- 2. MANDATORY TERMS: The Solicitation may contain mandatory provisions identified by the use of the words "must," "will," and "shall." Failure to comply with a mandatory term in the Solicitation will result in bid disqualification.

All Vendors submitting a bid must attend the mandatory pre-bid meeting. Failure to attend the mandatory pre-bid meeting shall result in disqualification of the Vendor's bid. No one person attending the pre-bid meeting may represent more than one Vendor.

An attendance sheet provided at the pre-bid meeting shall serve as the official document verifying attendance. The State will not accept any other form of proof or documentation to verify attendance. Any person attending the pre-bid meeting on behalf of a Vendor must list on the attendance sheet his or her name and the name of the Vendor he or she is representing. Additionally, the person attending the pre-bid meeting should include the Vendor's E-Mail address, phone number, and Fax number on the attendance sheet. It is the Vendor's responsibility to locate the attendance sheet and provide the required

Failure to complete the attendance sheet as required may result in disqualification of Vendor's bid.

All Vendors should arrive prior to the starting time for the pre-bid. Vendors who arrive after the starting time but prior to the end of the pre-bid will be permitted to sign in, but are charged with knowing all matters discussed at the pre-bid.

Questions submitted at least five business days prior to a scheduled pre-bid will be discussed at the pre-bid meeting if possible. Any discussions or answers to questions at the pre-bid meeting are preliminary in nature and are non-binding. Official and binding answers to questions will be published in a written addendum to the Solicitation prior to bid opening.

- 8. ADDENDUM ACKNOWLEDGEMENT: Changes or revisions to this Solicitation will be made by an official written addendum issued by the Purchasing Division. Vendor should acknowledge receipt of all addenda issued with this Solicitation by completing an Addendum Acknowledgment Form, a copy of which is included herewith. Failure to acknowledge addenda may result in bid disqualification. The addendum acknowledgement should be submitted with the bid to expedite document processing.
- 9. BID FORMATTING: Vendor should type or electronically enter the information onto its bid to prevent errors in the evaluation. Failure to type or electronically enter the information may result in bid disqualification.

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

- 1. CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENT: Issuance of a Purchase Order signed by the Purchasing Division Director, or his designee, and approved as to form by the Attorney General's office constitutes acceptance of this Contract made by and between the State of West Virginia and the Vendor. Vendor's signature on its bid signifies Vendor's agreement to be bound by and accept the terms and conditions contained in this Contract.
- 2. **DEFINITIONS:** As used in this Solicitation / Contract, the following terms shall have the meanings attributed to them below. Additional definitions may be found in the specifications included with this Solicitation / Contract.
 - 2.1 "Agency" or "Agencies" means the agency, board, commission, or other entity of the State of West Virginia that is identified on the first page of the Solicitation or any other public entity seeking to procure goods or services under this Contract.
 - 2.2 "Contract" means the binding agreement that is entered into between the State and the Vendor to provide the goods and services requested in the Solicitation.
 - 2.3 "Director" means the Director of the West Virginia Department of Administration, Purchasing Division.
 - 2.4 "Purchasing Division" means the West Virginia Department of Administration, Purchasing Division.
 - 2.5 "Purchase Order" means the document signed by the Agency and the Purchasing Division, and approved as to form by the Attorney General, that identifies the Vendor as the successful bidder and Contract holder.
 - 2.6 "Solicitation" means the official solicitation published by the Purchasing Division and identified by number on the first page thereof.
 - 2.7 "State" means the State of West Virginia and/or any of its agencies, commissions, boards, etc. as context requires.
 - 2.8 "Vendor" or "Vendors" means any entity submitting a bid in response to the Solicitation, the entity that has been selected as the lowest responsible bidder, or the entity that has been awarded the Contract as context requires.

- 4. NOTICE TO PROCEED: Vendor shall begin performance of this Contract immediately upon receiving notice to proceed unless otherwise instructed by the Agency. Unless otherwise specified, the fully executed Purchase Order will be considered notice to proceed
- 5. QUANTITIES: The quantities required under this Contract shall be determined in accordance with the category that has been identified as applicable to this Contract below.
 - | ✓ | Open End Contract: Quantities listed in this Solicitation are approximations only, based on estimates supplied by the Agency. It is understood and agreed that the Contract shall cover the quantities actually ordered for delivery during the term of the Contract, whether more or less than the quantities shown.
 - Service: The scope of the service to be provided will be more clearly defined in the specifications included herewith.
 - [Combined Service and Goods: The scope of the service and deliverable goods to be provided will be more clearly defined in the specifications included herewith.
 - One Time Purchase: This Contract is for the purchase of a set quantity of goods that are identified in the specifications included herewith. Once those items have been delivered, no additional goods may be procured under this Contract without an appropriate change order approved by the Vendor, Agency, Purchasing Division, and Attorney General's office.
- 6. PRICING: The pricing set forth herein is firm for the life of the Contract, unless specified elsewhere within this Solicitation/Contract by the State. A Vendor's inclusion of price adjustment provisions in its bid, without an express authorization from the State in the Solicitation to do so, may result in bid disqualification.
- 7. EMERGENCY PURCHASES: The Purchasing Division Director may authorize the Agency to purchase goods or services in the open market that Vendor would otherwise provide under this Contract if those goods or services are for immediate or expedited delivery in an emergency. Emergencies shall include, but are not limited to, delays in transportation or an unanticipated increase in the volume of work. An emergency purchase in the open market, approved by the Purchasing Division Director, shall not constitute of breach of this Contract and shall not entitle the Vendor to any form of compensation or damages. This provision does not excuse the State from fulfilling its obligations under a One Time Purchase contract.
- 8. REQUIRED DOCUMENTS: All of the items checked below must be provided to the Purchasing Division by the Vendor as specified below.

