On a former day, to-wit, December 22, 1998, came the petitioner, Arch A. Moore, Jr., a suspended member of The West Virginia State Bar, by DiTrapano, Barrett & DiPiero, and Rudolph L. DiTrapano and Sean P. McGinley, his attorneys, pursuant to Rule 3.33(b) of the Rules of Lawyer Disciplinary Procedure, and presented to the Court his petition for reinstatement of his license to practice law in West Virginia. Thereafter, on August 20, 2003, came the Hearing Panel Subcommittee, by its chairperson, Allan N. Karlin, pursuant to Rule 3.33(c) of the Rules of Lawyer Disciplinary Procedure, and presented to the Court its written recommendation that the petition for reinstatement be denied. Thereafter, on August 22, 2003, came the petitioner, by Rudolph L. DiTrapano, his attorney, and presented to the Court his timely request for a hearing pursuant to Rule 3.33(c) of the Rules of Lawyer Disciplinary Procedure.



It is further ordered that the petitioner file an original and nine copies of a brief on or before the 26<sup>th</sup> day of September, 2003; that the respondent, Lawyer Disciplinary Board, file a like number of briefs on or before the 17<sup>th</sup> day of October, 2003; and any reply brief deemed necessary to be filed on or before the 31<sup>st</sup> day of October, 2003.
