- 5. VERBAL COMMUNICATION: Any verbal communication between the Vendor and any State personnel is not binding, including verbal communication at the mandatory pre-bid conference. Vendor shall be exclusively responsible for payment of employees and contractors for all wages and salaries, taxes, withholding payments, penalties, fees, fringe benefits, professional liability insurance premiums, contributions to insurance and pension, or other deferred compensation plans, including but not limited to, Workers' Compensation and Social Security obligations, licensing fees, etc. and the filing of all necessary documents, forms, and returns pertinent to all of the foregoing.

Vendor shall hold harmless the State, and shall provide the State and Agency with a defense against any and all claims including, but not limited to, the foregoing payments, withholdings, contributions, taxes, Social Security taxes, and employer income tax returns.

- 36. INDEMNIFICATION: The Vendor agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the State and the Agency, their officers, and employees from and against: (1) Any claims or losses for services rendered by any subcontractor, person, or firm performing or supplying services, materials, or supplies in connection with the performance of the Contract; (2) Any claims or losses resulting to any person or entity injured or damaged by the Vendor, its officers, employees, or subcontractors by the publication, translation, reproduction, delivery, performance, use, or disposition of any data used under the Contract in a manner not authorized by the Contract, or by Federal or State statutes or regulations; and (3) Any failure of the Vendor, its officers, employees, or subcontractors to observe State and Federal laws including, but not limited to, labor and wage and hour laws.
- 37. PURCHASING AFFIDAVIT: In accordance with West Virginia Code § 5A-3-10a, all Vendors are required to sign, notarize, and submit the Purchasing Affidavit stating that neither the Vendor nor a related party owe a debt to the State in excess of \$1,000. The affidavit must be submitted prior to award, but should be submitted with the Vendor's bid. A copy of the Purchasing Affidavit is included herewith.
- 38. ADDITIONAL AGENCY AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT USE: This Contract may be utilized by other agencies, spending units, and political subdivisions of the State of West Virginia; county, municipal, and other local government bodies; and school districts ("Other Government Entities"). Any extension of this Contract to the aforementioned Other Government Entities must be on the same prices, terms, and conditions as those offered and agreed to in this Contract, provided that such extension is in compliance with the applicable laws, rules, and ordinances of the Other Government Entity. If the Vendor does not wish to extend the prices, terms, and conditions of its bid and subsequent contract to the Other Government Entities, the Vendor must clearly indicate such refusal in its bid. A refusal to extend this Contract to the Other Government Entities shall not impact or influence the award of this Contract in any manner.
- 39. CONFLICT OF INTEREST: Vendor, its officers or members or employees, shall not presently have or acquire an interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict with or compromise the performance of its obligations hereunder. Vendor shall periodically inquire of its officers, members and employees to ensure that a conflict of interest does not arise. Any conflict of interest discovered shall be promptly presented in detail to the Agency.
- 40. REPORTS: Vendor shall provide the Agency and/or the Purchasing Division with the following reports identified by a checked box below:

 Such reports as the Agency and/or the Purchasing Division may request. Requested reports may include, but are not limited to, quantities purchased, agencies utilizing the contract, total contract expenditures by agency, etc.

 Quarterly reports detailing the total quantity of purchases in units and dollars, along with a listing of purchases by agency. Quarterly reports should be delivered to the Purchasing Division via email at purchasing.requisitions@wv.gov.

41. BACKGROUND CHECK: In accordance with W. Va. Code § 15-2D-3, the Director of the Division of Protective Services shall require any service provider whose employees are regularly employed on the grounds or in the buildings of the Capitol complex or who have access to sensitive or critical information to submit to a fingerprint-based state and federal background inquiry through the state repository. The service provider is responsible for any costs associated with the fingerprint-based state and federal background inquiry.

After the contract for such services has been approved, but before any such employees are permitted to be on the grounds or in the buildings of the Capitol complex or have access to sensitive or critical information, the service provider shall submit a list of all persons who will be physically present and working at the Capitol complex to the Director of the Division of Protective Services for purposes of verifying compliance with this provision. The State reserves the right to prohibit a service provider's employees from accessing sensitive or critical information or to be present at the Capitol complex based upon results addressed from a criminal background check.

Service providers should contact the West Virginia Division of Protective Services by phone at (304) 558-9911 for more information.

