support the result findings.
- **4.1.10.5** HRS will utilize the split sample method of collection, handling and storage in compliance with 49 CFR Part 40.
- **4.1.10.6** HRS will utilize Clinical Reference Laboratory which is a SAMHSA-certified laboratory. Clinical Reference Laboratory will test and store specimens (primary and split) and have in place equipment that meets applicable regulations. Proof of SAMHSA certification is attached to this response in the Exhibits section.
- **4.1.10.7** HRS will utilize Fed Ex for transportation of all specimens to the appropriate testing laboratory in accordance with 49 CFR Part 40.
- **4.1.10.8** HRS will submit blind performance test specimens to the laboratory. HRS utilizes Protox for this service. The results will be delivered and billed to the WV State Tax Division Operations Division.
- **4.1.10.9** HRS will perform a chemical analyses of specimens to determine whether the person from whom the specimen was taken has been using any of the following drugs: Amphetamines, Cocaine, Opiates, Phencyclidines (PCP), Barbiturates, Benzodiazepines, Methadone, Propoxyphene and Methaqualone.
- **4.1.10.10** HRS will provide a confirmatory test on all positive drug screens using gas chromatography/mass spectrometry technology, or other acceptable method that meets industry standard.
- **4.1.10.11** HRS will provide a Certified Medical Review Officer (MRO) that is certified in accordance with 49 CFR Part 40. HRS utilizes Clear Star as their MRO. Proof of MRO Certification can be found in the Exhibits section of this response.

- **4.1.10.12** HRS will provide test result to WV State Tax Division Director of Operations or his/her designee via confidential means, immediately upon confirmation by the MRO, but not later than 5:00 pm on the third business day following the date of a test. If not reported timely, HRS recognizes that the WV State Tax Division will not be charged for the test.
- 4.1.10.13 HRS will report results as Negative, Positive, Abnormal or safety concern.
- **4.1.10.14** HRS acknowledges if a WV State Tax Division employee or prospective employee wishes to challenge a positive test result, such re-testing must be conducted from the same specimen that was originally taken, and the cost of which shall be borne by the employee or prospective employee. WV State Tax Division will not be responsible for the cost of these re-tests. Additionally, arrangements for re-testing and payment are to be made by HRS and the employee or prospective employee.

Specimen Collection, Laboratory, and Results Reporting

Breath alcohol testing and urine collection for drug screening requires trained, professional Breath Alcohol Technicians (BATs) and collectors. Supervisor Required for Mobile Collections

No collection event will be started or conducted without the presence of the organization's site supervisor who is in charge of the testing program for that site.

Adulteration Assays

The laboratory performs any required specimen adulteration assays necessary at no extra charge.

Rejected Specimens

If the client or laboratory reports troubled and/or rejected specimens these reports are sent to the Operations Manager. Upon receipt of this information several measures are taken to correct the error with the collector and to coordinate a second specimen being collected. In addition if troubled specimens can be salvaged by affidavit it is secured as soon as possible and forwarded to the appropriate entity (lab, MRO, client). After the immediate intervention has occurred the collector will be referred for retraining if needed. The rejected specimens will not result in fees to WV State Tax Division.

Service times and 24 hour Emergency Services

HRS uses the client's on-site facilities and local Med Express, i.e. WV State Tax Division locations with office and restroom or other suitable facility, to perform these collections. HRS will provide trained and certified BATs and specimen collectors for on-site collections utilizing personnel from HRS's branch offices in Huntington, WV from 7:00a.m. to 5:00p.m. Monday through Friday. After hours services can also be arranged as necessary.

HRS's Huntington branch office is located at 821 Sixth Avenue, Huntington, West Virginia 25701, and the toll-free phone number is 1-800-442-3926. The hours of operation are 8:00 am - 5:00 pm Monday through Friday. The Huntington branch office will be responsible for the day-to-day operations of your program.

The laboratory performs any required specimen adulteration assays necessary at no extra charge.

The laboratory retains custody of any positive urine specimen under properly secured refrigerated conditions in accordance with established governmental regulations (at the least a minimum of one year). Any urine specimen which does not test positive upon confirmation is destroyed in accordance with governmental regulations.

Within 24 hours of completion of a test negative results are available to be downloaded from the laboratory computer to ClearStar. Negative results will be downloaded to ClearStar, sorted and reviewed, and available to the client within 48 business hours.

