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INSTRUCTIONS TO VENDORS SUBMITTING BIDS

1. REVIEW DOCUMENTS THOROUGHLY: The attached documents contain a solicitation for bids. Please read these instructions and all documents attached in their entirety. These instructions provide critical information about requirements that if overlooked could lead to disqualification of a Vendor's bid. All bids must be submitted in accordance with the provisions contained in these instructions and the Solicitation. Failure to do so may result in disqualification of Vendor's bid.

2. MANDATORY TERMS: The Solicitation may contain mandatory provisions identified by the use of the words "must," "will," and "shall." Failure to comply with a mandatory term in the Solicitation will result in bid disqualification.

3. PREBID MEETING: The item identified below shall apply to this Solicitation.

All Vendors submitting a bid must attend the mandatory pre-bid meeting. Failure to attend the mandatory pre-bid meeting shall result in disqualification of the Vendor's bid. No one individual is permitted to represent more than one vendor at the pre-bid meeting. Any individual that does attempt to represent two or more vendors will be required to select one vendor to which the individual's attendance will be attributed. The vendors not selected will be deemed to have not attended the pre-bid meeting unless another individual attended on their behalf.

An attendance sheet provided at the pre-bid meeting shall serve as the official document verifying attendance. Any person attending the pre-bid meeting on behalf of a Vendor must list on the attendance sheet his or her name and the name of the Vendor he or she is representing.

All Vendors should arrive prior to the starting time for the pre-bid. Vendors who arrive after the starting time but prior to the end of the pre-bid will be permitted to sign in but are charged with knowing all matters discussed at the pre-bid.

Questions submitted at least five business days prior to a scheduled pre-bid will be discussed at the pre-bid meeting if possible. Any discussions or answers to questions at the pre-bid meeting are preliminary in nature and are non-binding. Official and binding answers to questions will be published in a written addendum to the Solicitation prior to bid opening.

4. VENDOR QUESTION DEADLINE: Vendors may submit questions relating to this Solicitation to the Purchasing Division. Questions must be submitted in writing. All questions must be submitted on or before the date listed below and to the address listed below to be considered. A written response will be published in a Solicitation addendum if a response is possible and appropriate. Non-written discussions, conversations, or questions and answers regarding this Solicitation are preliminary in nature and are nonbinding.

5. VERBAL COMMUNICATION: Any verbal communication between the Vendor and any State personnel is not binding, including verbal communication at the mandatory pre-bid conference. Only information issued in writing and added to the Solicitation by an official written addendum by the Purchasing Division is binding.

6. BID SUBMISSION: All bids must be submitted on or before the date and time of the bid opening listed in section 7 below. Vendors can submit bids electronically through wvOASIS, in paper form delivered to the Purchasing Division at the address listed below either in person or by courier, or in facsimile form by faxing to the Purchasing Division at the number listed below. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Purchasing Division may prohibit the submission of bids electronically through wvOASIS at its sole discretion. Such a prohibition will be contained and communicated in the wvOASIS system resulting in the Vendor's inability to submit bids through wvOASIS. The Purchasing Division will not accept bids, modification of bids, or addendum acknowledgment forms via email. Bids submitted in paper or facsimile form must contain a signature. Bids submitted in wvOASIS are deemed to be electronically signed.

Any bid received by the Purchasing Division staff is considered to be in the possession of the Purchasing Division and will not be returned for any reason.

8. ADDENDUM ACKNOWLEDGEMENT: Changes or revisions to this Solicitation will be made by an official written addendum issued by the Purchasing Division. Vendor should acknowledge receipt of all addenda issued with this Solicitation by completing an Addendum Acknowledgment Form, a copy of which is included herewith. Failure to acknowledge addenda may result in bid disqualification. The addendum acknowledgement should be submitted with the bid to expedite document processing.

9. BID FORMATTING: Vendor should type or electronically enter the information onto its bid to prevent errors in the evaluation. Failure to type or electronically enter the information may result in bid disqualification.

10. ALTERNATE MODEL OR BRAND: Unless the box below is checked, any model, brand, or specification listed in this Solicitation establishes the acceptable level of quality only and is not intended to reflect a preference for, or in any way favor, a particular brand or vendor. Vendors may bid alternates to a listed model or brand provided that the alternate is at least equal to the model or brand and complies with the required specifications. The equality of any alternate being bid shall be determined by the State at its sole discretion. Any Vendor bidding an alternate model or brand should clearly identify the alternate items in its bid and should include manufacturer's specifications, industry literature, and/or any other relevant documentation demonstrating the equality of the alternate items. Failure to provide information for alternate items may be grounds for rejection of a Vendor's bid.

11. EXCEPTIONS AND CLARIFICATIONS: The Solicitation contains the specifications that shall form the basis of a contractual agreement. Vendor shall clearly mark any exceptions, clarifications, or other proposed modifications in its bid. Exceptions to, clarifications of, or modifications of a requirement or term and condition of the Solicitation may result in bid disqualification.

12. COMMUNICATION LIMITATIONS: In accordance with West Virginia Code of State Rules §148-1-6.6, communication with the State of West Virginia or any of its employees regarding this Solicitation during the solicitation, bid, evaluation or award periods, except through the Purchasing Division, is strictly prohibited without prior Purchasing Division approval. Purchasing Division approval for such communication is implied for all agency delegated and exempt purchases.

13. REGISTRATION: Prior to Contract award, the apparent successful Vendor must be properly registered with the West Virginia Purchasing Division and must have paid the \$125 fee, if applicable.

14. UNIT PRICE: Unit prices shall prevail in cases of a discrepancy in the Vendor's bid.

15. PREFERENCE: Vendor Preference may be requested in purchases of motor vehicles or construction and maintenance equipment and machinery used in highway and other infrastructure projects. Any request for preference must be submitted in writing with the bid, must specifically identify the preference requested with reference to the applicable subsection of West Virginia Code § 5A-3-37, and must include with the bid any information necessary to evaluate and confirm the applicability of the requested preference. 15A. RECIPROCAL PREFERENCE: The State of West Virginia applies a reciprocal preference to all solicitations for commodities and printing in accordance with W. Va. Code § 5A-3-37(b). In effect, non-resident vendors receiving a preference in their home states, will see that same preference granted to West Virginia resident vendors bidding against them in West Virginia. Any request for reciprocal preference must include with the bid any information necessary to evaluate and confirm the applicability of the preference. 16. SMALL, WOMEN-OWNED, OR MINORITY-OWNED BUSINESSES: For any solicitations publicly advertised for bid, in accordance with West Virginia Code §5A-3-37 and W. Va. CSR § 148-22-9, any non-resident vendor certified as a small, women- owned, or minority-owned business under W. Va. CSR § 148-22-9 shall be provided the same preference made available to any resident vendor. Any non-resident small, women-owned, or minority-owned business must identify itself as such in writing, must submit that writing to the Purchasing Division with its bid, and must be properly certified under W. Va. CSR § 148-22-9 prior to contract award to receive the preferences made available to resident vendors. Preference for a non-resident small, women-owned, or minority owned business shall be applied in accordance with W. Va. CSR § 148-22-9.