- 42. PREFERENCE FOR USE OF DOMESTIC STEEL PRODUCTS: Except when authorized by the Director of the Purchasing Division pursuant to W. Va. Code § 5A-3-56, no contractor may use or supply steel products for a State Contract Project other than those steel products made in the United States. A contractor who uses steel products in violation of this section may be subject to civil penalties pursuant to W. Va. Code § 5A-3-56. As used in this section:
- a. "State Contract Project" means any erection or construction of, or any addition to, alteration of or other improvement to any building or structure, including, but not limited to, roads or highways, or the installation of any heating or cooling or ventilating plants or other equipment, or the supply of and materials for such projects, pursuant to a contract with the State of West Virginia for which bids were solicited on or after June 6, 2001.
- b. "Steel Products" means products rolled, formed, shaped, drawn, extruded, forged, cast, fabricated or otherwise similarly processed, or processed by a combination of two or more or such operations, from steel made by the open heath, basic oxygen, electric furnace, Bessemer or other steel making process. The Purchasing Division Director may, in writing, authorize the use of foreign steel products if:
- c. The cost for each contract item used does not exceed one tenth of one percent (.1%) of the total contract cost or two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00), whichever is greater. For the purposes of this section, the cost is the value of the steel product as delivered to the project; or d. The Director of the Purchasing Division determines that specified steel materials are not produced in the United States in sufficient quantity or otherwise are not reasonably available to meet contract requirements.

43. PREFERENCE FOR USE OF DOMESTIC ALUMINUM, GLASS, AND STEEL: In Accordance with W. Va. Code § 5-19-1 et seq., and W. Va. CSR § 148-10-1 et seq., for every contract or subcontract, subject to the limitations contained herein, for the construction, reconstruction, alteration, repair, improvement or maintenance of public works or for the purchase of any item of machinery or equipment to be used at sites of public works, only domestic aluminum, glass or steel products shall be supplied unless the spending officer determines, in writing, after the receipt of offers or bids, (1) that the cost of domestic aluminum, glass or steel products is unreasonable or inconsistent with the public interest of the State of West Virginia, (2) that domestic aluminum, glass or steel products are not produced in sufficient quantities to meet the contract requirements, or (3) the available domestic aluminum, glass, or steel do not meet the contract specifications. This provision only applies to public works contracts awarded in an amount more than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) or public works contracts that require more than ten thousand pounds of steel products.

The cost of domestic aluminum, glass, or steel products may be unreasonable if the cost is more than twenty percent (20%) of the bid or offered price for foreign made aluminum, glass, or steel products. If the domestic aluminum, glass or steel products to be supplied or produced in a "substantial labor surplus area", as defined by the United States Department of Labor, the cost of domestic aluminum, glass, or steel products may be unreasonable if the cost is more than thirty percent (30%) of the bid or offered price for foreign made aluminum, glass, or steel products. This preference shall be applied to an item of machinery or equipment, as indicated above, when the item is a single unit of equipment or machinery manufactured primarily of aluminum, glass or steel, is part of a public works contract and has the sole purpose or of being a permanent part of a single public works project. This provision does not apply to equipment or machinery purchased by a spending unit for use by that spending unit and not as part of a single public works project.

All bids and offers including domestic aluminum, glass or steel products that exceed bid or offer prices including foreign aluminum, glass or steel products after application of the preferences provided in this provision may be reduced to a price equal to or lower than the lowest bid or offer price for foreign aluminum, glass or steel products plus the applicable preference. If the reduced bid or offer prices are made in writing and supersede the prior bid or offer prices, all bids or offers, including the reduced bid or offer prices, will be reevaluated in accordance with this rule.

- (2) The name of the laboratory certified by the United States Department of Health and Human Services or its successor that performs the drug tests;
- (3) The average number of employees in connection with the construction on the public improvement;
- (4) Drug test results for the following categories including the number of positive tests and the number of negative tests: (A) Pre-employment and new hires; (B) Reasonable suspicion; (C) Post-accident; and (D) Random.

Vendor should utilize the attached Certified Drug Free Workplace Report Coversheet when submitting the report required hereunder. Pursuant to W. Va. Code 21-1D-2(b) and (k), this provision does not apply to public improvement contracts the value of which is \$100,000 or less or temporary or emergency repairs.

