The bill prohibits political subdivisions from enacting any ordinance, regulation, local policy, local resolution or other legal requirements regulating certain areas of the employer-employee relationship and the sale or marketing of consumer merchandise. The purpose of this bill is to eliminate the requirement for all new legislative rules to have a five year sunset date after the initial five year sunset date, to allow the Secretary of State to conform all active legislative rules with a sunset provision to the requirements of this section, and requires the Secretary of State to file a notice of sunset in the State Register upon the expiration of a legislative rule within thirty days of its expiration. Finally, the bill requires that effective July 1, 2021, all legislative rules subject to the sunset provisions of this section shall have a termination date of July 1 of the applicable year.
