Agency Experience

Youth Services System is a unique consortium of programs and services designed to meet the needs of high risk/high need children and their families. We are situated in and have served the communities of Northern West Virginia since 1974. Our Agency is comprised of residential, community-based, school-based and in-home services designed to provide a wide array of treatment and support responses to the needs of children and families.

Our residential services include two emergency youth shelters which offer crisis services, two transitional living centers for youth (17-21) aging out of foster care, and a residential treatment program for youth with intellectual deficits and developmental delays. We offer employment and training services to youth as well as individual and family therapy, professional assessment services, and an intensive outpatient program for youth with drug and alcohol issues.

In over forty years of service, we have worked with over 22,000 children and families. We have achieved national distinction for program accomplishments through the National Child Labor Committee's Lewis Hines Award (1988) as well as the U.S. Department of Justice's award as a national Model Worthy of Replication (1989). We are the only private not-for-profit to manage a secure Juvenile Detention Center. For this reason, we were designated as West Virginia's nominee to the Ford Foundation's "Innovative Programs" award.

We are licensed by the WV Department of Health and Human Resources to provide emergency shelter care, residential treatment for ID/DD youth, behavioral health services, and transitional living services.

Designated as a 501- C-3 non-profit by the Internal Revenue Service, we are governed by a volunteer Board of Directors. Our Agency is audited annually for compliance with fiscal controls and practices including an A-133 audit check for use of funds from the federal government.

Since 1992, Youth Services System has operated an array of Community-Based Services including an intensive outpatient program (IOP) for treating adolescents with drug and alcohol addictions, Safety Services and Supervised Visitation for parents with child protection cases, and case management and assessment services, including the Comprehensive Assessment and Planning System (CAPS) developed for use in West Virginia for services for youth and their families. Our school-based services reach youth in Ohio and Marshall County schools. This year we are launching an affiliate chapter of Big Brothers/Big Sisters.

Youth Services System Board of Directors is a dedicated group of volunteers with experience in education, civil rights, law enforcement, and service provision. The Agency's management team has over 100 years of combined services to both Youth Services System and in the communities in which we work. This Agency has received and managed federal grants for both capital expansion and program provision from

Housing and Urban Development, Department of Justice, Department of Labor and the Health and Human Services. As well, the Agency has managed grants from a variety of private foundations.

We currently manage contracts with the WV Department of Health and Human Resources to hire and place caseworkers throughout Region I. YSS has contracts with private providers for clinical and medical services to insure the provision of rapid professional assessments and clinical oversight when circumstances require. Because of our range of services, Youth Services System maintains a longstanding, open, cooperative and mutually respected standing with all of the DHHR offices and Juvenile Court jurisdictions in Region 1.

Youth Services System is insured through the West Virginia State Board of Risk Management and is in compliance with requirements in the current DJS contract. This Agency complies with all current regulations and policies concerning confidentiality, including federal HIPPA requirements, conflicts of interest, lobbying, and criminal investigation and background checks.

We seek to offer residents ways to engage in self-reflection, to meet a diverse group representing our community, and to give them practical skills for their relationships with others.

- Journaling is offered to residents during a group. Thoughts, feelings, and discussions occur with counselors.

 Female residents get the opportunity to use make up, paint their nails, and fix their hair.

Education

- Education is provided by the WV Department of Education.
- 21 students completed the "Thinking for a Change" curriculum and earned certificates. This is an integrated, cognitive behavioral change program for offenders that include cognitive restructuring, social skills development, and development of problem solving skills.
- ➤ In addition, two students earned their high school diplomas and seven passed the TASC, The TASC is a national high school equivalency assessment. It assesses five subject areas: Reading, Writing, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies. The five subject area tests are based on what current students need to know to pass high school tests. All together, the TASC test measures examinees' levels of achievement relative to that of graduating high school seniors, and Career and College readiness standards.
- > Currently we are in the process of enrolling students into CTE courses. These courses prepare students for Career and Technical occupations such as animal science, computer game design, and fashion and interior design.
- > To eliminate challenging behaviors both in school and during off-schools hours, the Facility Director, Assistant Director, and the school staff worked together to develop a Positive Behavior Support Plan for the students.

Education Continued

- > The purpose of this plan is an approach to eliminate challenging behaviors and replace them with pro social skills. Use of PBS decreases the need for more intrusive or aversive interventions (i.e. punishment or suspension) and can lead to both systemic as well as individualized change.
- > The students earn "Doe Bucks" for maintaining a B+ average GPA and attending school every day without write-ups. The students earn ONE doe buck per week. They can use these "bucks" to purchase items at the "Doe Buck Store." They can cash them in each week or save them up for more "expensive" items. The items range from a snack item to journals or 10 minute telephone calls.
- Each week the top 25% of the students earn a movie ticket for the opportunity to watch a movie on Saturday. If a write up is warranted, the student does not lose his/her buck but has to wait until the next week to cash it in. Thus positive behavior is rewarded.