- 4. AIA DOCUMENTS: All construction contracts that will be completed in conjunction with architectural services procured under Chapter 5G of the West Virginia Code will be governed by the AIA A101-2007 and A201-2007 or the A107-2007 documents, as amended by the Supplementary Conditions for the State of West Virginia, in addition to the terms and conditions contained herein.
- 5. SUBCONTRACTOR LIST SUBMISSION: In accordance with W. Va. Code § 5-22-1, The apparent low bidder on a contract for the construction, alteration, decoration, painting or improvement of a new or existing building or structure valued at more than \$250,000.00 shall submit a list of all subcontractors who will perform more than \$25,000.00 of work on the project including labor and materials. This provision shall not apply to any other construction projects, such as highway, mine reclamation, water or sewer projects. Additionally, if no subcontractors who will perform more than \$25,000.00 of work are to be used to complete the project, it will be noted on the subcontractor list.
- a. Required Information. The subcontractor list shall contain the following information:
 - i. Bidder's name
 - ii. Name of each subcontractor
 - iii. License numbers as required by W. Va. Code § 21-11-1 et. seq.
 - iv. Notation that no subcontractor will be used to perform more than \$25,000.00 of work, when applicable
- b. Submission. The completed subcontractor list shall be provided to the Purchasing Division within one business day of the opening of bids for review. Failure to submit the subcontractor list within one business day after the deadline for submitting bids shall result in disqualification of the bid.
- c. Substitution of Subcontractor. Written approval must be obtained from the State Spending Unit before any subcontractor substitution is permitted. Substitutions are not permitted unless:
 - i. The subcontractor listed in the original bid has filed for bankruptcy;
 - ii. The subcontractor in the original bid has been debarred or suspended; or
 - iii. The contractor certifies in writing that the subcontractor listed in the original bill fails, is unable, or refuses to perform his subcontract.

6. GREEN BUILDINGS MINIMUM ENERGY STANDARDS: In accordance with § 22-29-4, all new building construction projects of public agencies that have not entered the schematic design phase prior to July 1, 2012, or any building construction project receiving state grant funds and appropriations, including public schools, that have not entered the schematic design phase prior to July 1, 2012, shall be designed and constructed complying with the ICC International Energy Conservation Code, adopted by the State Fire Commission, and the ANSI/ASHRAE/IESNA Standard 90.1-2007: Provided, That if any construction project has a commitment of federal funds to pay for a portion of such project, this provision shall only apply to the extent such standards are consistent with the federal standards.

HVAC Preventative & Corrective Maintenance

SPECIFICATIONS

1 PURPOSE AND SCOPE: The West Virginia Purchasing Division is soliciting bids on behalf of the West Virginia State Police to establish an open-end contract for HVAC Maintenance Service Agreement, to include preventative, predictive, and corrective maintenance labor, inspections, and emergency service labor to maintain total coverage of the heating, ventilation and air conditioning system.

Facilities to be covered shall be:

Department Headquarters Complex inclusive of the main Headquarters Building, Automotive, Body and Communication Shops, Troop 4 Headquarters Building and South Charleston Detachment, all located at 725 Jefferson Road, South Charleston WV and the Procurement Division located at 4124 Kanawha Turnpike, South Charleston WV adjoining the Jefferson Road address.

Training Academy Complex inclusive of Troop 8 Headquarters and Special Operations, Hangar Building, Maintenance Shop, Buildings A, B and C, Firearms Range Building, Kitchen (Building C), Professional Development Center Administrative Building, K-9 Building, Professional Development Center Dorm Building, and Multi-Purpose Building, all located on Academy Drive, Dumbar WV.

- 2 DEFINITIONS: The terms listed below shall have the meanings assigned to them below. Additional definitions can be found in section 2 of the General Terms and Conditions.
 - 2.1 "HVAC Maintenance" means Preventative Maintenance and Corrective Maintenance services provided by Vendor under this Contract, but shall not include an individual project that exceeds \$25,000 in total value including both parts and labor; and shall not include the addition of new HVAC equipment to increase the size or coverage area of the existing HVAC system.
 - 2.2 "Preventative Maintenance" means the scheduled inspections and the replacement of parts, components, and materials on HVAC equipment prior to the failure or wearout period of the parts, components or materials in accordance with the equipment manufacturer's specifications and recommendations and any testing required to ensure that equipment is in proper working order;
 - 2.3 "Corrective Maintenance" means work performed on an as-requested basis to correct a malfunction or failure in an HVAC system; and testing to ensure that equipment is in proper working order.
 - 2.4 "Pricing Page" means the pages upon which Vendor should list its proposed price for the Contract Services. The Pricing Page is either included on the last page of this RFQ or attached hereto as Appendix D.