- 9. LITIGATION BOND: The Director reserves the right to require any Vendor that files a protest of an award to submit a litigation bond in the amount equal to one percent of the lowest bid submitted or \$5,000, whichever is greater. The entire amount of the bond shall be forfeited if the hearing officer determines that the protest was filed for frivolous or improper purpose, including but not limited to, the purpose of harassing, causing unnecessary delay, or needless expense for the Agency. All litigation bonds shall be made payable to the Purchasing Division. In lieu of a bond, the protester may submit a cashier's check or certified check payable to the Purchasing Division. Cashier's or certified checks will be deposited with and held by the State Treasurer's office. If it is determined that the protest has not been filed for frivolous or improper purpose, the bond or deposit shall be returned in its entirety.
- 10. ALTERNATES: Any model, brand, or specification listed herein establishes the acceptable level of quality only and is not intended to reflect a preference for, or in any way favor, a particular brand or vendor. Vendors may bid alternates to a listed model or brand provided that the alternate is at least equal to the model or brand and complies with the required specifications. The equality of any alternate being bid shall be determined by the State at its sole discretion. Any Vendor bidding an alternate model or brand should clearly identify the alternate items in its bid and should include manufacturer's specifications, industry literature, and/or any other relevant documentation demonstrating the equality of the alternate items. Failure to provide information for alternate items may be grounds for rejection of a Vendor's bid.
- 11. EXCEPTIONS AND CLARIFICATIONS: The Solicitation contains the specifications that shall form the basis of a contractual agreement. Vendor shall clearly mark any exceptions, clarifications, or

other proposed modifications in its bid. Exceptions to, clarifications of, or modifications of a requirement or term and condition of the Solicitation may result in bid disqualification.

This clause shall in no way be considered exclusive and shall not limit the State or Agency's right to pursue any other available remedy.

- 13. ACCEPTANCE/REJECTION: The State may accept or reject any bid in whole, or in part. Vendor's signature on its bid signifies acceptance of the terms and conditions contained in the Solicitation and Vendor agrees to be bound by the terms of the Contract, as reflected in the Purchase Order, upon receipt.
- 14. REGISTRATION: Prior to Contract award, the apparent successful Vendor must be properly registered with the West Virginia Purchasing Division and must have paid the \$125 fee if applicable.
- 15. COMMUNICATION LIMITATIONS: In accordance with West Virginia Code of State Rules §148-1-6.6, communication with the State of West Virginia or any of its employees regarding this Solicitation during the solicitation, bid, evaluation or award periods, except through the Purchasing Division, is strictly prohibited without prior Purchasing Division approval. Purchasing Division approval for such communication is implied for all agency delegated and exempt purchases.
- 16. FUNDING: This Contract shall continue for the term stated herein, contingent upon funds being appropriated by the Legislature or otherwise being made available. In the event funds are not appropriated or otherwise made available, this Contract becomes void and of no effect beginning on July 1 of the fiscal year for which funding has not been appropriated or otherwise made available.
- 17. PAYMENT: Payment in advance is prohibited under this Contract. Payment may only be made after the delivery and acceptance of goods or services. The Vendor shall submit invoices, in arrears, to the Agency at the address on the face of the purchase order labeled "Invoice To."
- 18. UNIT PRICE: Unit prices shall prevail in cases of a discrepancy in the Vendor's bid.
- 19. DELIVERY: All quotations are considered freight on board destination ("F.O.B. destination") unless alternate shipping terms are clearly identified in the bid. Vendor's listing of shipping terms that contradict the shipping terms expressly required by this Solicitation may result in bid disqualification.
- 20. INTEREST: Interest attributable to late payment will only be permitted if authorized by the West Virginia Code. Presently, there is no provision in the law for interest on late payments.
- 21. PREFERENCE: Vendor Preference may only be granted upon written request and only in accordance with the West Virginia Code § 5A-3-37 and the West Virginia Code of State Rules. A Resident Vendor Certification form has been attached hereto to allow Vendor to apply for the preference. Vendor's

- failure to submit the Resident Vendor Certification form with its bid will result in denial of Vendor Preference. Vendor Preference does not apply to construction projects.
- 22. SMALL, WOMEN-OWNED, OR MINORITY-OWNED BUSINESSES: For any solicitations publicly advertised for bid on or after July 1, 2012, in accordance with West Virginia Code §5A-3-37(a)(7) and W. Va. CSR § 148-22-9, any non-resident vendor certified as a small, women-owned, or minority-owned business under W. Va. CSR § 148-22-9 shall be provided the same preference made available to any resident vendor. Any non-resident small, women-owned, or minority-owned business must identify itself as such in writing, must submit that writing to the Purchasing Division with its bid, and must be properly certified under W. Va. CSR § 148-22-9 prior to submission of its bid to receive the preferences made available to resident vendors. Preference for a non-resident small, women-owned, or minority owned business shall be applied in accordance with W. Va. CSR § 148-22-9.
- 23. TAXES: The Vendor shall pay any applicable sales, use, personal property or any other taxes arising out of this Contract and the transactions contemplated thereby. The State of West Virginia is exempt from federal and state taxes and will not pay or reimburse such taxes.
- 24. CANCELLATION: The Purchasing Division Director reserves the right to cancel this Contract immediately upon written notice to the vendor if the materials or workmanship supplied do not conform to the specifications contained in the Contract. The Purchasing Division Director may cancel any purchase or Contract upon 30 days written notice to the Vendor in accordance with West Virginia Code of State Rules § 148-1-7.16.2.
- 25. WAIVER OF MINOR IRREGULARITIES: The Director reserves the right to waive minor irregularities in bids or specifications in accordance with West Virginia Code of State Rules § 148-1-4.6.
- 26. TIME: Time is of the essence with regard to all matters of time and performance in this Contract.
- 27. APPLICABLE LAW: This Contract is governed by and interpreted under West Virginia law without giving effect to its choice of law principles. Any information provided in specification manuals, or any other source, verbal or written, which contradicts or violates the West Virginia Constitution, West Virginia Code or West Virginia Code of State Rules is void and of no effect.
- 28. COMPLIANCE: Vendor shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, regulations and ordinances. By submitting a bid, Vendors acknowledge that they have reviewed, understand, and will comply with all applicable law.
- 29. PREVAILING WAGE: On any contract for the construction of a public improvement, Vendor and any subcontractors utilized by Vendor shall pay a rate or rates of wages which shall not be less than the fair minimum rate or rates of wages (prevailing wage), as established by the West Virginia Division of Labor under West Virginia Code §§ 21-5A-1 et seq. and available at http://www.sos.wv.gov/administrative-law/wagerates/Pages/default.aspx. Vendor shall be responsible for ensuring compliance with prevailing wage requirements and determining when prevailing wage

