Acceptance of goods and/or services will occur upon delivery or after a reasonable amount of time (10) days) after delivery unless the order is over 20 personal computers and to be delivered to various locations. In this situation, "a reasonable amount of time" shall not exceed 30 days.

2. <u>General Terms & Conditions RFQ and RFP, Section 6:</u> Vendor assumes that payment terms are identified in the West Virginia Code. If not, may Vendor define payment terms in its proposal response? For example, the State shall pay Vendor with 30 days from Vendor's date of invoice.

Payment terms are defined in the Prompt Payment Plan of 1995 described in State Code (7-5-7).

3. <u>General Terms & Conditions RFQ and RFP, Section 10 and "CANCELLATION" section on RFQ page 3:</u> Vendor assumes that the State will pay Vendor for products and services delivered up to the effective date of termination. Will the State permit Vendor to clarify this point in its proposal?

State agencies will pay for products delivered and accepted up to the effective date of termination. If the products have been shipped but do not conform to the specifications of the bid, the products will be returned at the vendor's expense.

4. <u>General Terms & Conditions RFQ and RFP, Section 14:</u> Vendor assumes that HIPAA is not applicable to the products and services proposed by Vender hereunder. Can the State please confirm that HIPAA will not be applicable to a contract awarded hereunder?

State agencies will not be disclosing Protected Health Information to the vendor; thus, the HIPAA requirements do not apply.

5. Part 1, Section 1.4: The RFQ contemplates that a separate contract_document will be agreed upon and executed by the successful Vendor and the State. Given the products and services offered, there are a number of terms and conditions that are generally included within agreement of this type that are not included in the RFQ and RFP. For example, the RFQ and RFP do not contain terms and conditions addressing acceptance, warranties, or liability. Accordingly, Vendor would like an opportunity to include certain additional terms and conditions for discussion with the State and inclusion in the final contract. Will the State permit Vendor to include such additional terms and conditions in its proposal?

It is our intent that the RFQ and the Vendor's response comprise the contract. If the vendor plans to add terms and conditions, the WV-96 (Agreement Addendum) provisions must be included in the discussions. The State will review additional terms and conditions but will have the option of accepting or rejecting them.

6. <u>Part 1, Section 1.5:</u> Vendor may use its existing network of subcontractors to perform certain support services. Will the State agree that the State's consent will not be required for such existing subcontractors, or at least agree that such consent will not be unreasonable withheld?

The vendor may choose its own subcontractors. The State agencies need to know who is coming to their location to work on their equipment. Consent will not be unreasonably withheld.

No, we believe that the 2GB Dimm is the better choice for the State agencies.

15, Q33 is an old chipset. Do you intend to stay at current technology levels with the Q35.

The Q33 is the minimum configuration required for the Standard Desktop but he Vendor may bid equal to or better than. We expect the technology to continue to be upgraded throughout the contract term but each replacement will have to be equal to or better than at the same price or lower.

16. Is there a reason that a different minimum chipset was specified for the Standard Desktop (Q33) and the Power User Desktop (Q35) when a different operating system image would be required for each? While the price of a Q33 equipped desktop may be slightly lower than a Q35 desktop, is any consideration given by the difference in imaging and support costs?

The Q33 is the minimum configuration required for the Standard Desktop but the Vendor may bid equal to or better so if you want to bid the Q35 for both the Standard Desktop and the Power User Desktop that would be acceptable. As far as the image, the FSB MHZ and level 2 cache are significantly different in the Q33 and Q35, so we felt that would be a cost issue.

17. Would the State change the chipset requirement to include the G31 and x31 class Intel chipsets? These chipsets are newer than the proposed Q33 and have a longer life cycle and similar functionality.

No. Upon review, these chipsets are slightly lower than the Q33 chipset. The Q33 has a higher FSB s-peed and more memory for graphics. If you propose a newer chipset, remember that it must be equal to or better than the Q33.

