The purpose of this addendum is to modify the solicitation identified as DEFK13017 ("Solicitation") to reflect the change(s) identified and described below.

Description of Modification to Solicitation:

Vendor questions and responses are attached. The bid opening date remains May 30, 2013 at 1:30 pm.

Additional Documentation: Documentation related to this Addendum (if any) has been included herewith as Attachment A and is specifically incorporated herein by reference.

Terms and Conditions:

ATTACHMENT A**QUESTIONS:**

- Q1: Meeting** – Will there be an official pre-bid meeting?
- A1: No, but there will be a pre-work conference with Camp Dawson Environmental personnel after the contract is awarded and prior to field work.**
- Q2: Audio** – Will acoustic surveys be accepted as the primary Phase 2 sampling technique?
- A2: Yes, as long as the draft study plan is approved by the USFWS Field Office.**
- Q3: Capture Permits** – Is there a minimum requirement concerning the number of biologist with a collection permit that must be onsite during acoustic surveys?
- A3: Contractor will coordinate with USFWS FO to determine.**
- Q4: Netting** – Will mist-netting be required if Indiana bats are detected, using the acoustic method during Phase 2, as outlined in Phase 3 of the USFWS 2013 guidelines?
- A4: Contractor will coordinate with USFWS FO to determine.**
- Q5: Call Detection** – Is there a minimum number of call detections, collected during Phase 2 acoustic sampling that will trigger Phase 3 mist-net sampling?
- A5: Contractor will coordinate with USFWS FO to determine.**
- Q6: Call Analysis** – Must both acoustic analysis programs agree upon the identification of aforementioned Indiana bat calls ($P < 0.05$)? Will this be the main trigger to initiate Phase 3 sampling? Will a qualified qualitative call identifier be necessary to verify potentially recorded Indiana bat calls?
- A6: Contractor will coordinate with USFWS FO to determine.**
- Q7: Sampling Effort** – Will there be a preferred minimum level of effort concerning mist-netting sampling if Phase 3 is implemented?
- A7: Contractor will coordinate with USFWS FO to determine.**

- Q8: Acoustic detectors/mist-netting** – Can mist-netting equipment and audio detectors be used simultaneously during Phase 2, as a supplement to the 2007 guidelines, to shorten survey duration if acoustics are not accepted at the primary methodology?
- A8: Contractor will coordinate with USFWS FO to determine.**
- Q9: Net/Acoustic Sites** - Can nets and acoustic methods be used within the same 123 acre site to decrease net-nights/audio detector nights during Phase 2?
- A9: Contractor will coordinate with USFWS FO to determine.**
- Q10: Telemetry** – Will telemetry and emergence counts be required upon capture of a non-reproductive female Indiana bat as stated in Phase 4 of the USFWS 2013 guidelines?
- A10: Contractor will coordinate with USFWS FO to determine.**
- Q11: Tracking Samples** – Will one bat be sufficient for tracking purposed? Is there a minimum/maximum amount of bats that will be required for tracking if required?
- A11: Contractor will coordinate with USFWS FO to determine.**
- Q12: Emergence** – Will emergence surveys be required if a roost is located?
- A12: Contractor will coordinate with USFWS FO to determine.**
- Q13: Foraging Data** – If tracking is required to locate potential roost, will the gathering of foraging data also be required?
- A13: Contractor will coordinate with USFWS FO to determine.**
- Q14: Reproductive Female** – Will it be assumed that a maternity colony exist in the area if a reproductive female is captured during either Phase 2 or 3? Can this assumption then negate the need for radio telemetry?
- A14: Contractor will coordinate with USFWS FO to determine.**
- Q15: Maps** – Will we have access to maps of Camp Dawson and its specific tracks, either hardcopy or shapefiles?
- A15: Yes, Camp Dawson will provide contractor with any and all GIS data and/or hardcopy maps relevant to this project.**

Q16: Resource Management Plan – Will a copy of the *Camp Dawson Draft Final Integrated Natural Resource Management Plan* or like information be provided?

A16: Yes, Camp Dawson will provide contractor with copies of any Resource Management Plans, Faunal Survey Reports, Vegetative Survey Reports, etc. relevant to this project.

Q17: USFWS – Can these questions, if necessary, be forward to the local US Fish and Wildlife Service Field Office prior to bid submittal?

A17: Yes, contractor may begin coordination with USFWS FO prior to bid submittal.