- requirements are applicable. The required contract provisions contained in West Virginia Code of State Rules § 42-7-3 are specifically incorporated herein by reference.
- 30. ARBITRATION: Any references made to arbitration contained in this Contract, Vendor's bid, or in any American Institute of Architects documents pertaining to this Contract are hereby deleted, void, and of no effect.
- 31. MODIFICATIONS: This writing is the parties' final expression of intent. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Contract to the contrary, no modification of this Contract shall be binding without mutual written consent of the Agency, and the Vendor, with approval of the Purchasing Division and the Attorney General's office (Attorney General approval is as to form only). No Change shall be implemented by the Vendor until such time as the Vendor receives an approved written change order from the Purchasing Division.
- 32. WAIVER: The failure of either party to insist upon a strict performance of any of the terms or provision of this Contract, or to exercise any option, right, or remedy herein contained, shall not be construed as a waiver or a relinquishment for the future of such term, provision, option, right, or remedy, but the same shall continue in full force and effect. Any waiver must be expressly stated in writing and signed by the waiving party.
- 33. SUBSEQUENT FORMS: The terms and conditions contained in this Contract shall supersede any and all subsequent terms and conditions which may appear on any form documents submitted by Vendor to the Agency or Purchasing Division such as price lists, order forms, invoices, sales agreements, or maintenance agreements, and includes internet websites or other electronic documents. Acceptance or use of Vendor's forms does not constitute acceptance of the terms and conditions contained thereon.
- 34. ASSIGNMENT: Neither this Contract nor any monies due, or to become due hereunder, may be assigned by the Vendor without the express written consent of the Agency, the Purchasing Division, the Attorney General's office (as to form only), and any other government agency or office that may be required to approve such assignments. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Purchasing Division approval may or may not be required on certain agency delegated or exempt purchases.
- 35. WARRANTY: The Vendor expressly warrants that the goods and/or services covered by this Contract will: (a) conform to the specifications, drawings, samples, or other description furnished or specified by the Agency; (b) be merchantable and fit for the purpose intended; and (c) be free from defect in material and workmanship.
- 36. STATE EMPLOYEES: State employees are not permitted to utilize this Contract for personal use and the Vendor is prohibited from permitting or facilitating the same.
- 37. BANKRUPTCY: In the event the Vendor files for bankruptcy protection, the State of West Virginia may deem this Contract null and void, and terminate this Contract without notice.

- 38. HIPAA BUSINESS ASSOCIATE ADDENDUM: The West Virginia State Government HIPAA Business Associate Addendum (BAA), approved by the Attorney General, is available online at http://www.state.wv.us/admin/purchase/vrc/hipaa.html and is hereby made part of the agreement provided that the Agency meets the definition of a Covered entity (45 CFR §160.103) and will be disclosing Protected Health Information (45 CFR §160.103) to the Vendor.
- 39. CONFIDENTIALITY: The Vendor agrees that it will not disclose to anyone, directly or indirectly, any such personally identifiable information or other confidential information gained from the Agency, unless the individual who is the subject of the information consents to the disclosure in writing or the disclosure is made pursuant to the Agency's policies, procedures, and rules. Vendor further agrees to comply with the Confidentiality Policies and Information Security Accountability Requirements, set forth in http://www.state.wv.us/admin/purchase/privacy/default.html.
- 40. DISCLOSURE: Vendor's response to the Solicitation and the resulting Contract are considered public documents and will be disclosed to the public in accordance with the laws, rules, and policies governing the West Virginia Purchasing Division. Those laws include, but are not limited to, the Freedom of Information Act found in West Virginia Code § 29B-1-1 et seq.

If a Vendor considers any part of its bid to be exempt from public disclosure. Vendor must so indicate by specifically identifying the exempt information, identifying the exemption that applies, providing a detailed justification for the exempt information, identifying the exempt information from the general bid information, and submitting the exempt information as part of its bid but in a segregated and clearly identifiable format. Failure to comply with the foregoing requirements will result in public disclosure of the Vendor's bid without further notice. A Vendor's act of marking all of nearly all of its bid as exempt is not sufficient to avoid disclosure and WILL NOT BE HONORED. Vendor's signature on its bid also affirms that neither it nor its representatives have any interest, nor shall acquire any interest, direct or indirect, which would compromise the performance of its services hereunder. Any such interests shall be promptly presented in detail to the Agency.

The individual signing this bid on behalf of Vendor certifies that he or she is authorized by the Vendor to execute this bid or any documents related thereto on Vendor's behalf; that he or she is authorized to bind the Vendor in a contractual relationship; and that, to the best of his or her knowledge, the Vendor has properly registered with any State agency that may require registration.

- 44. PURCHASING CARD ACCEPTANCE: The State of West Virginia currently utilizes a Purchasing Card program, administered under contract by a banking institution, to process payment for goods and services. The Vendor must accept the State of West Virginia's Purchasing Card for payment of all orders under this Contract unless the box below is checked.
 - Vendor is not required to accept the State of West Virginia's Purchasing Card as payment for all goods and services.
- 45. VENDOR RELATIONSHIP: The relationship of the Vendor to the State shall be that of an independent contractor and no principal-agent relationship or employer-employee relationship is contemplated or created by this Contract. The Vendor as an independent contractor is solely liable for the acts and omissions of its employees and agents. Vendor shall be responsible for selecting, supervising, and compensating any and all individuals employed pursuant to the terms of this Solicitation and resulting contract. Neither the Vendor, nor any employees or subcontractors of the Vendor, shall be deemed to be employees of the State for any purpose whatsoever. Vendor shall be exclusively responsible for payment of employees and contractors for all wages and salaries, taxes, withholding payments, penalties, fees, fringe benefits, professional liability insurance premiums, contributions to insurance and pension, or other deferred compensation plans, including but not limited to, Workers' Compensation and Social Security obligations, licensing fees, etc. and the filing of all necessary documents, forms and returns pertinent to all of the foregoing. Vendor shall hold harmless the

State, and shall provide the State and Agency with a defense against any and all claims including, but not limited to, the foregoing payments, withholdings, contributions, taxes. Social Security taxes, and employer income tax returns.