17. WAIVER OF MINOR IRREGULARITIES: The Director reserves the right to waive minor irregularities in bids or specifications in accordance with West Virginia Code of State Rules § 148-1-4.6.

18. ELECTRONIC FILE ACCESS RESTRICTIONS: Vendor must ensure that its submission in wvOASIS can be accessed and viewed by the Purchasing Division staff immediately upon bid opening. The Purchasing Division will consider any file that cannot be immediately accessed and viewed at the time of the bid opening (such as, encrypted files, password protected files, or incompatible files) to be blank or incomplete as context requires and are therefore unacceptable. A vendor will not be permitted to unencrypt files, remove password protections, or resubmit documents after bid opening to make a file viewable if those documents are required with the bid. A Vendor may be required to provide document passwords or remove access restrictions to allow the Purchasing Division to print or electronically save documents provided that those documents are viewable by the Purchasing Division prior to obtaining the password or removing the access restriction.

19. NON-RESPONSIBLE: The Purchasing Division Director reserves the right to reject the bid of any vendor as Non-Responsible in accordance with W. Va. Code of State Rules § 148-1-5.3, when the Director determines that the vendor submitting the bid does not have the capability to fully perform or lacks the integrity and reliability to assure good-faith performance.”

20. ACCEPTANCE/REJECTION: The State may accept or reject any bid in whole, or in part in accordance with W. Va. Code of State Rules § 148-1-4.5. and § 148-1-6.4.b.”

21. YOUR SUBMISSION IS A PUBLIC DOCUMENT: Vendor's entire response to the Solicitation and the resulting Contract are public documents. As public documents, they will be disclosed to the public following the bid/proposal opening or award of the contract, as required by the competitive bidding laws of West Virginia Code §§ 5A-3-1 et seq., 5-22-1 et seq., and 5G-1-1 et seq. and the Freedom of Information Act West Virginia Code §§ 29B-1-1 et seq.

DO NOT SUBMIT MATERIAL YOU CONSIDER TO BE CONFIDENTIAL, A TRADE SECRET, OR OTHERWISE NOT SUBJECT TO PUBLIC DISCLOSURE.

Submission of any bid, proposal, or other document to the Purchasing Division constitutes your explicit consent to the subsequent public disclosure of the bid, proposal, or document. The Purchasing Division will disclose any document labeled "confidential," "proprietary," "trade secret," "private," or labeled with any other claim against public disclosure of the documents, to include any "trade secrets" as defined by West Virginia Code § 47-22-1 et seq. All submissions are subject to public disclosure without notice.

22. WITH THE BID REQUIREMENTS: In instances where these specifications require documentation or other information with the bid, and a vendor fails to provide it with the bid, the Director of the Purchasing Division reserves the right to request those items after bid opening and prior to contract award pursuant to the authority to waive minor irregularities in bids or specifications under W. Va. CSR § 148-1-4.6. This authority does not apply to instances where state law mandates receipt with the bid.

23. EMAIL NOTIFICATION OF AWARD: The Purchasing Division will attempt to provide bidders with e-mail notification of contract award when a solicitation that the bidder participated in has been awarded. For notification purposes, bidders must provide the Purchasing Division with a valid email address in the bid response. Bidders may also monitor ~~WV~~OASIS or the Purchasing Division's website to determine when a contract has been awarded.

24. ISRAEL BOYCOTT CERTIFICATION: Vendor's act of submitting a bid in response to this solicitation shall be deemed a certification from bidder to the State that bidder is not currently engaged in, and will not for the duration of the contract, engage in a boycott of Israel. This certification is required by W. Va. Code § 5A-3-63.

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

1. CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENT: Issuance of an Award Document signed by the Purchasing Division Director, or his designee, and approved as to form by the Attorney General's office constitutes acceptance by the State of this Contract made by and between the State of West Virginia and the Vendor. Vendor's signature on its bid, or on the Contract if the Contract is not the result of a bid solicitation, signifies Vendor's agreement to be bound by and accept the terms and conditions contained in this Contract.

2. DEFINITIONS: As used in this Solicitation/Contract, the following terms shall have the meanings attributed to them below. Additional definitions may be found in the specifications included with this Solicitation/Contract.

2.1. "Agency" or "Agencies" means the agency, board, commission, or other entity of the State of West Virginia that is identified on the first page of the Solicitation or any other public entity seeking to procure goods or services under this Contract.

2.2. "Bid" or "Proposal" means the vendors submitted response to this solicitation.

2.3. "Contract" means the binding agreement that is entered into between the State and the Vendor to provide the goods or services requested in the Solicitation.

2.4. "Director" means the Director of the West Virginia Department of Administration, Purchasing Division.

2.5. "Purchasing Division" means the West Virginia Department of Administration, Purchasing Division.

2.6. "Award Document" means the document signed by the Agency and the Purchasing Division, and approved as to form by the Attorney General, that identifies the Vendor as the contract holder.

2.7. "Solicitation" means the official notice of an opportunity to supply the State with goods or services that is published by the Purchasing Division.

2.8. "State" means the State of West Virginia and/or any of its agencies, commissions, boards, etc. as context requires.

2.9. "Vendor" or "Vendors" means any entity submitting a bid in response to the Solicitation, the entity that has been selected as the lowest responsible bidder, or the entity that has been awarded the Contract as context requires.

3. CONTRACT TERM; RENEWAL; EXTENSION: The term of this Contract shall be determined in accordance with the category that has been identified as applicable to this Contract below:

An emergency purchase in the open market, approved by the Purchasing Division Director, shall not constitute of breach of this Contract and shall not entitle the Vendor to any form of compensation or damages. This provision does not excuse the State from fulfilling its obligations under a One-Time Purchase contract.

7. REQUIRED DOCUMENTS: All of the items checked in this section must be provided to the Purchasing Division by the Vendor as specified:

20. TIME: Time is of the essence regarding all matters of time and performance in this Contract.

21. APPLICABLE LAW: This Contract is governed by and interpreted under West Virginia law without giving effect to its choice of law principles. Any information provided in specification manuals, or any other source, verbal or written, which contradicts or violates the West Virginia Constitution, West Virginia Code, or West Virginia Code of State Rules is void and of no effect.

22. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS: Vendor shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, regulations and ordinances. By submitting a bid, Vendor acknowledges that it has reviewed, understands, and will comply with all applicable laws, regulations, and ordinances.

SUBCONTRACTOR COMPLIANCE: Vendor shall notify all subcontractors providing commodities or services related to this Contract that as subcontractors, they too are required to comply with all applicable laws, regulations, and ordinances. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Contract to the contrary no modification of this Contract shall be binding without mutual written consent of the Agency, and the Vendor, with approval of the Purchasing Division and the Attorney General's office (Attorney General approval is as to form only). Any change to existing contracts that adds work or changes contract cost, and were not included in the original contract, must be approved by the Purchasing Division and the Attorney General's Office (as to form) prior to the implementation of the change or commencement of work affected by the change.

25. WAIVER: The failure of either party to insist upon a strict performance of any of the terms or provision of this Contract, or to exercise any option, right, or remedy herein contained, shall not be construed as a waiver or a relinquishment for the future of such term, provision, option, right, or remedy, but the same shall continue in full force and effect. Any waiver must be expressly stated in writing and signed by the waiving party.

26. SUBSEQUENT FORMS: The terms and conditions contained in this Contract shall supersede any and all subsequent terms and conditions which may appear on any form documents submitted by Vendor to the Agency or Purchasing Division such as price lists, order forms, invoices, sales agreements, or maintenance agreements, and includes internet websites or other electronic documents. Acceptance or use of Vendor's forms does not constitute acceptance of the terms and conditions contained thereon.

27. ASSIGNMENT: Neither this Contract nor any monies due, or to become due hereunder, may be assigned by the Vendor without the express written consent of the Agency, the Purchasing Division, the Attorney General's office (as to form only), and any other government agency or office that may be required to approve such assignments.

28. WARRANTY: The Vendor expressly warrants that the goods and/or services covered by this Contract will: (a) conform to the specifications, drawings, samples, or other description furnished or specified by the Agency; (b) be merchantable and fit for the purpose intended; and (c) be free from defect in material and workmanship.

29. STATE EMPLOYEES: State employees are not permitted to utilize this Contract for personal use and the Vendor is prohibited from permitting or facilitating the same.

30. PRIVACY, SECURITY, AND CONFIDENTIALITY: The Vendor agrees that it will not disclose to anyone, directly or indirectly, any such personally identifiable information or other confidential information gained from the Agency, unless the individual who is the subject of the information consents to the disclosure in writing or the disclosure is made pursuant to the Agency's policies, procedures, and rules. Vendor further agrees to comply with the Confidentiality Policies and Information Security Accountability Requirements, set forth in www.state.wv.us/admin/purchase/privacy.

31. YOUR SUBMISSION IS A PUBLIC DOCUMENT: Vendor's entire response to the Solicitation and the resulting Contract are public documents. As public documents, they will be disclosed to the public following the bid/proposal opening or award of the contract, as required by the competitive bidding laws of West Virginia Code §§ 5A-3-1 et seq., 5-22-1 et seq., and 5G-1-1 et seq. and the Freedom of Information Act West Virginia Code §§ 29B-1-1 et seq.

32. LICENSING: In accordance with West Virginia Code of State Rules § 148-1-6.1.e, Vendor must be licensed and in good standing in accordance with any and all state and local laws and requirements by any state or local agency of West Virginia, including, but not limited to, the West Virginia Secretary of State's Office, the West Virginia Tax Department, West Virginia Insurance Commission, or any other state agency or political subdivision. Obligations related to political subdivisions may include, but are not limited to, business licensing, business and occupation taxes, inspection compliance, permitting, etc. Upon request, the Vendor must provide all necessary releases to obtain information to enable the Purchasing Division Director or the Agency to verify that the Vendor is licensed and in good standing with the above entities.

SUBCONTRACTOR COMPLIANCE: Vendor shall notify all subcontractors providing commodities or services related to this Contract that as subcontractors, they too are required to be licensed, in good standing, and up-to-date on all state and local obligations as described in this section. 33. The Vendor as an independent contractor is solely liable for the acts and omissions of its employees and agents. Vendor shall be responsible for selecting, supervising, and compensating any and all individuals employed pursuant to the terms of this Solicitation and resulting contract. Neither the Vendor, nor any employees or subcontractors of the Vendor, shall be deemed to be employees of the State for any purpose whatsoever. Vendor shall be exclusively responsible for payment of employees and contractors for all wages and salaries, taxes, withholding payments, penalties, fees, fringe benefits, professional liability insurance premiums, contributions to insurance and pension, or other deferred compensation plans, including but not limited to, Workers' Compensation and Social Security obligations, licensing fees, etc. and the filing of all necessary documents, forms, and returns pertinent to all of the foregoing.

Vendor shall hold harmless the State, and shall provide the State and Agency with a defense against any and all claims including, but not limited to, the foregoing payments, withholdings, contributions, taxes, Social Security taxes, and employer income tax returns.

36. INDEMNIFICATION: The Vendor agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the State and the Agency, their officers, and employees from and against: (1) Any claims or losses for services rendered by any subcontractor, person, or firm performing or supplying services, materials, or supplies in connection with the performance of the Contract; (2) Any claims or losses resulting to any person or entity injured or damaged by the Vendor, its officers, employees, or subcontractors by the publication, translation, reproduction, delivery, performance, use, or disposition of any data used under the Contract in a manner not authorized by the Contract, or by Federal or State statutes or regulations; and (3) Any failure of the Vendor, its officers, employees, or subcontractors to observe State and Federal laws including, but not limited to, labor and wage and hour laws.

37. NO DEBT CERTIFICATION: In accordance with West Virginia Code §§ 5A-3-10a and 5-22-1(i), the State is prohibited from awarding a contract to any bidder that owes a debt to the State or a political subdivision of the State. By submitting a bid, or entering into a contract with the State, Vendor is affirming that (1) for construction contracts, the Vendor is not in default on any monetary obligation owed to the state or a political subdivision of the state, and (2) for all other contracts, neither the Vendor nor any related party owe a debt as defined above, and neither the Vendor nor any related party are in employer default as defined in the statute cited above unless the debt or employer default is permitted under the statute.

