






Forum Doors: Conservation and maintenance treatments of the art cast bronze doors and transoms of the Forum Theater at the State Capitol of Pennsylvania by sculptor and architect Lee Oscar Lawrie. Work consisted of rebuilding and replacement of the mechanical components/closers to put them in working order along with cleaning, repatination and art glass replacement. The theatre has 11 sets of these 1,600 pound bronze doors with transoms and art glass. Lawrie is most noted for his sculptures of Moses, Atlas at Rockefeller Center in NY. Project was split into two phases along with a 5 year maintenance contract.

Bronze Conservation and Maintenance of the Statuary at the PA State Capitol Complex (Hartranft and Penrose). Based on microscope evidence and research, our team found that the letters were previously gilded. After our regular maintenance of the sculpture in 2020, the team added gold leaf to the letters so it is now historically accurate.
