- Study will examine the interest by other states in sharing administrative functions to create economi9es of scale and leverage resources. Study will also examine effects of combining risk pools and expansion of costs across larger populations.
- Vendor will conduct interviews with other states to assess current environments and Exchange planning efforts to determine interest in potentially establishing a Regional Exchange effort.
- From these interviews, an issue brief will be developed outlining the
