# PTR10035 Technical Questions and Answers

1) Section 2.3 states (and addendum 2, question 2 seems to reiterate) that the wall glazing is to be "translucent polycarbonate structured sheet." Polycarbonate structured sheet is a multi-wall / fluted / ribbed material that is not transparent, and is translucent to the point of having a shower door quality, so that images are very distorted. Is this your intent, or were you wanting a transparent solid polycarbonate (with a bronze tint)?

Answer: Bronze tint will be approved.

2) For the roof metal, will you accept a galvanized / "galvalume-coated" steel roof panel (barrel and hip shapes), with a 20-year warranty 3-coat Kynar 500 paint finish, assuming it matches the color of the rest of the shelter?

Answer: This must meet specs as stated. Denied.

3) Since each transit system is choosing colors, if the above roof metal option is approved, can the systems choose a roof color that may or may not be the same as the rest of the shelter, but complimentary, from a standard chart?

Answer: Denied.

4) Can you give an idea or a range of about how many shelters of a particular type / color each transit system will be ordering?

Answer: WVDPT can't guarantee the number of any orders. Please review RFQ.

#### **TOLAR QUALITY CONTROL**

Tolar's reputation has been built on the foundation of top quality and service. Only first-grade materials and processes are used. A rigorous quality-control process monitors the design, fabrication and finish to ensure that Tolar shelters will keep their "new" appearance with a minimum of maintenance for many years.

Before production starts, approval drawings are produced and submitted to our customer for review and written acceptance prior to production. This ensures that all details are in accordance with specifications and customer expectations, and that the configuration details and accessories will fit the specified site locations. Once the main design features are finalized and accepted, the detailed shop drawings and final bill of material are produced. These drawings and calculations are certified and sealed by an engineer licensed in the state of installation. This process confirms compliance with the local building code, wind load and seismic requirements.


We also confirm that all shelters, if installed correctly, are in compliance with ADA.

In addition to the approved drawings, after selection of the finish powder coat color(s) from the printed RAL color deck, two samples of the actual powder coat finish on aluminum coupons are submitted for final customer approval. This ensures customer acceptance of the color, gloss and texture. One of these color strips is to be returned to Tolar indicating approval and for use in our quality control procedures.


#### Finish Quality

Tolar does not do its own powder coating in house, but we utilize the services under contact with qualified professional finishing specialists who can meet our stringent finish standards, and who also use one of the premium powder suppliers we pre-select.

In order to provide a long-term warranty and to ensure compliance with our quality standards, we monitor and document the finish quality of each production run with a minimum of four sample parts, which are selected for adhesion by both non-destructive and destructive testing according to ASTM D3359-93. Additional adhesion testing is conducted by boiling water immersion in accordance with AAMA-2604, section 7.4.1.3, and is certified with each run and matched to applicable serial numbers.







#### **Fabrication Quality**

Our proprietary aluminum extrusions are pressed specifically for Tolar through our own engineered dies by one of several certified extruders. Spot checks are performed during the receiving process to ensure compliance with our specifications.

During fabrication, the shop supervisors and the quality control supervisor certify all first articles and depending on the part, they audit the particular process against the engineered drawings to ensure compliance.

#### Solar Lighting:

Since 2004 Tolar Manufacturing has had an exclusive contractual partnership with SOL Inc., a world leader in solar technology. Together SOL and Tolar have jointly developed a range of practical, durable and cost effective solar powered security and advertising display lighting products to meet the particularly needs of the transit industry. 
#### **Shelter Assembly at Site:**

For smaller shelters, it is not necessary to use any heavy equipment for lifting. Taking care to protect the finish with padding, tilt the roof and insert corner posts into the corner sockets, the rear center post into the rear roof frame and fasten using the 3/8" stainless steel post hardware. For larger shelters, or if you are using a crane with a sling, lift the roof and fasten the posts into the proper locations.

Lower the shelter into position onto the adjustable shoes. The illustration on page 4 shows the shoe layout. Square and plumb the posts so that the distance between the posts at the top and bottom is the same. Use of a wood spacer is recommended if you are not using an installation template.

Using the appropriate size drill as recommended for the ground hardware sets provided, the shoe plate holes through the concrete pad.

Level and plumb the shelter starting from the highest corner where the shoe's stub shaft can be fully inserted into the post. Using a carpenter's level on the roof perimeter extrusion and posts to check the shelter for level and plumb, and secure the posts by drilling through the post into the stub shaft of the shoe with a number 3 drill bit and insert the  $\#14 \times \%$ " drive screws and tap them into place.



#### Final Roof Assembly (if required)


Roofs are sometimes shipped without the end bells and covers installed to allow stacking. In that case do the following:


Remove the cover film from the two arched plastic end panels and insert the panels into the 5/16" wide channels on the underside of the bell angles.


Set bell angle assemblies on the roof frame ends so that the plastic end panels are up against the  $\frac{3}{4}$ " tall wall that is on top of the roof body.


Secure each mounting angle to roof body using four #8 x  $\frac{3}{4}$ " Phillips head self-tapping screws.


To aid in attaching bell angle to the bows & roof coverings there is a shallow groove about 3/2" from the edge. Use five #14 x 1 1/2" TEKS screws with the first being at the mid point, and with the same spacing as the center pressure ribs.






























#### **PURCHASING AFFIDAVIT**

West Virginia Code §5A-3-10a states: No contract or renewal of any contract may be awarded by the state or any of its political subdivisions to any vendor or prospective vendor when the vendor or prospective vendor or a related party to the vendor or prospective vendor is a debtor and the debt owed is an amount greater than one thousand dollars in the aggregate.

#### **DEFINITIONS:**

"Debt" means any assessment, premium, penalty, fine, tax or other amount of money owed to the state or any of its political subdivisions because of a judgment, fine, permit violation, license assessment, defaulted workers' compensation premium, penalty or other assessment presently delinquent or due and required to be paid to the state or any of its political subdivisions, including any interest or additional penalties accrued thereon.

"Debtor" means any individual, corporation, partnership, association, limited liability company or any other form or business association owing a debt to the state or any of its political subdivisions. "Political subdivision" means any county commission; municipality; county board of education; any instrumentality established by a county or municipality; any separate corporation or instrumentality established by one or more counties or municipalities, as permitted by law; or any public body charged by law with the performance of a government function or whose jurisdiction is coextensive with one or more counties or municipalities. "Related party" means a party, whether an individual, corporation, partnership, association, limited liability company or any other form or business association or other entity whatsoever, related to any vendor by blood, marriage, ownership or contract through which the party has a relationship of ownership or other interest with the vendor so that the party will actually or by effect receive or control a portion of the benefit, profit or other consideration from performance of a vendor contract with the party receiving an amount that meets or exceed five percent of the total contract amount.

**EXCEPTION:** The prohibition of this section does not apply where a vendor has contested any tax administered pursuant to chapter eleven of this code, workers' compensation premium, permit fee or environmental fee or assessment and the matter has not become final or where the vendor has entered into a payment plan or agreement and the vendor is not in default of any of the provisions of such plan or agreement.

Under penalty of law for false swearing (West Virginia Code §61-5-3), it is hereby certified that the vendor affirms and acknowledges the information in this affidavit and is in compliance with the requirements as stated.