41. PREFERENCE FOR USE OF DOMESTIC STEEL PRODUCTS: Except when authorized by the Director of the Purchasing Division pursuant to W. Va. Code § 5A-3-56, no contractor may use or supply steel products for a State Contract Project other than those steel products made in the United States. A contractor who uses steel products in violation of this section may be subject to civil penalties pursuant to W. Va. Code § 5A-3-56. As used in this section:

- a. "State Contract Project" means any erection or construction of, or any addition to, alteration of or other improvement to any building or structure, including, but not limited to, roads or highways, or the installation of any heating or cooling or ventilating plants or other equipment, or the supply of and materials for such projects, pursuant to a contract with the State of West Virginia for which bids were solicited on or after June 6, 2001.
- b. "Steel Products" means products rolled, formed, shaped, drawn, extruded, forged, cast, fabricated or otherwise similarly processed, or processed by a combination of two or more or such operations, from steel made by the open hearth, basic oxygen, electric furnace, Bessemer or other steel making process.
- c. The Purchasing Division Director may, in writing, authorize the use of foreign steel products if:
 1. The cost for each contract item used does not exceed one tenth of one percent (.1%) of the total contract cost or two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00), whichever is greater. For the purposes of this section, the cost is the value of the steel product as delivered to the project; or
 2. The Director of the Purchasing Division determines that specified steel materials are not produced in the United States in sufficient quantity or otherwise are not reasonably available to meet contract requirements.

42. PREFERENCE FOR USE OF DOMESTIC ALUMINUM, GLASS, AND STEEL: In Accordance with W. Va. Code § 5-19-1 et seq., and W. Va. CSR § 148-10-1 et seq., for every contract or subcontract, subject to the limitations contained herein, for the construction, reconstruction, alteration, repair, improvement or maintenance of public works or for the purchase of any item of machinery or equipment to be used at sites of public works, only domestic aluminum, glass or steel products shall be supplied unless the spending officer determines, in writing, after the receipt of offers or bids, (1) that the cost of domestic aluminum, glass or steel products is unreasonable or inconsistent with the public interest of the State of West Virginia, (2) that domestic aluminum, glass or steel products are not produced in sufficient quantities to meet the contract requirements, or (3) the available domestic aluminum, glass, or steel do not meet the contract specifications. This provision only applies to public works contracts awarded in an amount more than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) or public works contracts that require more than ten thousand pounds of steel products.

The cost of domestic aluminum, glass, or steel products may be unreasonable if the cost is more than twenty percent (20%) of the bid or offered price for foreign made aluminum, glass, or steel products. If the domestic aluminum, glass or steel products to be supplied or produced in a “substantial labor surplus area”, as defined by the United States Department of Labor, the cost of domestic aluminum, glass, or steel products may be unreasonable if the cost is more than thirty percent (30%) of the bid or offered price for foreign made aluminum, glass, or steel products. This preference shall be applied to an item of machinery or equipment, as indicated above, when the item is a single unit of equipment or machinery manufactured primarily of aluminum, glass or steel, is part of a public works contract and has the sole purpose or of being a permanent part of a single public works project. This provision does not apply to equipment or machinery purchased by a spending unit for use by that spending unit and not as part of a single public works project.

All bids and offers including domestic aluminum, glass or steel products that exceed bid or offer prices including foreign aluminum, glass or steel products after application of the preferences provided in this provision may be reduced to a price equal to or lower than the lowest bid or offer price for foreign aluminum, glass or steel products plus the applicable preference. If the reduced bid or offer prices are made in writing and supersede the prior bid or offer prices, all bids or offers, including the reduced bid or offer prices, will be reevaluated in accordance with this rule.

43. INTERESTED PARTY SUPPLEMENTAL DISCLOSURE: W. Va. Code § 6D-1-2 requires that for contracts with an actual or estimated value of at least \$1 million, the Vendor must submit to the Agency a disclosure of interested parties prior to beginning work under this Contract.  - 2.4 **“IRT”** is the Interagency Review Team which is an interagency team comprised of representatives from U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, US Fish and Wildlife Service, WV Department of Environmental Protection, WV Division of Natural Resources and other federal, state and local agencies as appropriate.
 - 2.5 **“Mitigation Banking”** is the restoration, creation, enhancement, or preservation of a wetland, stream, or other habitat area undertaken expressly for the purpose of compensating for unavoidable resource losses in advance of development actions, when such compensation cannot be achieved at the development site or would not be as environmentally beneficial.
 - 2.6 **“A mitigation bank”** is a site developed for mitigation banking. The person or entity undertaking such restoration work is referred to as a mitigation banker.
 - 2.7 **“Mitigation Credits”** are units of exchange defined as the ecological value associated with the accrual or attainment of aquatic resource function, condition, or other performance measure at a mitigation site. Mitigation credits are determined based on the West Virginia Stream and Wetland Valuation Metric. The Interagency Review Team periodically releases bank credits as the bank meets certain performance milestones. This happens over the course of the "establishment period", which lasts around 10 to 12 years. When the IRT releases potential bank

credits, they become available credits meaning they can be purchased for ecological offset.

- 2.8 “Released Mitigation Credits”** are those credits available for sale to offset impacts. Credits are based on meeting performance standards and approved by the IRT.
- 2.9 “Pricing Pages”** means the schedule of prices, estimated order quantity, and totals contained in wvOASIS or attached hereto as Exhibit A and used to evaluate the Solicitation responses.
- 2.10 “RIBITS”** (Regulatory In lieu fee and Bank Information Tracking System) is a website created by the US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) with information on mitigation and conservation banks and in-lieu fee (ILF) program sites. It houses information about all mitigation and ILF sites including site documents, mitigation credit availability, and service areas as well as tracks all credit transactions.
- 2.11 “Solicitation”** means the official notice of an opportunity to supply the State with goods or services that is published by the Purchasing Division.
- 2.12 “SSA”** means Secondary Service Area as identified in the WV In Lieu Fee Stream and Wetland Mitigation Program Instrument.

3. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS:

- 3.1 Contract Items and Mandatory Requirements:** Vendor shall provide Agency with the Contract Items listed below on an open-end and continuing basis. This contract will be awarded to multiple Vendors based on the need to have access to mitigation credits statewide. Contract Items must meet or exceed the mandatory requirements as shown below.
- 3.1.1** Released Credits from a U.S. Army Corps of Engineers approved mitigation bank in SSA 1 (Estimated Quantities 3800 stream credits and 1 wetland credit)
- 3.1.2** Released Credits from a U.S. Army Corps of Engineers approved mitigation bank in SSA 2 (Estimated Quantities 1 stream credit and 1 wetland credit)
- 3.1.3** Released Credits from a U.S. Army Corps of Engineers approved mitigation bank in SSA 3 (Estimated Quantities 1 stream credit and 1 wetland credit)

3.1.4 Released Credits from a U.S. Army Corps of Engineers approved mitigation bank SSA 4 (Estimated Quantities 1 stream credits and 1 wetland credit)

3.1.5 Released Credits from a U.S. Army Corps of Engineers approved mitigation bank in SSA 5 (Estimated Quantities 1 stream credit and 1 wetland credit)

4. BIDDER'S MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- 4.1** Bidders shall be the owner or authorized representative of a stream and/or wetland mitigation bank that is approved by the USACE. The mitigation bank shall be active and operating in compliance with applicable federal and state permits, laws and regulations and be in good regulatory standing.
- 4.2** A copy of the bank's geographic service area map or equivalent must be provided with the bid submission.
- 4.3** The mitigation bank shall include with its bid submission the Bank's typical Agreement for Credit Purchase and Sale.
- 4.4** The mitigation bank shall have the number and type of credits released by the IRT and available for sale upon signing of the Agreement for Credit Purchase and Sale.
- 4.5** Any authorizations or approvals required by the USACE, IRT or other regulatory organizations regarding the use or availability of mitigation credits must be completed prior to the date of the Agreement for Credit Purchase and Sale.