All laboratory-positive results will be downloaded to ClearStar for review. In the event of a laboratory positive the MRO will perform a telephonic interview with the donor to

determine any "legitimate" causes (prescription medication, food sources, etc.). If necessary, the donor may be requested to provide proof of prescription, or medical records. The MRO may find it necessary to speak with the donor's pharmacy or physician to verify medical history.

Actual personal interview of donor is rarely necessary and is in fact discouraged by most MROs. About the only time an MRO may find it necessary for an actual physical examination is in the event of a positive laboratory test for opiates; i.e. heroin. If the donor's medical and personal history warrants the MRO may decide upon a physical examination for such drug use signs as "needle tracts," skin tone, etc. In that case the MRO would contact a physician licensed in the appropriate state to perform a physical examination on a contracted basis.

Laboratory test result information must first be matched with the MRO copy of the custody and control (COC) form before results can be reported from the MRO to WV State Tax Division. Once the review process has been completed these results are available in 48 business hours.

ClearStar MRO adheres to strict rules of confidentiality. Test results of the WV State Tax Division will not be released without the prior consent of the WV State Tax Division program coordinator.

MRO Credentials are included in the Exhibits Section.

Other Relevant Services

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: On November 5, 1973, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) published the Standards for Devices to Measure Breath Alcohol (38 FR 30459). A Qualified Products List of Evidential Breath Measurement Devices comprised of instruments that met this standard was first issued on November 21, 1974 (39 FR 41399).

On December 14, 1984 (49 FR 48854), NHTSA converted this standard to Model Specifications for Evidential Breath Testing Devices (Model Specifications), and published a Conforming Products List (CPL) of instruments that were found to conform to the Model Specifications as Appendix D to that notice. Those instruments are identified on the CPL with an asterisk.

On September 17, 1993, NHTSA published a notice to amond the Model Specifications (58 FR 48705) and to update the CPL. That notice changed the alcohol concentration levels at which instruments are evaluated, from 0.000, 0.050, 0.101, and 0.151 BAC, to 0.000,

0.020, 0.040, 0.080, and 0.160 BAC, respectively. It also included a test for the presence of acetone and an expanded definition of alcohol to include other low molecular weight alcohols, e.g., methyl or isopropyl. Since that time, the CPL has been annotated to indicate which instruments have been determined to meet the Model Specifications published in 1984. and which have been determined to meet the Model Specifications, as revised and published in 1993. Thereafter, NHTSA has periodically updated the CPL with those breath instruments found to conform to the Model Specifications. The most recent update to the CPL was published June 14, 2012 (77 FR 35747).

NHTSA published the 1974 Qualified Products List, the 1984 CPL and all succeeding updates to the CPL in the Federal Register. Future updates of the CPL will be posted on the NHTSA Web site (https://www.nhtsa.dot.gov/drunk-driving/alcohol-measurement-devices) rather than to the Federal Register. Online publication will make it easier for users to access the most recent CPL and will allow NHTSA to make more timely updates to the CPL. NHTSA will continue to publish any amendments to the Model Specifications in the Federal

Register.

The CPL published today adds twelve (12) new instruments that have been evaluated and found to conform to the Model Specifications, as amended on September 17, 1993 for mobile and nonmobile use. One instrument is distributed by two different companies. so it has been listed twice. One manufacturer changed their legal name. One manufacturer added a new product option for USB and Ethernet connectivity. One manufacturer added a Bluetooth keyboard accessory to two (2) devices and a calibration accessory for seven (7) of its devices. These devices were found to conform with or without the accessories. Another seven (?) instruments are now being listed under a different distributer/manufacturer and those devices will be cross-referenced for legacy purposes. In alphabetical order by company, the new devices are:

(1) The "AlcoMate TS600" distributed by AK GlobalTech Corporation. Palisades Park, New Jersey. This device will be known as the Alcoscan ALP-1 outside of the U.S. The AlcoMate TS600 is a hand-held device with an electrochemical (EC) fuel cell sensor. This device is powered by internal batteries and is intended for mobile or stationary operations.