- 46. The affidavit must be submitted prior to award, but should be submitted with the Vendor's bid. A copy of the Purchasing Affidavit is included herewith.
- 48. ADDITIONAL AGENCY AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT USE: This Contract may be utilized by and extends to other agencies, spending units, and political subdivisions of the State of West Virginia; county, municipal, and other local government bodies; and school districts ("Other Government Entities"). This Contract shall be extended to the aforementioned Other Government Entities on the same prices, terms, and conditions as those offered and agreed to in this Contract. If the Vendor does not wish to extend the prices, terms, and conditions of its bid and subsequent contract to the Other Government Entities, the Vendor must clearly indicate such refusal in its bid. A refusal to extend this Contract to the Other Government Entities shall not impact or influence the award of this Contract in any manner.
- 49. CONFLICT OF INTEREST: Vendor, its officers or members or employees, shall not presently have or acquire any interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict with or compromise the performance of its obligations hereunder. Vendor shall periodically inquire of its officers, members and employees to ensure that a conflict of interest does not arise. Any conflict of interest discovered shall be promptly presented in detail to the Agency.
- 50. REPORTS: Vendor shall provide the Agency and/or the Purchasing Division with the following reports identified by a checked box below:
 - [Such reports as the Agency and/or the Purchasing Division may request. Requested reports may include, but are not limited to, quantities purchased, agencies utilizing the contract, total contract expenditures by agency, etc.

- 51. BACKGROUND CHECK: In accordance with W. Va. Code § 15-2D-3, the Director of the Division of Protective Services shall require any service provider whose employees are regularly employed on the grounds or in the buildings of the Capitol complex or who have access to sensitive or critical information to submit to a fingerprint-based state and federal background inquiry through the state repository. A contractor who uses steel products in violation of this section may be subject to civil penalties pursuant to W. Va. Code § 5A-3-56. As used in this section:
 - a. "State Contract Project" means any erection or construction of, or any addition to, alteration of or other improvement to any building or structure, including, but not limited to, roads or highways, or the installation of any heating or cooling or ventilating plants or other equipment, or the supply of and materials for such projects, pursuant to a contract with the State of West Virginia for which bids were solicited on or after June 6, 2001.
 - b. "Steel Products" means products rolled, formed, shaped, drawn, extruded, forged, cast, fabricated or otherwise similarly processed, or processed by a combination of two or more or such operations, from steel made by the open heath, basic oxygen, electric furnace, Bessemer or other steel making process.

The Purchasing Division Director may, in writing, authorize the use of foreign steel products if:

a. The cost for each contract item used does not exceed one tenth of one percent (.1%) of the total

contract cost or two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00), whichever is greater. For the purposes of this section, the cost is the value of the steel product as delivered to the project; or

- b. The Director of the Purchasing Division determines that specified steel materials are not produced in the United States in sufficient quantity or otherwise are not reasonably available to meet contract requirements.
- 53. PREFERENCE FOR USE OF DOMESTIC ALUMINUM, GLASS, AND STEEL: In Accordance with W. Va. Code § 5-19-1 et seq., and W. Va. CSR § 148-10-1 et seq., for every contract or subcontract, subject to the limitations contained herein, for the construction, reconstruction, alteration, repair, improvement or maintenance of public works or for the purchase of any item of machinery or equipment to be used at sites of public works, only domestic aluminum, glass or steel products shall be supplied unless the spending officer determines, in writing, after the receipt of offers or bids, (1) that the cost of domestic aluminum, glass or steel products is unreasonable or inconsistent with the public interest of the State of West Virginia, (2) that domestic aluminum, glass or steel products are not produced in sufficient quantities to meet the contract requirements, or (3) the available domestic aluminum, glass, or steel do not meet the contract specifications. This provision only applies to public works contracts awarded in an amount more than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) or public works contracts that require more than ten thousand pounds of steel products.

The cost of domestic aluminum, glass, or steel products may be unreasonable if the cost is more than twenty percent (20%) of the bid or offered price for foreign made aluminum, glass, or steel products. If the domestic aluminum, glass or steel products to be supplied or produced in a "substantial labor surplus area", as defined by the United States Department of Labor, the cost of domestic aluminum, glass, or steel products may be unreasonable if the cost is more than thirty percent (30%) of the bid or offered price for foreign made aluminum, glass, or steel products.

This preference shall be applied to an item of machinery or equipment, as indicated above, when the item is a single unit of equipment or machinery manufactured primarily of aluminum, glass or steel, is part of a public works contract and has the sole purpose or of being a permanent part of a single public works project. This provision does not apply to equipment or machinery purchased by a spending unit for use by that spending unit and not as part of a single public works project.

All bids and offers including domestic aluminum, glass or steel products that exceed bid or offer prices including foreign aluminum, glass or steel products after application of the preferences provided in this provision may be reduced to a price equal to or lower than the lowest bid or offer price for foreign aluminum, glass or steel products plus the applicable preference. If the reduced bid or offer prices are made in writing and supersede the prior bid or offer prices, all bids or offers, including the reduced bid or offer prices, will be reevaluated in accordance with this rule.

SPECIFICATIONS

- 1. PURPOSE AND SCOPE: The West Virginia Purchasing Division is soliciting bids On behalf of the West Virginia Division of Highways, Department of Transportation to establish an open-end contract for Nine Cubic Yard Stainless Steel Demountable and Abrasive Chemical Spreader (Hydraulic).
- 2. **DEFINITIONS:** The terms listed below shall have the meanings assigned to them below. Additional definitions can be found in section 2 of the General Terms and Conditions.
 - 2.1 "Contract Item" or "Contract Items" means the list of items identified in Section 3, Subsection 1 below.
 - 2.2 "Pricing Pages" means the schedule of prices, estimated order quantity, and totals attached hereto as Exhibit A and used to evaluate the RFQ.
 - 2.3 "RFQ" means the official request for quotation published by the Purchasing Division and identified as 7013EC07.
 - 2.4 "DOH" means Division of Highways.

3. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS:

- 3.1 Contract Items and Mandatory Requirements: Vendor shall provide Agency with the contract Items listed below on an open-end and continuing basis. Contract items must meet or exceed the mandatory requirements as shown below.
- 3.1.1 General Nine Cubic Yard Stainless Steel Demountable and Abrasive Chemical Spreader (Hydraulic) general mandatory requirements.
 - 3.1.1.1 Spreader offered shall be of the commercial heavy-duty, self-contained, hopper type.
 - 3.1.1.2 Spreader shall consist of a 12 gauge 201 stainless steel body, feeder conveyor, spinner disc, power drive, and all components necessary to make a complete operating unit.