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- 2.5 "RFQ" means the official request for quotation published by the Purchasing Division and identified as CRFQ DPS1700000001.
- 2.6 "Owner" as used in this specification shall mean the West Virginia State Police.
- 2.7 "Vendor or Contractor" as used in this specification shall mean that qualified vendor who is awarded a purchase order.
- 3 PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS: Vendor shall provide Agency with HVAC Maintenance on an open-end and continuing basis as outlined in this Contract.

3.1 HVAC Maintenance

- 3.1.1 Vendor shall provide HVAC Maintenance in accordance with manufacturer's recommendations and specifications at all facilities listed on attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.
 - 3.1.1.1 Vendor shall furnish and install parts as necessary to keep the equipment in the best possible working order.
 - 3.1.1.2 At all times, the Vendor shall maintain the efficiency, speed and safety of the equipment as designated by the original manufacturer specifications
 - 3.1.1.3 Vendor shall perform all necessary examinations and adjustments to maintain equipment at the specified limits; adjust or replace all safety devices, including regulators, limit switches, pressure relief valves, or other safety or regulating devices.
 - 3.1.1.4 Vendor shall furnish all equipment, tools, and parts necessary in the performance of the HVAC Maintenance. Equipment and tools will be provided at no cost to the Agency. Equipment, tools, and parts shall include, but are not limited to: bearings, belts, filters, gaskets, controls, safety devices, controllers, control parts, coils, switches, contacts, and valves, control panels, ducting material, chemicals, lubricants, fluids, gases, motors, pumps, and fittings or connections.

HVAC Preventative & Corrective Maintenance

- 3.1.1.5 Vendor shall provide non-reusable parts, components and materials used in the scope of performing under this Contract at no cost to the Agency. Such items may include, but are not limited to, grease, cleaning supplies, rags, etc.
- 3.1.1.6 Vendor shall be responsible for placement of ceiling grid and tiles should they become soiled or damaged by Vendor. Agency will make final determination whether to clean or replace on a case-by-case basis.
- 3.1.1.7 Vendor shall review all operating sequences and practices of the current equipment in order to assure the effective environmental conditionings while minimizing operational costs. This initial survey of the operating parameters will be conducted within the first 30 days of the contract award except for certain seasonal systems. Seasonal equipment will be surveyed during the next appropriate operating season. Survey shall include, but not be limited to, time schedules, reset schedules, economizer changeovers where applicable, set points, and energy management routines.
- 3.1.1.8 Vendor may only remove equipment from service for a period of 24 hours or more with written permission for the Agency. Any request to remove equipment for 24 hours or more must include a description of the work required and an estimate of the time the equipment will be out of service.
- 3.1.1.9 Vendor shall maintain a continuous 24-hour emergency telephone service where they can be reached everyday of the week, including Sundays and Holidays. Vendor shall establish a call down list or other procedure that will insure the quickest possible response time.
- 3.1.1.10 Vendor shall not perform any HVAC Maintenance under this contract without prior approval from Agency.

3.1.2 Preventative Maintenance:

- 3.1.2.1 Vendor shall perform Preventative on a monthly basis as agreed upon by the Vendor and Agency.
- 3.1.2.2 Vendor shall submit a proposed schedule of all Preventative Maintenance within 30 days of Vendor being awarded this contract for approval by Agency, at Agency's discretion. The proposed schedule must include inspections, lubrications, adjustments, tests, cleaning, routine repairs and all other known Preventative Maintenance activities.

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- 3.1.2.3 Examples of Preventative Maintenance include, but are not limited to, replacement of batteries in thermostats, cleaning, painting, lubricating, packing, sealing, adjusting, calibrating, repairing, furnishing and replacing of filters, and furnishing and replacing parts and equipment.
- 3.1.2.4 Preventative Maintenance performed under this Contract shall not exceed \$25,000 per project in total costs.

3.1.3 Corrective Maintenance:

- 3.1.3.1 Vendor shall respond to Corrective Maintenance calls by phone or in person within two hours and must arrive on site to begin performance as soon as possible, not later than four hours after Vendor is notified of the request. Vendor may only deviate from the required four hour response time with written permission from the Agency.
- 3.1.3.2 Corrective Maintenance must be performed between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 4:30 P.M., Monday through Friday unless the HVAC Maintenance will cause disruption of business activity.
- 3.1.3.3 Agency may request Corrective Maintenance on an emergency basis by notifying the Vendor of the emergency. Vendor must respond to all emergency requests within 30 minutes of being notified of the emergency request and arrive on site to begin performance no later than two hours after being notified of the emergency.
- 3.1.3.4 Corrective Maintenance performed under this Contract shall not exceed \$25,000 per project in total cost.