5. CONTRACT AWARD:

- 5.1 Contract Award:** The Contract is intended to provide the DEP ILF with a purchase price on all Contract Items. The Contract shall be awarded to Vendors that provide the Contract Items meeting the required specifications for the lowest overall total cost as shown on the Pricing Pages.
- 5.2 Pricing Pages:** Vendor should complete the Pricing Pages by providing a unit cost and multiplying by the estimated quantity to calculate the extended cost. Vendor should complete the Pricing Pages in their entirety as failure to do so may result in Vendor's bids being disqualified.

The Pricing Pages contain a list of the Contract Items and estimated purchase volume. The estimated purchase volume for each item represents

the approximate volume of anticipated purchases only. No future use of the Contract or any individual item is guaranteed or implied.

Vendor should type or electronically enter the information into the pricing page to prevent errors in the evaluation.

Vendor's who wish to respond to a centralized Request for Quotation (CRFQ) online may submit information through the state's wvOASIS Vendor self-service (VSS). If unable to respond online, Vendor must submit their pricing page with their submitted bid prior to the scheduled bid opening date.

6. ORDERING AND PAYMENT:

If Vendor has the ability to accept on-line orders, it should include in its response a brief description of how Agencies may utilize the on-line ordering system. Vendor shall ensure that its on-line ordering system is properly secured prior to processing Agency orders on-line.

6.1.1 Agency will issue an Agency Delivery Order (ADO) for purchase of mitigation credits. Agency must use the lowest bid Vendor unless it is determined that the Vendor does not have mitigation credits available for purchase at the time of request.

6.1.2 If lowest bid Vendor has credits available but not enough to complete the requested amount, then the DEP will procure the credits available from the lowest bid Vendor and then contact the next lowest bid Vendor to obtain the requested amount of mitigation credits and so on until the total amount is obtained.

6.1.3 If there is a tie among the lowest bid Vendors, the DEP may request another quote to procure the mitigation credits or procure mitigation

credits from the Vendor that has mitigation bank credits closest to where the DEP ILF funds were taken in.

6.1.4 Once the Agreement for Credit Purchase and Sale is signed, the Vendor shall place those credits in reserve until the purchase is complete.

6.2 Payment: Within ten (10) business days of the Credit Transfer into the DEP ILF RIBITS stream credit ledger, Vendor shall provide the DEP ILF with an invoice for the Purchase Price (“*Invoice*”) and DEP ILF shall remit Purchase Price payment in accordance with the payment procedures of the State of West Virginia.

7. DELIVERY AND RETURN:

7.1 Delivery Time: Within ten (10) business days of signing the Agreement for Credit Purchase and Sale for the released credits the Vendor shall transfer the purchased number of Stream Credits to the DEP ILF Program by notifying the Corps to debit Vendor’s online Corps-maintained RIBITS Stream Credit ledger in the amount of the purchased Stream Credits (“*Credit Transfer*”).

7.2 Late Delivery: The Agency placing the order under this Contract must be notified in writing if orders will be delayed for any reason. Any delay in delivery that could cause harm to an Agency will be grounds for cancellation of the delayed order, and/or obtaining the items ordered from a third party.

Any Agency seeking to obtain items from a third party under this provision must first obtain approval of the Purchasing Division.

7.3 Return of Unacceptable Items: If the Agency deems the Contract Items to be unacceptable, the Contract Items shall be returned to Vendor at Vendor’s expense and with no restocking charge. Vendor shall either make arrangements for the return within five (5) days of being notified that items are unacceptable or permit the Agency to arrange for the return and reimburse Agency for delivery expenses. The returned product shall either be replaced, or the Agency shall receive a full credit or refund for the purchase price, at the Agency’s discretion.

7.4 Return Due to Agency Error: Items ordered in error by the Agency will be returned for credit within 30 days of receipt.

- 8.1.4** Failure to remedy deficient performance upon request.

8.2 The following remedies shall be available to Agency upon default.

- 8.2.1** Immediate cancellation of the Contract.
- 8.2.2** Immediate cancellation of one or more release orders issued under this Contract.
- 8.2.3** Any other remedies available in law or equity.

9. MISCELLANEOUS:

- 9.1 No Substitutions:** Vendor shall supply only Contract Items submitted in response to the Solicitation unless a contract modification is approved in accordance with the provisions contained in this Contract.
- 9.2 Vendor Supply:** Vendor must carry sufficient inventory of the Contract Items being offered to fulfill any Agreement for Credit Purchase and Sale signed under this Contract. By signing the Agreement for Credit Purchase and Sale, Vendor certifies that it can supply the Contract Items needed at that time.

