


## PART 2 - VENDOR QUESTIONS AND RESPONSES

Question No. 1: Contract as it relates to Davis Bacon Act. At Ennis Brothers LLC we pay fairly close to the prevailing wage, however our employees being seasonal and part time in nature, we don't normally pay for additional benefits. Can you clarify the following:

- What is the prevailing wage for Charleston WV for groundskeepers including "fringe benefits"? Or simply put, what would I be required to pay my employees working on this contract to be compliant with Davis Bacon? Will the other Vendors be given this information?
- How will you enforce the Davis Bacon Act? I am concerned that you will receive
  at least one bid not factoring in wages necessary to be compliant with the Davis Bacon
  Act.

Response No. 1: Davis Bacon Wage Rates are <u>NOT</u> required for this solicitation. The agency made a mistake by including that in the RFQ, terms and conditions, and speaking about it at the Pre-Bid Meeting. Davis Bacon Wages are only required on contracts using Federal money for construction, alteration or repairs of public buildings or public works.

Question No. 2: There appears to be a link for a form. That link is dead. There is no form number. Can you send me the form or give me the number to the form for requesting preference being a Veteran owned company?

Response No. 2: This is the link to the WV-1 Form for vendors wishing to claim a preference in accordance with Law and Rule. (See Section 4: B – Other Federal Designations – Veteran Small Business Ownership): <a href="http://www.state.wv.us/admin/purchase/VRC/WV1.pdf">http://www.state.wv.us/admin/purchase/VRC/WV1.pdf</a>

Question No. 3: The bld indicates the winning bid will be the lowest bid. Ennis Brothers LLC being a Veteran owned company, do we need to be the lowest bid to be the winning bid or just be a competitive bid? It was my understanding in the past that the winning bid did not necessarily have to be the lowest bid if it could be justified, i.e., the winning bid was the second lowest bid, however it was from a veteran owned company.

Response No. 3: A competitive bid. An award will be made to the lowest, responsible bidder meeting the mandatory specifications and requirements.

Due to the nature of the contract (lawn care services), none of the following vendor preference types would apply in this case: reciprocal preference, preference for the purchase of motor vehicles and construction and maintenance equipment and machinery, or SWAM preference. This can be further explained in W. Va. Code §5A-3-37(c)(2)(E) and §5A-3-37(c)(2)(F).

Question No. 4: As I understood from the meeting, previous bid submissions as it relates to past awards or past bid submissions could be found on the Oasis website. Can you please direct me more specifically to where I can find them on the Oasis website? I am unable to do so.

All Vendors submitting a bid must attend the mandatory pre-bid meeting. Failure to attend the mandatory pre-bid meeting shall result in disqualification of the Vendor's bid. No one individual is permitted to represent more than one vendor at the pre-bid meeting. Any individual that does attempt to represent two or more vendors will be required to select one vendor to which the individual's attendance will be attributed. The vendors not selected will be deemed to have not attended the pre-bid meeting unless another individual attended on their behalf.

Service providers should contact the West Virginia Division of Protective Services by phone at (304) 558-9911 for more information.
- 41. PREFERENCE FOR USE OF DOMESTIC STEEL PRODUCTS: Except when authorized by the Director of the Purchasing Division pursuant to W. Va. Code § 5A-3-56, no contractor may use or supply steel products for a State Contract Project other than those steel products made in the United States. A contractor who uses steel products in violation of this section may be subject to civil penalties pursuant to W. Va. Code § 5A-3-56. As used in this section:
  - a. "State Contract Project" means any erection or construction of, or any addition to, alteration of or other improvement to any building or structure, including, but not limited to, roads or highways, or the installation of any heating or cooling or ventilating plants or other equipment, or the supply of and materials for such projects, pursuant to a contract with the State of West Virginia for which bids were solicited on or after June 6, 2001.
  - b. "Steel Products" means products rolled, formed, shaped, drawn, extruded, forged, cast, fabricated or otherwise similarly processed, or processed by a combination of two or more or such operations, from steel made by the open heath, basic oxygen, electric furnace, Bessemer or other steel making process.
  - The Purchasing Division Director may, in writing, authorize the use of foreign steel products if:
    - The cost for each contract item used does not exceed one tenth of one percent (.1%) of the total contract cost or two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00), whichever is greater. For the purposes of this section, the cost is the value of the steel product as delivered to the project; or
    - The Director of the Purchasing Division determines that specified steel materials are not produced in the United States in sufficient quantity or otherwise are not reasonably available to meet contract requirements.

42. PREFERENCE FOR USE OF DOMESTIC ALUMINUM, GLASS, AND STEEL: In Accordance with W. Va. Code § 5-19-1 et seq., and W. Va. If the domestic aluminum, glass or steel products to be supplied or produced in a "substantial labor surplus area", as defined by the United States Department of Labor, the cost of domestic aluminum, glass, or steel products may be unreasonable if the cost is more than thirty percent (30%) of the bid or offered price for foreign made aluminum, glass, or steel products. This preference shall be applied to an item of machinery or equipment, as indicated above, when the item is a single unit of equipment or machinery manufactured primarily of aluminum, glass or steel, is part of a public works contract and has the sole purpose or of being a permanent part of a single public works project. This provision does not apply to equipment or machinery purchased by a spending unit for use by that spending unit and not as part of a single public works project.

All bids and offers including domestic aluminum, glass or steel products that exceed bid or offer prices including foreign aluminum, glass or steel products after application of the preferences provided in this provision may be reduced to a price equal to or lower than the lowest bid or offer price for foreign aluminum, glass or steel products plus the applicable preference. If the reduced bid or offer prices are made in writing and supersede the prior bid or offer prices, all bids or offers, including the reduced bid or offer prices, will be reevaluated in accordance with this rule.

43. INTERESTED PARTY SUPPLEMENTAL DISCLOSURE: W. Va. Code § 6D-1-2 requires that for contracts with an actual or estimated value of at least \$1 million, the Vendor must submit to the Agency a disclosure of interested parties prior to beginning work under this Contract. Additionally, the Vendor must submit a supplemental disclosure of interested parties reflecting any new or differing interested parties to the contract, which were not included in the original pre-work interested party disclosure, within 30 days following the completion or termination of the contract. A copy of that form is included with this solicitation or can be obtained from the WV Ethics Commission. This requirement does not apply to publicly traded companies listed on a national or international stock exchange. A more detailed definition of interested parties can be obtained from the form referenced above.
