A joint effort between the West Virginia Division of Homeland Security and the West Virginia National Guard seeks to bring portable generators to the state to use in times of disaster. This initiative comes after several emergencies left many communities statewide without power for extended periods of time. The West Virginia State Agency for Surplus Property (WVSASP) requested the generators from the General Services Administration (GSA) on behalf of the state.

“WVSASP allocates the generators and charges the requesting agency a nominal administrative fee,” said Administrative Services Manager Anthony Cooper.

Surplus Property State Vehicle Auction Scheduled for July 8

The West Virginia State Agency for Surplus Property (WVSASP) will host a vehicle auction on Wednesday, July 8, at 2700 Charles Avenue in Dunbar. Approximately 50 surplus state vehicles will be available for sale during the auction.

WVSASP's previous absolute vehicle auction realized 50 vehicles sold. Purchasing Division Assistant Director and WVSASP Manager Elizabeth Perdue said the previous auction was a huge success, and as WVSASP prepares for a large-scale construction project beginning this summer, now seemed like a good time to offer another one.

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Changes Coming to WVSASP with Planned Construction!

The West Virginia State Agency for Surplus Property (WVSASP) has experienced significant changes in recent years, including the switch from sealed bids to daily sales, the move to online auctions, and an expanded online presence with its Facebook page.

However, the changes expected over the next year could be among the most exciting yet for WVSASP, with a planned major renovation of its offices and warehouses in Dunbar. During the month of July, work will begin on tearing down buildings throughout the Dunbar location, beginning with the auction room followed by the federal warehouse and main office building.

Construction will involve an all-inclusive building that will include the administrative offices and warehouse space, eliminating the need

for visitors having to walk across the parking lot to or from the current office building or warehouse. This will create a more pleasant shopping experience for visitors and prevent them from being exposed to the weather elements.

The new warehouse area is designed to be more inviting and retail-oriented, better organized and better suited to customers so they can find exactly what they are looking for. To address the need for more security, the design plans also include an enclosed parking area.

Unfortunately, these changes will not come without a certain degree of inconvenience to visitors and staff, as WVSASP will have to temporarily shift its vehicle lot. Other daily operations may also expect some slight interruptions while deal-

ing with the ongoing construction work. Posted signs will ask that customers “pardon our mess” during this time period. Furthermore, Surplus Property staff hopes that customers will be forgiving of the temporary inconveniences.

WVSASP is excited about the changes to its Dunbar location and how they will improve the overall customer experience. This is a change that has been a long-time coming and is believed to be the next phase of an exciting future for our agency!


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Surplus Property Warehouse Location



DIRECTIONS: Exit I-64 at Dunbar/Roxalana Road, turn right on Roxalana Road then turn onto WV-25 West. At 16th Street, turn left. Go to intersection with Charles Avenue -- if you miss 16th Street, go to 22nd Street which is also a throughway. Turn right onto Charles Avenue, continue to 28th Street and turn right. The West Virginia State Agency for Surplus Property is on that corner inside the cyclone fence.

appropriate time to clear our lot as much as possible,” she said. The construction project, which is expected to last through September of 2016, will introduce new office space and warehouse facilities to WVSASP. **See related article on Page 2.**

Gates will open at 8:30 a.m., with the auction scheduled to begin promptly at 10 a.m. Potential bidders may inspect the sale property beginning June 29 through July 7 from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. at the Dunbar location. Payment on the day of the auction may be made by cash, check, and Visa, MasterCard and Discover.

All property is subject to prior sale. All vehicles must be removed from the lot within three business days of the auction.

Terms: All organizations must pay by check or credit card. No cash transactions permitted.

Terms and Conditions of Sale

FEDERAL AND STATE REGULATIONS: Acceptance of Federal equipment and supplies by users who have established eligibility to participate in WVSASP is subject to certifications and agreements identified on the reverse side of the Distribution Document. **1:** Federal equipment and supplies are restricted to institutional use only, not personal use, and are to be used for a minimum of one year; **2:** All vehicles and items with an acquisition cost of \$5,000.00 or more shall be used for the purpose(s) for which acquired within one year from the date the property was invoiced and used for 18 months thereafter. **3:** During the restriction period, the property shall not be sold, traded, leased, lent, bailed, cannibalized, encumbered or otherwise disposed of or removed from the State of West Virginia without the express approval of WVSASP. The recipients of Federal property are urged to contact WVSASP prior to taking any actions which might be interpreted as modifying any of the certifications and agreements stated on the reverse side of the Distribution Document.

TERMS: Payment required upon receipt unless previous arrangements have been made. Payment must be by check or credit card issued against an eligible organization. No personal checks, money orders or cash transactions are permitted.

SHIPPING: All service charges are FOB Dunbar Warehouse unless expressly indicated. Out-shipping can be arranged by calling 304.766.2626. Delivery charges will be added to the invoice.