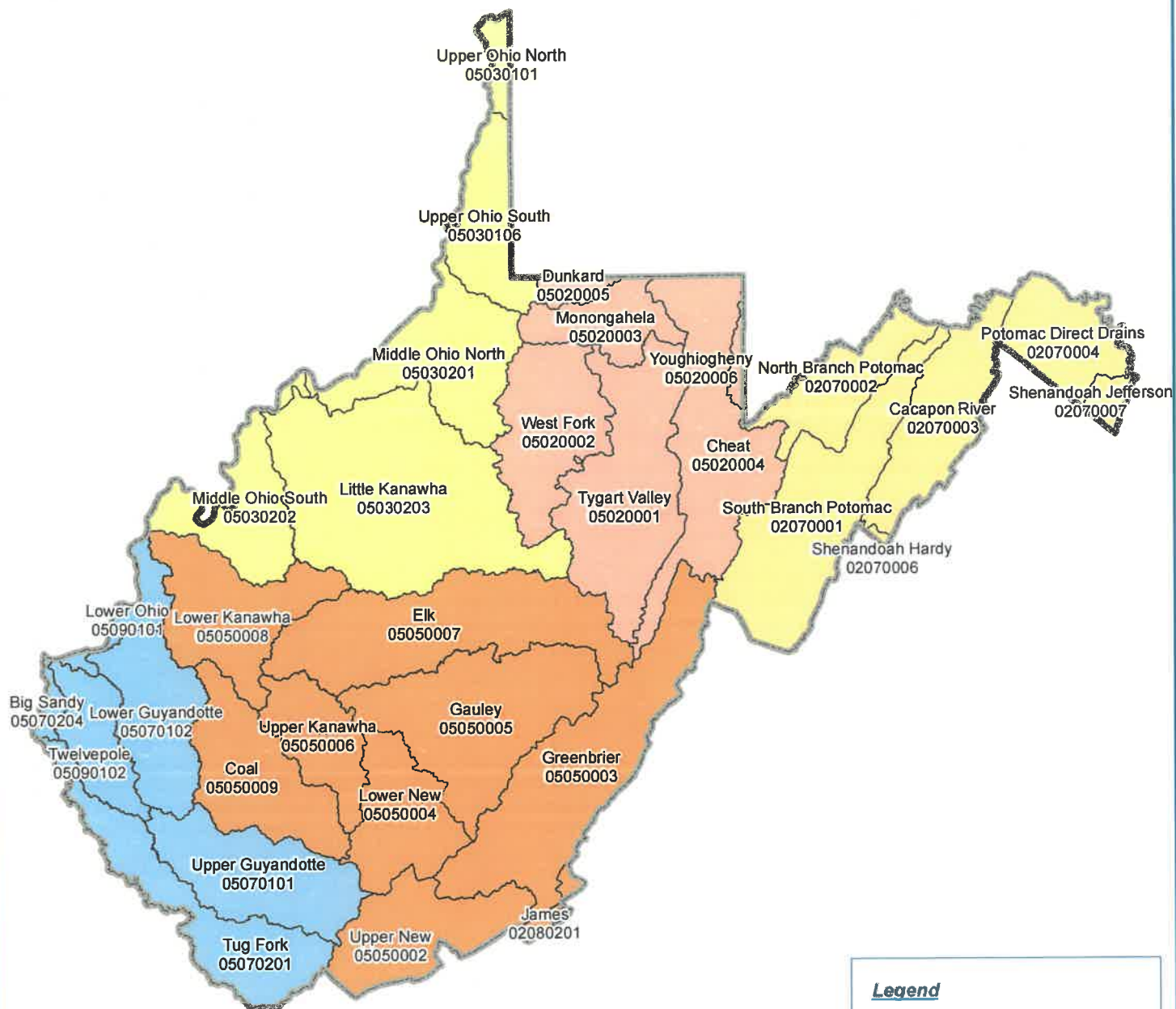

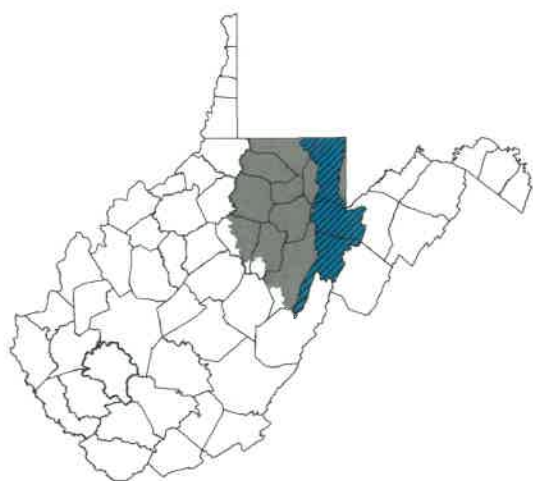
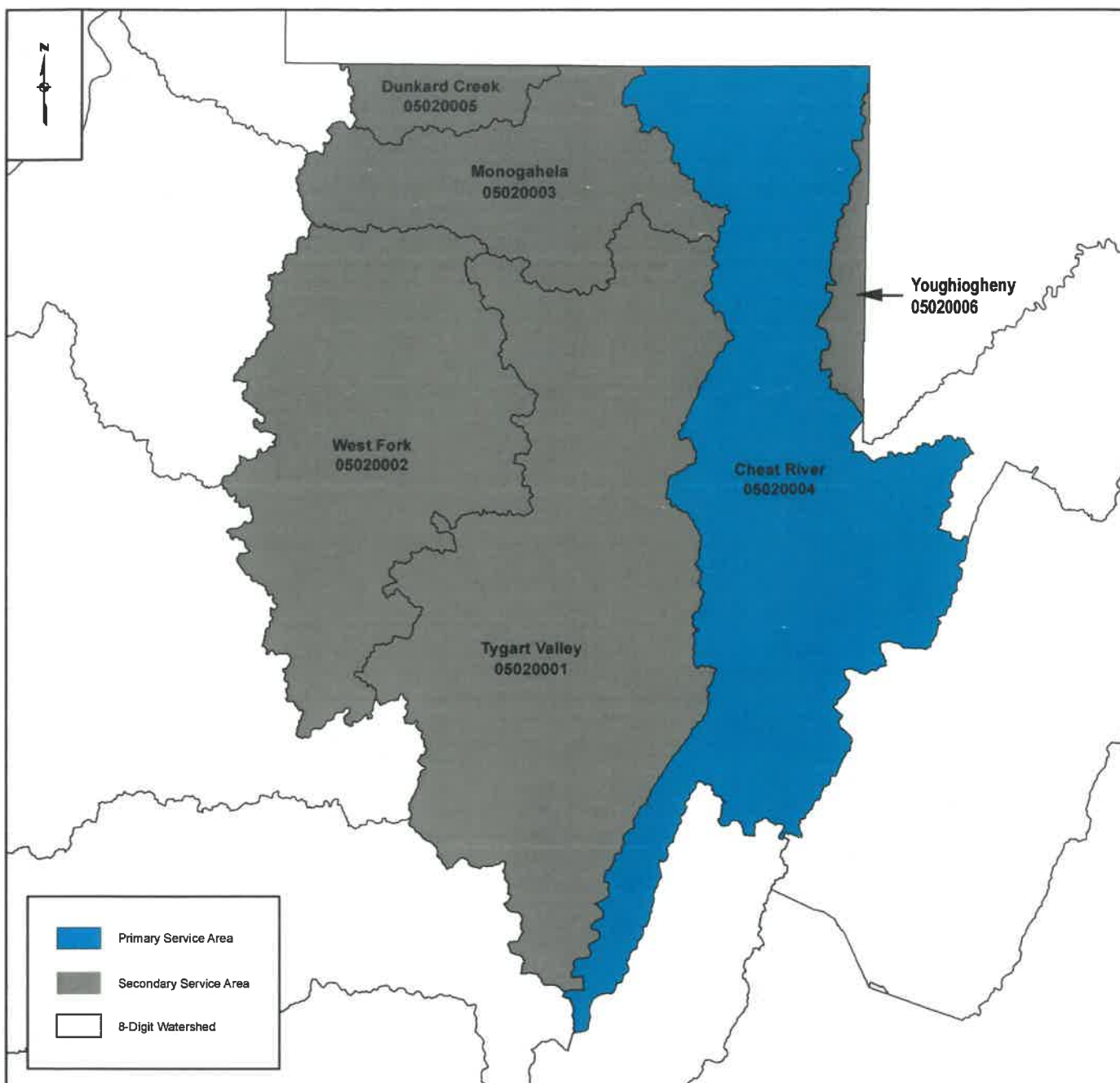
8 Digit HUC Watershed

