

This Siemens Healthcare Diagnostics RFQ response has been presented to comply with <u>all</u> the specifications listed in the WEH90053 Bid Request.

All the listed General Terms & Conditions in WEH90053 have been agreed to by Siemens Healthcare Diagnostics.

All the listed Instructions to Bidders in WEH90053 have been reviewed and agreed to by Siemens Healthcare Diagnostics.

The Procurement Specifications have been reviewed and our RFQ response meets those specifications in total at 100%.

This Addendum is to clarify any potential areas that may seem to conflict with the specifications listed on the State Bid # WEH90053.

Response to RFQ specification number 7, that the test kits have a minimum shelf life of 90 days beyond date of receipt. Siemens test kits typically have a year or more shelf life when shipped. As our shipping center does not release test kits with less than 90 days, the wording on this reply states the guarantee as can be controlled by our shipping department – so the phrasing in our reply states 'from the date of shipment'. If there was ever a time when Welch Community Hospital received any test kit that had, upon the date received, less than 90 days all the Laboratory needs to do is notify the Sales Representative who would send in the replacement test kit at no charge. Siemens guarantees shelf life on their test kits at 90 days.

Response to RFQ specification number 10, all products and equipment are to be quoted FOB destination, unless otherwise stated in vendor's quotation. Currently, Welch has one (1) no charge standard shipment per month – this bid has extended that offer to two (2) no charge standard shipments per month. Additional information on Shipping and Freight are included under the next to last Tab labeled Shipping & Freight Policy. Equipment is FOB Destination.

Detail explanation of Bid/Price Sheet Notes.

Welch Community Hospital has been using our Dimension analyzers for well over 10 years. The Unit # shown on the Bid Sheet (as sent to us) has changed for some of the items (all items have an asterisk written in on our Bid Sheet reply). The Unit # can sometimes change over time. All of our responses showing a different Unit # are for the SAME method requested in the Description column and the SAME methodology requested in the Bid. Counts per Unit remain exactly the same as what is reflected on the Bid Sheet.

It should be noted that Line 7 for 20 Units of Glucose with Unit # DF40 at 960 test per units has always been our Unit #DF39A (which has 960 test per unit) — the Glucose with Unit # DF40 has 1440 test per unit and is listed on line 97. 


Figure 1: Five Alert Functions




Figure 2: The Stat Alert Screen

Reagent Monitoring




Figure 3: Reagent Cartridge Inventory Screen




Figure 4: Sample Alert Features and Screen

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


Figure 5: Example: snapshot of Online Education for Dimension Vista®

In the event of conflict between this addendum and the agreement, this addendum shall control:

- 1. **DISPUTES** Any references in the agreement to arbitration or to the jurisdiction of any court are hereby deleted. Disputes arising out of the agreement shall be presented to the West Virginia Court of Claims.
- 2. HOLD HARMLESS Any clause requiring the Agency to indemnify or hold harmless any party is hereby deleted in its entirety.
- 3. GOVERNING LAW The agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of West Virginia. This provision replaces any references to any other State's governing law.
- 4. TAXES Provisions in the agreement requiring the Agency to pay taxes are deleted. As a State entity, the Agency is exempt from Federal, State, and local taxes and will not pay taxes for any Vendor including individuals, nor will the Agency file any tax returns or reports on behalf of Vendor or any other party.
- PAYMENT Any references to prepayment are deleted. Payment will be in arrears.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Purpose:

The Acquisition and Contract Administration Section of the Purchasing Division "State" for the Department of Health and Human Resources, Bureau for Behavioral Health Facilities, Welch Community Hospital, "Agency" is soliciting Quotations to provide reagents/consumables for chemistry analyzer systems for Welch Community Hospital.

PROCUREMENT SPECIFICATIONS

General Requirements

Vendor is to provide two (2) fully automated chemistry analyzers, (Dade RXL Max or equal) at no additional charge for use with requested reagents/consumables. Vendor is to provide a system that will include a computer, monitor and printer. All equipment will be retained and maintained by the vendor.

Welch Community Hospital desires a Vendor with a proven track record for providing necessary supplies and maintaining of equipment. Vendor must provide three (3) references from clients who have received similar services from the vendor within the past 3 years.

Scope of Work:

Vendor shall provide chemistry analyzer equipment and reagent/consumables as needed for the Laboratory at Welch Community Hospital. Vendor shall include, but not be limited to the following requirements:

- 1. The equipment must be a single platform that can perform all our test methods.
- 2. There shall be full mirror image back-up feature so that critical tests have a back-up in the event that an analyzer is down. They must also include a back-up platform for those times when the primary analyzer(s) are not functional.
- 3. The system must have monitors that notify when STAT tests are completed. It must also monitor the amount of product still available in the equipment to reduce the amount of wasted reagents. The system shall also allow for reagents to be added while maintaining ongoing system operation, eliminating the need for the system to be put in "standby" mode.

- 4. Other features shall include; auto repeat of panic values (with values that Hospital can set into the system), and auto dilution of elevated results (Hospital can choose the dilution factor).
- 5. Vendor must ensure that a local engineer/technician is available to provide service within 2 hours of receiving a service call. Technical support should be available via telephone 24 hours a day/7 days a week to troubleshoot problems and/or answer staff questions.
- 6. Vendor will ensure hospital's laboratory staff receives proper in-service training whenever there are updates made to the equipment. Preferably, this should be conducted on-site whenever possible.