- 3.1.1.3 Spreader shall be capable of uniformly spreading sand, cinders, salt, calcium chloride, or other mixtures up to a width of forty (40) feet.
- **3.1.2** Body The following are mandatory requirements related to the body of the spreader.
 - 3.1.2.1 The body shall be of 201 stainless steel construction 100% welded inside and outside of the body.
 - 3.1.2.2 The struck capacity shall be within the range of 8.7 9.3 cubic yards minimum.
 - 3.1.2.3 Inside length shall be 13 feet as measured from front of spreader hopper to the rear hopper gate and conveyor chain exit point.
 - 3.1.2.4 The body sides must slope at minimum 45 degree pitch to insure free flow of materials to the conveyor.
 - 3.1.2.5 The body sides and end-gates shall be constructed with minimum 12 gauge 201 stainless steel.
 - 3.1.2.6 Sills shall be a minimum of 10 gauge 304 stainless steel with longitudinal flanges supported on rectangular formed cross sills.
 - 3.1.2.7 The body shall be provided with four (4) 201 stainless steel 5/8 inch round lifting eyes. The inside eye opening shall be designed to allow the passage of an alloy eye type Grade 80' 3/8 inch grab hook with a width dimension of 2 11/16 inch (with the top screen down in the rest position on top of the spreader). Two (2) of the lifting eyes shall be on each side of spreader mounted and secured in such a manner that the entire unit may be safely lifted for storage/installation purposes.
 - 3.1.2.8 Overall Height shall be 59 inches maximum.
 - 3.1.2.9 Inside width shall be 82 inches maximum.
- **3.1.3 Hardware** The following are mandatory requirements related to necessary hardware for the spreader.
 - 3.1.3.1 All necessary hardware shall be stainless steel.

- 3.1.3.2 Stainless steel cab shield shall extend 13 inches in front of hopper at 45 degrees.
- 3.1.3.3 A 300 series stainless steel grab handle must be mounted to the drivers side spill shield side plate at a convenient location to assist operator when climbing atop spreader to remove "chunks or debris".
- 3.1.3.4 A fold up stainless steel ladder shall be mounted on rear of spreader body at right for easier access to top.
- 3.1.3.5 A 300 series stainless steel grip strut step plate shall be mounted on rear of spreader "spinner" housing frame, above rear baffle, full width of spinner housing.
- 3.1.4 Conveyor The following are mandatory requirements related to the conveyor of the spreader.
 - 3.1.4.1 The conveyor shall be located in bottom of hopper capable of engaging material along its full length and moving the material to the rear adjustable metering gate.
 - 3.1.4.2 Conveyor shall be continuous ladder type consisting of two (2) parallel chains with cross bars on 4 ½" centers made of ½" x 1-1/2" steel.
 - 3.1.4.3 Each cross bar shall be formed and welded both top and bottom to chain links.
 - 3.1.4.4 Tensile strength of each chain strand shall be 21,000 pounds minimum.
 - 3.1.4.5 Overall width of chain conveyor shall be 20 inches minimum.
 - 3.1.4.6 Replaceable rubber wear strips to prevent contact of material being spread with the chain must be provided.
 - 3.1.4.7 A 10 gauge 201 stainless steel heavy-duty replaceable conveyor plate shall be fitted.
 - 3.1.4.8 Conveyor shall have adjustment provisions at rear of spreader for at least 3" lateral take up.

- 3.1.4.9 The material composition of the adjustment mechanism shall be stainless steel.
- 3.1.4.10 The conveyor drive motor shall be mounted on rear of the reduction gear box and have a ratio of approximately 50 1.
- 3.1.4.11 Conveyor gear box motor shall have an integral speed sensor.
- 3.1.4.12 Any and all exposed moving or rotating mass shall be adequately shielded in order to protect personnel while performing required operational adjustments, such shielding shall include gear box extended input shaft when rate sensor is installed.
- 3.1.4.13 The pintle conveyor chain shall be heat treated formed links with locked, non-turning pins.
- 3.1.4.14 Feedgate opening shall be 12" high x 18" wide.
- **3.1.5 Distributor Spinner Assembly** The following are mandatory requirements related to the distributor spinner assembly.
 - 3.1.5.1 The distributor disc shall be of urethane material minimum 20" in diameter and equipped with six (6) fins (approximately) designed to obtain a controlled spread of four (4') to forty feet (40').
 - 3.1.5.2 Material shall be guided from conveyor end to distributor disc by means of an externally adjustable material flow baffles, enclosed within the chute.
 - 3.1.5.3 Spinner shall be vertically adjustable minimum 18 inches and provide minimum 20 inch to 38 inch spinner position below the mounting surface.
 - 3.1.5.4 A deflector baffle or diverter chute shall be provided in the enclosed distributor spinner hopper assembly so it can be positioned in such a manner that material can be unloaded from spreader without striking spinner. **NOTE:** Flip up chute is not acceptable.
- 3.1.6 Baffles The following are mandatory requirements related to baffles.
 - 3.1.6.1 Baffles shall be provided to control direction and width of spread.

- 3.1.6.2 Baffle sections must be easily adjusted in desired position, from full down to horizontal, without use of tool.
- **3.1.7 Power Drive** The following are mandatory requirements related to the power drive.
 - 3.1.7.1 The power drive shall be hydraulic having two (2) hydraulic motors, one (1) powering the spinner and one (1) the conveyor.
- 3.1.8 Screen Over Hopper The following are mandatory requirements related to the screen.
 - 3.1.8.1 A minimum of four (4) sectional screens shall be hinged to a 10 gauge 201 stainless steel 4 inch x 6 inch formed box beam running longitudinally the full length of spreader hopper.
- 3.1.9 Lighting The following are mandatory requirements related to the lights.
 - 3.1.9.1 Stop, tail, turn combination lights and marker lights shall be shielded.
 - 3.1.9.2 Warning light shall be Class 1 LED amber.
- **3.1.10 Hydraulic Components** The following are mandatory requirements related to the hydraulic components.
 - 3.1.10.1 The following hydraulics shall be supplied with each spreader (hose lengths to be determined by spreader vendor) to provide for proper installation on Division of Highways dump trucks.
 - 3.1.10.2 All necessary fittings for complete hookup of spreader hydraulics to the Division of Highways dump trucks central hydraulic system shall be provided.
 - 3.1.10.3 All fittings shall be the steel type designed for hydraulic use: galvanized iron pipe or fittings are not acceptable.
 - 3.1.10.4 The truck central hydraulic system, supplied and installed by another vendor, will be complete to and including the rear manifold, located at the rear cross-member of truck. The rear manifold will have attached to it one (1) ¼ inch I.D. pressure line with ¾ inch quick disconnect, one (1) ½

inch I.D. pressure line with ½ inch quick disconnect, one (1) 1 inch I.D. return line with 1-1/4 inch quick disconnect. The quick disconnects will be "VH" series snap-tite. The spreader vendor shall supply male quick disconnects, metal caps, and plugs for connection to truck manifold.