**HARMONY UMBRELLA MITIGATION BANK
AGREEMENT FOR PURCHASE OF MITIGATION CREDITS**

THIS AGREEMENT FOR PURCHASE OF MITIGATION CREDITS (this "Agreement") is effective as of _____, 201__, between Harmony Environmental, LLC a West Virginia limited liability company ("Seller"), and the purchaser named on the signature page hereto ("Purchaser").

BACKGROUND:

A. Seller has developed the Harmony Umbrella Mitigation Bank (the "Bank") under one or more permits issued by the United States Army Corps of Engineers (the "USACE") and an Umbrella Mitigation Banking Instrument (the "UMBI") for the Bank that has been approved by the USACE or that Seller intends to have approved by the USACE. Pursuant to the UMBI, Seller has or expects to have rights to certain wetland and stream mitigation credits (the "Credits") obtained from the USACE.

B. Purchaser has applied, or will apply, for one or more permits (the "Purchaser's Permit") from the USACE to fill or to otherwise impact wetlands and/or streams ("Purchaser's Project") that require(s) Purchaser to mitigate for such impacts by purchasing Credits.

C. Purchaser desires to purchase from Seller, and Seller desires to sell to Purchaser, Credits, on the terms and subject to the conditions set forth in this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the premises and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, and intending to be legally bound hereby, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. Purchase Terms.

(a) Subject Credits and Purchase Price. Purchaser agrees to purchase from Seller, and Seller agrees to reserve and sell to purchaser, the number of Credits (the "Subject Credits") shown on the signature page hereto for the aggregate purchase price shown on the signature page hereto (the "Purchase Price").

(b) Deposit. Concurrent with its execution and delivery of this Agreement, Purchaser has paid to Seller a deposit payment in the amount shown on the signature page hereto (the "Deposit"). The Deposit shall be applied against the Purchase Price at the Closing (as defined in Section 2 hereof) and is non-refundable to the Purchaser in any event, except as provided in Section 6 hereof.

(c) Reservation of Credits; Reservation Period. Concurrent with its execution and delivery of this Agreement, Seller has delivered to Purchaser an affidavit (the "Reservation Affidavit") in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A evidencing Seller's reservation of the Subject Credits for Purchaser's benefit, and evidencing the agreement of Seller to sell the Subject Credits to Purchaser upon the satisfaction of the conditions to closing set forth herein. Subject to Seller's receipt of the Deposit, the period during which Seller shall reserve the Subject Credits for Purchaser shall commence on the Effective Date and shall end at 5:00 p.m., local Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania time on the date set forth on the signature page hereto (the "Reservation Expiration Date"). The Reservation Expiration Date may be extended by mutual agreement of Seller and Purchaser; provided, however, that Seller shall have no obligation to extend the Reservation Expiration Date. Any such extension may be subject to the payment by Purchaser to Seller of an additional sum, which additional sum may be retained as consideration for the extension of the Reservation Expiration Date, and need not be credited against the balance of the

Purchase Price at Closing, unless Seller agrees otherwise. In the event that the Reservation Expiration Date is extended pursuant hereto, Seller shall deliver to Purchaser a replacement affidavit evidencing Seller's reservation of the Subject Credits for the benefit of Purchaser for the extended period.

(d) If Purchaser's mitigation requirements, as set forth in and determined solely by Purchaser's Permit, vary from the number of Subject Credits set forth on the signature page hereto, then the number of Subject Credits to be purchased and sold pursuant hereto may be adjusted by mutual agreement of Seller and Purchaser to equal the number required by Purchaser's Permit, and in such event, the Purchase Price shall be increased or decreased based on the Per Credit Price set forth on the signature page hereto. Any such increase in the number of Subject Credits shall be subject to the availability of unreserved Credits. In no event will the Purchase Price be decreased pursuant to this Section 1(c) to an amount less than the amount of the Deposit. If no mitigation is required or approved by the USACE for the Purchaser's Project, Purchaser will be deemed to have defaulted under this Agreement, and the provisions of Section 7 hereof shall apply.

2. Conditions to Closing; Closing.

(a) Conditions to Closing. The obligations of Seller and Purchaser to consummate the sale and purchase of the Subject Credits are subject to the satisfaction of the following conditions:

(i) no temporary restraining order, preliminary or permanent injunction or other order preventing the consummation of the sale and purchase of the Subject Credits shall be in effect;

(ii) no law shall have been enacted or shall be deemed applicable that prohibits the sale and purchase of the Subject Credits, or otherwise operates to preclude the sale and purchase of the Subject Credits; and

(b) Closing. The closing on the purchase and sale of the Subject Credits (the "Closing") shall take place as soon as practicable after the conditions set forth in Section 3 hereof shall have been satisfied, on a date and at a location to be specified by the parties. The date on which the Closing occurs is referred to in this Agreement as the "Closing Date."

(c) Closing Deliveries. The following deliveries shall occur at the Closing:

(i) Seller shall deliver to Purchaser a Bill of Sale, in the form attached hereto as Exhibit B, evidencing the sale of the Subject Credits to Purchaser; and

(ii) Purchaser shall deliver to Seller the Purchase Price (as may be adjusted pursuant to Section 1(d) hereof), less the Deposit, in immediately available funds to an account designated by Seller.

3. Covenants of Seller.

(a) Reservation of Credits. Upon its receipt of the Deposit and a copy of this Agreement executed by Purchaser, Seller shall deliver a Reservation Affidavit to Purchaser. Seller shall maintain a number of Credits sufficient to enable Seller to deliver the Subject Credits to Purchaser at Closing; provided, however, that if as of the date of this Agreement, the UMBI has not been approved by the USACE, then upon approval of the UMBI by the USACE, Seller's obligation to maintain Credits for Purchaser's benefit shall commence on such date.

(b) UMBI and the Bank. If the UMBI has not been approved by the USACE as of the date of this Agreement, Seller shall use commercially reasonable efforts to obtain such approval as promptly as practicable. At its sole cost and expense, Seller shall comply with its obligations set forth in the UMBI and shall comply with all legal requirements applicable to the creation, operation, management and maintenance of the Bank in order to maintain Seller's ability to sell the Subject Credits to Purchaser.