3.1.4 Parts:

- 3.1.4.1 Vendor is responsible for procuring all necessary parts needed to perform HVAC Maintenance under this Contract within the required time frames established herein.
- 3.1.4.2 Vendor shall maintain a supply or inventory of routinely used replacement parts for the HVAC equipment utilized by the Agency. All replacement parts shall be equal to or better than original manufacturer's parts.
- 3.1.4.3 Parts Warranty: The vendor shall provide a copy of the manufacturer's warranty on parts with the invoice.

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- 4 FACILITIES ACCESS: The facilities identified in the contract may require access cards and/or keys to gain entrance.
 - 4.1 Anyone performing under this Contract will be subject to Agency's security protocols and procedures.
 - 4.2 Vendor shall inform all staff Agency's security protocol and procedures.

5 QUALIFICATIONS:

5.1 Experience: Vendor must have successfully installed and maintained HVAC equipment of the type, character and magnitude currently being utilized by Agency and included on the list on HVAC equipment, attached hereto as, on two or more occasions in the last five years. The list of HVAC equipment is incorporated herein by reference.

Vendor should furnish information concerning the two largest facility contracts it has completed, current vendor capacity, other relevant experience, and other similar contract obligations to provide similar work.

- 5.2 Training: Vendor shall be trained and/or certified to provide HVAC Maintenance on the equipment located at the Agency's facilities as shown on attached. Vendor must provide Agency with documentation to verify training and certification upon request.
- 5.3 Factory Authorization: Vendor must be authorized by the applicable manufacturer to perform repair and warranty on the equipment listed on attached.
- 5.4 Certifications: Vendor shall ensure that all HVAC Maintenance performed under this Contract is performed by an appropriately licensed individual. Required licenses may include, but are not limited to the following:
 - 5.4.1 Electricians WV Electricians License
 - 5.4.2 Plumbers WV Plumbers License
 - 5.4.3 HVAC EPA 608 Certification and Apprentice Certification or Completion of HVAC Vocational Program.
 - 5.4.4 WV Contractor's License
- 5.5 Building Codes: At a minimum, the HVAC Maintenance shall comply with the current editions of the following standards and codes in effect at the time of performance.
 - 5.5.1 National Electric Code (NEC)
 - 5.5.2 International Building Code (IBC)
 - 5.5.3 International Mechanical Code (IMC)
 - 5.5.4 Underwriters laboratories: Products shall be UL-916-PAZX listed.

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- 5.5.5 ANSI/ASHRAE Standard 135-2004 (BACnet)
- 5.5.6 ANSI/EIA/CEA-709.1 (LonTalk)
- 5.5.7 NFPA (National Fire Protection Association)
- 6 REPORTS: Vendor shall provide all of the reports as outlined below.
 - 6.1 Preventative Maintenance Log: Vendor shall provide and update a Preventative Maintenance log in the form of a chart posted in the vicinity of HVAC equipment. The Preventative Maintenance log must include a listing of all Preventative Maintenance performed, the name of the individual performing the Preventative Maintenance, the date it was performed, and the time spent performing the Preventative Maintenance. Vendor shall also maintain a duplicate maintenance log that the Vendor must submit to the Agency on a monthly basis.
 - 6.2 Wiring Diagram: Vendor shall maintain updated wiring diagrams for the HVAC equipment. Vendor must permanently mount wiring diagrams on full-size display panels near the equipment controllers. These wiring diagrams are to remain the property of the Agency and will be surrendered upon termination of this contract.
 - 6.3 Corrective Maintenance Log: Vendor shall maintain a log of all Corrective Maintenance performed under this Contract. The log must include the name of the individual performing the Corrective Maintenance, a description of the work performed, a list of any parts that were repaired or replaced, the total time spent performing the Corrective Maintenance, and the date and time Corrective Maintenance was performed. Vendor shall submit a copy of this log to the Agency upon the Agency's request.
 - 6.4 Quarterly and Annual Reports: Vendor shall provide quarterly reports and annual summaries to the Agency, and to the Purchasing Division when requested, with a detailed listing of HVAC Maintenance performed under this Contract during that period of time. The quarterly and annual reports must include a listing of the hours worked per project, the cost of hours worked per project, the total of all hours worked and corresponding cost, a listing of parts utilized per project, the cost of parts utilized per project, the total parts used for the period, the cost of parts for the period, a grand total of all costs for the period, and any other information that the Agency or Purchasing Division may request.
- 7 TRAVEL: Vendor shall be responsible for all mileage and travel costs, including travel time associated with performance of this Contract. Such costs will not be paid by the Agency.