- 3.1.11 Manifold Block The following are mandatory requirements related to the manifold block.
 - 3.1.11.1 An anodized 6061T6 aluminum or 201 stainless steel grease manifold block shall be mounted at the rear of the body incorporating the front bearing grease extension tubes, rear bearing grease fittings, and feedgate screw jack lubrication tube to allow for lubrication of the front bearings and feedgate screw jack from a single convenient location. Other fittings shall be placed at convenient locations for normal maintenance.
 - 3.1.11.2 The anodized 6061T6 aluminum or 201 stainless steel grease manifold block shall have a minimum of six (6) ports tapped to accept three (3) 1/8 inch straight grease zerks and three (3) 1/8 inch grease Parflex hoses to provide for adequate one location greasing of the front and rear bearings and feed gate screw jack. Any unused ports are to be properly plugged.
- 3.1.12 Hoses—The following are mandatory requirements related to the hoses.
 - 3.1.12.1 All hoses incorporated into the grease manifold block system shall be Parflex hose manufactured by Parker Hannifan Corporation or equal, and shall have an inside diameter of 1/8 inch, a maximum outside diameter of 0.34 inch, a maximum working pressure of 2500 psi and a minimum burst pressure of 10,000 psi. The hoses used shall be held in place by a sufficient number of rubber cushioned hose clamps.
- **3.1.13** Advertisement The following are mandatory requirements related to advertising.
 - 3.1.13.1 Vendors are permitted to attach a permanent metal plate 4" x 6" maximum size to the unit for identification. All other types of advertising, decals, labels, etc. will interfere with the West Virginia Division of Highway's standards and are not permitted.

- 3.1.14 MISCELLANEOUS The following are mandatory requirements related to miscellaneous items needed.
 - 3.1.14.1 One (1) piece of angle iron 3/8" x 4" x 4" x 90" and two (2) pieces of 1" round shafting ten inches (10") long shall be included to construct a safety keeper bar. State forces will add this item when the hopper is mounted, vendor shall supply material.
 - 3.1.14.2 Unit shall include all other features considered as standard equipment but not specifically addressed above.
- 3.2 Contract Items Non-Mandatory Requirements: Vendor should provide Agency with the non-mandatory Contract Items listed as desirable, but are non-mandatory.
- 3.2.2 Body Non-mandatory desirable items related to the body of the spreader.
 - 3.2.2.1 Top of the body should have a formed double crimped section for additional support.
 - 3.2.2.2 Should have a minimum of six (6) sides composed of 12 gauge 201 stainless steel. The body should have full slope body side supports rigidly tying in the formed cross sills with the body sides to give the highest degree of resistance to warping or twisting under heavy loads.
- **3.2.3** Hardware Non-mandatory desirable items related to hardware of spreader.
 - 3.2.3.1 A 12 gauge 201 stainless steel cab shield should be mounted on front of body to protect cab from falling material when loading with slope design to fall in hopper as spreader unloads.
 - 3.2.3.2 Ladder to be equipped with hand holds, non-slip strut steps, and manufacturers locking mechanism to lock ladder in up position when not in use.

- **3.2.4** Conveyor Non-mandatory desirable items related to the conveyor of the spreader.
 - 3.2.4.1 Chain driven by 6 tooth drop forged steel sprockets and 1 ½ inchalloy steel front and rear.
 - 3.2.4.2 Additional 7 gauge 201 stainless steel reinforcing plate should be welded to longitudinal webs covering area of drive shaft bearing and idler bearing adjustment (if required).
 - 3.2.4.3 A 7 gauge stainless steel adjustable discharge gate of the greasable screw jack type, located at the body rear to properly adjust the flow of material to the spinner.
- 3.2.5 Baffles Non-mandatory desirable items related to the baffles.
 - 3.2.5.1 Should have four (4) sections over right, left, rear, and front of spinners. The front spinner baffle shield (truck side) can be stationary.
- 3.2.7 Power Drive Non-mandatory desirable items related to the power drive.
 - 3.2.7.1 The spinner hydraulic motor should be mounted below the spinner hopper assembly.
 - 3.2.7.2 The orbital, low speed, hi-torque type, conveyor hydraulic motor should be integrally mounted to conveyor gear box.
- 3.2.8 Screen Over Hopper Non-mandatory desirable items related to the screen.
 - 3.2.8.1 Screen sections should be 3/8" diameter carbon steel rods welded forming 2-1/2" x 2-1/2" square openings with reinforcing bars at the center of each section.
 - 3.2.8.2 Screens should not increase the overall height of the spreader more than 7" down center.
 - 3.2.8.3 Screens should be powder coated black.

- 3.2.9 Lighting Non-mandatory desirable items related to the lights.
 - 3.2.9.1 Combination/marker lights should be LED type.
 - 3.2.9.2 A work light to be mounted on cab shield for night shift visibility of spreader grating with weatherproof wiring.
- 3.2.15 Paint Non-mandatory desirable items related to the color of spreader.
 - 3.2.15.1 All parts and accessories that are not required as stainless or rust proof may be painted manufacturers standard color.

4. CONTRACT AWARD:

- 4.1 Contract Award: The Contract is intended to provide Agencies with a purchase price on all Contract Items. The Contract shall be awarded to the Vendor that provides the Contract Items meeting the required specifications for the lowest overall total cost as shown on the Pricing Pages.
- 4.2 Pricing Pages: Vendor should complete the Pricing Pages (Exhibit A) by completing the Year, Make, model, and inserting quoted price. Vendor should complete the pricing pages in their entirety as failure to do so may result in Vendor's bids being disqualified.

5. ORDERING AND PAYMENT:

- 5.1 Ordering: Vendor shall accept orders by regular mail, facsimile, e-amil, or any other written forms of communication.
- 5.2 Payment: Vendor shall accept payment in accordance with the payment procedures of the State of West Virginia.

6. DELIVERY AND RETURN:

- orders are received. Vendor shall deliver standard orders within 90 working days after orders are received. Vendor shall ship all orders in accordance with the above schedule and shall not hold orders until a minimum delivery quantity is met. A completed pilot model for inspection must be provided within 60 working day(s) after receipt of the purchase agreement by the successful vendor.
- 6.2 Late Delivery: The Agency placing the order under this Contract must be notified in writing if orders will be delayed for any reason. A "line sheet" (if applicable) and the "Equipment Preventative Maintenance Questionnaire", (Exhibit "B") must be with pilot unit upon delivery. Attn: Marcia Lee. The inside eye opening shall be designed to allow the passage of an alloy eye type Grade 80' 3/8 inch grab hook with a width dimension of 2 11/16 inch (with the top screen down in the rest position on top of the spreader). Two (2) of the lifting eyes shall be on each side of spreader mounted and secured in such a manner that the entire unit may be safely lifted for storage/installation purposes.

