- Awards will be made in the best interest of the State of West Virginia.
- 2. The State may accept or reject in part, or in whole, any bid.
- 3. All quotations are governed by the West Virginia Code and the Legislative Rules of the Purchasing Division.
- 4. Prior to any award, the apparent successful vendor must be properly registered with the Purchasing Division and have paid the required \$125.00 registration fee.
- 5. All services performed or goods delivered under State Purchase Orders/Contracts are to be continued for the term of the Purchase Order/Contract, contingent upon funds being appropriated by the Legislature or otherwise being made available. In the event funds are not appropriated or otherwise available for these services or goods, this Purchase Order/Contract becomes void and of no effect after June 30.
- 6. Payment may only be made after the delivery and acceptance of goods or services.
- 7. Interest may be paid for late payment in accordance with the West Virginia Code.
- 8. Vendor preference will be granted upon written request in accordance with the West Virginia Code.
- The State of West Virginia is exempt from federal and state taxes and will not pay or reimburse such taxes.
- 10. The Director of Purchasing may cancel any Purchase Order/Contract upon 30 days written notice to the seller.

SCOPE OF WORK

1. Tie Replacement

- a. Replace 5,000 crossties as marked on approximately 15 miles of the SBVR, MP 17.0 to MP 31.7.
- b. Ties will be handled carefully to avoid damage in accordance with AREMA specifications.
- c. The contractor will replace only those ties marked for replacement by SBVR.
- d. The contractor will remove and properly dispose of old ties. Ties must be stacked clear of tracks and must not be stacked on property other than SBVR right-of-way without the property owner's permission.

2. Spiking of Ties

- a. Ties will be spiked to a gage of 56 ½ inches, plus or minus ¼ inch.
- b. Up to five ties on either side of a newly inserted tie will be plugged and respiked to correct gage
- c. All ties replaced or respiked will have new spikes. Old spikes will not be reused. Spikes shall be started and driven vertically and square with the rail. They shall have full bearing against the side of the rail base. Spikes shall not be overdriven. SBVR will provide information on correct spiking pattern and track curvature. The correct spiking pattern will be used on all new ties and any adjacent ties that are respiked to correct gage. It is estimated that 65% of the ties to be replaced are in curves and that 20% of the ties replaced will require adjacent ties to be respiked. Any other ties in a curve that do not have the designated spiking pattern will be the responsibility of the SBVR.

3. Rail Anchors

- a. All rail anchors will be reapplied in their existing location and properly fitted against ties.
- 4. Tamping
 - a. Tie gang will tamp all newly inserted ties as they are placed in the track and ballast will be replaced at ends of ties.

5. Ballast

a. Contractor will place 7,000 tons of ballast. Of that total amount, 2,160 tons will be placed at locations indicated on the attached maps. The remainder will be spread as needed for the overall lift.

6. Final Surfacing, Alinement and Ballast Regulating

- a. Contractor will use a Jackson 6700, Mark IV or equivalent to give the entire track a "skin lift" and establish best fit for curves including appropriate spirals. Surfacing will taper into six bridges. There are six gravel crossings that will need to be tamped through. These are generally short except for the crossing at Sector (MP 25.5) which is approximately 50 feet long. Only the small crossing at MP 26.8 has timber flangeways. There are four cattle guards. Three of these have steel rail panels that lift out. One is an open trestle-type that will need to be shimmed when the track is raised.
- b. Two insertions will be made for each tie.
- c. SBVR will provide information regarding the amount of superelevation to be placed in curves.
- d. There is one No. 10 turnout to be tamped at Sector. Tamping will continue for a distance of at least 100 feet onto the side track to ensure uniform surface through the turnout.

CONDUCT OF WORK

The SBVR normally operates freight trains Monday through Friday. These trains will be rescheduled during this project to provide the contractor with an eight-hour window between 10:00 AM and 6:00 PM without train traffic. Freight trains do not normally operate on the weekends. This provides an opportunity to work without interruption or having to clear up at the end of each day. An excursion train operated by an outside party begins its season in May. The 2006 schedule is attached to this RFQ and the 2007 schedule is expected to be similar. The contractor must not interfere with the excursion train operation.

Track will be made safe for train operations at the end of each work day. Work will be subject to inspection by the SBVR. Contractor will be responsible for repair of any damage done to signals. Repairs must be done that same day.

Contractor will be responsible for clean up of work site. All debris and refuse will be removed from the site and disposed of properly. Old spikes will be placed in piles along the right-of-way and will remain the property of SBVR.

The contractor will comply with all safety rules and regulations as required by the Federal Railroad Administration, SBVR and other parties as applicable. An SBVR employee will obtain the necessary work authorities and provide radio communication with the SBVR office.

Materials can be stored at Vanderlip (MP 16.9), Sector (MP25.7) and McNeill (MP 32.5). Ontrack equipment can be stored at Vanderlip and Sector. There is vehicular access to each of these locations.

