BASED ON ESTIMATES SUPPLIED BY THE SPENDING UNITS, IT IS UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED THAT THE CONTRACT SHALL COVER THE QUANTITIES ACTUALLY ORDERED FOR DELIVERY DURING THE TERM OF CONTRACT, WHETHER MORE OR LESS THAN THE QUANTITIES SHOWN.

PAYMENT: CALCIUM CHLORIDE SOLUTION SHALL BE PAID AT THE PER GALLON UNIT BID PRICE OF THE SOLUTION DELIVERED AND APPLIED AND AS MEASURED BY THE APPROVED METERING DEVICE. IN NO CASE WILL THIS AMOUNT EXCEED THE TOTAL GALLONAGE CERTIFIED ON THE DELIVERY REPORT.