18. Power Desktop. Do you want video dongles included in configuration. Config is

not currently requesting any but current standard includes dual VGA which is being utilized by many agencies

Not all power users utilize the dual monitors, so having the "Y" dongle included is not necessary, If the video on the system only has DVI, then yes a DVI to VGA connector must be included for single monitor hookup, but a Part number and price on the accessory page is required for the "Y" adapter dual monitor cable.

19. Wireless. Do you have a requirement on wireless cards, Intel, Broadcom etc?

We use Intel internal wireless cards.

20. Our traveler notebook has a built in optical drive that limits the amount of space inside our notebook. This design allow for more flexibility in a very small package. Will one memory slot be acceptable in the Traveler Notebook?

The thought behind a POWERED USB hub is. If a laptop has less than 3 USB ports, most likely it cannot handle as many USB options that require power. If the USB hub supplied can provide power to at least two other units without having to have external power, 2 USB ports plus a powered USB hub will meet this requirement.

23. Would you consider modifying specs to be specific in screen size and weight? Industry standard for ultra portables is 12.1" display under 4 lbs so you are opening up the possibility of some quoting non-portables that fall within the requirements.

We have changed the weight for the traveling worker notebook to 3 to 5 pounds.

24. Tablet. Will you accept Standard aspect screens vs wide. The ThinkPad X61tablet is the industry's most awarded tablet ever and currently ranked #1 by PC Magazine but we offer only XGA and SXGA +, not WXGA or WSXGA+.

XGA and SXGA will be acceptable.

For any system that is 2GB, it should be one DIMM, for any system that is 4GB, it may be two 2GB dims.

While the price of a Q33 equipped desktop may be slightly lower than a Q35 desktop, is any consideration given by the difference in imaging and support costs?

The Q33 is the minimum configuration required for the Standard Desktop but the Vendor may bid equal to or better so if you want to bid the Q35 for both the Standard Desktop and the Power User Desktop, that would be acceptable. As far as the image, the FSB MHZ and level 2 cache are significantly different in the Q33 and Q35, so we felt that would be a cost issue.

Not all power users utilize the dual monitors, so having the "Y" dongle included is not necessary, if the video on the system only has DVI, then yes a DVI to VGA connector must be included for single monitor hookup, but a Part number and price on the accessory page is required for the "Y" adapter dual monitor cable.

Once again we would like to stay with INTEL if possible. One of our agencies has to have INTEL cards for wireless to work.

18. Our traveler notebook has a built in optical drive that limits the amount of space inside our notebook. This design allow for more flexibility in a very small package. Will one memory slot be acceptable in the Traveler Notebook?

Since all Notebooks / Laptops are at 2GB this would mean that if we needed to upgrade we would be discarding a 2GB module, and paying higher price for larger Dimm. Also the only notebooks I know of with only one memory slot are ones with integrated system memory on the motherboard which can't be upgraded.

2 slot minimum is required.

The thought behind a POWERED USB hub is. If a laptop has less than 3 USB ports, most likely it cannot handle as many USB options that require power. For on the road traveling, it should be no problem. For in an office environment if the dockstation has a powered hub integrated with more than 2 USB, then that should be fine, otherwise the USB hub needs to be powered.

20. Tablet. Will you accept Standard aspect screens vs wide. The ThinkPad X61tablet is the industry's most awarded tablet ever and currently ranked #1 by PC Magazine but we offer only XGA and SXGA +, not WXGA or WSXGA+.

SXGA +/ XGA will be acceptable.

21. Monitors: In the Mandatory Pre-Bid Conference the State made a verbal statement that the State has standardized on View Sonic 17 and 19 inch monitors. Is this a proprietary purchase? Can a vendor offer another manufacturer that meets or exceeds the functional features of the View Sonic Monitors for the RFQ?

We revised this in the meeting to 19" and above. 17" is being phased out. The Vendor is expected to offer their choice of monitor. Some agencies prefer the ViewSonic monitors but they can buy them off of the SIP08 contract. Agencies are required to buy the personal computers from IP08 but have the option of buying the monitors on IP08 or SIP08.