Question: Baker Equipment: 5/8" round is not available in 201 stainless steel, will you change this to 304 stainless steel 5/8 inch round lifting eyes?

Answer: Yes, this will read as four (4) 304 stainless steel 5/8 inch round lifting eyes.

4. 3.1.2.8 Inside width shall be 84 inches maximum.

Question: Highway Equipment/West Virginia Tractor: Will DOH accept 82" as this is our standard model manufactured width?

Answer: No, specifications shall remain as written.

5. 3.1.3.2 Stainless steel cab shield shall extend 13 inches in front of hopper at 45 degrees.

Question: Swenson Spreader: Could the state provide the width for the cab shield?

Answer: A bolt on full width cab shield (84" x 13") with end plates and 2 gussets.

6. 3.1.4.2 Conveyor shall be continuous ladder type consisting of two (2) parallel chains with cross bars on 4 ½" centers made of ½" x 1-1/2" steel.

Question: LH Jones: Could the word minimum be inserted between "of" and "1/4"?" The cross bars available to our manufacturer are a more rugged 3/8" x 1-1/2".

Answer: No, specifications remain as written.

7. 3.1.4.6 Replaceable rubber wear strips to prevent contact of materials being spread with the chain must be provided.

Question #1: LH Jones: You are asking for rubber shields on spreader chain, do you want this just on the sides, front, back or all?

Question #2: Henke Mfg.: Can I get clarification as to what your referring here? Are these mounted on the sides of the conveyor?

Answer: The rubber shields run lengthwise over chain with wiper seals at the rear of conveyor.

8. 3.1.4.11 Conveyor gear box motor shall have an integral speed sensor.

Question # 1: LH Jones: Could you provide specific information about what connectors should be used on the motor sensor to match with the State's existing wiring harnesses?

Answer: The spinner shall be 3.0 CIR 4 Volt White # 15505073153AAA or equal:

Sensor 5.9 CIR 2 Volt M12, White # 155100A1115AAZDS or equal.

Question # 2: LH Jones: Does the State have a preference about how many pulses the motor/sensor produces? If so please provide the preferred number of pulses.

Answer: Minimum 100 pulses per revolution.

Question 1 and 2 will be revised to read as: 3.1.4.11 Conveyor gear box motor shall have an integral speed sensor. The spinner shall be 3.0 CIR 4 Volt White # 15505073153AAA or equal. The sensor shall be 5.9 CIR 2 Volt M12, White # 155100A1115AAZDS or equal. The motor/sensor shall produce 100 pulses per revolution.

9. 3.1.4.14 Feedgate opening shall be 12" high x 18" wide.

Question # 1/Suggestion: Baker Equipment: This should read 10" high x 18" wide?

Question # 2: Henke Mfg.: Will you accept 10" x 18" opening? During operation the chute isn't opened but a couple inches anyway.

Answer: Correct to read as:

3.1.4.14 Feedgate opening shall be 10" x 18" wide.

10. 3,1.5.3 Spinner shall be vertically adjustable, a minimum 18 inches, and provide a 20 inch to 38 inch minimum spinner position below the mounting surface.

Question/Suggestion: Baker Equipment: We feel this should read as: Spinner shall be vertically adjustable, a minimum 18 inches and provide a 39" to 47 %" minimum spinner position below the mounting surface.

Answer: Revise to read as: 3.1.5.3 Spinner shall be vertically adjustable, a minimum 18 inches and provide a 39" to 47 %" minimum spinner position below the mounting surface.

11. 3.1.7 Power Drive

Question/Suggestion: Baker Equipment: This section needs to have a better description of location and type of motors.

Answer: This is a Charlyn motor or equal. It will be added to section 3.1.7. It will read as:

3.1.7.2 Charlyn motor or equal.

12. 3.1.8.1 A minimum of four (4) sectional screens shall be hinged to a 10 gauge 201 stainless 4 inch x 6 inch formed box beam running longitudinally the full length of spreader hopper.

Question: Highway Equipment/West Virginia Tractor: Will DOH accept 9.0 lb. CS 4" x 6" I- beam?

Answer: No, I-beams are not stainless steel, where a box beam is.

13. 3.1.10.4 / 3.1.12.1 Reference to "Snap-Tite" and "Parker"

Question: LH Jones: Snap-Tite and Parker brand name components are called for, respectively. Since these sections are mandatory specifications, are the brand names required? Or, per the instructions to vendors submitting bids, which says, all references to brands are to establish the acceptable level of quality only and is not intended to reflect a preference for, or in any way favor, a particular brand or vendor. Vendors may bid alternates,... provided that the alternate is at least equal to the model or brand and complies with the specifications can alternate brands be supplied for these mandatory specifications as long as they are equal in specification?

Answer: These sections 3.1.10.4 and 3.1.12.1 will be revised to read "Snap-Tite" and "Parker" or equal.

14. 3.2.2 Body

3.2.2.1 Top of the body should have a formed double crimped section for additional support.

Question/Suggestion: Baker Equipment: This describes the top edge double flange lip that is formed into the top edge of the sides and ends giving the sides and ends a top rail for both support and a frame work for the top screens to rest on. (Without this the sheets would have no support at the top edge). We would like for this to be moved to mandatory?

Answer: Move to mandatory and it will read as:

- 3.1,2.10 Top of the body shall have a formed double crimped section for additional support.
- 15. 3.2.2.2 Should have a minimum six (6) sides composed of 12 gauge 201 stainless steel. The body should have full slope body side supports rigidly tying in the formed cross sills with the body sides to give the highest degree of resistance to warping or twisting under heavy loads.

Question #1: Baker Equipment: This needs to be moved to mandatory and it should read as four (4) side supports?

Question # 2: Swenson Spreader: Can the state provide clarification on what this means "a minimum of six (6) sides? Is the six (6) sides total or per side? Does the Five CY spreader have the same six (6) sides?