(2) The "Intoxilyzer 500" manufactured by CML Inc., Owensboro, Kentucky. This instrument is currently

listed on the CPL for Alcohol Screening Devices and will be removed when that CPL is updated. Improvements to the device's sampling system allow it to conform as an EBT. It is a hand-held instrument intended for use in mobile or stationary operations. It uses a fuel cell sensor and is powered by an internal battery. The Intoxilyzer 500 is also distributed as the Lion Alcolmeter 500 by Lion Laboratories outside the U.S., so it has been listed twice on the CPL, once under each of its distributors/manufacturers.

(3) The "Intoxilyzer 9000" manufactured by CMI, Inc., Owensboro, Kentucky. This is a bench-top device that is intended for use in mobile or stationary operations. This device uses an infrared (IR) sensor to measure ethanol concentration. The Intoxilyzer 9000 can be powered by either 110 volts alternate current (AC) or 12 volts direct

current (DC).

(4) The "Alcotest 3820" manufactured by Draeger, Inc., Irving, Texas. The Alcotest 3820 is a hand-held device that uses an electrochemical (EC) fuel cell sensor to measure othanol concentration. This instrument is powered by internal batteries and is intended for use in stationary or mobile operations.

operations.
(5) The "Alcotest 5510" manufactured by Draeger, Inc., Irving, Texas. The Alcotest 5510 is a hand-held device that uses an electrochemical (EC) fuel cell senor to measure ethanol. This device is powered by internal batteries and is intended for use in mobile or stationary

operations.

(6) The "Alcotest 5820" manufactured by Draeger, Inc., Irving, Texas. The Alcotest 5820 is a hand-held device that uses an electrochemical (EC) fuel cell senor to measure ethanol. This device is powered by internal batteries and is intended for use in mobile or stationary operations.

(7) The "Alcotest 6820" manufactured by Draeger, Inc., Irving, Texas. The Alcotest 6820 is a hand-held device that uses an electrochemical (EC) fuel cell senor to measure ethanol. This device is powered by internal batteries and is intended for use in mobile or stationary

operations.

(8) The "AlcoQuant 6020 Plus" manufactured by EnviteC. Wismar, Germany and distributed by Honeywell GmbH. Fond du Lac, Wisconsin. The AlcoQuant 6020 Plus is a hand-held device with a fuel cell sensor. This device is powered by internal batteries and is intended for use in mobile and stationary operations.

(9) The Alco-Sensor FST manufactured by Intoximeters, Inc., Saint Louis, Missouri, The Alco-Sensor FST is a hand-held Evidential Breath Tester that uses an electrochemical (EC) fuel cell sensor to measure ethanol concentration. This instrument is powered by internal batteries and is intended for use in stationary or mobile operations.

(10) The Intox DMT Dual Sensor manufactured by Intoximeters, Inc., Saint Louis, Missouri, The Intox DMT Dual Sensor is a bench-top Evidential Breath Tester that is intended for use in stationary or mobile operations. This device uses both an infrared (IR) sensor and an electrochemical (EC) fuel cell sensor. The Intox DMT Dual Sensor can be powered by either 110 volts AC or 12 volts DC.

(11) The "Intox EC/IR II.1" manufactured by Intoximeters. Inc, Saint Louis, Missouri. This is a benchtop device intended for use in mobile or stationary operations. This device uses both an electrochemical (EC) fuel cell sensor and an infrared (IR) sensor to measure ethanol concentrations. The Intox EC/IR II.t can be powered by either 110 volts AC or 12 volts DC.

(12) The "FC10Plus" manufactured by Lifeloc Technologies, Inc... Wheat Ridge, Colorado. This is a hand-held device that is intended for use in mobile or stationary operations. This device uses a fuel cell sensor and is powered by internal batteries.

This update indicates that two (2) devices (the Phoenix 6.0 and the FC20, manufactured by Lifeloc Technologies, Inc., Wheat Ridge, Colorado) come with Bluetooth keyboard support and five additional fields that users can use to enter additional information. With these features, these devices will be listed on the CPL as the "Phoenix 6.0BT" and the "FC20BT". This update indicates also that seven (7) devices manufactured by Lifeloc come with the EASYCAL calibration accessory. Those devices include the FC10, FC10Plus, FC20, FC20BT, EV30, Phoenix 6.0 and the Phoenix 6.0BT. The CPL specifies that each of these devices conforms to the model specifications "w/or without the EASYCAL accessory."

