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GENERAL TERMS & CONDITIONS REQUEST FOR QUOTATION (RFQ) AND REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL (RFP)

- 1. Awards will be made in the best interest of the State of West Virginia.
- 2. The State may accept or reject in part, or in whole, any bid
- 3. All quotations are governed by the West Virginia Code and the Legislative Rules of the Purchasing Division.
- 4. Prior to any award, the apparent successful vendor must be properly registered with the Purchasing Division and have paid the required \$125 fee.
- 5. All services performed or goods delivered under State Purchase Order/Contracts are to be continued for the term of the Purchase Order/Contracts, contingent upon funds being appropriated by the Legislature or otherwise being made available. In the event funds are not appropriated or otherwise available for these services or goods, this Purchase Order/Contract becomes void and of no effect after June 30.
- 6. Payment may only be made after the delivery and acceptance of goods or services.
- 7. Interest may be paid for late payment in accordance with the West Virginia Code
- 8. Vendor preference will be granted upon written request in accordance with the West Virginia Code
- 9. The State of West Virginia is exempt from federal and state taxes and will not pay or reimburse such taxes.
- 10. The Director of Purchasing may cancel any Purchase Order/Contract upon 30 days written notice to the seller.
- 11. The laws of the State of West Virginia and the *Legislative Rules* of the Purchasing Division shall govern all rights and duties under the Contract, including without limitation the validity of this Purchase Order/Contract
- 12. Any reference to automatic renewal is hereby deleted. The Contract may be renewed only upon mutual written agreement of the parties
- 13. BANKRUPTCY: In the event the vendor/contractor files for bankruptcy protection, this Contract may be deemed null and void, and terminated without further order.
- 14. HIPAA BUSINESS ASSOCIATE ADDENDUM: The West Virginia State Government HIPAA Business Associate Addendum (BAA), approved by the Attorney General, and available online at the Purchasing Division's web site (http://www.state.wv.us/admin/purchase/vrc/hipaa.htm) is hereby made part of the agreement. Provided that, the Agency meets the definition of a Cover Entity (45 CFR §160.103) and will be disclosing Protected Health Information (45 CFR §160.103) to the vendor.
- 15. WEST VIRGINIA ALCOHOL & DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE ACT: If this Contract constitutes a public improvement construction contract as set forth in Article 1D, Chapter 21 of the West Virginia Code ("The West Virginia Alcohol and Drug-Free Workplace Act"), then the following language shall hereby become part of this Contract: "The contractor and its subcontractors shall implement and maintain a written drug-free workplace policy in compliance with the West Virginia Alcohol and Drug-Free Workplace Act, as set forth in Article 1D, Chapter 21 of the West Virginia Code. The contractor and its subcontractors shall provide a sworn statement in writing, under the penalties of perjury, that they maintain a valid drug-free work place policy in compliance with the West Virginia and Drug-Free Workplace Act. It is understood and agreed that this Contract shall be cancelled by the awarding authority if the Contractor: 1) Fails to implement its drug-free workplace policy; 2) Fails to provide information regarding implementation of the contractor's drug-free workplace policy at the request of the public authority; or 3) Provides to the public authority false information regarding the contractor's drug-free workplace policy."

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Request for Information

The State of West Virginia, Department of Health and Human Resources, Bureau for Public Health, Office of Environmental Health Services' (OEHS), Environmental Engineering Division is requesting information on the development of an environmental data exchange node to be incorporated into the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) exchange network. A Glossary of Terms is included to assist in understanding words and phrases not commonly known or used.

OEHS' objectives of using the data exchange network:

- Be able to use the node to transfer OEHS SDWIS/State data to EPA from OEHS' Oracle databases.
- Develop a data flow for the node for geographic information from OEHS' Source Water Protection and Source Water Area Polygon Data Layer to EPA and other trusted partners.
- Develop and implement a web-based electronic data interchange on the node that is Cross Media Electronic Reporting Rule compliant.
- Creation of a web front end that will query the node for data and return information to WV public water system operators located throughout West Virginia.
- Creation of a node at West Virginia State Geographic Information Systems Technical Center (WVGISTC) at West Virginia University and development of a data flow for GeoXML data from OEHS to WVGISTC.

By having an environmental data exchange node, OEHS expects the following outcomes:

- Improved efficiency and accuracy in transferring data to and from trusted data sharing partners.
- Real-time data can be shared with partners at any time the information is desired.

The node will have the following capabilities:

- Be compliant with EPA's Node 2.0 specifications in accordance with the EPA Network Exchange protocol.
- Using the EPA product known as Lab to State, laboratories from across the country will be able to submit data to OEHS that meets EPA electronic reporting requirements.
- WV public water systems will have the ability to submit monthly operational reports electronically, meeting the EPA electronic reporting requirements.
- Convert data from the SDWIS Oracle Database and migrate via the node to the EPA's Central Data Exchange (CDX) website.
- Convert data from OEHS' Oracle ARCSDE database to GXL format compatible with Node 2.0 specifications.

Additional node information:

- Source Code and documentation will be provided to OEHS as part of any development required.
- Any development will use secure coding standards set by WVDHHR.
- Stored procedures will be used to pass data; coding techniques will be used to cleanse the data that will be input to eliminate SQL injection; and operators' website will use secure password based authentication.
- OEHS will provide information about the database tables for any development needs.
- The node will use Oracle Internet Application Server as its web server.

Vendors interested in this RFI need to be able to respond to questions and provide information on the following:

- Setting up and configuring Node 2.0 software.
- Training OEHS staff on how to use the administration piece of the Node 2.0 software.
- Creation of a website for WV public water system operators to view their information.
- Configuration of the OEHS Node 2.0 to communicate with the WVGISTC Node 2.0.
- Data flows from OEHS' SDWIS/State to EPA and WVGISTC.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Term	Explanation
SDWIS	EPA's Safe Drinking Water Information System
SDWIS/State	Program developed by EPA for use by states to collect drinking water information and submit it to EPA on a regular basis.
Source Water Protection	Efforts to protect drinking water sources, both surface and ground water.
Source Water Area Polygon Data Layer	A Geographic Information System data layer that defines the area that contributes ground or surface water to a particular public water system.
Cross Media Electronic Reporting Rule	A regulation promulgated by EPA as minimum standards for a regulating agency to accept electronic reporting in lieu of paper reporting from a regulated entity.
WVGISTC	Provides technical support services to state agencies in the development and operation of GIS in WV.
EPA's Node 2.0	A web server that facilitates the interface between database systems and the Exchange Network. The Node is the entity's "point of presence" on the Exchange Network.
ARCSDE database	OEHS' Source Water Protection Geographic Information System.