Answer: Move to mandatory and revise, it will read as:

3.1.2.11 Shall have a minimum six (6) side supports total composed of 12 gauge 201 stainless steel. The body shall have full slope body side supports rigidly tying in the formed cross sills with the body sides to give the highest degree of resistance to warping or twisting under heavy loads.

Answer: No, the 5 cubic yd. spreader has a minimum of 4 sides.

16. 3.2.3 Hardware

- 3.2.3.1 A 12 gauge 201 stainless steel cab shield should be mounted on front of body to protect cab from falling material when loading with slope designed to fall in hopper as spreader unloads.
- 3.2.3.2 Ladder to be equipped with hand holds, non-slip strut steps, and manufacturers locking mechanism to lock ladder in up position when not in use.

Question #1/Suggestion: Baker Equipment: The above items need to be moved to mandatory, because these items are descriptive information that need to be included in mandatory.

Question #2: Swenson Spreader: Can the state provide dimensions for the cab shield?

Answer: Please see question # 5 for answer to cab shield dimensions. We will delete section 3.2.3 and move it to mandatory. It will read as:

- 3.1.3.6 A 12 gauge 201 stainless steel cab shield shall be mounted on front of body to protect cab from falling material when loading with slope designed to fall in hopper as spreader unloads.
- 3.1.3.7 Ladder to be equipped with hand holds, non-slip strut steps, and manufacturers locking mechanism to lock ladder in up position when not in use.

17. 3.2.4 Conveyor

- 3.2.4.1 Chain driven by 6 tooth drop forged steel sprockets and 1 ½ inch alloy steel front and rear.
- 3.2.4.2 Additional 7 gauge 201 stainless steel reinforcing plate should be welded to longitudinal webs covering area of drive shaft bearing and idler bearing adjustment (if required).
- 3.2.4.3 A 7 gauge stainless steel adjustable discharge gate of the greasable screw jack type, located at the rear to properly adjust the flow of material to the spinner.

Question/Suggestion: Baker Equipment: The above items need to be put in mandatory requirements. They are integral parts of the conveyor system in order to make sure the conveyor works. Also the rear feedgate is a integral part of the system, as well it is needed to regulate the flow of material to the spinner for correct pounds per mile calibration of material being put down on the roads.

Answer: Delete section 3.2.4 and move to mandatory. It will then read as:

- 3.1.4.15 Shall be chain driven by 6 tooth drop forged steel sprockets and 1 ½ inch alloy steel front and rear.
- 3.1.4.16 Additional 7 gauge 201 stainless steel reinforcing plate shall be welded to longitudinal webs covering area of drive shaft bearing and idler bearing adjustment (if required).
- 3.1.4.17 Shall have a 7 gauge stainless steel adjustable discharge gate of the greasable screw jack type, located at the rear to properly adjust the flow of material to the spinner.

18. 3.2.5 Baffles

3.2.5.1 Should have four (4) sections over right, left, rear, and front of spinners. The front spinner baffle shield (truck side) can be stationary.

Question: Baker Equipment: We are requesting that this be put into mandatory requirements, because it describes the four (4) baffles and their position?

Answer: Delete section 3.2.5 and move to mandatory. It will then read as:

3.1.6.3 Shall have four (4) sections over right, left, rear, and front of spinners. The front spinner baffle shield (truck side) can be stationary.

19. 3.2.7.1 The spinner hydraulic motor should be mounted below the spinner hopper assembly.

Question #1: Henke Mfg.: Our hydraulic motor assembly mounts above, is this acceptable?

Question # 2: Baker Equipment: We feel this needs put into mandatory, because the descriptive information is needed to properly get the correct motors in the correct locations. Our motor is mounted above the spinner disc assembly, is this acceptable?

Answer: Yes, we will delete section 3.2.7 and revise and move to mandatory. It will then read as:

3.1.7.2 The spinner hydraulic motor shall be mounted above the spinner hopper assembly.

20. 3.2.7.2 The orbital, low speed, hi-torque type, conveyor hydraulic motor should be integrally mounted to conveyor gear box.

Question: Baker Equipment: This should be moved to mandatory?

Answer: Move to mandatory, it will read as:

- 3.1.7.3 The orbital, low speed, hi-torque type, conveyor hydraulic motor shall be integrally mounted to conveyor gear box.
- 21. 3.2.8.1 Screen sections should be 3/8" diameter rods welded to 3/16 inch 2 inch angle frame forming 2-1/2" x 2-1/2" square openings.
 - 3,2.8.2 Screens should not increase the overall height of the spreader more than 7" down center.
 - 3.2.8.3 Screens should be powered black.

Question: Baker Equipment: These 3 sections 3.2.8.1, 3.2.8.2 and 3.2.8.3 need to be moved to mandatory, because it is descriptive information needed to build and bid the top screens for the unit? We feel 3.2.8.3 should read wet painted black.

Answer: We will delete section 3.2.8 and move it to mandatory. We will also revise 3.2.8.3 to read wet painted black. This will read as:

- 3.1.8.2 Screen sections shall be 3/8" diameter rods welded to 3/16 inch -2 inch angle frame forming 2-1/2" x 2-1/2" square openings.
- 3.1.8.3 Screens shall not increase the overall height of the spreader more than 7" down center.
- 3.1.8.4 Screens shall be wet painted black.

3.2.9.1 Combination/marker lights should be LED type. 22.

3.2.9.2 A work light should be mounted on cab shield for night shift visibility of spreader grating with

weatherproof wiring.

Question: Baker Equipment: These two (2) sections need to be moved to mandatory, due to

descriptive information needed to build and bid the lighting section?

Answer: We will delete section 3.2.9 and move it to mandatory, it will read as:

3.1.9.3 Combination/marker lights shall be LED type.

3.1.9.4 A work light shall be mounted on cab shield for night shift visibility of spreader grating with

weatherproof wiring.

Questions that had no reference numbers with them:

23. Question: LH Jones: The 13' spreader is calling for a 13' cab shield as a mandatory specification and the 9' spreader is calling for a 20" cab shield as a non-mandatory specification, can we provide one size or

the other for all spreaders?

Answer: Remains as written.

Question: Baker Equipment: In a previous spec there was a schematic provided and referred to. This is

not in the new specification?

Answer: This was distributed at the pre-bid and is also included in this addendum as Exhibit C.

Question: Baker Equipment: The team wonders if we should ask about installation at factory of the spill

shield, work light and screen. The questions were asked for each of these in 2011 and response was to

ship loose. Should we assume the same for this bid?

Answer: Yes.