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- 8 CONTRACT AWARD: This Contract will be awarded to the Vendor meeting the required specifications that provide the lowest total overall cost on the pricing page.
 - 8.1 Pricing Pages: Vendor should complete the Pricing Pages by inserting the requested information in the appropriate location and performing the calculations necessary to arrive at a total cost. The requested information includes: a monthly base rate for the Academy and HQ buildings, an hourly labor rate, a percentage markup, the total labor cost, the total parts cost, and the total cost. Vendor should complete the Pricing Pages in their entirety as failure to do so may result in Vendor's bid being disqualified.

The Pricing Pages contain an estimated number of labor hours and an estimated cost for parts. The estimates for labor and parts represent an amount that will be utilized for evaluation purposes only. No future use of the Contract or any individual item is guaranteed or implied.

Vendor should type or electronically enter the information into the Pricing Pages to prevent errors in the evaluation. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Purchasing Division may correct errors at its discretion.

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9 ORDERING:

- 9.1 Preventative Maintenance Ordering: After award of this Contract, the Agency and Vendor shall agree upon a Preventative Maintenance schedule. The Agency shall then issue an Agency Delivery Order (ADO) against this Contract covering the agreed upon Preventative Maintenance to be performed. Agency shall not issue an ADO that allows Preventative Maintenance performed under this Contract to exceed \$25,000 per project in total costs.
- 9.2 Corrective Maintenance Ordering: The Agency shall define the scope of each Corrective Maintenance project to be performed under this Contract and submit it to the Vendor for a cost quote prior to Vendor's commencement of any work. The cost quote must detail the intended scope of work required to complete the project and contain an itemized listing of time and parts that will be required. If the Vendor's quote is satisfactory to the Agency, then the Agency will issue an ADO allowing Vendor to commence work. This ADO shall have a unique number, reference the master contract number, and detail the scope of work for the project in question. Issuance of the ADO to the Vendor shall be considered authorization to begin work. If the Agency determines that the cost quote is not satisfactory, then Agency and Vendor shall work to obtain a satisfactory cost quote by modifying the project, requesting different parts, performing labor with state employees, or other methods that Agency and Vendor deem appropriate. Agency shall not issue an ADO that allows Corrective Maintenance performed under this Contract to exceed \$25,000 per project in total cost.
- 9.3 Vendor is not permitted to perform any work other than that specified on the ADO issued under section 9.1 or 9.2 of this Contract.
- 9.4 Issuance of multiple ADOs to circumvent the \$25,000 per project limitation on Preventative Maintenance or Corrective Maintenance is strictly prohibited.
- 9.5 Change orders that cause Preventative Maintenance or Corrective Maintenance to exceed \$25,000 per project will not be permitted.

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10 PAYMENT:

10.1 Labor: Agency shall pay a single flat hourly rate for all HVAC Maintenance performed under this Contract.

10.2 Parts: Vendor shall bill Agency for parts at Vendor's cost plus a markup designated by Vendor on the Pricing Page. The markup must apply to all parts and should be listed on the Pricing Page as a multiplier. (Examples of how the multiplier should be used are shown below.) For purposes of this Contract, Vendor's cost is the amount paid by Vendor to the manufacturer or supplier and does not include Vendor's overhead, stocking fees, delivery charges, or other fees that are not direct payment for parts. All charges not associated with direct payments to the manufacturer or supplier must be accounted for in the markup represented by the multiplier.

Multiplier Example	Meaning
.05	Vendor sells parts to Agency at one-half of Vendor's cost
1.0	Vendor sells parts to Agency at Vendor's cost
1.25	Vendor sells parts to Agency at Vendor's cost put a 25% markup
1.5	Vendor sells parts to Agency at Vendor's cost plus a 50% markup

Notwithstanding the foregoing, Vendor may invoice Agency for expedited or emergency delivery of parts provided that the expedited or emergency delivery was requested by the Agency in advance, the delivery charge is specifically listed on the billing invoice to the Agency, the Agency pays no more than the actual delivery charge, and the actual delivery charge documentation is included with the invoice.

