Marshall University Obtains Plane Through WV Surplus and the Federal Surplus Property Program



The Federal Surplus Property Program gives eligible organizations, such as state agencies, educational institutions, and nonprofit organizations, access to property retired by the federal government. In the spring of 2022, Marshall University and Mountwest Community and Technical College will launch a new aviation program featuring assets obtained through the Federal Surplus Property Program. The Aviation Maintenance Technology (AMT) program will feature planes secured by WV Surplus on their behalf. The federal program was established in 1949 and authorizes WV Surplus to coordinate the donation of retired federal surplus property to eligible organizations.

Veteran-Owned Small Business Acquires Property through WV Surplus

With the implementation of the Veterans Small Business Enhancement Act of 2018, veteran-owned businesses now have access to retired federal property through WV Surplus. Rockwood Properties LLC in Princeton, West Virginia, is the first veteran-owned small business to acquire property through this program.

"The program has saved me thousands of dollars," said Leland Price, owner of Rockwood Properties. "I am excited for how this will impact my business."

Rockwood Properties acquired a forklift through WV Surplus which has already been put to use. The forklift is being used in the business's construction operations by moving heavy pallets and lifting shingles and other roofing materials.

"The forklift has already paid for itself," shared Price.

Veterans interested in participating in this program must first register and be verified with the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. Upon receiving verification, veterans may complete WV Surplus' *Application for Eligibility for Veteran-Owned Small Businesses*. Once this form is approved, veterans will be issued a unique user ID and password to screen for federal property.

"It took some time to get verified by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs," advised Price. "But it was absolutely worth the wait to have access to federal property."

State Plane Sold through Online Auction by WV Surplus

In the summer of 2021, WV Surplus facilitated the auction of the state's 2009 Cessna 208B Grand Caravan. The auction was held virtually through WV Surplus' auction site, GovDeals. After a onemonth listing, the plane was sold for \$1,526,650.00.

"WV Surplus is responsible for the retirement of most state property, no matter how big or small," said WV Surplus Manager Elizabeth Cooper. "When a state agency has an item it no longer needs, we want to ensure it is retired in the best way possible. For the state's plane, holding an online auction allowed us to reach a larger audience that would be interested in this unique item."

During the month it was listed online, the Cessna Grand Caravan received 64 bids. The winner, Loren Watts, was located in Richland, WA.

The state originally purchased the plane in 2009 and had completed 574 flight hours and made 657 landings since that time. Despite its good condition, usage had declined, and the decision was made to sell it instead of letting it depreciate in value. The Aviation Division will use the funds from this sale for future operations.

"While most people think WV Surplus only receives office furniture and vehicles, the truth is we see all types of unique inventory," added



WV Surplus is responsible for the retirement of many state government assets such as the plane seen above. For unique assets or items that cannot be transported to the Dunbar warehouse, WV Surplus utilizes an online auction service known as GovDeals.

Cooper. "I hope the successful auction of this plane encourages state agencies to contact us with questions about our process and feel more comfortable planning for higher-priced items that need to be retired."

To see what property is available, visit *GovDeals.com* and search "West Virginia State Agency for Surplus Property." Auctions can also be viewed by visiting *WVSurplus.gov* and clicking the "GovDeals" logo on the bottom of the home page.

While the property listed on GovDeals is at times located at the WV Surplus warehouse in Dunbar, the items can be physically located all across the state of West Virginia. "Marshall University has already received one plane from Florida, and we are working with WV Surplus on acquiring two additional planes located in Boston," said James Smith, director of AMT for Marshall University. "We were lucky that the types of planes we wanted for our program were immediately available."

Students enrolled in the AMT program will train for their FAA certifications over an 18-month period. To complete the approximately 1,970 hours of shop time needed for these certifications, it is critical that the AMT program have enough equipment to meet FAA requirements.

"If someone in southern West Virginia wanted to learn aircraft maintenance, they would have previously had to go to Bridgeport," added Smith. "This is the first course like this in the area."

The university was able to fund the administrative costs to process the transfer thanks to a grant from Toyota. Smith said he plans to continue monitoring the Federal Surplus Property Program for the availability of other turboprop aircraft. In addition to the aircraft, the aviation program utilized WV Surplus' state warehouse in Dunbar to furnish its office facilities.

"I learned about WV Surplus from an individual with Wayne County law enforcement," said Smith. "The application was simple, and WV Surplus staff members have been great to work with. It has been a large cost savings, which means lower student fees."

WV Surplus has the authority to administer the transfer of donated federal surplus property through the U.S. General Services Administration. While this service is available to all eligible organizations, a current *Application for Eligibility* must be on file with WV Surplus. The application can be found online at *www.state.wv.us/admin/purchase/surplus/forms/SurplusApp107A. pdf.* Registered organizations may obtain a unique user ID and password from WV Surplus to screen property at *GSAXcess.gov.*

Federal property available for donation includes construction equipment, fire trucks, industrial machinery, medical equipment, trailers, tools, and much more. Please note that the entity that receives property will be required to follow service use requirements.



DIRECTIONS: Exit I-64 at Dunbar/Roxalana Road, turn right on Roxalana Road then turn onto WV-25 West. At 16th Street, turn left. Go to intersection with Charles Avenue -- if you miss 16th Street, go to 22nd Street which is also a throughway. Turn right onto Charles Avenue, continue to 28th Street and turn right. The West Virginia State Agency for Surplus Property is on that corner inside the cyclone fence.

Terms and Conditions of Sale

FEDERAL AND STATE REGULATIONS: Acceptance of Federal equipment and supplies by users who have established eligibility to participate in WV Surplus is subject to certifications and agreements identified on the reverse side of the Distribution Document. **1:** Federal equipment and supplies are restricted to institutional use only, not personal use, and are to be used for a minimum of one year; **2:** All vehicles and items with an acquisition cost of \$5,000.00 or more shall be used for the purpose(s) for which acquired within one year from the date the property was invoiced and used for 18 months thereafter. **3:** During the restriction period, the property shall not be sold, traded, leased, lent, bailed, cannibalized, encumbered or otherwise disposed of or removed from the State of West Virginia without the express approval of WV Surplus. The recipients of Federal property are urged to contact WV Surplus prior to taking any actions which might be interpreted as modifying any of the certifications and agreements stated on the reverse side of the Distribution Document.

TERMS: Payment required upon receipt unless previous arrangements have been made. Payment must be by check or credit card issued against an eligible organization. No personal checks, money orders or cash transactions are permitted.

SHIPPING: All service charges are FOB Dunbar Warehouse unless expressly indicated. Out-shipping can be arranged by calling 304.766.2626. Delivery charges will be added to the invoice.