(c) Contravention of this Agreement. Seller shall not sell any number of Credits that would prevent the consummation of the sale of the Subject Credits to the Purchaser; provided, however, that if Purchaser's Permit requires Purchaser to purchase a number of Credits in excess of the number of Subject Credits set forth on the signature page hereto, the failure of Seller to maintain Credits in excess of the number set forth on the signature page hereto shall not be deemed to be a breach of the foregoing covenant.

4. Covenant of Purchaser. Purchaser shall use commercially reasonable efforts to obtain Purchaser's Permit, and all other permits and approvals necessary for the performance of Purchaser's Project, all on a timely basis, at Purchaser's sole cost and expense.

5. Acknowledgments by Purchaser. Purchaser acknowledges that Seller is not providing advice to Purchaser about whether the Subject Credits meet Purchaser's requirements, or about any other issue related to Purchaser's Permit. Purchaser further acknowledges that Seller has made no representation or warranty to Purchaser that the use of its Credits will be deemed appropriate by the USACE to offset any or all of the wetland and/or stream impact associated with Purchaser's Project.

6. Seller's Breach or Failure to Perform. If Purchaser has performed each of its obligations under this Agreement (except for delivery of the balance of the Purchase Price), but Seller breaches any covenant contained in Section 3 hereof, or fails to perform its obligations required to be performed at Closing, then Purchaser may terminate this Agreement upon written notice to Seller, and upon Seller's receipt of such termination notice, Seller shall return the Deposit actually paid by Purchaser, and in addition, Seller shall indemnify and hold harmless Purchaser for, and shall pay to Purchaser the amount of, any losses, claims, liabilities, damages and expenses ("Losses") arising, directly or indirectly, from or in connection with the breach by Seller of any covenant contained in Section 3 hereof, or the failure of Seller to perform its obligations required to be performed at Closing; provided, however, that Seller's obligation to indemnify and hold Purchaser harmless and to pay to Purchaser the amount of any such Losses shall not exceed the amount of the Deposit. Upon payment of such sums, Seller and Purchaser shall be relieved of all further obligations under this Agreement, and Purchaser shall be deemed to have waived all other remedies for Seller's breach or failure to perform, or with respect to the failure to consummate the transactions contemplated to occur pursuant to this Agreement.

7. Purchaser's Breach or Failure to Perform. If Seller has performed each of its obligations under this Agreement (except for delivery of a Bill of Sale for the Subject Credits), but Purchaser breaches any covenant contained in Section 4 hereof, or fails to perform its obligations required to be performed at Closing, then Seller may terminate this Agreement upon written notice to Purchaser and retain the Deposit actually paid by Purchaser, in full settlement of any claims of Seller, whereupon Purchaser shall be relieved of all further obligations under this Agreement, and Seller shall be deemed to have waived all other remedies for Purchaser's breach or failure to perform.

8. General.

(a) Successors and Assigns. This Agreement may not be assigned by either party hereto without the prior written consent of the other party; provided, however, that after the Closing, Purchaser may assign the Subject Credits to any third party. Subject to the foregoing, all of the terms and

provisions of this Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns.

(b) Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and interpreted and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of West Virginia, without giving effect to any choice of law or conflict of laws rules or provisions (whether of the State of West Virginia or any other jurisdiction) that would cause the application of the laws of any jurisdiction other than the State of West Virginia.

(c) Consent to Jurisdiction. Each party irrevocably and unconditionally waives any objection to the laying of venue for any action, suit or proceeding arising out of this Agreement or the transactions contemplated hereby in (a) the State of West Virginia, or (b) the United States District Court for the Southern District of West Virginia, and hereby further irrevocably and unconditionally waives and agrees not to plead or claim in any such court that any such action, suit or proceeding brought in any such court has been brought in an inconvenient forum. EACH PARTY HEREBY IRREVOCABLY WAIVES ALL RIGHT TO TRIAL BY JURY IN ANY ACTION, PROCEEDING OR COUNTERCLAIM (WHETHER BASED ON CONTRACT, TORT OR OTHERWISE) ARISING OUT OF OR RELATING TO THIS AGREEMENT OR THE ACTIONS OF SUCH PARTY IN THE NEGOTIATION, ADMINISTRATION, PERFORMANCE AND ENFORCEMENT HEREOF.

(d) Notices. Any notice, request, demand, waiver, consent, approval or other communication that is required or permitted hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed given: (i) on the date established by the sender as having been delivered personally, (ii) on the date delivered by a private courier as established by the sender by evidence obtained from the courier, (iii) on the fifth business day after the date mailed, by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid. Such communications, to be valid, must be addressed as follows:

If to Purchaser, to the address set forth on the signature page hereto. Either party may change its address for notices by prior written notice to the other party. If more than one method for sending notice as set forth above is used, the earliest notice date established as set forth above shall control.

(e) No Third Party Beneficiaries. No provision of this Agreement is intended to confer upon any person other than the parties hereto any rights or remedies hereunder.

(f) Entire Agreement. This Agreement and the documents and instruments specifically referred to herein or delivered pursuant hereto set forth the entire understanding of the parties hereto with respect to the sale and purchase of the Subject Credits. Any and all previous agreements and understandings between or among the parties regarding the subject matter hereof, whether written or oral, are superseded by this Agreement.

(g) Amendments and Waivers. Any provision of this Agreement may be amended or waived if, and only if, such amendment or waiver is in writing and is signed, in the case of an amendment, by each party to this Agreement, or in the case of a waiver, by the party against whom the

waiver is to be effective. No failure or delay by any party in exercising any right or privilege hereunder shall operate as a waiver thereof, nor shall any single or partial exercise thereof preclude any other or further exercise thereof or the exercise of any other right, power or privilege.

(h) Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which when executed and delivered shall be deemed to be an original and all of which counterparts taken together shall constitute but one and the same instrument. This Agreement shall become effective when each party hereto shall have received a counterpart hereof signed by the other party hereto. The parties agree that the delivery of this Agreement may be effected by means of an exchange of pdf or facsimile signatures with original copies to follow by mail or courier service.

(i) Attorneys' Fees. In the event of any litigation between the parties to enforce any of the provisions of this Agreement, the unsuccessful party to such litigation shall pay to the successful party all costs and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees, whether or not incurred in trial or on appeal, incurred by the successful party, all of which may be included in and as a part of any judgment rendered in such litigation.

(j) No Broker. Seller and Purchaser each represents to the other that it has engaged no broker, agent, salesman or similar person who is entitled to a commission or other fee in connection with the sale and purchase of the Subject Credits.