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11 DEFAULT:

- 11.1 The following shall be considered a vendor default under this Contract.
 - 11.1.1 Failure to perform HVAC Maintenance in accordance with the requirements contained herein.
 - 11.1.2 Failure to comply with other specifications and requirements contained herein.
 - 11.1.3 Failure to comply with any applicable laws, rules, ordinances, or building code applicable to the Contract or HVAC Maintenance in general.
 - 11.1.4 Failure to remedy deficient performance upon request.
- 11.2 The following remedies shall be available upon default.
 - 11.2.1 Cancellation of the Contract.
 - 11.2.2 Cancellation of one or more ADOs issued under this Contract.
 - 11.2.3 Any other remedies available in law or equity.
- 11.3 Agency reserves the right to inspect the HVAC Maintenance to ensure that Vendor's performance is in compliance with this Contract. If Agency determines that Vendor has failed to perform in accordance with this Contract, Agency may demand that the Vendor immediately remedy the failure or consider the failure to be a default. Vendor's failure to remedy the deficient performance, if given the opportunity to do so, shall be considered a default.

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12 EQUIPMENT TO BE SERVICED AND MAINTAINED

12.1 Preventative Maintenance calls shall include the following services as required and applicable to keep system(s) and equipment operating properly.

12.1.1 Air Conditioning Equipment

- 12.1.1.1 A major inspection of all compressors is to be performed annually, including volumetric testing, determination of pump down capability and test for acidity and other variances from normal condition and calibrated monthly.
- 12.1.1.2 All operating and safety controls and regulators are to be checked and calibrated monthly.
- 12.1.1.3 All electrical connections are to be checked semiannually by the use of infrared scans. Written results of the scans will be furnished to the owner's representative each semi-annual (6 month) period.
- 12.1.1.4 Leak-checks of refrigerant lines and pressure control lines, and necessary repairs of these, will be performed monthly or as otherwise required.
- 12.1.1.5 Operating temperatures and pressures will be read and logged monthly during the cooling season, and otherwise as needed in support of the at-large systems under this agreement.
- 12.1.1.6 Condenser fan belts and fan motors will be inspected, adjusted, repaired or replaced as required on a monthly basis in the cooling system.
- 12.1.1.7 Annual cleanings, using chemical methods will be performed on all condenser coils and evaporator coils and evaporator coils. These will be inspected during the cooling season, as needed, for the acquisition of scale or deposits from the environment.
- 12.1.1.8 Leak-checks of refrigerant lines and pressure control lines, and necessary repairs of these, will be performed monthly or as otherwise required.
- 12.1.1.9 Operating temperatures and pressures will be read and logged monthly during the cooling season, and otherwise as needed in support of the at-large systems under this agreement.

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- 12.1.1.10 Condenser fan belts and fan motors will be inspected, adjusted, repaired or replaced as required on a monthly basis in the cooling system.
- 12.1.1.11 Annual cleanings, using chemical methods will be performed on all condenser coils and evaporator coils and evaporator coils. These will be inspected during the cooling season, as needed, for the acquisition of scale or deposits from the environment.

12.1.2 Air Handling Equipment

- 12.1.2.1 Fan belts on major air handling blowers will be adjusted as required and replaced each six months.
- 12.1.2.2 Bearings will be lubricated as required.
- 12.1.2.3 Air filters will be changed monthly. A high efficiency 40% pleated filter, or its equivalent, is explicitly specified for this agreement.

12.1.3 Temperature Control Devices and Systems

- 12.1.3.1 Regularly and systematically examine, adjust, calibrate and clean all thermostats, humidity controls, valves, relays, motors, compressor and accessories directly pertaining to the control systems.
- 12.1.3.2 Regularly and systematically furnish lubricants and lubricate such components as air compressors, valve packing glands, dampers, bearings, linkages and switches directly pertaining to the control system.
- 12.1.3.3 Replace valve packing materials of control valves as often as may be necessary in order to maintain the valves without leaking.
- 12.1.3.4 Replace or repair worn parts or complete controls with new or reconditioned controls.
- 12.1.3.5 The maintenance, repair or replacement of automatically controlled dampers and valves is to be included.
- 12.1.3.6 All controllers should be checked for calibration, presence of moisture or oil, control part and seat alignment and response of capillaries and shall be calibrated as required.