Agency Experience

Youth Services System is a unique consortium of programs and services designed to meet the needs of high risk/high need children and their families. We are situated in and have served the communities of Northern West Virginia since 1974. Our Agency is comprised of residential, community-based, school-based and in-home services designed to provide a wide array of treatment and support responses to the needs of children and families.

Our residential services include two emergency youth shelters which offer crisis services, two transitional living centers for youth (17-21) aging out of foster care, and a residential treatment program for youth with intellectual deficits and developmental delays. We offer employment and training services to youth as well as individual and family therapy, professional assessment services, and an intensive outpatient program for youth with drug and alcohol issues.

In over forty years of service, we have worked with over 22,000 children and families. We have achieved national distinction for program accomplishments through the National Child Labor Committee's Lewis Hines Award (1988) as well as the U.S. Department of Justice's award as a national Model Worthy of Replication (1989). We are the only private not-for-profit to manage a secure Juvenile Detention Center. For this reason, we were designated as West Virginia's nominee to the Ford Foundation's "Innovative Programs" award.

We are licensed by the WV Department of Health and Human Resources to provide emergency shelter care, residential treatment for ID/DD youth, behavioral health services, and transitional living services.

Designated as a 501- C-3 non-profit by the Internal Revenue Service, we are governed by a volunteer Board of Directors. Our Agency is audited annually for compliance with fiscal controls and practices including an A-133 audit check for use of funds from the federal government.

Since 1992, Youth Services System has operated an array of Community-Based Services including an intensive outpatient program (IOP) for treating adolescents with drug and alcohol addictions, Safety Services and Supervised Visitation for parents with child protection cases, and case management and assessment services, including the Comprehensive Assessment and Planning System (CAPS) developed for use in West Virginia for services for youth and their families. Our school-based services reach youth in Ohio and Marshall County schools. This year we are launching an affiliate chapter of Big Brothers/Big Sisters.

Youth Services System Board of Directors is a dedicated group of volunteers with experience in education, civil rights, law enforcement, and service provision. The Agency's management team has over 100 years of combined services to both Youth Services System and in the communities in which we work. This Agency has received and managed federal grants for both capital expansion and program provision from

Housing and Urban Development, Department of Justice, Department of Labor and the Health and Human Services. As well, the Agency has managed grants from a variety of private foundations.

We currently manage contracts with the WV Department of Health and Human Resources to hire and place caseworkers throughout Region I. YSS has contracts with private providers for clinical and medical services to insure the provision of rapid professional assessments and clinical oversight when circumstances require. Because of our range of services, Youth Services System maintains a longstanding, open, cooperative and mutually respected standing with all of the DHHR offices and Juvenile Court jurisdictions in Region 1.

Youth Services System is insured through the West Virginia State Board of Risk Management and is in compliance with requirements in the current DJS contract. This Agency complies with all current regulations and policies concerning confidentiality, including federal HIPPA requirements, conflicts of interest, lobbying, and criminal investigation and background checks.

We seek to offer residents ways to engage in self-reflection, to meet a diverse group representing our community, and to give them practical skills for their relationships with others.

- Journaling is offered to residents during a group. Thoughts, feelings, and discussions occur with counselors.

Education

- > Education is provided by the WV Department of Education.
- 21 students completed the "Thinking for a Change" curriculum and earned certificates. This is an integrated, cognitive behavioral change program for offenders that include cognitive restructuring, social skills development, and development of problem solving skills.
- In addition, two students earned their high school diplomas and seven passed the TASC, The TASC is a national high school equivalency assessment. It assesses five subject areas: Reading, Writing, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies. The five subject area tests are based on what current students need to know to pass high school tests. All together, the TASC test measures examinees' levels of achievement relative to that of graduating high school seniors, and Career and College readiness standards.
- Currently we are in the process of enrolling students into CTE courses. These courses prepare students for Career and Technical occupations such as animal science, computer game design, and fashion and interior design.
- > To eliminate challenging behaviors both in school and during off-schools hours, the Facility Director, Assistant Director, and the school staff worked together to develop a Positive Behavior Support Plan for the students.

Education Continued

- > The purpose of this plan is an approach to eliminate challenging behaviors and replace them with pro social skills. Use of PBS decreases the need for more intrusive or aversive interventions (i.e. punishment or suspension) and can lead to both systemic as well as individualized change.
- The students earn "Doe Bucks" for maintaining a B+ average GPA and attending school every day without write-ups. The students earn ONE doe buck per week. They can use these "bucks" to purchase items at the "Doe Buck Store." They can cash them in each week or save them up for more "expensive" items. The items range from a snack item to journals or 10 minute telephone calls.
- Each week the top 25% of the students earn a movie ticket for the opportunity to watch a movie on Saturday. If a write up is warranted, the student does not lose his/her buck but has to wait until the next week to cash it in. Thus positive behavior is rewarded.