Intoximeters, Inc., Saint Louis, Missouri acquired the breath alcohol

testing business of National Patent Analytical Systems, Inc. (NPAS). Since there have been no changes to the devices other than ownership and a device name change, all six devices previously listed under NPAS (BAC DataMaster (with or without the Delta-1 accessory), BAC Verifier DataMaster (w/or without the Delta-1 accessory), DataMaster cdm (w/or without the Delta-1 accessory), DataMaster DMT w/ Fuel Cell option, DataMaster DMT w/ Rev A Fuel Cell option, and DataMaster DMT] will now be listed under both Intoximeters and NPAS. The NPAS DataMaster DMT will now be known as the Intoximeters Intox DMT. Accordingly, this device will be listed under Intoximeters under both names.

The CPL has been updated to reflect that Draeger Safety Diagnostics. Inc. will begin operating under the name Draeger, Inc. effective July 1, 2017 in order to align all sales and service operations for Draeger in the United States.

In accordance with the foregoing, the CPL is updated, as set forth below.

In order to be considered for the issuance of a Guarantee in FY 2018, Qualified Issuer Applications must be submitted by 11:59 p.m. Eastern Standard Time (EST) on January 9, 2018 and Guarantee Applications must be submitted by 11:59 p.m. EST on January 23, 2018. If applicable, CDFI Certification Applications must be received by the CDFI Fund by 11:59 p.m. EST on November 30, 2017. Under FY 2018 authority, which is contingent upon

Congressional authorization, Bond Documents and Bond Loan documents must be executed, and Guarantees will be provided, in the order in which Guarantee Applications are approved or by such other criteria that the CDFI Fund may establish, in its sole discretion, and in any event by September 30, 2018.

Executive Summary: This NOGA is published in connection with the CDFI Bond Guarantee Program, administered by the Community Development Financial Institutions Fund (CDFI Fund), the U.S. Department of the Treasury (Treasury), Through this NOGA, the CDFI Fund announces the availability of \$500 million of Guarantee Authority in FY 2018, contingent upon Congressional authorization. This NOGA explains application submission and evaluation requirements and processes, and provides agency contacts and information on CDFI Bond Guarantee Program outreach. Parties interested in being approved for a Guarantee under the CDFI Bond Guarantee Program must submit Qualified Issuer Applications and Guarantee Applications for consideration in accordance with this NOGA.

Capitalized terms used in this NOGA and not defined elsewhere are defined in the CDFI Bond Guarantee Program regulations (12 CFR 1808.102) and the CDFI Program regulations (12 CFR 1805.104).

I. Guarantee Opportunity Description

A. Authority. The CDFI Bond Guarantee Program was authorized by the Small Business Jobs Act of 2010 (Pub. L. 111-240; 12 U.S.C. 4713a) (the Act). Section 1134 of the Act amended the Riegle Community Development and Regulatory Improvement Act of 1994 (12 U.S.C. 4701, et seq.) to provide authority to the Secretary of the Treasury (Secretary) to establish and administer the CDFI Bond Guarantee Program.

B. Bond Issue size; Amount of Guarantee authority. In FY 2018, the Secretary may guarantee Bond Issues having a minimum Guarantee of \$100 million each, up to an aggregate total of \$500 million, contingent upon Congressional authorization.

C. Program summary. The purpose of the CDFI Bond Guarantee Program is to support CDFI lending by providing Guarantees for Bonds issued for Eligible Community or Economic Development Purposes, as authorized by section 1134 and 1703 of the Act. The Secretary, as the Guarantor of the Bonds, will provide a 100 percent Guarantee for the repayment of the Verifiable Losses of Principal, Interest, and Call Premium of Bonds issued by Qualified Issuers. Qualified Issuers, approved by the CDFI Fund, will issue Bonds that will be purchased by the Federal Financing Bank. The Qualified Issuer will use 100 percent of Bond Proceeds to provide Bond Loans to Eligible CDFIs, which will use Bond Loan proceeds for Eligible Community and Economic Development Purposes, including providing Secondary Loans to Secondary Borrowers.

D. Review of Guarantee Applications, in general.

1. Qualified Issuer Applications submitted with Guarantee Applications will have priority for review over Qualified Issuer Applications submitted without Guarantee Applications. With the exception of the aforementioned prioritized review, all Qualified Issuer Applications and Guarantee
