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ATTACHMENT RESPONSES

1. Knowledge of Public Service Commission statutes and rules pertaining to transportation.

RESPONSE: As attorney and director of transportation division at the PSC for approximately 28 years, applicant obtained substantial knowledge of agency rules and state statutes pertaining to transportation.

2. Knowledge on the utilization, interpretation and analysis of FMCSA - Analysis and Information on line.

RESPONSE: In the course of applicant's former employment at the PSC, applicant became closely familiar with the FMCSA, as well as with the utilization and interpretation of its Analysis and Information on line.

3. Knowledge of the utilization, interpretation and analysis of SafetyNet Program and data.

RESPONSE: In the course of applicant's former employment at the PSC, applicant routinely used, interpreted and analyzed the SafetyNet Program and its data.

Knowledge of the utilization, interpretation and analysis of MCMIS program and data.

RESPONSE: In the course of applicant's former employment at the PSC, applicant gained substantial knowledge of the utilization, interpretation and analysis of the MCMIS program and data.

Knowledge and understanding of MCSAP program guidelines and requirements.

RESPONSE: Applicant's former experience at the PSC included the pioneering and implementation of the MCSAP program, and its requirements, in West Virginia.

 Knowledge of State of West Virginia Law Enforcement entities and law enforcement procedures.

RESPONSE: As former director of transportation division at the PSC, applicant developed substantial knowledge of, and working relationships with, state law enforcement entities and procedures, especially as they pertain to transportation safety.

7. Working knowledge of Division of Highways and Division of Motor Vehicles requirements.

RESPONSE: Applicant's PSC experience in transportation safety and economic regulatory related matters over a 25 year period gave applicant considerable working knowledge of DOH and DMV programs and requirements.

8. Working knowledge of WVPSC Safety and Weight Enforcement structure.

RESPONSE: Applicant's WVPSC transportation experience included organization, direction and supervision of the agency;s safety and weight enforcement programs. Applicant was instrumental in implementing the transfer of weight enforcement duties and personnel from WV Division of Highways to WVPSC.

9. Working knowledge of WVPSC Safety Program and Safety Regulations.

RESPONSE: The PSC transportation safety programs and regulations were developed, implemented and enforced under applicant's direction and supervision from 1981 through October 31, 2005.

10. Knowledge of Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration program and FMCSR's.

RESPONSE: In the course of applicant's duties at the PSC it was necessary to develop substantial knowledge of the FMCSA program and the rules (FMCSR's) promulgated thereunder. Applicant's safety enforcement personnel enforced those rules on commercial motor vehicles and their drivers operating in West Virginia.

Ability to draft appropriate rules or statutes necessary to implement program.

RESPONSE: In applicant's experience as both director and attorney, Iapplicant routinely drafted rules and statutes necessary to implement transportation safety and economic regulatory programs and initiatives.

12. Ability to provide legal representation of Enforcement Section of the Transportation Division of the WVPSC relative to the crash report form, rules, statutes and general legislation within the program goals and objectives.

RESPONSE: As retired director and attorney, and as current member of the West Virginia State Bar (WV Bar ID # 857), applicant is both authorized and qualified to legally represent the agency relative to crash report forms, rules, statutes and general legislation within the CVARS program goals and guidelines.

13. Have a working relationship with the commercial motor vehicle safety industry and related federal and state agencies to enhance the ability to serve as a liaison between the entities to facilitate a working dialogue.

RESPONSE: Applicant's experience at the PSC included development of long-standing working relationships with commercial motor vehicle safety industry officials, as well as related federal and state agency officials, with all of whom applicant served as agency liaison to maintain working dialogue on behalf of the agency.

14. 19. Vendor shall have knowledge of, and experience with, state implementation of a Commercial Vehicle Analysis Report System (CVARS) grant.

RESPONSE: From April, 2006 until present, Applicant, as contractor with the West Virginia Public Service Commission, has discharged all duties under the CVARS grant assigned to the Commission. These duties include collaborating with other state agencies to develop the Uniform Traffic Crash Report (UTCR); participating in train-the-trainer exercises with the WV

State Police and WV Division of Highways to roll out the UTCR on a pilot basis; and implementing site visits and UTCR training for county Sheriff's Offices and municipal Police Departments throughout West Virginia.

20. Vendor shall have knowledge of, and experience with, crash data quality and timeliness requirements imposed on WV Public Service Commission by its participation in the CVARS grant program.

RESPONSE: During the course of the applicant's participation in CVARS grant program activity on behalf of the WVPSC from April, 2006 until present, applicant has become fully aware of various crash data quality and timeliness improvement measures imposed upon the WVPSC.
