- 3. All quotations are governed by the West Virginia Code and the Legislative Rules of the Purchasing Division.
- 4. Prior to any award, the apparent successful vendor must be properly registered with the Purchasing Division and have paid the required \$125.00 registration fee.
- 5. All services performed or goods delivered under State Purchase Orders/Contracts are to be continued for the term of the Purchase Order/Contract, contingent upon funds being appropriated by the Legislature or otherwise being made available. In the event funds are not appropriated or otherwise available for these services or goods, this Purchase Order/Contract becomes void and of no effect after June 30.
- 6. Payment may only be made after the delivery and acceptance of goods or services.
- 7. Interest may be paid for late payment in accordance with the West Virginia Code.
- 8. Vendor preference will be granted upon written request in accordance with the West Virginia Code.
- 9. The State of West Virginia is exempt from federal and state taxes and will not pay or reimburse such taxes.

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West Virginia Public Broadcasting is requesting quotes on an ATSC compliant multiplexing-re-multiplexing/PSIP generating system. This system will accept up to eight ASI streams plus TCP/IP data and generate a broadcast-ready stream for transport to our transmitters. All software, hardware, cabling, and support will be awarded to a single vendor.

A trade-in allowance as a purchase option is requested.

1. General Requirements

- 1.1. West Virginia Public Broadcasting operates a Network Operating Center which provides programming to 3 full power DTV transmitters and 8 translators. Multiple programs are multiplexed and transported to the associated transmitters.
- 1.2. Vendor is requested to provide an "end to end" solution as described in Section 2 "Scope."
- 1.2.1. Three primary tasks will be performed by the system
- 1.2.1.1. Program multiplexing/re-multiplexing
- 1.2.1.2. PSIP generation and insertion
- 1.2.1.3. Traffic system interface
- 1.3. All equipment shall be factory new and shall not be used, refurbished, or B-stock.

2. Scope

- 2.1. Multiplexer/Re-multiplexer
- 2.1.1. The multiplexer/re-multiplexer shall accept a multiplexed ASI stream from existing encoders and multiplexer, along with 7 additional ASI sources, plus 1 (one) TCP/IP interface; for PSIP data

provided by a vendor-supplied sub-system (total of 9 individual inputs.) Inputs shall be re-multiplexed onto a single ASI output capable of output rates up to 90 Mbps.

- 2.1.1.1. The existing encoders and multiplexers are:
- 2.1.1.1.1 Two Harmonic MV-40 Encoders
- 2.1.1.1.2. One Harmonic MV-45 Encoder
- 2.1.1.1.3. One Harmonic MV-450 Encoder
- 2.1.1.1.4. One Harmonic MN-20 Multiplexer
- 2.1.1.1.4.1. Multiplexer also performs statistical multiplexing
- 2.1.2. The multiplexer/re-multiplexer shall have internal memory storage to ensure continuation of PSIP broadcast in the event of a PSIP generator failure.
- 2.1.3. The multiplexer/re-multiplexer shall be capable of multiplex bandwidth management and overflow prevention.
- 2.1.4. The multiplexer/re-multiplexer should be configured via standard web browser and front panel.
- 2.1.5. Multiplexer/re-multiplexer should be capable of IP data encapsulation/de-encapsulation.
- 2.2. PSIP Generator
- 2.2.1. Vendor shall provide a PSIP generator.
- 2.2.1.1. PSIP generator shall be ATSC A65C compliant.
- 2.2.1.2. PSIP generator shall produce all necessary tables to provide static and dynamic PSIP for a minimum of four minor channels.

- 2.2.1.3. PSIP generator shall be capable of 4 days of Electronic Program Guide.
- 2.2.1.3.1. PSIP Generator shall extract EPG tables from existing traffic system.
- 2.2.1.3.1.1. Existing traffic system generates Protrack XML files.
- 2.2.2. PSIP Generator interface to multiplexer/re-multiplexer shall be TCP/IP.

3. Integration

- 3.1. All hardware, software, interconnecting cables and devices, standard EIA 19" rack mounting hardware, power supplies and cables shall be provided by the vendor.
- 3.1.1. All power supplies shall be internal to the equipment.
- 3.2. All hardware shall mount in a standard 19" rack, provided by West Virginia Public Broadcasting.

4. Installation and support

- 4.1. Vendor shall provide telephone support for initial installation and programming.
- 4.2. Vendor shall provide 24 hour toll free technical support for all hardware and software for a minimum of five years.
- 4.3. Vendor shall provide a minimum of one year parts and labor warranty.

5. Future upgrades

5.1. The multiplexing-re-multiplexing/PSIP generating system shall be field upgradeable in both hardware and software to accommodate revisions in industry standards and addition of services.

6. Trade-in Allowance Options

- 6.1. Vendor is requested to provide a "trade in allowance for existing multiplexer/re-multiplexer and PSIP generator.
- 6.1.1. Current Multiplexer/re-multiplexer is a Thompson Grass Valley "Amber".
- 6.1.2. Current PSIP generator is a Thompson Grass Valley "Pearl".
- 6.2. Quote shall list trade in allowance separately, as an option.

7. Definitions

- 7.1. ASI Asynchronous Serial Interface (ASI) (1) A streaming format like an MPEG Transport Stream (MPEGTS). It can contain a single program or be a multiplex of multiple programs, each consisting of video, audio and associated tables.
- 7.2. ATSC The Advanced Television Systems Committee, Inc., is an international, non-profit organization developing voluntary standards for digital television. The ATSC member organizations represent the broadcast, broadcast equipment, motion picture, consumer electronics, computer, cable, satellite, and semiconductor industries. Specifically, ATSC is working to coordinate television standards among different communications media focusing on digital television, interactive systems, and broadband multimedia communications. ATSC is also developing digital television implementation strategies and presenting educational seminars on the ATSC standards.
- 7.3. PSIP Program and Service Information Protocol is a small collection of tables designed to operate within every Transport Stream (TS) for terrestrial broadcast of digital television. Its purpose is to describe the information at the system and event levels for all virtual channels carried in a particular TS. Additionally, information for analog channels as well as digital channels from other Transport Streams may be incorporated. There are two main categories of information in the ATSC PSIP Standard, system information and program data. System information allows navigation and access of

the channels within the DTV transport stream, and the program data provides necessary information for efficient browsing and event selection. Some tables announce future events and some are used to locate the digital streams than make up an event. The PSIP data are carried via a collection of hierarchically arranged tables.
