GENERAL TERMS & CONDITIONS REQUEST FOR QUOTATION (RFQ) AND REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL (RFP)

- 1. Awards will be made in the best interest of the State of West Virginia.
- 2. The State may accept or reject in part, or in whole, any bid.
- 3. Prior to any award, the apparent successful vendor must be properly registered with the Purchasing Division and have paid the required \$125 fee.
- 4. All services performed or goods delivered under State Purchase Order/Contracts are to be continued for the term of the Purchase Order/Contracts, contingent upon funds being appropriated by the Legislature or otherwise being made available. In the event funds are not appropriated or otherwise available for these services or goods this Purchase Order/Contract becomes void and of no effect after June 30.
- 5. Payment may only be made after the delivery and acceptance of goods or services.
- 6. Interest may be paid for late payment in accordance with the West Virginia Code.
- 7. Vendor preference will be granted upon written request in accordance with the West Virginia Code.
- 8. The State of West Virginia is exempt from federal and state taxes and will not pay or reimburse such taxes.
- 9. The Director of Purchasing may cancel any Purchase Order/Contract upon 30 days written notice to the seller.

The West Virginia Department of Military Affairs & Public Safety, Division of Corrections is soliciting contracts to provide psychological evaluation services to the Division of Corrections' sentenced inmates housed in regional jail facilities awaiting transfer to a correctional facility in accordance with the following specifications.

Specifications:

The successful Vendor will be required to travel to and/or communicate with the following facilities operated by the West Virginia Regional Jail and Correctional Facility Authority (RJA):

- · Central Regional Jail, Flatwoods, Braxton County, WV
- · Eastern Regional Jail, Martinsburg, Berkeley County, WV
- · Northern Regional Jail, Moundsville, Marshall County, WV
- · North Central Regional Jail, Greenwood, Doddridge County, WV
- · Potomac Highlands Regional Jail, Augusta, Hampshire County, WV
- South Central Regional Jail, Charleston, Kanawha County, WV
- · Southern Regional Jail, Daniels, Raleigh County, WV
- · Southwestern Regional Jail, Holden, Logan County, WV
- Tygart Valley Regional Jail, Elkins, Randolph County, WV
- · Western Regional Jail, Barboursville, Cabell County,

WV Background:

The Division of Corrections, hereafter referred to as "Agency", manages sentenced adult felons. Currently, there are approximately one thousand seven hundred seventy one (1,771) offenders housed in regional jails facilities due to lack of correctional facility bed space. The goal of this requisition is to facilitate the classification process in order to transfer inmates into an appropriate correctional facility as soon as possible.

Limits of confidentiality will be observed by the successful vendor and its practitioners and will be required to sign agreements to adhere to Agency's policy. The Agency contact personnel during the performance of the contract will be identified and conveyed to the Vendor upon implementation of services.

Scope of Work

Psychological Evaluations: The Agency will administer tests to an estimated sixty (60) to one hundred (100) DOC offenders housed in RJA facilities each month during the contract period. Specifically, these tests are the Minnesota Multiphasic Personality Inventory Restructured Form (MMPI-2-RF,Beta-3, Texas Christian University Drug Screen 2 (TCUD 2), and the Wide Range Achievement Test (WRAT-4). On a schedule to be determined by the Agency and RJA, the Vendor will be notified electronically of testing completed and be provided with the following documentation: Pre/Post Sentencing Reports, CIB report, and raw testing data. Utilizing qualified psychologists, the Vendor shall conduct a face to face interview with the offender on the next scheduled interview day and will complete the Social History interview provided by the Agency as well as the psychological evaluation. Interviews via telecommunication will be considered to be a face to face contact.


