As you are aware, our recent attempt to bid and award new tire collection contracts for all four Pollution Prevention Open Dump Program (PPOD) districts has met an obstacle and has been put on hold. It has now been brought to my attention that the REAP PPOD Southern and Western District Tire Collection Contracts (WVDEP contracts CMA DEP20\*37 & 38) have no further extensions available and will expire on June 30, 2024. This fact leaves REAP in a situation that forces us to request an emergency extension of the two contracts referenced above. The extensions are being requested for the following reasons:

First and foremost, these two contracts are being used to operate ongoing tire collection events in 16 counties. These collection events occur monthly, weekly, or sometimes daily and have become popular with the citizens of those counties. If extensions of these contracts are not granted, the ongoing collections in these counties will cease immediately, and will not resume until such time that new contracts are issued. Counties affected are: Boone, Cabell, Calhoun, Fayette, Greenbrier, Kanawha, Mason, Mercer, Mongo, Monroe, Putnam, Roane, Summers, Wayne, Wood, and Wyoming. These collections have become a popular method of waste tire disposal in the aforementioned counties, and the residents of these counties have come to rely on the service. Interruption of this service may lead to increased illegal dumping of waste tires, creating a significant impact in the affected counties, as well as a significant amount of public outcry and/or bad press for the agency.

Secondly, removal of the 18 trailers currently being used by REAP PPOD under these two contracts (there are also two trailers staged at a contractor yard and at a cleanup site) from their staging areas, before the June 30 contract deadline is a logistical impossibility. Even if the required work directives, cost proposals, and ADOs were already complete, it would be impossible for the two contractors to remove all staged trailers, and transport them to a licensed disposal facility, prior to the deadline.

For the reasons above, I am requesting that an emergency contract extension be granted on the two tire collection contracts. Should you have any further questions, or need any further information, feel free to contact me.