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- 12.1.3.7 All control devices shall be checked for leaks, sticking stems, air tightness, broken or weak springs, ruptured diaphragms, and shall be replaced or repaired. Control valve work to include repacking and reseating as required.
- 12.1.3.8 All dampers shall be checked for tight closure, bent blades, and defective linkages. Repair or replacement is included.

12.1.4 Boiler Systems (to include in-line circulating pumps)

- 12.1.4.1 Inspect for soot and corrosion and clean as required.
- 12.1.4.2 Perform a regular relief valve test and repair or replace to proper pressure operation.
- 12.1.4.3 Perform operational test and assure proper settings; operation controls, high temperature safety, flame failure safety and high/low gas pressure cutoff.
- 12.1.4.4 Clean fire passes and heating surfaces.
- 12.1.4.5 Regularly check condition of water both visually and by chemical test.
- 12.1.4.6 Clean pilots and igniters.
- 12.1.4.7 Check flame composition and shape; adjust as required.
- 12.1.4.8 Inspect and clean orifices, passages and nozzles.

HVAC Preventative & Corrective Maintenance

- 12.1.4.9 Adjust fuel-to-air ratio for optimum efficiency.
- 12.1.4.10 Check for proper operation of main and safety shutoff valves. Repair, adjust, replace as needed.
- 12.1.4.11 Check for leaks and overall security, repair as needed.
- 12.1.4.12 Assure gas valve shutoff and check gas pressure regulator setting. Adjust, repair, or replace as required for optimum efficiency.
- 12.1.4.13 Check all gauges for accuracy, calibrate or replace as needed.
- 12.1.4.14 Shut down boiler at end of heating season and perform all necessary shutdown tasks.
- 12.1.4.15 Startup boiler at beginning of heating season and perform all necessary start up tasks.
- 12.1.4.16 Supply corrosion inhibitors in sufficient quantity to cover one (1) year's needs.
- 12.1.4.17 At least twelve (12) service calls per year are included in the contract price. During each call the following tests will be performed:
 - 12.1.4.17.1 Corrosive chemical leaks
 - 12.1.4.17.2 Total Alkalinity
 - 12.1.4.17.3 Dissolved solids/conductivity
 - 12.1.4.17.4 Nitrate levels
 - 12.1.4.17.5 Any other tests deemed necessary by the vendor
- 12.1.4.18 Any and all test kits will be furnished by the vendor
- 12.1.4.19 A written monthly report of the status of the aforementioned boiler system will be submitted to the owner's representative.
- 12.1.4.20 Annually break tube boilers down and inspect/clean tubes, gaskets, and water holding systems.
- 12.1.4.21 Clean fire passes and heating surfaces.

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13.2 Telephone Service:

- 13.2.1 The vendor shall maintain continuous telephone service by which he can be reached 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Sundays and Holidays are included.
- 13.2.2 The owner shall provide the vendor with the phone numbers for the location where work is to be performed, and any other phone numbers that may allow for the necessary communications.

Failure to read the Bid Documents in their entirety and comply with the stated requirements contained therein may result in bid disqualification.

Errors That Shall Be Reason for Immediate Bid Disqualification

- 1. Failure to attend a mandatory pre-bid meeting
- 2. Failure to sign the bid
- 3. Failure to supply West Virginia contractor's license # on bid
- 4. Failure to supply a signed drug free workplace affidavit with the bid
- 5. Failure to supply a valid bid bond or other surety approved by the State of West Virginia
- 6. Failure to meet any mandatory requirement of the RFQ
- 7. Failure to acknowledge receipt of Addenda (only if stipulated as mandatory)
- 8. Failure to submit bid prior to the bid opening date and time
- 9. Federal debarment
- 10. State of West Virginia debarment or suspension

Errors that May Be Reason for Bld Disqualification Before Contract Award

- 1. Uncontested debt to the State exceeding \$1,000.00 (must be cured prior to award)
- Workers' Compensation or Unemployment Compensation delinquency (must be cured prior to award)
- 3. Not registered as a vendor with the State (must be cured prior to award)
- 4. Failure to obtain required bonds and/or insurance
- 5. Failure to provide the sub-contractor listing within 1 business day of bid opening.
- 6. Failure to use the provided RFQ form (only if stipulated as mandatory).