The SBVR can provide a locomotive and engineer for \$100 per hour. One flat car and two Rogers ballast cars are available at no charge. Work trains must be scheduled Monday through Friday and are subject to availability of the engineer and equipment. Contractor must outline the plan for work train use at the beginning of the project.

Contractor will use Heavy and Highway Construction Rates as established for Grant and Hardy Counties. These rates are pursuant to WV Code 21-5A, et, seq. and are available at www.wvsos.com/adlaw/wagerates/heavyhighway04.htm. Contractor will be responsible for submitting certified payrolls to the SRA. The Grant County/Hardy County line is at MP 28.3.

MATERIALS

Contractor will provide new ties, tie plugs and spikes and will transport them to the work site. Ties will be new 7" X 9" X 8'6" industrial grade ties. The specifications set forth in Chapter 3 of the AREMA specifications will govern. The ties will be 100% end-plated, mixed hardwoods and oak, creosote pressure treated to 7# retention or refusal. Contractor will provide treated tie plugs and 6" cut track spikes per AREMA specifications. Tie plates will be provided by the SBVR where existing tie plates are defective or missing.

Contractor will provide ballast which shall be crushed stone or crushed slag and shall conform to the current AREMA "Specifications of Prepared Stone, Slag and Gravel Ballast." Size of ballast shall be AREMA #3 as indicated below:

COMPLETION DATE

All work must be completed by June 30, 2007. The cost to the SBVR for the administration of the contract as well as for train delays that will be incurred after that date make it necessary for the agency to assess liquidated damages against the contractor for each calendar day any work remains uncompleted after that date. The charge will be \$500.00 per day.

BID REQUIREMENTS

Contractor MUST have previous experience in railroad crosstie replacement and track surfacing.

A mandatory prebid meeting will be held on October 23, 2007 at 1:00 pm at the SBVR office in Moorefield. This meeting will include an inspection trip of the portion of the railroad that is to receive the new ties. Bidders must provide their own hi-rail vehicle or make arrangements with other potential vendors to ride with them. If a vendor comes to the prebid without making prior arrangements for hi-rail access and there are no seats available, the contractor will be unable to inspect the track and possibly be unable to bid on this project.

The quantities in the RFQ are for estimating purposes only. The actual scope of work will be issued to the contractor on a written state contract order (Form number WV-39). The awarded unit price will be used to determine the cost of the actual scope of work authorized.

For bidding purposes, contractor is to give a unit cost for each item listed below. Low bid will be determined by the lowest total amount for all unit costs multiplied by the estimated quantities as listed below:

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AFFIDAVIT

West Virginia Code §5A-3-10a states:

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No contract or renewal of any contract may be awarded by the state or any of its political subdivisions to any vendor or prospective vendor when the vendor or prospective vendor or a related party to the vendor or prospective vendor is a debtor and the debt owned is an amount greater than one thousand dollars in the aggregate.

DEFINITIONS:

"Debt" means any assessment, premium, penalty, fine, tax or other amount of money owed to the state or any of its political subdivisions because of a judgment, fine, permit violation, license assessment, defaulted workers' compensation premium, penalty or other assessment presently delinquent or due and required to be paid to the state or any of its political subdivisions, including any interest or additional penalties accrued thereon.

"Debtor" means any individual, corporation, partnership, association, limited liability company or any other form or business association owing a debt to the state or any of its political subdivisions.

"Political subdivision" means any county commission; municipality; county board of education; any instrumentality established by a county or municipality; any separate corporation or instrumentality established by one or more counties or municipalities, as permitted by law; or any public body charged by law with the performance of a government function or whose jurisdiction is coextensive with one or more counties or municipalities.

"Related party" means a party, whether an individual, corporation, partnership, association, limited liability company or any other form or business association or other entity whatsoever, related to any vendor by blood, marriage, ownership or contract through which the party has a relationship of ownership or other interest with the vendor so that the party will actually or by effect receive or control a portion of the benefit, profit or other consideration from performance of a vendor contract with the party receiving an amount that meets or exceed five percent of the total contract amount.

EXCEPTION:

The prohibition of this section does not apply where a vendor has contested any tax administered pursuant to chapter eleven of this code, workers' compensation premium, permit fee or environmental fee or assessment and the matter has not become final or where the vendor has entered into a payment plan or agreement and the vendor is not in default of any of the provisions of such plan or agreement.

LICENSING:

The vendor must be licensed in accordance with any and all state requirements to do business with the state of West Virginia.

CONFIDENTIALITY:

The vendor agrees that he or she will not disclose to anyone, directly or indirectly, any such personally identifiable information or other confidential information gained from the agency, unless the individual who is the subject of the information consents to the disclosure in writing or the disclosure is made pursuant to the agency's policies, procedures and rules. Vendors should visit www.state.wv.us/admin/purchase/privacy for the Notice of Agency Confidentiality Policies.

Under penalty of law for false swearing (West Virginia Code, §61-5-3), it is hereby certified that the vendor acknowledges the information in this said affidavit and are in compliance with the requirements as stated.
